The Court address Mr. Brown. It looks like at one point you came close to a settlement but then there were issues regarding priority dates and quantification. Has the quantification issue been resolved?

Mr. Brown states they have not addressed the issue because we have not obtained the documents from National Archives to address the priority dates. If you recall, the quantification issue was an issue prior to the St. David stipulation. The formula applies in all of the cases in the San Pedro.

The Court states we will wait until Mr. Brown files a notice that the National Archives has reopened.

Mr. Sparks states he will look at the St. David stipulation again because he is not sure that the stipulation applies to all the parties in the San Pedro.
