Mr. Burnside states that BHP Copper has filed their notice for withdrawal of objections and will no longer be participating on the joint pre-trial statement.

Discussion is held regarding the status of the case.

Mr. Cooper informs the Court that the Town of Mammoth has submitted the joint pretrial statement. They received proposed settlement documents from San Carlos Apache Tribe and have circulated it to the other parties. Mr. Cooper believes they will have a stipulated order for the Court's consideration within 30 days.

Mr. McGinnis agrees with the proposed settlement and preserves their right to participate in the trial if necessary.

Mr. Cahoy agrees with Mr. McGinnis and goes along with the settlement as they last saw it proposed.

Mr. Cooper states that the agreement was tendered subject to the approval of the San Carlos Apache Tribe's governing body. Mr. Cooper will update his Town Council next Thursday and seek its authority to sign the settlement documents.

Mr. Sparks confirms that this matter is scheduled to be heard by his client on June 7, 2022 at the regular constitutional meeting.
