- Language Development Across the Lifespan
  Neurology of Human Communication
- Introduction to Clinical Practice (completion of 25 hours of observation)
- Introduction to Audiology & Hearing Science
- Aural (Re)Habilitation

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Submit to Longwood University -Longwood online application

Submit through CSDCAS:

- CSDCAS application and essay questions
- ✓ Official bachelor's degree transcripts from an accredited college or university and all other transcripts for subsequent work.
- Cumulative degree GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or master's degree
- Three letters of recommendation\*
- Resume or curriculum vitae
- ✓ \$40 application fee

\*Longwood CSD undergraduates: one of the three letters must be from faculty other than CSD faculty.

## **TUITION & FEES**

Based on current tuition rates, tuition costs \$461 per credit hour\* in-state and \$1,108 per credit hour out-of-state\*. These costs do not include textbooks.
