

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The United States claims that it owns land on which the relevant sources of water are 17 18 located. It has further represented that it is in contact with Arizona Department of Water 19 Resources, Cochise County, Echoing Hope Ranch, and trustees of the Kolbe Living Trust about 20 its claims.

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
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Echoing Hope and Kolbe claims (WFR 111-24-CBB-003) SOCs: 39-3796, 39-3797, 39-3799, 39-11030

7 This WFR does not appear in contested case W1-11-232. Four SOCs (containing 8 three water right claims) in this WFR appear in contested case no. W1-11-1344 but 9 should be part of the United States' W1-11-232 case. In 1995, The Nature Conservancy ("TNC") deeded lands and water rights in this WFR to both the United States Bureau of 10 Land Management and to Walter and Mayola Kolbe. Three water rights were deeded 11 solely to the United States BLM. Numerous errors by an adjacent landowner and by 12 ADWR over the years have left the ownership of these SOCs in the name of Echoing 13 Hope Ranch and Kolbe Living Trust, despite attempts to correct the issue. The United 14 15 States met with ADWR on June 22, 2022 to begin the process to correct the ownership issues. The United States has also reached out to counsel for the Kolbes and for Echoing 16 Hope Ranch. By July 29, 2022, the BLM submitted paperwork to ADWR claiming these 17 SOCs. Additionally, at the request of ADWR, on August 5, 2022, the BLM sent a letter 18 to Director Buschatzke at ADWR about the ownership issues. The letter included 19 documents that prove BLM ownership. The BLM will have to work with three sections 20 within ADWR (wells, surface water, and adjudication) to correct the issue. BLM also 21 contacted the Cochise County Assessor office to correct parcel ownership. 22

On August 4, 2022, Echoing Hope sent out three proposed abstracts in case W1-11-1344. In a letter attached to the abstracts, Echoing Hope indicated that it had filed new SOCs and "36" basis of claims with ADWR for each of the three claims. These new SOCs directly overlap SOCs filed by the BLM and conflict with BLM's claims. In its letter, Echoing Hope stated,

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The WFR [in each claim] references Statement of Claimant Nos. 39-003799, 39-003798, 39-003796 39-003797 and 39-011030 which were the subject of assignments and attempted clarification over the years. There were a number of parcel splits from the larger ranch property that was owned by McDowell Craig Manufacturing Co., named as the landowner in the WFR. There were three wells in the same 10-acre quadrant that were assigned by previous owners to successor land owners, but the well descriptions in the accompanying filings were inconsistent. Additionally, some filings were transferred twice and others not at all. Due to the confusion resulting from parcel splits and what was being assigned, new statements of claimant were drafted by Echoing Hope Ranch in an attempt to clarify its claimed water rights.

As explained below, the BLM owns the land containing the water sources claimed under SOCs 39-3799, 39-3796, and 39-3797. SOC 39-11030 seems to be a combination of the three SOCs. An error by the Kolbes, the predecessors in interest to Echoing Hope, created both an incorrect record of ownership with ADWR and incorrect locations of the PODs. BLM has taken steps to correct both.

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1. McDowell-Craig Irrigation Well (39-3799, 55-619258):

TNC largely granted the land around the McDowell-Craig Irrigation Well to the Kolbes. However, TNC excepted from the Kolbe deed two 30 by 30 foot squares that contain the McDowell-Craig Irrigation well and pump house. To the BLM, TNC granted the two 30 by 30 foot squares of land around the well and pump, and an easement to access the well and pump sites. BLM and the Kolbes had a Cooperative Agreement allowing the Kolbes to use the well. Echoing Hope Ranch is the successor to the Kolbes. In the last five years, BLM has internally worked to update the Cooperative Agreement with Echoing Hope, however the ownership issues needed to be clarified first. Ownership of the well remains with the BLM. The county assessor incorrectly listed Echoing Hope Ranch as the owner of the two 30 by 30 foot parcels as Echoing Hope Ranch. In July 2022, the BLM worked with the Cochise County Assessor to correct its land ownership records associated with the McDowell-Craig Irrigation Well (39-3799). The Cochise County Assessor's Office added parcel # 10438012F for the well site and parcel # 10438012G for the pump site, with the USA C/O Bureau of Land Management listed as the owner of the parcels. BLM will continue to work with ADWR and Echoing Hope to clarify ownership.

2. McDowell-Craig Farm Well South (39-3796, 55-619260):

The McDowell-Craig Farm Well South was granted to the United States by TNC in 1995. In 2006, the Kolbes sent a letter to ADWR stating that the Department made a clerical error in listing the BLM as the owners of the well. ADWR changed its record of ownership to Kolbes' name. The Kolbes also transferred the location of the well with ADWR. BLM believes the Kolbes' mistook McDowell-Craig Farm Well South for the McDowell-Craig Irrigation Well or the domestic well (39-3798, 55-619259) that was located near/within their parcel. In 2012, Kolbe transferred ownership of the well to Echoing Hope Ranch. The BLM has submitted paperwork and title documents to ADWR to reinstate the BLM as owner of the well and to correct the location back to its original coordinates.

On August 5, 2022, the BLM sent a separate letter to ADWR on the McDowellCraig Farm Well to clarify the issues on the ownership and location of the well.
ADWR's July 1, 2022 Report incorrectly placed this well at the NWSESE quadrant based
on the incorrect cadastral that was submitted by Kolbe in 2006. The well is located in the NWSWSE.

3. McDowell-Craig Spring (39-3797):

ADWR currently lists the Kolbes as the owners of the McDowell-Craig Spring. However, in May 2022 BLM field crews verified the location of the spring in the NENW of Section 22, which is land owned by the BLM. The BLM filed a public records request with ADWR to locate the patent mentioned in the SOC for the spring with a priority date

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of 2-22-1916. The BLM intends to file a claim, once more information is known about the patent.

4. <u>39-11030</u>:

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
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
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This SOC seems to include the McDowell-Craig Farm Well South (39-3796, 55-619260), the McDowell-Craig Irrigation Well (39-3799, 55-619258), the Mc Dowell-Craig Spring (39-3797), and a domestic well (39-3798, 55-619259). BLM is claiming 39-3796, 39-3798, and 39-3799. (See Schedule A in the original SOC filing). Domestic well 39-3799 belongs to the Kolbe Living Trust. The United States met with the Kolbe Living Trust to discuss the domestic well. The Trust is claiming only the domestic well. The United States, the Trust, and Echoing Hope will be meeting this week to continue to discuss these claims.
