Discussion is held regarding the proposed *de minimis* abstract submitted by SPR and the Arizona State Land Department and Statement of Claimant 39-18135 filed on by the Arizona State Land Department. Mr. Crestin believes it may be best to proceed with an amended watershed file report ("WFR") at this point because of the claimed stock and wildlife watering and irrigation uses in Statement of Claimant 39-18135.

Mr. McGinnis states that from SRP's perspective, its preference is to proceed to adjudicate the stock watering and irrigation claims and bypass the *de minimis* procedure. Mr. McGinnis concerned about relying on the Statement of Claimant asserting as the

1853 date and states that it would not be a bad idea to have ADWR file an amended WFR.

Discussion is held about notice required for an amended WFR.

The Court states that it will not approved the draft abstract at this time.

Ms. Parks asks that ADWR have until end of March or beginning of April of 2021 to prepare an amended WFR.

Mr. McGinnis clarifies his earlier position that its makes sense in this case given the findings in the watershed file report not to use the *de minimis* procedure where there are additional claims that must be determined. Mr. Sparks concurs that this case differs from a situation where the only claim was a *de minimis* claim for a water right.
