Mr. Brown advises the Court that the issues in this matter are same as in last case, i.e., he is waiting on documentation from the National Archives to determine priority date.

The Court asks Mr. Brown if he has had any discussions with Ms. Mobley. Mr. Brown advises the Court that he has not. He further states that his office has been working on maps internally regarding irrigation rights. Mr. Brown will be filing Amended Statements of Claimants with the Court.

Ms. Mobley confirms with the Court that she has not taken any action regarding potential water rights she may have in this matter. The Court explains procedures to Ms. Mobley, including the need to create a map that specifically identifies the irrigated land and to obtain documentation to support claims for water rights.

Ms. Consoli advises the Court that the Nature Conservancy is close to having accurate abstracts available.

Further discussion is held.

Mr. McGinnis and Mr. Sparks provide the Court with further background information regarding this matter.

Mr. Palmer advises the Court that he would like more information from the Nature Conservancy. Remaining counsel does not voice any concerns or objections.

Ms. Consoli stated that she will be able to put a package together in next 45 days for the Objecting Parties to review.

Mr. Brown will file either a Stipulated Abstract or a Status Report with the Court by **January 10, 2022.**

Counsel has no objections to the foregoing.
