Court reporter, Crystal Hereford, is present and a record of these proceedings is made digitally.

Mr. LeBlanc provides the Court with copies of the proposed abstracts at the Court's request.

Discussion is held regarding the chain of title. Mr. LeBlanc explains that the issue with this WFR is that the places of use span four parcels. He was able to find chain of title for only one of those parcels, therefore, Pima County is unable to provide Mr. Sparks a complete chain of title at this moment.

He further stated that Pima County will not be pursuing water rights for irrigation use described by 113-12-BD-002-IR004 and 113-12-BD-002-IR090.

The Court will proceed with the *de minimis* claims that are outstanding and it will grant Pima County's request for a stay in regards to the irrigation claims pending the outcome in contested case *In re Luebbermann*.

Mr. Foy, Ms. Brennan, Mr. Pew and Mr. Burnside have no objections.

IT IS ORDERED staying further proceedings on the claims for irrigation use but not the *de minimis* use until the resolution of the case *In re Luebbermann*. A status conference will be set after the decision is issued in *In re Luebbermann* to set discovery deadlines.

Further discussion is held regarding WFR 113-12-023. Mr. LeBlanc indicates that he is still working on the assignment for SP001. Additionally, Statement of Claimant 39-2777 describes the tank in the wrong section and township and it appears that it was filed by someone who did not own the land at the time.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Pima County file a new statement of claimant or assignment of Statements of Claimant for WFR 113-12-023-SP001 by **February 28**, **2019.**
