Graduate Fellowships

The Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) Program is pleased to offer the following Fellowships for newly admitted and continuing graduate students. Each award will be given based upon the submission of a written essay and review of the applicant's references that were submitted as a part of the application to graduate school process. Essays should be a minimum of 500 words and maximum of 1,000 words and thoroughly answer the topics specified.

1. Communication Sciences and Disorders Fellowship: This award is offered only to incoming students for whom admission has been offered into the CSD Program. It carries a stipend of **\$1500.00** for the 2022-2023 academic year. The applicant must prepare a written essay on the following topic: *Describe those activities in which you have actively participated and that have prepared you to become a successful Speech-Language Pathologist.*

2. The Jason Foundation Scholarship: This award is offered only to incoming graduate students who will be enrolled full-time for the 2022-2023 academic year and carries a stipend of **\$1,100.00**. The applicant must prepare a written essay on the following topic: *How would you as a speech language pathologist impact the life of a person with brain injury? Include in the essay your future plans to work with this population.*

Completed applications are **due March 25, 2022 by 5 PM EST.**
