**Testimony by Karen I. Ward, Equip for Equality
Before the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability
Proposed Closure of the Jack Mabley Developmental Center
Dixon, Illinois
October 17, 2011**

Equip for Equality, the independent, not-for-profit organization designated by the Governor in 1985 to administer the federally mandated Protection and Advocacy system for people with disabilities in Illinois, appreciates the opportunity to testify before the Commission in support of the proposed closure of Jack Mabley Developmental Center (Mabley DC). Equip for Equality's mission is to advance the civil and human rights of people with disabilities, which is accomplished through self-advocacy training and technical assistance, legal services, public policy initiatives, and investigations of abuse and neglect in all settings that serve people with disabilities.

Equip for Equality fully supports the closure of state institutions such as Mabley DC in order to allow people with disabilities to live and thrive in the community. Although the impetus for the proposed closure is budgetary, we believe that the current fiscal crisis presents an opportunity to do the right thing. For years the state has spent too much money to deliver too little to its citizens with developmental disabilities. We are actively working with the governor and state agencies in order to develop a comprehensive, well-thought out plan for transition of the individuals living at Mabley DC to appropriate settings equipped to meet their needs. With appropriate supports and services, including services to address sensory needs and ensure communication access, all individuals with disabilities, including those with the most significant disabilities, can live in the community.

To be done safely and effectively, the closure of state operated institutions and the transition of individuals to the community must be carefully designed and implemented. We know this can be done and done well. Fourteen states, including Michigan, have closed all of their state-operated institutions for people with developmental disabilities and are successfully serving those individuals in the community.

The current fiscal crisis makes clear that Illinois cannot afford the high cost of continuing to do the wrong thing. Serving individuals with developmental disabilities in community settings has been proven to be more cost effective than providing services in an institution. On average it is three times more expensive to serve an individual in a state-operated developmental center as it is to serve an individual in a Community Integrated Living Arrangement, or CILA.

Perpetuating this practice is not only fiscally unsound; it is contrary to the state's expressed commitment to rebalance our long term care system. Closure of Mabley DC will give many of its residents the opportunity to live safer, healthier and fuller lives in the community. The closure of Mabley DC will also allow Illinois to move one step closer to fulfilling the integration mandate of the Americans with Disabilities Act to provide services in the most integrated setting possible to meet an individual's needs and comply with the Supreme Court's *Olmstead* decision that

unnecessary segregation and institutionalization of individuals with disabilities constitutes discrimination under the ADA. The legal consensus that people have a fundamental right to live in the most integrated environment that meets their needs is consistent with data showing that individuals with developmental disabilities are successful in community settings. It is also consistent with the consent decree in the *Ligas v. Hamos* case in which the state has fully embraced the concept of services in the community for those currently residing in ICFDDs.

The issue before this body--whether to concur with the proposed closure of Mabley DC-- must be evaluated by focusing first on the needs and desires of the individuals with developmental disabilities residing there; the impact on jobs or local economies cannot be the primary factors driving this decision. Studies on outcomes of deinstitutionalization of people with developmental disabilities have concluded that most people who have moved from institutions into community environments have made significant gains in adaptive behaviors and have decreased more challenging behaviors. Longitudinal studies based upon parent surveys in states that have closed institutions, such as Wisconsin, Minnesota and Pennsylvania, also substantiate that a large percentage of parents who were initially opposed to closure became satisfied with community living and believed their family members to be happier in the community.

Equip for Equality recognizes that transitioning individuals out of Mabley DC and into the community presents challenges, especially given the time frame proposed. However, we believe that it can be done successfully if the transition plan includes the following strategic measures:

First, there must be enhanced on-site monitoring during the closure process to ensure the safety of individuals residing in the facility.

Second, there must be independent oversight of the transition planning and implementation to ensure that the full array of options is available and that an individual's choice is respected and informed decisions can be made.

Third, there must be an extensive effort to educate people with disabilities and their guardians and families regarding the options for community living.

Fourth, there must be adequate resources available for follow-up and ongoing support services to ensure success in the community.

Finally, and certainly not least, the transition process must be adequately funded to ensure both a successful transition and continued success in the community, and, as required by the Community Services Act, the savings realized as a result of the closure of Mabley DC must be reinvested in the community to provide ongoing services and supports.

Equip for Equality is currently working with the state and other organizations to plan for a successful transition. We will continue to work with the state to ensure that individuals currently residing at Mabley DC are provided with high quality choices that can meet each person's unique preferences and needs so they can enjoy a stable, safe and fulfilling life in the most integrated setting.

Good evening Commissions members.

I'm appearing before you as the co-founder of the Community for All Coalition with my late husband, Lester. I am also a member of the State-wide Independent Living Council and the Illinois Council on Developmental Disabilities.

The Illinois economy is in crisis. The state's revenues are plummeting and the state currently owes billions of dollars in unpaid bills for services rendered many months ago.

Clearly our state needs to operate its services as efficiently as possible. Only programs that benefit the greatest number of people in the best ways at the lowest possible per capita cost deserve to be funded. Those programs that do not provide high quality services in an efficient manner should be redesigned.

Currently, it is estimated that the state of Illinois is spending \$181,700 per person per year in State Operated Developmental Centers. With this kind of money, surely the state can provide better alternatives than those at Mabley Developmental Center. And it should do so. The funds that are currently being spent on Mabley could be more effectively used to enable these individuals to live in the community of their choice with supports which are designed to meet their individual needs, wants and desires.

Fourteen (14) other states have closed all of their State Operated Developmental Centers. Michigan, for example, closed its last institution about a year ago. Now it serves many more people in the community at a much lower cost than Illinois currently does. I refer to Michigan because it is a state with similar economic woes and it is of a similar size and makeup to Illinois. Additionally, it is also a heavily unionized state as is our state. Illinois ranks 51st compared to other states, including Washington D.C., in terms of the number of people supported in community settings rather than institutions. On average, quality community-based living can be provided for less than half of the cost of institutionalization.

Some who oppose the closure of this institution may be afraid of the future. This is a normal response. Other families who have transitioned their family members to the community with individualized supports have found that their family members thrive in their new surroundings. This can be seen in the article

"Mother, Daughter Find New Life After Howe" published earlier this year in the Southtown Star.

We can use Illinois' current economic situation to do the right thing and assist families and individuals with a respectful, careful, and considerate transition into the community. There must be the individualized supports in place for each person to live a fulfilling and happy life.

We urge that the Commission members recommend the closure of Mabley Developmental Center.

IT IS NOT ABOUT MABLEY

Good evening. My name is Matt Toohey and I am the Executive Director of Access Services of Northern Illinois which is the independent service coordination agency for persons with intellectual disabilities in NW Illinois. Our agency has assisted in the closure of the developmental disability units that were once at Singer Mental Health Center and assisted in moving individuals from the Mabley Developmental Center to smaller community settings.

It is not about Mabley Developmental Center. The uproar about the announced closure of state facilities is about well-paying jobs and the impact of a closure on those communities. It is about maintaining a state run institutional system that outlived its effectiveness years ago. It is about the continued guarantee that a relatively few individuals are entitled to services that cost over twice what similar individuals have in community settings. It is about the continued myth that people with disabilities, especially those with intellectual disabilities, are our most vulnerable citizens and need to be protected.

If the Governor had announced that Fox Developmental Center in Dwight would be closed the same catch phrases or predictions of doom would be uttered by that community and the employees affected by such an action.

All people are vulnerable at some time. Are we to "protect" all from possible harm and risk?

When I hear that only state institutions can provide for people with significant challenges in a safe setting I cringe when I recall the people who died at Howe Developmental Center because of an abusive and neglectful environment staffed by well-paid state employees.

When I hear that only Mabley Center can serve individuals who have visual and/or hearing impairments I wonder why it is not mentioned that Kreider Services also successfully serves such individuals.

There are numerous people who have left state institutions and are successfully living and participating in a community at far less cost than those who remain is

those institutions. There are thousands of people successfully living in community settings who never lived in an institution.

Why have 14 other states successfully closed all or many of their institutions while a minority or people in Illinois claim that such attempts here have resulted in nightmare after nightmare? Could it be that those states valued people by adequately funding community services? Could it be that there was the political will to do right by people by adequately supporting them in the community instead of housing them out of the public eye?

What it is about is treating people as we would want to be treated. The only places where people are housed or live with more than 10 people in one building are state or private institutions, nursing homes, hospitals, prisons or jail, college dorms, or military housing for the enlisted. With the exception of prisons, nursing homes and state or private institutions such housing is meant to be temporary not one's home.

Many of the approximately 2,100 people in state institutions in Illinois have family members who believe that that institution should be their home. They believe that it is their entitlement.

The conversation that should be had is when will we support people with intellectual disabilities in natural settings with the individualized supports they need to succeed? When will the conversation not be about a particular facility but about valuing people with intellectual disabilities as members of our communities?

When we end the conversation about the place and start the conversation about people and their value to our communities only then can we end the discordant uproar of "institution good"
, "community bad".

I urge the Governor, the Department of Human Services and the General Assembly to focus on people and what is needed to support them rather than cost savings, job loss, and guarantees of life long placement. Had this been done ten years ago our precious fiscal resources would certainly have been better spent with better outcomes.

Thank you members of the Commission for this opportunity to comment on the closure of the Mabley Developmental Center. The Illinois Council on Developmental Disabilities supports the planned closure of the Center.

The closure represents an opportunity to:

provide the supports necessary for individuals currently residing at Mabley to live full lives in their communities;

re-balance the current service system for people with developmental disabilities; and

reinvest scarce public funds to further improve and expand community-based services.

The question is, "What is the right way to provide services for people with disabilities today?" The answer is different today than it was back when Mabley was built. Our service delivery industry has changed, just as many other industries change and improve over time.

The Council believes that all people with developmental disabilities can live in the community when they have the appropriate supports. Research shows that with the right supports, individuals, including those with the most severe needs, can live successfully and even thrive in the community. It is imperative that as we plan for this transition, resources are re-allocated and funding appropriated to provide these supports so that the State doesn't fail those transitioning.

As we prepare for the closure, we cannot forget the most important people involved. The focus needs to be on the safe, person-centered transition of each individual who currently resides at Mabley. It may take some individuals multiple visits to community homes before they feel comfortable making a decision about their future. They need to be supported in a positive manner by all involved in the decision making process. It is of the utmost importance that each decision is made slowly and carefully to result in the best outcome for each individual.

A first step to achieving success is to engage in the discussion of making long-term systemic change. We realize this is a daunting task, but one that can't wait. The Council's Blueprint for System Redesign in Illinois which was released in 2008 provided a framework for the re-balancing process. It provided long term solutions for the inequities in the system, which has plagued us for years. The Council will be updating the Blueprint over the next few months to revisit the findings and refresh the action steps. We will share the final report with each of you. We look forward to using the data and information as a way to continue to strengthen the system even in these difficult economic times.

We urge the State to do whatever necessary to assure that the transition is planned and thoughtful, leveraging the necessary resources to make it successful. The residents of Mabley Developmental Center deserve the State's full support, as well as cooperation from the general public, state and local officials, community service providers, and anyone involved in this process. Dear Senator Schoenberg and Representative Bellock:

High-needs individuals with developmental disabilities are and will continue to be expensive to serve. This is true whether they are to be served in State Operated Developmental Centers (SODCs) or in community settings.

Some community advocates claim that people can be served in the community for "on average \$55,000" per year. It is certainly not true that high-needs individuals with severe medical and/or behavioral challenges, like those currently served in the SODCs, can be appropriately, adequately and safely served in the community for \$55,000 or for significantly less than in the SODCs.

In the attached document, an actual high-needs SODC resident, BRB, is evaluated for CILA services and rates with the assistance of one of the largest and most reputable community providers in the state.

In scenario #1, Provider is realistically evaluating BRB for services and rates for which BRB would likely qualify in a one-person CILA. A one-person CILA was chosen due to BRB's extreme behaviors and low ICAP score. The estimate is \$183,016 at current wage rates, or \$192,592 with a modest \$1 per hour raise for low-wage direct care staff. Even in this expensive "best case scenario," guardians, as well as many professionals in the field, would judge these services to be inadequate and dangerous. These concerns are footnoted in the attached document and include: isolation, periods of time with unsafe staffing levels (e.g., 1:1 with no back-up staff), inability of community to use mechanical restraints, likely use of emergency "911" to summon police due to lack of immediately available professional help, behavior intervention and psychotropic medication administration by low-wage staff, and greatly reduced professional support (compared to SODCs).

In scenario #2, Provider is again realistically assessing what BRB would likely be provided in a four-person CILA with the assumption that BRB has improved during scenario #1. That cost is \$146,701 at current wage rates, or \$153,550 with \$1 per hour raise. Guardians and other professionals would have the same concerns as in scenario #1. Additionally, the assumption that BRB would improve in scenario #1 (rather than deteriorate or place other house mates at risk, which is much more likely) is not realistic because BRB depends on a high level of structure and his behavior deteriorates with less.


In scenario #3, we have evaluated BRB's needs and attempted to provide professional and staffing supports minimally comparable to SODC services. The cost for scenario #3 exceeds \$270,000. Even at that cost, some of the same concerns persist, namely, isolation, lack of structure, and high risk of "911" police intervention due to diminished availability of sufficient professional staff trained to intervene, and inability of community service providers to employ mechanical restraints.

While very challenging, BRB is not the most challenging and cannot be dismissed as a uniquely expensive case. He does not present severe medical conditions, seizure activity, sexual aggression, fire-starting, or PICA (his PICA behavior has been extinguished at the SODC) as do some SODC residents.

While this document emphasizes cost issues, there are programmatic, human, and even legal issues which are at least as important as the issue of cost and must be weighed in deciding whether or not to close SODCs. Closures will both disrupt and risk the lives of the most fragile people with developmental disabilities, those who are served in SODCs. As their families and guardians, we implore you to seriously weigh these consequences.

Can The Community Provide HIGH NEEDS INDIVIDUALS Essential Services Comparable to SODC Services At Significantly Reduced Cost: BRB Case Study

High-Needs SODC Individuals:

Following years of State Operated Developmental Center (SODC) downsizing, and discharge of less difficult residents, the high-needs individuals who remain, as well as increasingly challenging new admissions, require a high level of support. If community services provided for these individuals are to be even relatively comparable to those provided in the SODCs, they will necessarily be expensive. BRB's needs are presented here as a *sample* to provide a comparison of SODC and community services and a cost analysis of providing BRB, or other high-needs individuals (some with extreme behavioral or medical challenges), services in the community.

BRB Profile:

- BRB is 41 years old, 6' tall, 190 lbs, and healthy.
- He is brain injured with borderline intellectual functioning.
- He has a diagnosis of pervasive developmental disorder. He is being treated for: obsessive/compulsive behaviors (currently monitored to prevent obsessive consumption of inordinately large amounts of fluids, including water from shower and toilet-interruption of O/C behaviors can bring about violent responses); unpredictable explosive (possibly neurologically triggered) physical aggression toward peers and staff; and destruction of property, particularly window breaking. He has a history (completely extinguished in SODC) of life-threatening PICA (swallowing inedible objects) which required three surgeries to remove pens/pencils.
- He has been expelled from numerous private settings (including highly regarded St. Coletta's and Oconomowoc Developmental Centers in Wisconsin). Discharge from private settings was always to home. His last private setting, 21 years ago, (secured through lawsuit settlement with state of GA) was Healthcare Rehabilitation Center, Austin, Texas, a brain-injury facility, at cost to GA of \$250,000 per year from 1987-90.
- Current resident of Choate Developmental Center since 1990.

Current treatment at Choate Developmental Center (representative of services available at all SODCs):

Staffing

-BRB has a private room to minimize agitation, to allow staff to monitor behaviors, and to protect BRB and peers. Staff levels are 1:1 for 3 shifts daily, occasionally elevated to 2:1 off-unit, always at 2:1 off-campus. His limited off-campus trips (occasional brief trips to Wal-Mart, McDonald's, doctor visits) are always staffed 2:1. Additional staff are always available on the living unit and work site.

Medication Administration

BRB is administered medications, including four psychotropics, by an RN three times daily with regular on-campus blood level testing.

Behavior Intervention

The Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) provides for structure and support to prevent explosive violent episodes, aggression toward peers and staff, property destruction, excessive intake of fluids, excessive smoking, perseverative tape recording of music, excessive use of caffeine. Situations requiring use of restraints (including statutorily mandated professional supervision of mechanical restraints¹) and methodology are outlined in BIP. Self-imposed early intervention strategies (e.g., voluntary use of sleeping bag "cocoon" to address stressful situations) are taught and encouraged. Staffing for behavior intervention includes daily interaction with Public Service Administrator (unit director), Residential Services Supervisor, Habilitation Plan Coordinator (HPC, formerly QSP/QMRP), Behavior Analyst, Social Worker, Nurse, Vocational Instructor, and Technicians. Available daily for communication/intervention, Psychologist, MD, Psychiatrist.

Day Program

BRB engages in on-campus work (recycling) 4-4.5 hours daily with 1:1 staffing, 2:1 when necessary. BRB has the option to return to his room during work hours, if he believes he is "not together," to prevent violent outbursts.

Religious, Social, Recreational

On-campus opportunities include church services, recreational activities, exercise. He has regular home visits.

¹ 405 ILCS 5/2-108. *Use of restraint*. Most private providers have policy against use of mechanical restraints and would find it difficult to comply with the statutorily mandated professional oversight requirements.

The Community Alternative (scenarios #1 and #2 provided by Community Provider, Scenario #3 and footnotes by IL-ADD)

NOTE: The individual (BRB) used to base the estimates in scenarios 1 and 2 is described as a person exhibiting highly challenging behavior and who would be very difficult to serve in a community setting.

Scenario #1:

BRB is being served in a one person CILA² setting with additional support staff for significant portions of the day, i.e., during his day program. **Assumption:** BRB has an ICAP score of 18 which reflects a composite of behavioral challenges of an actual person as he would likely be scored in the community.

Staffing

Scenario #1 reflects a staffing ratio that is mostly 1:1, including overnight staff.³ The staff add-on does reflect some natural overlapping of staff during day training as well as a period of 2:1 on the week-end when BRB may be in the community.

Medication Administration

Scenario # 1 assumes that BRB would take between 5 and 9 medications at each of the 3 medication pass times each day. The CILA direct contact staff are trained to administer all oral medications. The rate does not reimburse for additional staff time to administer medication. The amount reflected is an estimate of the amount that would be reimbursed for RN oversight of medication administration.⁴

Behavior Intervention

The premise is that BRB would need 4 hours of behavior intervention a week for the first 60 days after transitioning to the CILA and 2 hours a week thereafter for a total of 120 hours of behavior intervention a year.

Additional QMRP & Supervisor Support

The base CILA rate allows for 2.5 hours a week each for QMRP and Supervisor support. The amount shown reflects an additional 2.5 hours a week for both QMRP and Supervisor.

Day Program

BRB has been provided with 1:1 supports for day services.

Estimated Costs to BRB in this setting are as follows:

²The 1-person CILA setting would be extremely isolating, confining, and unstructured, conditions that would exacerbate BRB's maladaptive behaviors.

³This staffing model is typical for a 1-person CILA. However, 1:1 staffing, without backup staff, would be inadequate and dangerous for some individuals, including BRB. In this scenario, BRB would be at significant risk of police intervention (staff calling 911) due to the inability of a single staff to physically manage his violent outbursts. Additionally, most community providers will not permit administration of mechanical restraints, an essential component of BRB's behavior intervention program. Police response to 911 could come too late to prevent injury to BRB/staff/public. Police response to violence could potentially include tasing, shooting, or criminal charges and jail.

⁴BRB requires, among other medications, four psychotropics, some with illicit street value. Some medications counter the effects of other medications and accountability for proper administration is essential. SODC medications are administered by an RN. In this CILA, responsibility for proper administration would be placed with a low-wage direct care staff.

⁵If provider were reimbursed \$9576 for \$1 hr DSP wage increase, would cost provider \$10,400 to pass on.

Scenario #2:

BRB is being served in a 4- person CILA setting with additional support staff for large portions of the day, including at his day program. **Assumption # 1:** BRB has progressed⁶ so that he can now be served in a 4-person CILA with attendant reduction in the CILA rate from Scenario #1 in Behavior Intervention and Staff Add-on.

Assumption # 2: BRB has an ICAP score of 18 and his house mates have ICAP scores of 33,46, and 50.

Staffing

Scenario # 2 reflects a staffing ratio that is mostly 1:1, including overnight staff.⁷ The staff add-on does reflect some natural overlapping of staff during day training as well as a period of 2:1 on the week-end when BRB may be in the community. There would be a higher staffing ratio overall for the house as there would be 3 other men living in the home.

Medication Administration

Scenario # 2 assumes that BRB would take between 5 and 9 medications at each of the 3 medication pass times each day. The CILA direct contact staff are trained to administer all oral medications. The rate does not reimburse for additional staff time to administer medication. The amount reflected is an estimate of the amount that would be reimbursed for RN oversight of medication administration.⁸

Behavior Intervention

Behavior Intervention would not include 2 additional hours during the first 60 days of transition as in scenario #1, but would continue with 2 hours a week for a total of 102 hours of behavior intervention a year.

Additional QMRP & Supervisor Support

The base CILA rate support 2.5 hours a week each. The amount shown reflects an additional 2.5 hours a week for both QMRP and Supervisor.

Day Program

BRB has been provided with 1:1 supports for day services

⁶The lack of structure in scenario #1 would make it more likely that BRB would decline behaviorally, rather than progress.

⁷When BRB would be with one staff only, without back-up staff, he would be at significant risk of police intervention (staff calling 911) due to the inability of a single staff to physically manage his violent outbursts. Additionally, most community providers will not permit administration of mechanical restraints, an essential component of BRB's behavior intervention program. Police response to 911 could come too late to prevent injury to BRB/staff/public. Police response to violence could potentially include tasing, shooting, or criminal charges and jail.

⁸BRB requires, among other medications, four psychotropics, some with illicit street value. Some medications counter the effects of other medications and accountability for proper administration is essential. SODC medications are administered by an RN. In this CILA, responsibility for proper administration would be placed with a low wage direct care staff.

⁹Provider has identified cost for hypothetical difficult to serve individual, JYJ, who is less challenging than BRB, with ICAP score of 45 in 4-Person CILA who has house mates with ICAP scores of 46, 50 and 69 with total cost of \$90, 934 or \$94,822 with DSP wage increase of \$1 hr.

Scenario #3

BRB is being served in a four person CILA setting. This setting is chosen so that BRB has 1:1 staffing at all times with back up staff available at all times, and 2:1 off-campus.

Staffing

Scenario 3 reflects a staffing ratio that is 1:1 or 2:1 supervision (one staff during night shift with back up staff available, two staff during day shift on week days, two staff during ½ day shift on week-ends when B.R.B. would be "off-campus"/in community, one staff during swing shift with back up staff available).

32 extra staff hours per week day x 5 days = 160 hrs per week

28 extra staff hours per week-end day x 2 days = 56 hrs. per week

216 hrs week x 52 weeks = 11232 hours per year @ \$12.86 144,443.52

Medication Administration

Nursing resources (beyond basic included in CILA rate) to administer regimen of mutually dependant medications (some with illicit street value).

No doubt you have gotten and will continue to get many such letters on this topic. I spent my first career within the Department of Human Services (and its predecessor agency DMHDD), and did work on facility closures during that career, among other tasks. Two hallmarks of each of the seven closures within which I had some role was that state government closed facilities which had outlived their usefulness due to age and technology **AND** in every case the state budgeted and allocated monies to subsequent treatment settings which provided equal or better care to the individuals who were displaced, or for whom services were no longer available. As a concerned citizen of Illinois I do not see any assurance built into the proposed closures which guarantees that services the state is both legally and morally obligated to provide, will be provided.

While the state's budget situation is dire it is also, in my view, the state's mandate to assure that people with disabilities have access to affordable services when such needs arise whether those needs are for prolonged residential care, short-term inpatient care, or other services that may be required. In the absence of state facility beds, and with CHIPs contracts which are no longer in place for community hospitals, I fear that city lockups and county jails will become the default mental health and developmental centers. I would ask that state officials who are making these determinations consider better alternatives than local area correctional settings for non-criminal behavioral health care when such services are needed.

I am Bob Logan, president of AFSCME Local 1268, Kreider-Services Employees Union, and I appreciate the opportunity to speak before you today concerning this very important issue and to urge continued support for maintaining the Mabley Center and its program of services to the developmentally disabled. Each member of Local 1268 is committed to advocating for those who would, but cannot advocate for themselves, namely the persons served by Kreider Services and the Mabley Center.

I have worked at Kreider-Services for seven years providing administrative and hands-on support to developmentally disabled members of our community, including a number who reside at Mabley Center. I currently work in a group home residential setting where one of our residents, James, maintains a job in the Recycling Program at Mabley.

Mabley effectively provides a broad range of necessary services to the developmentally disabled of northern Illinois, especially services to the very needy behavioral clients who cannot be serviced effectively in community living situations.

James was unable to adapt to a community living setting near his home and when his father became ill, was given emergency placement at Mabley. Mabley provided the necessary services to prepare James for transition to community living at Kreider Services and both he and his father are grateful for Mabley Center today.

During the time I have worked at Kreider-Services, we have worked hand in hand to meet the needs of more than 400 clients at any given time. I have observed many attempts to integrate clients from the Mabley Center into the community living arrangements maintained by Kreider Services.

I have witnessed a number of very successful transfers. I have also observed attempts to transfer clients to the community living setting in which we were unable to meet the needs of those selected for transfer, and after trial periods, these clients were necessarily returned to the specialized care services of the Mabley Center.

I have observed the health decline and increased behavioral actions of a number of transferred developmentally disabled clients as they moved from a secure and established setting to one of unfamiliarity. Many are fragile emotionally and are unable to adjust before declining health severely erodes their quality of life and at times has resulted in their death.

It is not a flattering measure of the priorities of our society that we are willing to consider sacrificing the welfare of our most vulnerable in times of financial hardship, while untold billions of dollars are squandered to support the devices of the more able, the rich and the famous.

Re: Governor Quinn's proposed closure of Jack Mabley Developmental Center

On September 8th, 2011 Governor Quinn announced a plan to close seven state facilities, including Mabley Center in Dixon, Illinois. The plan was announced by the Governor as an emergency cost cutting measure.

As responsible advocates for people with developmental disabilities, we are opposed to the Governor's plan for many reasons.

Community Vs. State - A False Dichotomy

The closure of Mabley Center was originally announced by Governor Quinn as a cost-cutting measure. As is far too often the case in modern politics, that announcement has devolved into an artificial "Us Vs. Them" argument in the media, with the suggestion that there are two diametrically opposed sides: Community Vs. State

We believe this complex issue - and particularly the lives of the disabled people served by Mabley Center - are far too important to be treated in that way.

Far from being opposed to providing community placement for the people we serve, preparation for community placement is the central mission for the program and staff at Mabley Center.

Over the past decade the team at Mabley Center has moved 67 people to community placement. Over the same time frame Mabley had 76 admissions, indicating that the Center has a placement rate at about 88% of it's intake rate. With an 84% community placement success rate the Center has demonstrated a strong understanding of the supports needed for the people they serve to excel in the community. Mabley Center is actively involved in helping people to prepare for and find community placement.

In addition to providing direct services for people at the Center, Mabley has a long tradition of offering community outreach services for the purpose of keeping people in their community homes. Mabley hosts the monthly Clinical and Administrative Review Team (CART) meeting for the Northwest Network. CART is a group of professionals from Mabley Center and regional community providers that gathers to offer consultative assistance to people who are struggling with behavioral and psychiatric concerns while still living in their homes.

In addition, Mabley Center has offered direct Technical Assistance - teams of professionals sent out to provide assistance on-site - to scores of people living in the community over the past 20 years. That assistance has covered a variety of needs, including behavioral treatment, training in crisis management, and training for working with people who are blind and deaf.

More recently Mabley Center has begun working directly with the [Support Services Teams](#)¹ to provide short-term stabilization of people with intensive behavioral needs. This is a new joint community team process intended to help people in crisis stay in their homes if possible and, if not, to stabilize and return them to community as quickly as possible. In the brief period of time that the SST's have been up and running Mabley has taken in two people for short term assistance. One of those people has already been placed back in the community, and a home has been identified for the other.

Safety Net

Like all developmental programs, Mabley Center serves people with developmental disabilities. However, Mabley Center specializes in serving two distinct and unique groups of people with disabilities:

- People with profound vision and/or hearing impairments (people who are blind, deaf, or both); and
- People with mental health and behavioral challenges so severe they present an ongoing risk of harm to themselves and/or others.

Mabley Center serve these two specialized groups of people, in its role as safety net for the community. When a person presents with these disabilities to the degree that a community provider cannot serve them Mabley Center's role is to offer them a safe place to go.

Sensory Impairments

Some people who have intellectual disabilities are also challenged by an inability to see, to hear, or both. Sometimes this is due to disease such as cataracts, sometimes it is self-induced - caused by accident or by self-injury. Often times the inability to hear or see is present at birth, a part of the same disorder that causes the intellectual disability. In all of these cases the challenge of learning to cope with daily life is further complicated by the fact that the person cannot see or hear the people trying to teach her.

Mabley Center is specifically designed to serve the needs of people with intellectual disabilities who are deaf and blind. The walkways have trailing fences designed to allow the blind to find their way independently from place to place on the campus. All of the homes have trailing rails down the hallways to serve the same purpose indoors. Signs are printed in Braille to ensure people can find what they are looking for on their own.

The staff at the Mabley Center are trained in sign language through the [Helen Keller National Center for Deaf-Blind Youth and Adults](#)². In addition, for those who are both deaf and blind, Mabley Center staff are trained in a very specialized technique known as contact sign, which involves making signs in the person's hands. This technique makes communication possible for people who would otherwise be isolated in a dark, lonely world by themselves. Mabley Center is the only state operated center in Illinois that offers these specialized techniques as a comprehensive service.

With the use of these techniques the staff at Mabley Center are able to help the people living there to grow towards independence. They learn to care for themselves, to work and earn money, and gain relationships with others that would not have otherwise been possible. And, with careful long-term planning, significant supports and resources, and a strong collaborative relationship with community providers such as [Kreider Services](#)³, some of those same folks have been able to successfully move into community settings.

Severe Behavioral Challenges

For people with severe psychiatric and behavioral disorders in addition to intellectual disabilities the world is often an unfriendly place. People with these disorders may engage in severe physical aggression towards others - including family, friends, and staff. They may hurt themselves, hitting, biting, and cutting themselves. They sometimes cause significant damage to property - both their own and that of others. They may run away, often without regard to the weather, the time of day, or their own personal safety. It is often difficult or impossible for the person to explain why they are doing these things and very difficult for others to understand as well. Such behaviors can make it impossible for the person to safely remain in their family home or their community group home.

People are not admitted to Mabley Center simply because they are having behavioral difficulties. As a general rule, a person is admitted to Mabley Center only after he or she has exhausted community crisis treatment options. In most cases this means that the person has been reviewed by CART, has received multiple treatment adjustments by his or her community psychiatrist, and has been in and out of emergency rooms and/or hospital psychiatric units multiple times. They typically have been [referred to the SST](#)⁴. Often the person has experienced police involvement and may have been arrested. A person does not enter Mabley Center instead of using the existing community service system. A person enters Mabley Center after it is clear that the existing community service system has been unable to help him.

This is evidenced by the fact that people frequently enter Mabley Center taking complicated regimens of psychotropic medications. For most people with mental illness in the general population one or two medications are sufficient to meet their needs. People admitted to Mabley are sometimes taking five or six medications, prescribed by their community physicians in an attempt to help, but are still in crisis.

By the time they arrive at Mabley the person has often exhausted the capabilities of his community placement. On rare occasions it is possible to return people to their previous homes. Most of the time, however, the community facility has discharged the person, indicating he is not welcome to return. Of the 87 people currently living at Mabley Center 49 (56%) entered after being discharged from their community program.

The people admitted to Mabley are those the existing community system has been unable to serve.

When a person comes to Mabley Center with these needs he or she receives comprehensive psychiatric and behavioral assessment and treatment. Successful treatment for these disorders requires specialized techniques and skilled, experienced practitioners.

Because behavioral and psychiatric symptoms can sometimes be caused by untreated medical conditions a comprehensive medical workup is performed by a physician and medical staff with years of experience in the field of developmental disabilities. Each person receives psychiatric services at the center performed by a psychiatrist with decades of experience working with children and adults with developmental disabilities. A team of psychologists and behavior analysts conduct functional assessments - a specialized assessment technique designed to determine *why* the person has been engaging in the behavior - and to develop behavioral treatment plans based upon those assessments.

Treatment planning is implemented by a team of highly trained Direct Care Staff. These staff, who also provide the day-to-day care of the people at Mabley Center, are specially trained in techniques to prevent challenging behaviors, to de-escalate them when they start, and to ensure the safety of everyone involved when behaviors cannot be de-escalated. This training allows staff at Mabley Center to safely manage severe challenging behaviors.

No Plan

Mabley has served as a successful safety net program for over two decades, providing care for people who have been unable to be successful in the community, and returning them to community homes.

It is clear that, with sufficient planning and allocation of resources, it is possible to establish a safety net program using community resources rather than state providers. It is equally clear, given that Mabley Center continues to serve people whom the community has been unable to assist, that such a system does not exist in Illinois today.

The Governor's proposed closure, being strictly a budgetary measure, includes no plan to compensate for the loss of safety net services. He does not propose to transfer resources to the community, he proposes to eliminate them.

Apples and Oranges

In the debate over closure repeated comparisons are made between state facilities like Mabley Center and the programs offered in the community as if these were equivalent services. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Cost Comparisons?

A primary area of comparison made in the media is the difference in cost of services offered between programs like Mabley Center as compared to those in the community. The numbers offered are presented as if they represent equivalent services. They are, in fact, very misleading.

Mabley Center is designed to be a comprehensive program meeting all of the needs of the people it serves. That array of comprehensive services is reflected in the operational costs of the facility.

The costs commonly quoted for community services reflect only a small portion of the services offered by Mabley Center - room and board, direct care staff and case management (Programming), administration, and transportation⁵. Clearly, there are significant differences in the types of services included under the costs for the two types of programs. Those differences are reflected in the table below:

Despite these differences, people with disabilities living in the community still require the services offered at Mabley. The distinction is that, instead of having them offered as part of an established comprehensive program they must assemble those services piecemeal from what is available in the community.

When those services are attained in the community their cost still comes out of the state budget. The overwhelming majority of people served by community programs pay for their medical care using public aid. Other services, such as day training, are funded through DHS on a different budget line, and are also not reflected in The CILA rate. In short, the cost information for community services often provided in media comparisons is like the base price listed on car advertisements: it's technically correct, but does not reflect what the state actually pays to drive a CILA off the lot.

Also ignored in media comparisons are the actual needs of the people served. The numbers typically quoted are the costs for the *basic* services offered by the *average* CILA program. By definition, given its long-term role as community safety net, the people served at Mabley Center *do not have average needs*. In fact, as has already been mentioned, most have intensive behavioral and psychiatric conditions the existing community system has been unable to serve.

Over 80% of the people served at Mabley Center have a psychiatric diagnosis - a diagnosis of mental illness such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, or depression,

among others - in addition to an intellectual disability. 72% of the people served by the center take psychiatric medication to address their mental health and behavioral needs. 36% of the people served at Mabley have an Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Fully 96% of the people served at Mabley Center require behavior treatment programming, and 90% of the people living at the center require highly specialized behavior treatment plans that involve intensive techniques designed and overseen by Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA's). Those programs are written to address a variety of behavioral concerns, including physical aggression (a concern for nearly 80% of the people living at Mabley Center), Self-Injurious Behavior (54%), property destruction (37%), and elopement (25%). A smaller portion (10%) of the people at Mabley Center struggle with pica, a very dangerous behavior in which the person is compelled to eat non-food items (dirt, feces, screws and nuts, cigarette butts, cleaning supplies). Pica is life condition-threatening that is extremely difficult to treat, and requires constant vigilance on the part of staff to ensure the person's safety. A similar number (9%) present with issues of sexual misconduct towards others, again requiring very close supervision to ensure the safety of the people around them.

Serving this population requires consistent application of psychiatric, behavioral, medical, and other therapies. Meeting that need is, of course, the reason those therapies are included in the comprehensive array of services offered at Mabley Center. These services are not offered through the average CILA program at the average CILA rate. On the rare occasions that CILA programs are developed to address more intensive behavioral needs they also require significantly higher reimbursement rates. Some community CILA programs have base rates up to \$80-90,000/year - base rates that do not include the array of therapy services those people will require. As those services are added into the mix - as we approach a more apples to apples comparison - the difference in costs begins to disappear.

That transitioning to community services does not truly save money is an understood phenomenon. Kevin Walsh, in his peer reviewed study published in the journal *Mental Retardation* in 2003, and updated in 2009, noted "cost savings at the macro level are relatively minor when institutional settings are closed" (Kevin K. Walsh, Theodore A. Kastner, and Regina Gentlesk Green, *Mental Retardation*, Volume 41, Number 2: 103-122, April 2003). While this is understood, it is somewhat hidden in Illinois' system because of the complicated ways in which services are offered.

None of this implies that community placement for all is anything other than a laudable goal. But responsible advocates should agree that decisions in times of deep financial crisis must be made with the real costs considered in the light of day.

Closure Does Not Equal Community Placement

The questionable likelihood of community savings is a moot point, however, as it is a fallacy at best to believe that the closure of a state facility in Illinois represents an opportunity for community placement for any but a select few.

In the past 10 years Illinois has closed three SODC's: both Singer Developmental Center in Rockford and Lincoln Developmental Center in Lincoln, in 2002, and Howe Developmental Center in Tinley Park in 2010.

Lincoln and Howe were both relatively large facilities, serving 380 and 247 people respectively, all of whom had to find alternative placement to effect closure. Then, as now, both of these closures were heralded by some as an opportunity for deinstitutionalization.

Unfortunately this was true only for a select few. In both cases only about a quarter of the people living at those SODC's - 23% from Lincoln⁶, 27% from Howe⁷ - moved to community placement. And where did they go, if not to smaller, more homelike settings?

They moved to another SODC.

In fact, many of the people who moved from Lincoln in 2001 and 2002 moved to Howe Developmental Center, only to be moved again to another SODC when that facility closed it's doors.

Singer Developmental Center was an unusual case. That facility was part of a combined mental health and developmental disabilities program and served only 44 people at the time of it's closure. Further, of those 44 about half were people with significant physical disabilities - a population that providers in the community have expertise in serving. This allowed for a larger percentage of people to move into the community from that program - about 34%. But, of course, the remaining people moved to other SODC's - many of them to Mabley Center⁸.

To place this in perspective with respect to deinstitutionalization goals it's important to have some context on these facilities and the direction of placement. Singer served 44 people in it's developmental program. It was the smallest developmental center in the state at the time. All of the people who moved from there to other SODC's moved into facilities more than twice the size.

Mabley in Dixon is the newest and smallest state center, serving about 90 people. Of those 90 people, history tells us that the overwhelming majority will move to another SODC if the facility is closed in the fashion the governor proposes. Each and every one of those people will be moving to an older, larger institution.

Clearly for all but a small minority of people facility closure does not equal deinstitutionalization. For most, it means relocation of institutionalization. In Illinois, closure means consolidation.

Community Readiness

Among people in the developmental disabilities treatment community there is a philosophy: *Every person can be served in the community given appropriate resources.*

This statement is almost certainly true and yet we see distressingly low rates of community placement coming out of closures. Key to understanding why is within the last three words of that saying: "*given appropriate resources*".

Community placement is certainly possible, even for people with intensive behavioral needs. It is being done in other states - Wisconsin, for example, has only three State Operated Developmental Centers. What Wisconsin also has, however, is a robust system of community providers resourced at a level that allows them to meet those needs.

The Illinois system is not robust.

This is a well understood fact. Several years ago Illinois established its [Blueprint for System Redesign](#)⁹ outlining changes needed to facilitate the move from institutional to community services. That plan explicitly indicates the need for increased capacity to manage challenging behaviors in the community as a key component of facilitating placement. Much of what was outlined in the Blueprint has yet to be accomplished and those services that have begun - the Support Services Teams, for example - have only recently been started and are still building capacity and experience. And, as established above, while community providers are private agencies, most of the people they serve pay for those services with state funding. Over the past several years Governor Quinn, like Blagojevich before him, has repeatedly put off payments to community providers. Those [payment delays](#)¹⁰ along with [budget cuts](#)¹¹ have left community providers financially strapped.

That financial situation has resulted in a huge deficit in available disability services in our state. [21,000 people are on the waiting list](#)¹² for community services in Illinois, 15,000 of which are classified as having either emergency or critical needs. With such a long waiting list, and with so few openings, and with dire financial situations, community providers (understandably) tend to serve people without severe challenging behaviors.

The massive discrepancy between the level of need and availability of services makes it clear that the community system is not receiving the support needed to meet the needs of the people currently on the waiting list, much less the highly specialized needs of the people served at Mabley Center.

Limited Time

Even if the community were capable of meeting the needs of the 21,000 people on the waiting list in addition to the folks at Mabley and Jacksonville, the Governor has all but

ensured relocation to another SODC by setting an impossible timetable. Successful community placement is a highly individualized process under the best of circumstances. To place people with intensive behavioral needs takes careful time and planning. As often as not, special deals have to be negotiated between the Department of Human Services and the community providers in order to facilitate those placements. These deals take a considerable period of time to navigate.

The relatively low placement rates achieved by Lincoln and Howe were reached only after a relatively long-term plan to close those facilities. Lincoln had 10 months in which to place people. Howe had nearly two years¹³. The governor's plan is to close Jacksonville and Mabley by the end of February 2012¹⁴, leaving only three months to find new community homes for nearly 300 people. Given these timeframes virtually none of those people will find their way to community homes.

Successful community placement must be done with careful planning and appropriate resources rather than with the budget driven haste of the current decisions. The current course of action will ensure that, for most of the people at these centers, facility closure will mean only relocation to older, larger state operated developmental centers.

No Savings to be Found

The Governor states¹⁴ closing Jack Mabley and Jacksonville Developmental Centers by the end of February 2012 will save \$14.6 million in fiscal year 2012. This is based upon reported annual operating budgets of \$10.7 and \$27.9 million for Mabley and Jacksonville respectively.

If both facilities close by February 29, 2012, they will be removed from the budget for the last four months of the fiscal year. Those savings appear to have been arrived at by dividing the annual operating budgets of the facilities by 12 to determine the monthly cost for each center, then multiplying that number by four to find out what the state will save between March and June.

This appears straightforward enough, but there is a significant detail that appears unaccounted for:

Where Did All the People Go?

The Governor's projected savings from the closing of Mabley and Jacksonville suggest that all of the costs related to operating these programs will disappear the day the doors of the facility's have closed. The Governor appears to have forgotten one important detail:

The nearly 290 people who live at Mabley and Jacksonville

Whether or not Mabley and Jacksonville are closed, the people living there will continue to need somewhere to live and will continue to require intensive care and supervision. As we've already discussed, the shamefully short timeframe that has been outlined

virtually guarantees the majority will move to other State Operated Developmental Centers.

It Takes People to Care for People

This will mean the populations of the remaining developmental centers in Illinois will grow. Along with that growth of population the cost of operating the other developmental centers will also grow. Ensuring the safety and care of people with developmental disabilities is a labor intensive activity.

Skilled labor, to be precise. When Howe was closed it is certainly the case that the state saved costs in terms of the maintenance and care of the facility and its grounds. But closing Howe did not cause the costs of caring for the people who lived there to simply disappear. Rather, when it shut its doors at the end of 2010 seven of the eight remaining state operated developmental centers required budget adjustments - [increases in the millions of dollars¹⁵](#) - in the 2011 operating budgets to provide care for the people moving out of Howe.

Those increases in operating costs at the remaining facilities were primarily due to the increased personal care and therapy services costs each remaining center required.

If Mabley Center were to close most of the operating cost, like the people who live there, can be expected to simply move to other state operated centers. And, as we've discussed earlier, even were these people with intensive developmental and behavioral needs to move to community settings, they would still be cared for through state funding at rates similar to those they are currently receiving. The Governor's plan doesn't cut those costs - it simply relocates them.

What's Left to Save?

In fact, the items related to cost of care - staffing, medical and therapeutic programs, food - are the major budget component for every state operated developmental center. At Mabley the [budget¹⁶](#) related to care for 2012 represents 86% of the cost of operating the facility. If the people at Mabley Centers were to move those costs would not be saved - they would be transferred. The only costs the Governor can reliably expect to save are those not related to care.

The Governor's fact sheet for his closure plan indicates that he intends to close Mabley Center by the end of February 2012. He projects a savings of \$14.6 million in this fiscal year by closing Mabley along with Jacksonville within that timeframe. The fiscal year ends June 30th, leaving four months of the fiscal year in which Mabley would be closed.

Mabley has a total annual budget, according to the Governor, of \$10.7 million. If we take his numbers, and divide out the cost per month, and then multiply by four we get the savings for the remainder of the fiscal year. That calculation is shown below:

But, understanding that people will almost certainly move to other state developmental centers, those numbers do not represent the actual savings. When only the services *not related* to personal care and therapies are considered the picture changes markedly:

If we take the Governor's numbers as he presents them, cutting the non-personnel related operational costs from Mabley will save less than \$500,000. This is a far cry short of the \$3.6 million that is suggested, and approaches amounts [described by some¹⁷](#) as being equivalent to a budgetary rounding error.

The proposed closures of Mabley Center will uproot the lives of nearly 90 disabled people with severe behavioral challenges, people with mental illness, people with autism and other developmental disabilities - people who struggle significantly with inconsistency and change. A disruption that will serve only to move them to another state operated center all for a real-world savings that amounts to less than 0.00001% of the state's [\\$52.7 billion budget¹⁸](#).

Responsible Advocacy

Responsible advocates for people with developmental disabilities cannot endorse a plan that disrupts the lives of disabled people with very intensive needs, removes a vital community safety net, and closes an efficient, effective program with a proven track record of community placement and support while resulting in no community placement and saving no money.

In Summary

- **Mabley is a Modern and Efficient Program**
 - Mabley Center is the newest and most modern of the state operated developmental centers.
 - The program at Mabley is efficient, with costs per person per year that are the third lowest among state operated centers.
- **Mabley Center Provides Specialized Treatment:**
 - With training from the Helen Keller National Center and staff trained in traditional and contact sign language communication Mabley Center is the only state operated program that specializes in treatment for developmentally disabled people with multiple sensory disabilities - people who are deaf, blind, or both.
 - Mabley Center functions as a vital safety net program for people with developmental disabilities who cannot be successfully served in the community due to severe mental illness and/or severe challenging behaviors. Mabley serves the people the community providers turn away.
 - The people at Mabley Center have intensive behavioral needs:
 - 96% require behavioral treatment planning.
 - 84% have psychiatric conditions in addition to developmental disabilities
 - 72% require psychotropic medications to treat mental illness or behavioral difficulties.
 - 79% are treated to address physical aggression.
 - The program at Mabley Center is comprehensive in nature, with the operating costs covering a vast array of vital medical, personal, and and therapeutic treatments that are not included as a part of any community CILA program.
- **Mabley Center is a Gateway to Community Placement**
 - Mabley Center actively places people in community settings. The Center has a placement rate at about 88% of it's intake rate.
 - With 84% community placement success rate over the past decade the team at Mabley Center has demonstrated a strong understanding of the supports needed for the people they serve to excel in the community.
- **Closing Mabley Center will not result in community placement for the people who live there:**
 - When Lincoln closed in 2001 the state had 10 months to find community placement for the people who lived there. Only 23% of the people moved to the community. [77% of the people at Lincoln moved to other state operated centers⁶](#).
 - When Howe closed in 2010 the state had nearly two years to find community placement for the people who lived there. Only 27% of the people moved to the community. [73% of the people at Howe moved to other state operated centers⁷](#).
 - The Governor plans to close Mabley Center and Jacksonville – displacing nearly 300 disabled people – by the end of February 2012. This allows three months for

the transition. This plan guarantees virtually everyone at Mabley and Jacksonville will be moved to other state operated centers.

- **The State Has Not Prepared the Community for the People at Mabley Center:**

- Illinois has a waiting list of [over 21,000 people](#)¹² with developmental disabilities in need of services. 15,000 of the people on that list are considered “emergency” or “critical” needs, and yet they wait.
- Mabley Center serves people with severe behavioral and developmental needs. Most of the people living at these centers are there because the community providers and emergency support systems were unable to meet their needs.
- Over the past several years Governor Quinn, like Blagojevich before him, has repeatedly put off payments to community providers. With [budget cuts](#)¹¹ and [payment delays](#)¹⁰ the Governor has left community providers financially strapped.
- With such a long waiting list, and with so few openings, and with dire financial situations, community providers (understandably) tend to serve people without severe challenging behaviors.
- The state’s failure to support community providers keeps them from being in a position to serve the people currently living at Mabley.
- The closures being a budgetary decision, the Governor has no presented no plan to improve the community’s capabilities.

- **Apples and Oranges - Claims that the Community Provides Similar Services for Less are Misleading:**

- Mabley’s budget covers the entirety of a comprehensive array of services for people with intensive developmental, medical, mental health and behavioral needs.
- The average CILA rate covers only the most basic services for people with relatively simple needs. All other services must be gained piecemeal, and are still paid for with state funds, though those costs are hidden because they are not part of the CILA rate.
- When CILA programs serve people with intensive needs they also require significantly higher budgets - sometimes as high as \$80-90,000 per person per year. And with this budget it is still the case that all other services must be gained piecemeal, and are still paid for with state funds.
- Studies show that when all of the costs of serving people with intensive needs are considered, little to no money is saved in the community.

- **Closing Mabley Center Will Not Save Money.**

- The Governor’s plan says that he will save \$3.6 million by closing Mabley Center. His plan apparently expects that the people living there will simply disappear.
- It takes skilled staff to care for people with disabilities. At Mabley the personal care and therapy [budget for 2012](#)¹⁶ represents 86% of the cost of operating the facility. The people living at Mabley will still require care if the Center is closed.

- When the Governor closed Howe in 2010 seven of the eight remaining state operated developmental centers required budget adjustments - *increases in the millions of dollars* - in their 2011 operating budgets to provide care for the people moving out of Howe.
- When personnel costs are removed from the equation the governor's savings from closing Mabley Center drops from \$3.6 million to *less than \$500,000*. This is a far cry short of the \$3.6 million that is suggested, and is a disruption that will serve only to move them to another state operated center all for a real-world savings that amounts to *less than 0.00001%* of the state's [\\$52.7 billion budget](#)¹⁸.

Remarks for Mabley Hearing – October 17, 2011

I have had the privilege to serve as the pastor at the Jack Mabley Center for the last three years. Like many in our community, I would never have known the amazing work that goes on there if I hadn't had the chance to observe it up close. From the outside one might easily dismiss its merits considering it perhaps an easy elimination en route to a balanced budget. But this facility which was virtually unknown to me before now has a name. In fact, it has almost 100 names representing the many residents who have such fulfilling lives because of the care they receive there. These residents are far more than a number to me. They are people, created in the image of God, with every right to a life of dignity and fulfillment. It saddens me to think that ^{our} the government whose responsibility is to protect ~~the~~ ^{our} most vulnerable citizens is ^{is making choices that are in direct opposition to this.} the one group they cannot depend on. ~~The residents of the Mabley Center are able to enjoy a lifestyle that each of us deserves. Not only are their physical needs met, but they are able to enjoy the things that many of us take for granted. Nothing can compare to seeing the joy in their eyes after winning a medal at the Special Olympics competitions, the smile on their face after an outdoor excursion riding a horse, enjoying a day at camp, the delight in their voice as they tell me about their day. Without the Mabley Center many of these residents would have a greatly diminished quality of life. They would be unable to receive this same kind of personalized care.~~

As a pastor it is my responsibility to help others find their God given purpose and to challenge those in my care to see the evils of this world and to DO something about it. As Christians it is a basic understanding that every person is part of God's creation, made in His likeness, and therefore ascribed value and worth. When we in our society choose to cut off services such as the Mabley Center we in effect are saying that this portion of our population is the one exception, the one group that really isn't worthy of our tax dollars, our time, our effort. I understand the situation with our state budget is dire, but I feel that the consequences of closing the Mabley Center would be dire too. ~~In the Bible Jesus tells a story about two types of people: those who willingly serve others by giving clothes to those who are naked, giving food to those who are hungry, drink to those who are thirsty, visiting those who are sick and in prison. And then there's the other group: those who didn't have time or desire to fulfill these basic tasks. IN the end Jesus condemns the second group and gives them this harsh admonition: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for the least of these, you did not do for me."~~ Regardless of our religious beliefs, we should take pause at these words. When we overlook or ignore the needs of those around us ~~our actions have greater ripples.~~

→ I commend the Mabley Center for recognizing the spiritual needs of its residents by allowing church services to be brought to them. Many of those whose family members are here tonight are those who attend ^{church} services. Each week when sharing prayer concerns they always remember 2 concerns - prayer for family and then prayer for staff - they love the staff and in many cases feel just as close to staff as they do to family. Mother, Daughter Find New Life After Howe

When Betty Turturillo watches her 58-year-old daughter accomplish the seemingly simple task of clipping a wooden clothespin onto the rim of a plastic bucket, she is genuinely impressed and tells her oldest child so.

That was great, Angel, she smiles. Want to do it again?

Of course Angela does, for hours, under the watchful eye of her doting mother.

She seems to be adjusting, she seems to be content, Betty says, stroking her daughters arm.

It has been more than a year since Angela was moved from Tinley Parks Howe Developmental Center to a ranch-style group home in New Lenox.

Shes nonverbal, so I have to go by what I see, Betty says.

What she sees, for the most part, is a return to normalcy.

Angela shares a home with five other adults. She attends workshops and goes out into the community to see the doctor, dentist and podiatrist.

In the world of the developmentally disabled, there is comfort in routine, there is joy in simplicity. And there is a dependence on familiarity. Thats one reason many family members of Howe residents were upset to learn in 2007 that the facility would be closing.

Now, as the dust settles on the ambitious project to relocate 263 developmentally disabled adults, Betty is at peace with her choice of a small group home over a large state-run facility, which is where most of the former patients ended up.

I hand-picked this place, she said.

The New Lenox home backs up to a wooded area. It is run by nonprofit Trinity Services, headed by former Howe director Art Dykstra.

I've known him since the 70s, Betty said. Trinity has a good reputation.

She suspects that the state will eventually shut down all of its large residential facilities.

And she is hopeful her daughter won't have to be moved again.

I just turned 80, Betty said. It's always a concern who's gonna be around for her when I'm gone.

For now, Betty makes the 20-minute trek from her Tinley Park home to the group home dubbed Cooper twice a week. She also brings Angela home one day on the weekend for a few hours.

Angela can sense when her mother is due to visit.

She starts to whimper and cry right about the time I'm expected, Betty said, adding that Angela recognizes people, which makes the high turnover rate among staff an ongoing struggle.

Most of the workers are young and not paid very well. Of course they want to move on, Betty said.

Its not a perfect world for Angela, but then it never has been.

But the disabled are treated a lot better now than they used to be, Betty said.

Angela suffered brain damage at birth. Though Betty soon realized her toddler was not like other babies, a diagnosis of cerebral palsy was not made until Angela turned 3.

It was kind of a relief to finally know, she said. Because now we could address it. Back then, doctors told me to just take her home and raise her like the other kids.

She did just that, until Angela turned 11 and became increasingly active.

When Betty realized her daughter needed full-time care, her options consisted of big state institutions or small schools that parent groups had started.

Angela was brought to a state-run facility in Dixon. For her family, who lived in Chicago at the time, the location was hardly convenient.

Then, in 1974, Angela became one of the first patients to move into the newly built Howe Developmental Center. Howe offered group home settings on a sprawling 80-acre site, with onsite medical care and opportunities to travel to workshops offsite.

The convenience was magnified when the Turturillos moved to Orland Park in 1986. Later, they moved even closer to Tinley Park.

As president of the Howe Friends and Family Association, Betty was among the most vocal opponents of Howes closure. She scoffed at the nonprofit advocacy group Equip for Equality's recommendation to close the facility based on allegations of abuse and neglect.

Nevertheless, in 2007 Howe was decertified, and plans were launched to shut it down.

The majority of its residents went to other state-run facilities. In June 2010, the last of Howes residents was moved out.

Now, with the transition and the controversy behind them, Betty can once again enjoy quiet moments with her daughter.

She really does like to work, she says, watching Angela meticulously place one clothespin after another onto the rim of the bucket.

I watched what she was able to do, she said. I taught her by learning from her.

Statement to the COGFA Regarding Mabley Dev. Center – October 17, 2011 by Cindy Black, Mother

My daughter, Dawn Furtek, age 45 is a unique individual with complex needs who has autism, deafness and epilepsy. Dawn was born on an Air Force base while her father was serving his country. She experienced a lack of oxygen during birth, went into status epilepticus 12 hours after birth, contracted spinal meningitis at the age of 15 months and stopped breathing during a seizure several months later. Thus unfolded a very challenging journey for Dawn and her family. Obtaining and maintaining adequate services for Dawn has been an ongoing battle especially with Dawn's history of difficult to manage aggressive and self-injurious behaviors including cutting her hand open repeatedly and severing tendons. After being rejected by multiple "community" placements and being placed on waiting lists for placements that never materialized, Dawn was accepted at Mabley Developmental Center (MDC).

Mabley is a very unique, specialized, homelike and highly developed program with strong ties to the Dixon community and with a stable, well-trained staff – possibly the only such program in the country – that serves individuals with developmental disabilities, challenging behavior, rare genetic disorders and sensory impairments including deafness, blindness and the deaf-blind – individuals for whom placements could not be found or if found could not be maintained in the community. Mabley has the capacity to serve 110 individuals and is currently serving approximately ninety at a cost lower than other SODCs (State Operated Developmental Centers). Prior to the announced closing, Mabley continued to receive referrals from the community and other SODCs.

A stable well-training staff is critical to successfully serving individuals with complex needs who need consistent structure and predictability, highly individualized treatment and therapeutic activities. The additional specialized skills, such as fluency in sign language, braille and augmentative communication, take time and effort to develop and maintain. According to a director of a major community provider, staff turn-over is the biggest problem for community providers primarily due to substandard wages. Many individuals at Mabley, including Dawn, have experienced traumatic unsuccessful "community" placements but were fortunately able to return to Mabley – an option that would no longer be available.

Certain officials and purported advocates believe that by closing Mabley there will be more money to serve individuals in the community. Unfortunately, they are ignoring the fact that the community is not equipped to adequately serve individuals with complex needs. States who have successfully closed state facilities without abandoning their most vulnerable and needy citizens first developed and funded community services at a cost considerably higher than what it costs to serve the same individuals at a SODC. Mabley is a cost effective SODC that provides comprehensive, stable care that meets the social-emotional, behavioral and medical needs of its residents and allows them to participate in the community.

Dawn enjoys family visits but makes it clear that she wants to go home to Mabley. If Dawn were to lose her home it is certain that her challenging behaviors would return placing her and others at grave risk. The expertise and stability of the Mabley program has allowed Dawn to lead a fulfilling life, maximizing her participation in community activities and maintaining meaningful relationships – that is not warehousing.

Being in a community placement where your language is not spoken – that is warehousing. Where you are placed on medication that worsens your condition because staff lack skills and resources – that is warehousing. Where there is constant staff turnover due to substandard wages – that is warehousing. Where you will not have access to the caretakers and community that have become your family and your home in every sense of the word – that is warehousing. Where you will be psychiatrically hospitalized repeatedly and repeatedly returned to a community placement that is not working – that is warehousing.

Closing Mabley is immoral and insensitive

I am here to speak to you, commission members, because my hope for our loved ones rests with your higher moral senses of what is right and just. I wish their lives could be different but that is not possible, we have tried the community and failed. Mabley is the only facility in Northwest Illinois that provides exceptional services for the deaf, blind and sensory impaired. Mabley also is a network for community providers experiencing extreme behaviors by the individuals they serve.

I have tried the community 6 times and failed. My sons were drugged, put in jail, one had a knife pulled on him by a roommate, and the other was sexually abused. We also tried family Cila and that failed.

My sons have Fragile X Syndrome, which is very complexed. Their behaviors are extreme, one will urinate, dig and smear on himself if he is not comfortable with his clothing, the other will swear, hit others and elope if put in an uncomfortable situation. They both require a tremendous amount of structure, the structure they receive at Mabley.

Those who are here to testify from the ARC and Equip for Equality do not know nor do they understand the facts of what we have been through with our loved ones. We are the advocates for our family members and we are extremely competent. We know what they need.

The state is not saving money by closing Mabley? Our individuals are not going away. There are no openings in the community, and so many with lesser needs are awaiting services. Will our individuals be placed in the remaining SODC's, which will become overcrowded? I thought you did not approved of warehousing. Isn't this what you will be doing? Also, the time frame set for closing our facility is callous.

My two sons need the stability of their home at Mabley. Any move will be traumatic. Our rights are being violated. They are depending on you to hear the truth and speak that truth to the Governor.

Testimony regarding the closing of Mabley Developmental Center
By Angela Black Childers, sister of Dawn Furtek

I oppose the closing of Mabley Developmental Center. Mabley and the Mabley community has been my sister's home for 27 years. My sister Dawn is deaf, autistic and developmentally disabled. Finding appropriate care and treatment for Dawn has always been challenging because of her unique handicaps of being both autistic and deaf as well as cognitively disabled. Mabley Developmental Center has been life saving and life changing for my sister. Dawn has been at Mabley since she was 18 years old and for her to loose her home and her community of peers and caretakers will be very traumatic for her.

Dawn was two years old when I was born but I have been more of a big sister then a little sister. My childhood was far from being "normal" or "average". I was raised by my mom and grandmother and our family life revolved around Dawn. I had a childhood filled with doctor's appointments and therapy appointments for Dawn. My mom was usually very stressed. She often did not have much time for me and even at a very young age, I understood that Dawn needed our mom more than I did. As a child, my mom was Dawn's advocate and she got all the help she could for Dawn so that my sister could reach her full potential.

Despite all of the extra help and therapies Dawn received, the autism still caused many acting out behaviors. We had many days of total chaos due to my sister's aggressive behaviors. I remember going to the store and frequently having to leave suddenly because Dawn would begin knocking over items and aggressively grabbing people. There was one occasion when I was thrown from a horse because Dawn began acting out and screaming. At home, Dawn would suddenly, without warning, run across the room, break something and slice her hand open. The injuries would be so severe that she would slice through tendons. Dawn would go through long periods of ripping her clothes up on a daily basis. During an acting out episode, my sister would overturn furniture including heavy dressers, break plates, glasses, windows, and destroy anything she could get her hands on. So, you can see that my childhood was far from average. And my sister's needs are far from average!

I would love if my sister could be successful in a group home. At one time, we did find a community placement that was willing to accept Dawn but she was kicked out after a few months due to her acting out behaviors. The reality is, is that community placements will not accept my sister due to her special needs and her acting out behaviors. I fear that most places (community and otherwise) will not accept Dawn and any place who would accept Dawn would kick her out after a short time.

Dawn has been receiving care in the home-like setting of Mabley Developmental Center for 27 years. Mabley is a specialized, homelike center and community onto itself that provides care to the developmentally disabled with challenging behaviors. Mabley was specifically designed to serve residents with developmental disabilities who have challenging behaviors. They also speak Dawn's language, which is sign language. They

serve a unique population including the deaf, deaf-blind and autistic and it is the only state facility in northwest Illinois. They Mabley currently serves 91 residents and it is the newest, most up to date facility in Illinois and the least in need of any repairs or updating. The cost to run Mabley per resident is significantly below the state average. The residents live in the Mabley community live in seven separate houses with up to 16 residents each. There are two residents per bedroom and each bedroom has an adjoining bathroom. In the center of the home there is an open kitchen, dinning room, family room and living room. The staff at Mabley is phenomenal. They are well trained and very dedicated to the residents and there is very low turnover at Mabley. They take excellent care of my sister. Each home in the Mabley community is designed and built for making maximum and effective use of staff resources.

Since being at Mabley, my sister's acting out behaviors have significantly diminished. She is happy and is now able to handle home visits. However, when Dawn is on a visit, she will sign "home". And by "home", my sister means Mabley. The Mabley community is Dawn's home and it has been her home for 27 years. Please do not take away my sister's home. What would you want if Dawn was your sister or if Dawn was your daughter? Are we not all called to care for the "least of these"?

My name is Susannah Tournear and my brother and ward is Prosper Allen Tournear. Allen has lived at Jack Mabley Developmental Center since 1984. Prior to that he had lived at home, where his increasing violent behavior had become more than my family could handle. Then at Decatur, IL, where we discovered that state employees were giving him drugs to decrease behavior issues and not monitoring him, then to Park on Roaman in Peoria, where they were unable to handle his violent outbursts and they sent him to Zeller when he became violent. My parents did a three-state search for an acceptable place for Allen to live and found Jack Mabley to be the only and best place for him.

For all of these 27 years, Allen has had the mind of a 3-6 year-old in a maturing body. He has lenox-gasteau syndrome (a form of epilepsy) and is the manifestation of love except for his violent outbursts, which are incidents that the community placements are unable to control. If there were community placements available that could manage such things, then we would be willing to make such a move, but at this time, you are asking us to cross a river without a bridge, with nothing on the other side. It will lead to innocent people being seriously hurt, and will lead to my very dear, precious brother being medicated beyond recognition or being arrested and put in prison, which will most certainly be his demise.

Jack Mabley has always had the best of people working on its staff, with the clients' best interest in mind, and at this critical financial time, when looking at the institutions being threatened for shut-down, Jack Mabley is the most fiscally responsible per client. It is the only facility in a 9-county area and the only facility in Northwest Illinois. Mabley specializes in services for the deaf and blind. Mabley has sent many of its clients into the community homes only to have them returned as

unacceptable. In fact, the CEO of Gateway in Princeton once told us that he relied on Mabley to take in people they could not facilitate. Mabley is not like other state institutions. It is a home where the staff is very caring and our family members are very happy there. It is more than a tragedy to shut down a home that does it right. Not all mentally handicapped citizens can live in community housing as it exists at this time, and when they are placed and then kicked out, where are they to go? To a lesser institution? We are dealing with much more than money. We are dealing with people. In closing facilities that give a higher level of care such as Jack Mabley, community housing would have to provide this same higher level of care, which it does not. Please vote for a supplemental appropriation to keep Mabley open and maintain this home for our families.

Thank you for the opportunity to be here today and thank you for being here and willing to listen.

I remember when I was in college coming home to find my little brother on top of my mother's back, pulling out her hair. I remember him running away from home and I had to go after him...he stopped and threw some things at me: a lawnmower, one of those rusty old garbage cans, and a wheelbarrow. He was strong then and he is now.

To know my little brother is actually to know a very caring, and extremely sweet man, but to put my little brother in the community is to offer the community nonviolent rape, a pedophile and violence. He is not a bad man; he is a 3-6 year old in a 46 year old body, exploring sexuality like a child and having violent anger bursts like a 2 year old, but in the body of a very strong man. He has to be checked by staff every 15 minutes to make sure he and his peers are alright and he is where he should be. My brother Allen's diagnosis is Intermittent Explosive Disorder, Severe Mental Retardation, Antisocial Personality Disorder, and Lennox-Gastout Syndrome, a seizure disorder.

If he were put into the community, Allen would either end up in prison, where he would certainly be himself behaviourly, and be hurt or killed by an inmate, or once again, he would be heavily medicated, which the state has done to him before, and which led to him nearly dying from the medication.

Jack Mabley has been his home, not an institution, but his *home* for 27 years. The staff is genuinely caring and he loves them. He has lived in other institutions, in Decatur and Peoria, that have had uncaring staff, doctors that medicate behaviors with dangerous drugs without following up, and he's been kicked out of these institutions when they couldn't handle his behavior... My parents did an extensive three-state investigation to find the best place for him to live, and the best and ONLY place was Jack Mabley. It was good then and has only gotten better since.

Jack Mabley has programs to deal with his issues and allows him to work and enjoy social events. He has a wonderful life here.

- If he were to move to another state facility, he may never see our parents again, as they are in their late 70's, there are no other facilities within a short driving distance, and we believe that as his disabilities increase with age, there will come a time when we won't be able to handle him for his short home visits.
- His maladaptive behavior frequency per month averages 43 incidences. They are physical aggression, stealing, agitation, and inappropriate sexual behavior.
- Allen is always excited to come to our houses on holidays for short visits, but due to his and our limitations, is unable to stay for prolonged visits, and he always excited to return home to Mabley when the visit is over. He sees it as a comfortable, secure place where people care about him. At Mabley, he loves shopping, looking at pictures in his magazines, setting the table for dinner, helping with dishes, going to classes with Linda (the teacher), and visiting with staff, especially Eric and Annette.
- After Zeller in Peoria closed, my father, a pastor, presided over two funerals for innocent Peoria citizens that were the direct result of Zeller clients being released into the community.
- Illinois is not ready to house the special needs of our Mabley residents. There is NO PLAN in place to take care of them after a facility shutdown.
- The governor has asked us to cross a river without a bridge and with nothing on the other side to go to.
- This is NOT going to solve the budget crisis; it IS going to move the need for money over laterally, cause extreme physical and emotional pain and loss, put people out of work, make a deep economic impact on the Dixon community, and separate families.

- It makes no sense to uproot people who can't understand what is happening and who do not acclimate well to change, to play political games, and presume that this would even begin to effect our budget crises. Why do we hurt those who can't even speak for themselves?
- I ask this panel to consider, what do we want to be known for as a society? The governor's office just granted \$50 million to 22 communities to create 300 jobs for park improvements. While improving our parks is a worthwhile endeavor, should we at this time, when as a state we cannot pay our bills and meet the basic needs of our disabled citizens, set our priorities on swimming pools and 300 jobs when 50 million is cut from the disabled that will eliminate 1900 jobs, displace families and create a risk for all citizens in these communities. Where is our logic in this and where is our heart as a people?
- Of all of the centers slated to close, Mabley is the most fiscally responsible per person.
- After Howe closed, my older brother spoke with some disgruntled citizens in the community who said that the ex-clients simply roamed about the streets unaccompanied. This would be very dangerous for the specific issues that Mabley clients have and for the community.
- Community placement has a waiting list of 21,000 people, not including these people in the state centers. How can you possibly find places for Jack Mabley's citizens?
- The community-based services are underfunded and the state has delayed payments to them.
- Jack Mabley makes a significant impact on the community. The staff give to charities, the clients participate in shopping, movies, park

cleaning, and more, families come to visit and boost the economy, and we find Dixon to be more tolerant to mentally/developmentally handicapped than anywhere we've been, due to their interaction with Mabley and their good people.

- No matter WHERE the citizens of Mabley are, they will need this level of service, which will cost the state.

- Hearing may take longer than 4 hours. Much longer.
- Bring a snack and something to drink.
- Wear layered clothing and bring a sweater.

The closing of Mabley Developmental Center would not only be a loss to this community but also to the residents and families who use this facility.

Mabley Developmental Center houses at this time between 88 to 90 residents with the the maximum bed capacity of 119 total beds. Its also the newest facility being built in 1989 and serves the northwestern part of the state.


The residents who live here depend on this facility due to the fact that most of them have some type of physical or mental handicap. Most of these residents are not candidates for group homes and some have failed in the group home setting. To relocate them to other facilities in the state would be costly since the closest facilities are Ludeman Center or Shapiro developmental center or Ann Kiley Developmental center. All of these are well over 50 miles away. This would cause an undo hardship on those families who come and visit their loved ones.

We request that the Mabley Developmental center remain open.

My brother Marty Fleming has lived at Jack Mabley Developmental Center for 25 wonderful years. It is his home and is a home for 90 other residents. It is the only facility in Northwest Illinois. This enables my parents to visit Marty every other week or other family to visit Marty. My parents 79 & 73 are both experiencing health issues, & could not care or meet Marty needs @ their home. I or Marty's other siblings would not be able to care or meet Marty needs in their home either. This home specializes in caring for the deaf, blind & mentally retarded residents. Marty and his entire family are very happy with this homelike care facility and sleep at night knowing he is well taken care of & loved. Marty & other residents do not handle change they need routine to function. We know from past experience Marty did not do well in a community service home. Marty has the mental development of a 3 ½ year old in a man's body with behavioral problems. Walk in our shoes visit Jack Mabley Developmental Center and experience for yourself what a wonderful facility this is for all the residents. Donald & Violet Fleming Testimonial for Marty Fleming resident of Jack Mabley Developmental Center

As parents of a mentally handicapped son we have always tried to do what is best for him! Marty, the youngest of our five children lived at home with us for 18 years. In an emergency situation where he had begun to become violent with us, we involved our minister and police chief (also his Sunday School Teacher at the time) to help us find alternate care in the mental health area. Marty was placed in the then home of the President of ARC of Henry County, who had all the knowledge and training to care for Marty. After numerous episodes of his running away and fearful of his safety we were called that we needed to bring him home because they were unable to care for him. We also tried to place him in Bethesda Lutheran Home in Wisconsin but he could not meet their requirements. Two more failed community placements and we finally felt we had found a home for Marty at Jack Mabley where all his special needs are met. He has the mentality of a 3 ½ year old, kidney failure, has to have all liquids thickened and food chopped, and has behavior problems because of schizophrenia. The staff at Mabley is his extended family and knows how to treat his needs. We live one hour away and visit Marty every two weeks and see how happy he is. Marty is taken out in the community for swimming, fishing, and lots of other activities with HIS Guys! If needed he is sung to at night to help him fall asleep. One of the staff helped to calm him by lying next to him for 30 minutes of his EEG after his ambulance ride to the hospital. The Dixon community supports all our residents regardless of the needs. When special medical or dental work is needed they place them in the Pediatrics ward of the hospital where they are treated with love and dignity. All of the residents who live at Jack Mabley are there because it meets the needs that they have. We feel blessed that we Marty had finally found a home and happiness. Please think of the human side and realize that Jack Mabley is not an institution but already is a community based home. Please don't close our son's home!

My name is Julie Wilson and I am writing on behalf of my brother, Marty Fleming, a resident of Mabley Developmental Center. It is important for you to know how this center, though often mistakenly referred to as a facility, is considered "home" to Marty and has been for the past 25 years. You need to understand that Marty lived with his parents and siblings until he was 18 years old. The decision to seek other housing for Marty was based on his needs and was not an easy decision for our family. Before arriving at Mabley, community housing was attempted; however, without success.

Hopefully, you have had the opportunity to visit Mabley Developmental Center and recognize the family and community atmosphere that has become "home" to my brother. Each of the homes on the property can be best compared to mini fraternities or sororities. There is a definite bond between the residents and staff as well as involvement and participation with the community and family members. I remember the last time Marty returned after a family visit and how excited he was to share the cookies that he had brought to share with his Mabley family. They were all gathered in the kitchen preparing for a picnic that evening. Again, I want emphasis this is not a facility but a home to the residents. Instead of closing this center, you should be using it as a model to what should be implemented throughout the state.

As an educator with a degree in special education and currently working towards system changes, I am highly aware of the needs of students with disabilities. Transitions are difficult for most people but many times detrimental to people with disabilities. In Marty's case, this is of great concern to our family. He needs the stability and compassion that is offered at the Mabley Developmental Center.

I guarantee that if you had a brother like Marty, the Mabley Developmental Center would be your choice for his living accommodations. Please do not close Marty's "home"!

To whom it may concern:

After a futile search (more than 40 years) for a facility with a program suitable for his needs, Curtis was placed in the Jack Mabley Center in Dixon, IL. This was his first experience with a program suitable for his needs. Curtis is 56 years old and Mabley Center has been and is his home. To relocate him now would be a major setback, undoing his accomplishments of the years at the Mabley Center and the workshop at the Kreider Center in Dixon.

Some of the history of Curtis' residency prior to his placement at Mabley:

Red Oak, Iowa – referred there because Illinois had no facility suitable for his needs. They had a nice brochure, but no staff people. Residents were left to vegetate on benches around the perimeter of the rooms with no programs (about 1971). There were no nurses or Doctors at the facility. The minimal staff on duty had little or no training. In the winter months, the road conditions were sometimes bad, so we could not plan the 300 mile trip to visit Curtis, therefore arrived unannounced to find no staff people in the building. It was an old 2-story farm house with no furniture or curtains on the windows. Curtis was able to tell us some of the things that happened to some of the clients there such as being locked in a box. A staff person raised one end of a bench, dumping Curtis on the floor and breaking his arm. We could no longer leave him there.

Brown School, Austin Texas – nice facility with staff and programs. When Curtis turned 21 years old, the school money and M.I. grant were terminated. Before this time, I could pay the balance owed above the school and grant monies from Illinois. When these terminated, I had to pay \$1650. per month. I did that for 1 year and went \$5000. in the red, therefore I had to terminate his residency there.

Galesburg Mental Health Center – not a good place. It was then closed to make way for a prison.

Dixon Mental Health Center – not a good place. They sent Curtis to Chester, IL, a facility for criminally insane, without my knowledge. I wanted to rip somebody's arms off, but I didn't know who to blame. Next, the Dixon Mental Health Center closed to make way for a prison.

Jack Mabley Center for Developmentally Disabled – Curtis was placed at Mabley, which had newly built cottages when the Dixon Mental Health Center closed. This was the first facility that had qualified staff people who treated the clients like human beings. Nurses and Doctors treated, prescribed and administered proper medication. Dietitians and cooks supplied and fed clients proper food and proper portions. Many need special diets. These staff people are like mothers to many of the clients, which really helps them to exist. These clients have so little – don't let them take away what little they have. The 2-bed rooms are equipped with decent furniture which allows residents to have some of their favorite things close to them. Windows are adorned with drapes and curtains. Curtis has medical problems and his needs are taken care of by the staff at Mabley. Sometimes we pick up Curtis for a picnic at Lowell Park in Dixon, when the weather permits. We occasionally pick up Curtis for overnight home visits in East Moline – birthdays and holidays. When it's time for him to return to Mabley, he is always ready to go back home to his cottage at Mabley. Mabley center is his home!

I was surprised to find so many people in the Illinois Quad Cities area have family members that are residents at Mabley. Many have had experiences similar to ours and some worse. They need Mabley.
