**DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY**: Order clarifying the Special Master's March 25, 2024, Report with respect to the investigation of the Yavapai-Apache Nation's claims.

On April 15, 2024, the Yavapai-Apache Nation ("Nation") filed a Motion for Clarification of the Report of the Special Master on Amendments to the Watershed Boundary Map and Sequencing for Future Hydrographic Survey Report Development ("Motion"). The Motion requested clarification as to the Special Master's March 25, 2024, Report regarding what Hydrographic Survey Report ("HSR") should include the

 Nation's water claims, and those of the United States on the Nation's behalf.

To clarify Conclusion of Law #16: The Special Master proposes that the two southernmost ten-digit hydrologic units of the Verde Canyon subwatershed be included in a proposed Salt River Valley HSR. March 25, 2024, Report at 32. The Special Master also proposes that the remaining ten-digit units of the Verde Canyon subwatershed be investigated along with the entire Lower Verde Valley subwatershed in a "Lower Verde Valley HSR." *Id.* The Special Master proposes a deadline for that proposed HSR of September 30, 2028. *Id.* To clarify Conclusion of Law #17: The Special Master recommends that the Yavapai-Apache Nation's and the Tonto Apache Tribe's water claims, and those of the United States on behalf of the Nation and the Tribe, should be adjudicated along with all state law claims in the above-mentioned Lower Verde Valley HSR. Further, all claims by the United States with respect to "Wild and Scenic River" reservations within the boundaries of the proposed Lower Verde Valley HSR are recommended to be included in that HSR.

It is recognized that the Report referenced only the "Verde Canyon" HSR; however, in the event that the Verde Canyon and Lower Verde Valley subwatersheds are investigated in separate HSRs, the Yavapai-Apache Nations's claims should be included in a comprehensive Lower Verde Valley HSR and those of the Tonto-Apache Tribe in a comprehensive Verde Canyon HSR.
