A record of the proceedings is made digitally in lieu of a court reporter.

The Court inquires whether the latest list of claims that the Court has received is the finalized list.

Mr. Gehlert states that yes, the list is final with the exception of claim 39-14506, which is duplicative and does not need to be included.

The Court states its intent to dismiss any other claims that are not included in the list. The Court inquires whether abstracts have been submitted for all claims. There were three abstracts submitted by ADWR that were missing some information.

Mr. Gehlert states that they will proceed with two of the new abstracts that ADWR has provided as they believe the breached stock ponds can still hold significant water. They are unsure if they will proceed with the third claim, the stock pond that is currently empty.

The Court inquires as to next steps and a timeline for adjudicating the in-stream flow claims.

Mr. Gehlert clarifies that claim 39-13611 is already certificated and is ripe for adjudication, whereas the other in-stream flow claims will need more administrative process.

The Court inquires if any of the parties are amenable to settlement.

Mr. Gehlert states that five claims were identified as amenable to settlement, three of which were in-stream flow uses. One of those three was the aforementioned duplicate that has been dropped, leaving two non-*de minimis* claims that are ready to move forward, the 13999 fish pond claim and the certificated claim.

The Court inquires if more time is needed for settlement discussions or if those two claims are ripe for adjudication.

Mr. Gehlert states that the certificated claim should be decreed but is unsure of the fish pond claim.

Mr. Crestin suggests that settlement may be made possible if the US were to provide proposed abstracts.

Mr. Gehlert is amendable to providing abstracts if a list of objectors is provided.

The Court will distribute an updated list of objectors. The Court inquires if all filings have been updated.

Mr. Gehlert states that all paperwork has been submitted, including names and address changes.

The Court inquires if there are roadblocks for the in-stream flow claims, 49-14-482 and 49-14-485.

Ms. Nielsen states that in-stream flow claims will need to be re-noticed. There are several in-stream flow applications that have been pending for some time. A new hydrologist has been hired to work through those. They are working with the Bureau of Land Management on those claims. Re-noticing could be an issue because there could be new objections.

The Court inquires of the timeline for re-noticing.

Ms. Nielsen replies that they may about six months.

The Court states that adjudication will move forward on claims that are ripe for adjudication and any claims that need to be re-noticed will wait. The Court inquires whether the US can produce any abstracts that are still needed.

Mr. Gehlert affirms that the US will do so.

The Court will finalize a list of needed abstracts and will send this list to the US. The Court will distribute the abstracts that have already been received. Any comments that have been received will be included. The Court will also distribute an updated list of objectors. The US will file any missing abstracts. The Court will set a deadline to provide any comments and will thereafter set a status conference to discuss the comments.

Mr. Gehlert notes that the US is largely in accord with the comments already made by SRP. Specifically, PWR 112-17-063 SW001 and SW002 were given a priority date by ADWR based on an NOA that they believe is not applicable to those claims, therefore, the priority date is invalid.

Mr. Sparks addresses a technical issue with the meeting link.

The Court will look into the issue.

Attached as Attachment B are corrected versions of the 17 draft abstracts that Special Master Harris issued in her October 11, 2021, Order that the US has indicated an intent to pursue. The corrected draft abstracts incorporate, where appropriate, comments received in January 2023.

For proposed water rights where the current place of use described on the draft abstract does not match the WFR and basis of right documentation, the supporting documents will need to be updated to reflect the current use. Whether these types of actions will be completed by the Court or through the ADWR administrative processes is

an issue currently before Judge Blaney. An order on how the US should proceed with the following abstracts will be provided once Judge Blaney issues his ruling:


