The Alaska Judicial Council will hold another public hearing on **Wednesday, August 23, 2023, at 12:15 p.m.**, to receive comments about the applicants for an Anchorage Superior Court judicial vacancy. Members of the public are invited to participate in person at the **Boney Courthouse, Supreme Court Courtroom, Fifth Floor, 303 K Street, Anchorage, Alaska** or by calling toll free **1-888-788-0099 with Meeting ID 570 085 6779**.

The Council will meet in Juneau on August 22 and in Anchorage on August 23-24, 2023, to interview applicants and nominate the most qualified for each vacancy, and to discuss administrative matters. The Juneau judicial vacancy is due to the resignation of Juneau Superior Court Judge Daniel Schally. The Anchorage judicial vacancy is due to the forthcoming retirement of Judge William F. Morse.

The Alaska Judicial Council's mission is to screen and nominate judicial and Public Defender applicants, evaluate the performance of judges, and make evaluation information and recommendations available to the voters, and conduct studies and make recommendations to improve the administration of justice.
