FOR FILING NUMEROUS
OBJECTIONS TO THE SAN
PEDRO RIVER HYDROGRAPHIC SURVEY REPORT

CONTESTED CASE NAME: In re General Procedures for Adjudication of San Pedro River Watershed.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The Special Master issues a case management order, applicable to all persons who anticipate filing 25 or more objections to the San Pedro River Watershed Hydrographic Survey Report, establishing certain filing procedures including, in some cases, the use of uniform objection terms and codes and the submission of objection information to DWR on computer media and in a standardized form.

THIS MATTER COMING before the Special Master on his own motion, after consultation with the Steering Committee for the Gila River Adjudication

(pursuant to a series of meetings, notice of which was provided to the Courtapproved mailing list); and the Master being fully advised;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following special filing requirements shall apply to those persons filing numerous objections to the San Pedro River Hydrographic Survey Report (HSR):

1. Introduction¹

Because numerous objections are expected to be filed to the San Pedro River HSR, special filing requirements are imposed on those persons who anticipate filing numerous objections. These special filing requirements will assist (a) the parties to the adjudication in formulating and organizing their objections; (b) the Clerk of the Superior Court in filing and docketing objections to the San Pedro River HSR; and (c) the Special Master in identifying objections which raise issues of broad legal importance, in consolidating common issues of law and fact, and in otherwise managing the expected large volume of objections.

2. <u>Brief Description of Special Filing Requirements</u>

Two sets of special filing requirements are set forth in this Order. The first set of procedures ("Multiple Objection Filing Procedures," *see* section 3, *below*) pertains to the filing of objections with the Clerk of the Superior Court. The second set of procedures ("Uniform Objection Process," *see* section 4, *below*) requires the use of a uniform set of objection terms and codes in preparing and filing objections to the San Pedro River HSR and the submission of this coded information to DWR on computer media and in a standardized form.

3. <u>Multiple Objection Filing Procedures</u>

[a] Persons Required to Comply

Any person who, during the objection period on the San Pedro River HSR, files objections to 25 or more Watershed File Reports; 25 or more Zone 2 Well Reports; 25 or more Catalogued Wells; makes 25 or more objections to Volume 1 of the HSR; or, as a result of any combination of the preceding, files 25 or more separate objection forms, shall comply with these Multiple Objection Filing Procedures.

 $^{^1}See$ RULES FOR PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE SPECIAL MASTER § 1.00 (Nov. 1, 1991) for definitions of terms used in this Order.

[b] Requirements

A person who is required to comply with these Multiple Objection Filing Procedures shall file that person's objections to the San Pedro River HSR as follows: The original and two copies (including all attachments) of each objection shall be mailed or submitted in person to the Clerk of the Superior Court for filing at the following location:

Clerk of the Superior Court Attn: Water Case Records Management Center 3345 W. Durango Street Phoenix, AZ 85009²

The original of each objection shall be <u>immediately followed by the two copies</u>. Separate stacks of original objections and copies will not be accepted by the Clerk. The objections shall be arranged by ascending Volume 1 page number, Watershed File Report Number, Zone 2 Well Report Number, and Catalogued Well Number (see the indices in Volume 2 of the HSR). The objections shall be arranged with the lowest number "on top of the stack."

Objectors filing large numbers of objections in person with the Clerk of the Superior Court are *requested* to make an appointment with the Clerk's Office before bringing in objections to be filed. The failure to make such an appointment, while disruptive of the processes of the Clerk's Office, will not preclude the filing of objections before the deadline.

4. <u>Uniform Objection Process</u>

[a] <u>Purpose</u>

The uniform objection process consists of terms and codes used to categorize objections to the San Pedro River HSR. Its purpose is to assist the Special Master, Clerk of the Superior Court, Department of Water Resources, and litigants in identifying like issues for consolidation and in managing the contested cases in the adjudication. The process also assists claimants in the formulation of potential objections.

²Filing of objections at the Durango Street Records Management Center will benefit all participants as it will remove the filing and processing of the objections from normal civil filings. The Clerk's Office is already strained in its efforts to staff this case and does not have the resources necessary to have personnel familiar with the water case in both the downtown and Durango Street locations.

With the assistance of the Steering Committee for the Gila River Adjudication, the Special Master has prepared a list of uniform objection terms and codes which appears as Attachment 1 to this Order. This list sets forth, in outline form, major objection categories and specific objection terms under each category. Each objection term is assigned a unique code number.

The list of uniform objection terms and codes is not to be used as a "shopping list" for objections. An objection must state in clear and concise language the particular factual and/or legal reasons for the objection and describe the evidence to support those reasons. The use of these uniform objection terms by themselves usually will not satisfy this requirement.

Ы Persons Required to Comply

Any person who, during the objection period on the San Pedro River HSR, files objections to 50 or more Watershed File Reports; 50 or more Zone 2 Well Reports; 50 or more Catalogued Wells; makes 50 or more objections to Volume 1 of the HSR; or, as a result of any combination of the preceding, files 50 or more separate objection forms, shall also comply with the Uniform Objection Process set forth in this section 4.

Any other person may elect to follow this Uniform Objection Process by following the procedure set forth in the next subparagraph.

[c] Notice of Intent to Comply With Uniform Objection Process

Any person who is required or desires to file objections pursuant to this Uniform Objection Process shall notify DWR of that person's intent, in writing, no later than April 17, 1992. Even though an objector may not know for a certainty whether the objector will exceed the threshold for filing objections pursuant to the Uniform Objection Process until closer to the objection deadline, the objector should notify DWR by April 17th if it is probable that the threshold will be exceeded.

Any person who is required or desires to comply with this Uniform Objection Process (referred to in this section 4 as "Objector") shall file that person's objections to the San Pedro River HSR by following the procedure set forth in the next subparagraph.

[d]Submission of Uniform Objection Information

On or before June 12, 1992, each person who is required or desires to file objections pursuant to this Uniform Objection Process shall submit to DWR, on computer media, its objections to the HSR utilizing the Uniform Objection Codes listed in Attachment 1 to this Order. If, within a major objection category (e.g., "Objections Concerning Diversions"), a specific objection term does not accurately describe the objection, the objector can use the more general objection code (e.g.,

"600"). This has the same result as indicating a general diversion objection. This computerized submission shall be prepared as follows (see Attachment 2, Summary of Required Codes by Objection Classification):

[1] Objections to Volume 1 (Excluding Major User Reports)

If an Objector objects to any portion of Volume 1 of the HSR, excluding the Major User Reports, the Objector shall code the <u>location</u> of the objection, by chapter or appendix, using the codes in Part I of Attachment 1. No other objection code is necessary.

[2] Objections to Major User Reports in Volume 1

If an Objector objects to a Major User Report³ in Volume 1 of the HSR, the Objector shall code the <u>location</u> of the Major User Report in Chapter 5, using the codes in Part I of Attachment 1, and shall also code the <u>identity</u> of the Major User using the identification codes in Part III of Attachment 1. An objection to a Major User Report will usually require an objection to the Watershed File Report pertaining to that Major User.

[3] Objections to Watershed File Reports

If an Objector objects to any portion of a Watershed File Report (Volumes 3-6 of the HSR), the Objector shall specify the uniform objection codes, using the codes in Part II of Attachment 1, that describe the Objector's objection to a Watershed File Report. For each Watershed File Report objected to, the Objector need only provide in computerized form the Watershed File Report Number and the relevant uniform objection codes for that Watershed File Report.

[4] Objections to Zone 2 Well Reports

If an Objector objects to any portion of a Zone 2 Well Report (Volume 7 of the HSR), the Objector shall specify the uniform objection codes, using the codes in Part II of Attachment 1, that describe the Objector's objection to the Zone 2 Well Report. For each Zone 2 Well Report objected to, the Objector need only provide in computerized form the Zone 2 Well Report Number and the relevant uniform objection codes for that Zone 2 Well Report.

³The use of the term, "major user," which is taken from Volume 1 of the San Pedro HSR, does not imply any determination by the Court as to the amount of water used by these parties. DWR should use the term, "major party," in subsequent HSRs.

[5] Objections to Catalogued Wells

If an Objector objects to a Catalogued Well (Volume 8 of the HSR), the Objector shall specify the uniform objection codes, using the codes in Part II of Attachment 1, that describe the Objector's objection to the Catalogued Well. For each Catalogued Well objected to, the Objector need only provide in computerized form the Catalogued Well Number and the relevant uniform objection codes for that Catalogued Well.

[6] Relationship of Major Users to Other Users

Frequently, the water uses of an individual water user are related to the water uses of a Major User such as an irrigation district, municipal water provider, or governmental entity. For instance, an irrigation district may have claimed water in behalf of its members. An individual landowner⁴ may have claimed water that is being supplied by a municipality. A permittee or lessee may have claimed water for land owned by the federal or state government.

In cases where the water uses of an individual landowner are somehow related to the water uses or claims of a Major User, it is important to provide the objection code for the Major User (Part III of Attachment 1) in the objection to the individual landowner's Watershed File Report. Furnishing this information assists the Clerk and the Special Master in providing notice of subsequent contested case proceedings to the appropriate persons.

[e] Format for Submission of Objection Information to DWR

The computerized, coded objection information shall be submitted to DWR on a 3.5 inch disk; a 5.25 inch disk; or on 0.5 inch, 9-track magnetic tape. The computerized, coded objection information shall be submitted in ASCII form utilizing flat file, word processing (fixed field), or DBF format. The submission should be accompanied by documentation including the identity of the Objector, the Objector's Watershed File Report Number or Statement of Claimant Number, record lengths, and field definitions (name, length and type). Any person desiring clarification or more information about these requirements should contact Michael Parton at DWR's Adjudication Division, (602) 542-1520.

Upon request, DWR will provide to an Objector a computerized data base of all Watershed File Report Numbers, Zone 2 Well Numbers, and Catalogued Well Numbers in the San Pedro River Watershed with an empty field for the insertion by

⁴"Landowner," as used in this Order, means that person or entity listed in a Watershed File Report, Zone 2 Well Report, or Catalogued Well Report as the apparent record owner of land on which a water use occurs.

the Objector of the appropriate uniform objection codes. DWR will make the data base available either on computer tape or floppy disk and may charge a reasonable fee for the computer media.⁵

[f] <u>Filing and Service of "Hard Copy" Objections</u>

Compliance with this uniform objection process does not relieve an Objector of its obligation to file, on or before May 18, 1992, the original and two copies of each objection (using the mandatory objection form) with the Clerk of the Superior Court. The Objector must also serve by mail a copy of each objection on the landowner whose water uses or claims are objected to.⁶

In preparing "hard copy" objections for filing with the Clerk, each statement of an objection should contain the applicable code number.⁷ Example:

"I object to water use IR 001 for the reason that the claimant failed to exercise due diligence in establishing the right (831)."

Additionally, the objection filing requirements contained in the instructional materials sent to claimants in the Gila River adjudication on November 20, 1991, and the objection filing requirements contained in the Rules for Proceedings Before the Special Master remain in full force and effect.

[g] Significance of Uniform Objection Code Submissions

The computerized information and codes submitted pursuant to this uniform objection process have no legal significance in and of themselves. While utilizing this computerized information for preliminary case management purposes, the Special Master will still review the official "hard copy" objections prior to making any final case management decisions. An opportunity will be provided at the scheduling conference in each contested case to discuss with the litigants whether the issues have been appropriately consolidated and whether the proper parties are before the Court.

⁵An objector does not have to purchase a computer tape or floppy disk from DWR in order to prepare the computerized objections. Upon payment of a reasonable fee, DWR is providing such computer media as a convenience. The prohibition against the imposition of fees on Tribes, contained in ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 45-254(F) (1987), applies to the original filing fees that accompanied the statements of claimants.

⁶A question has been raised about how this service requirement will be interpreted in the case of objections to the federally created water rights of an Indian tribe, band, community, or individual. Since the water rights of Tribes and their members will be addressed in separate HSRs and not in watershed HSRs such as the San Pedro HSR, the appropriate objection filing and service requirements will be determined at that time.

⁷In response to a comment: Since this information will be contained in the "hard copy" objections, the uniform objection information will be served upon the landowner.

5. <u>Exemptions</u>

Any person who would otherwise be required to comply with the provisions of this Order may request an exemption from these special filing requirements. Any person may also request the addition of additional terms and codes to Attachment 1 or permission to use that person's own coding system. Such requests may be made by a motion to the Special Master, no later than April 17, 1992, accompanied by an affidavit, indicating that the person does not have the computer resources, computer expertise, or financial means to comply with this Order, desires additions to Attachment 1, or has good reason to use its own coding system. The Master may hold hearings on any such requests (and may require any person using an alternative coding system to provide adequate written documentation about that system).

6. Access to Computerized Information

After DWR has had a reasonable opportunity to compile the uniform objection information submitted in computer form by objectors, the submitted information will be available to the public. Public access to this information must accommodate the prior needs of the Special Master and DWR to use this information for objection analysis and case scheduling. DWR may charge a reasonable fee for information supplied on computer media.

7. Orientation on Special Filing Requirements

The Special Master and DWR will provide two orientation sessions on these special filing requirements for the benefit of persons who are required or desire to follow these requirements. The first orientation will be held at 1:30 p.m. on February 20, 1992, in the Basement Conference Room (Room B044), Arizona Department of Water Resources, 15 South 15th Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona. The second orientation will be held at 1:30 p.m. on February 21, 1992, at the University of Arizona Water Resources Research Center (Conference Room), 350 N. Campbell Avenue, Tucson, Arizona.

8. Additional Information; Addresses

Additional information on these special filing requirements may be obtained from DWR. The address for such inquiries, as well as for the notices and submissions required by this Order, is as follows:
