**Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability
State Facility Closure Act Hearing
Illinois Youth Center at Joliet
Wednesday, April 4, 2012**

Submission for the Record

Members of the Commission, thank you for allowing me to testify this morning on the importance of the Illinois Youth Center at Joliet (IYC-Joliet).

This facility's role in maintaining the public safety of not only the Will County community but also the entire state is significant. Closing IYC-Joliet would not only pose risks to the safety and welfare of the youth population served, but it also does not make economic sense.

As we continue battling a nationwide recession, creating and maintaining good-paying jobs should be a priority. Currently, 226 staff members are employed at IYC-Joliet. The Department of Juvenile Justice anticipates adding only 40 positions, some as far as 100 miles from Joliet, should IYC-Joliet close. Nearly 190 people would face unemployment at a time when the Will County unemployment rate is 10.2 percent, impacting local families and the economy.

Furthermore, as the only juvenile maximum-security facility in the state, IYC-Joliet serves an important function in Illinois' juvenile detention system. To safeguard individual youths and the greater Department of Juvenile Justice population, it is necessary to offer appropriate and individualized housing and care. Failing to do so can lead to negative consequences for the facility's youth population and front-line staff.

The proposed closure would also result in additional costs to the state. IYC-Joliet recently completed a \$2.4 million roof replacement project and invested \$700,000 for furniture safety upgrades. Unlike IYC-Joliet, the St. Charles facility where the Department of Juvenile Justice proposes transferring many IYC-Joliet residents requires costly improvements to accommodate a maximum-security youth population. Moreover, as many youths must be transported to Cook County for court hearings, IYC-Joliet's proximity to Cook County helps to keep transportation and fuel costs to a minimum.

For these reasons, I urge you keep the doors open at the Illinois Youth Center at Joliet. I hope you will keep my remarks in mind as you develop your recommendation.

The English idiom "don't judge a book by its cover" is a metaphorical phrase which means "you shouldn't prejudge the worth or value of something, by its outward appearance alone".^[1]

And yet is this not exactly what the Governor of Illinois and the Juvenile Justice Initiative is doing? Governor Quinn, in his 2013 Fiscal Budget Fact Sheet, states the following:

IYC Joliet

☒ IYC Joliet opened in 1959, and the physical structure is the least rehabilitative (most like an adult prison) in the system.

☒ Facility capacity is 344; yet, IYC Joliet only houses 243 youths. *(Not accurate – IYC-Joliet, due to bed project has an actual capacity of 258. At the time this report is being written IYC-Joliet youth count is 222)*

☒ Youths will be transferred to IYC Kewanee and IYC Harrisburg. *(This will severely limit or end the visits from the family members of youth currently at IYC-Joliet. This will create both a financial and emotional hardship to families already struggling to survive. 85% of youth incarcerated at IYC-Joliet are from Cook County)* Some staff can be transferred to IYC Chicago (six current vacancies), IYC St. Charles (11 current vacancies) and IYC Warrenville (three current vacancies) as well as to other IYCs to accommodate increased population.

☒ Total cost reductions from closing IYC Joliet: \$17.1 million annually. *(This savings does not include the additional cost of transporting Consent Decree youth from their new parent facility back to Chicago for court appearances)*

In order to address the "physical structure" of IYC-Joliet one only has to become familiar with the type of committed young adults that IYC-Joliet houses. The average age of a young adult at IYC-Joliet is 17 years old. The physical identification of these young adults range from 5'8" to 6'5", weighing between 150 lbs to 300 lbs. They have been committed to IDOC/IDJJ for a variety of crimes which include: 1st Degree Murder, Manslaughter, Aggravated Battery with Great Bodily Harm, Criminal Sexual Assault of a Child (under 4 years of age), Kidnapping, Home Invasion, Robbery, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Rape, Vehicular Hi-jacking, Dangerous Drug Possession, Manufacturing/Delivery of Controlled Substances etc. The young adults at IYC-Joliet are housed in this "physical structure" due to the heinous and violent crimes they have committed or based on their negative behavior in a less restrictive "physical structure". The youth are transferred from IYC-Harrisburg, IYC-St. Charles, IYC-Chicago and IYC-Kewanee when their behaviors and actions can no longer be accepted in a less restrictive setting. They have shown through choice and action that they cannot co-exist with a more vulnerable population. There have been no escapes from IYC-Joliet largely based on the professional staff and the "physical structure" of this facility.

It should be noted, despite the difficult population at IYC-Joliet, the facility has been able to show growth in a positive manner since the inception of IDJJ and PBS involvement. In fact, as you will see in the PBS documentation provided, IYC-Joliet has been able to achieve the national average in programs.

In addition, despite the difficult population, IYC-Joliet has also exceeded in many areas as well. The staff at IYC-Joliet is committed to making a difference in the lives of the young men they are here to protect. They encourage the youth, on a daily basis, to think more from an individual stand point, to understand the negatives of the past do not have to dictate their future, to believe they are somebody, that they can and will make a positive contribution to society, their community and most importantly their family with effort and dedication. On any given day you will find staff assisting youth with homework issues, consoling them after news of a loved one's death is reported, talking about how to transition back into a community or family that is resistant to their return, or just talking about the day's sporting events. The youth at IYC-Joliet benefit from an academic program, intramural sports program, religious program, mental health counseling and one on one case management. In addition, IYC-Joliet is also home to the Wells Center Substance Abuse Program and the Parole Readjustment Program. This is what happens INSIDE IYC-JOLIET, communication, learning and a desire to change.

IDJJ and the Juvenile Justice Initiative have made it very clear reunification with the family is a large component in a youth's success upon release. It appears, by the Governor's statement cited for closure, this is not near as important as the outside appearance. In fact, no-one, except the staff at IYC-Joliet have taken a moment to see how this closure would affect the youth and their families. We have included a sample of the letters we have received from both the youth and their family members. We hope and pray you will take a few moments to read them, for the true value should be found from within the walls of IYC-Joliet not the outside.

Closing IYC a mistake

I'm an employee at Joliet's Illinois Youth Center, which is facing closure to balance Gov. Quinn's budget. I have a M.A. in forensic psychology and a B.S. in psychology. I have experience as a mental health counselor for juveniles in an acute care psychiatric setting.

I am telling you my background and qualifications in an attempt to illustrate that well-educated and well-meaning people who have been thoroughly trained to handle this dangerous and specialized subpopulation within the juvenile justice system do see this as an important institution that does it's best to help young adult males find the right path.

I would like to point out that almost 1,500 people have signed a petition to Gov. Quinn (www.change.org/petitions/the-governor-of-il-stop-the-closure-of-iyj-joliet-maximum-security-prison-for-young-adults) to oppose the closing of IYC. We are also having an informational picket Thursday, March 15, at the facility. 1:30 to 4:30 p.m.

Many families want IYC Joliet to stay open so they can visit their children. We have many many programs geared towards this specialized subpopulation that ends up at IYC Joliet. We receive youth who have assaulted staff, assaulted other youth or caused other disruptions other facilities were unequipped to handle.

Our facility is old, but in working condition. There is definitely room for improvement. However, in this era of budget cuts and belt tightening we are doing the best we can with what we have, and the best we can is pretty darn good.

As for the budget proposal, given that roughly 100 of the youth at IYC Joliet are fighting adult cases they also have to go to court. Eighty percent go to court in or around Chicago. The youth are going to be transferred to IYC Kewanee or Harrisburg, which are hours away. We will pay staff overtime to take the youth to court and related costs, and that overtime adds up.

“Overcrowding is certainly a problem in DOC and DJJ. The John Howard Society and DJJ ideally wish all youth were single bunk, aka no roommates, to stave off sexual assault issues in the system. In order to accomplish this, all facilities would be necessary. I feel this article fails to take into account the type of 'youth' housed at IYC Joliet. There are an average of 230 'youth' at any given time, roughly half of which are 17, 18, 19, and 20 facing either adult time or fighting adult cases. Youth at IYC Joliet are very violent, have been to all the other institutions before being transferred to IYC Joliet because they were too aggressive. Staff and other youth assault are a frequent occurrence. These youth are charged with 1st degree murder, attempted murder, armed robbery, aggravated battery, criminal sexual assault of a child under the age of 9, and more. These are not the population you should mix with younger, less violent criminals. They pose a threat to their safety and their future. The vast majority of these youth are deeply involved with a gang, and gang activity is common. I, personally, don't believe this population should be absorbed into the other facilities to corrupt youth that still have a much better chance of turning their lives around.”

Employees to rally to keep Illinois Youth Center open

JOLIET — Union employees will rally Thursday outside of the Illinois Youth Center to try to prevent the closing of the Joliet facility.

Gov. Pat Quinn wants to close the state detention facility for juveniles on July 31.

That would mean the loss of about 275 jobs, including 235 members of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, said Sharon Konopka, president of AFSCME Local 1753.

The rally from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. will be the first public demonstration to oppose the closing of the facility, which has been on McDonough Street since 1959.

Konopka said the union is in large part fighting an image problem.

"The reason he (Quinn) is closing Joliet is that he decided it's the least rehabilitative structure, which means we're ugly," Konopka said. "We have to look like a prison because we have young people that have committed the worst crimes in Illinois. You can't look like a college campus when you have murderers and rapists."

State Sen. Pat McGuire, D-Joliet, said the administration has characterized the Joliet facility as "most like an adult prison of all the youth centers."

McGuire plans to attend the rally and also is organizing a tour of the Joliet facility. He plans to invite legislators from neighboring districts to join him in his visit to the Joliet youth prison on Monday.

"Public safety seems to be a paramount issue here," McGuire said. "Judges and juries have decided that these individuals need to be in prison."

Part of the AFSCME argument for keeping Joliet open is that it is the only true maximum security facility in Illinois for juveniles, and there would be no good place to transfer the young people who are there.

But Kendall Marlowe, a spokesman for the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice, said Illinois Youth Centers in Kewanee, Warrenville and Harrisburg have maximum security facilities. And, the youth center in St. Charles is being equipped for maximum security.

"It's likely that a majority of these youths (from Joliet) would go to Kewanee and St. Charles," Marlowe said.

State Rep. Jack McGuire, D-Joliet, whose district includes the youth center, said it is not clear how much legislative opposition to Quinn's plan across Illinois.

"I haven't talked to too many members since (Quinn) came out with the announcement to close it," Jack McGuire said. "It hasn't been a subject of great discussion except for the members here."

The governor has also proposed closing a youth center in Murphysboro, as well as the Dwight and Tamms adult prisons. He also proposes closing six Adult Transition Centers. He has estimated budget savings from the closings at \$83.4 million.

Pat McGuire said there is a proposal in the state senate that would require the governor to get legislative approval before closing any state facilities. Currently, legislators review proposed closings and give advisory recommendations.

The General Assembly's Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability will hold a hearing in the Joliet area before the youth center can be closed. That hearing has not been scheduled.

Workers rally to keep Illinois Youth Center open

JOLIET — Workers at Illinois Youth Center-Joliet questioned what would happen to the state's most hardened juvenile criminals as they rallied Thursday to save the facility from the governor's budget cuts.

Gov. Pat Quinn has characterized Joliet as the "least rehabilitative" of the state prisons for juveniles and wants to close it at the end of July.

Joliet guards and counselors, however, say Joliet gets young offenders after they no longer have been able to adapt to less restrictive environments at other Illinois Youth Centers.

"When it comes to the point that they could not be controlled any longer, they come here. This is the end of the line," said Rosemary Bridges, a juvenile justice supervisor at Joliet. "That's what the governor is failing to mention. This is the end of the line."

Some of the workers questioned whether Quinn had a full grasp of how the state's youth centers operate when he targeted Joliet for closure.

"Not a clue," said Gregory Riddick. "Let him put one of these uniforms on and move these kids from building to building. Let him see what it's like. Here, you don't have these kids walking behind you. They're going to bust you in the head."

One of the youths recently brought to Joliet had been sentenced to 97 years in prison, Riddick said. In a typical van load of new arrivals, four in the group are likely to have combined prison sentences of more than 100 years, he said.

American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees Local 1753, which represents 225 members in Joliet, organized the rally. At least 200 people were there, AFSCME members from Stateville Correctional Center.

"They've got to stop coming to Joliet every time they want to do a closing," Ralph Portwood, president of AFSCME Local 1866 told state Rep. Jack McGuire, D-Joliet. McGuire was one of a number of legislators and political candidates who talked with workers at the rally.

Portwood pointed to the closing of the Joliet Correctional Center on Collins Street, past attempts to shut down Stateville and the closing of two smaller facilities in the Joliet area over the years.

New state Sen. Pat McGuire, D-Joliet, said the only explanation he has for targeting the Illinois Youth Center-Joliet "is a one-page sheet that calls Joliet the least rehabilitative facility." McGuire said he was hearing "a different story" from Joliet employees at the rally.

The Illinois Youth Center on McDonough Street does look like a prison, surrounded by high, barbedwire fence.

But workers at the rally said the facility also has a number of rehabilitation programs, including a school to help them finish their secondary education.

As for the barbed wire: "We have to look like this. We're a maximum facility for young adults," said Sharon Konopka, president of AFSCME Local 1753 and a counselor at the youth center.

Konopka said many of the youths at Joliet are 17 and older.

"They're fully developed young men, and they have committed violent and heinous crimes," she said. "You can't have a campus-like environment for murderers and rapists and people facing 50 years in prison. They're going to run."

A spokesman for the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice has said the state has maximum security facilities at its youth centers in Kewanee, Harrisburg and Warrenville, while St. Charles is being equipped for maximum security. However, the department's Web site only describes Joliet and Warrenville as maximum security facilities. And Warrenville is for female inmates only.

"We specialize in dealing with these types of kids," Bridges said. "We're trained from the day we arrive here on how to carry ourselves and how to relate to these kids."

Renovation now? Consider essentials first

Common sense

Living in tenuous times sometimes provokes the most erratic decisions, decisions which protect the pocketbook but not the moral and ethical concerns affecting the long-term health of a community. I can no longer stand idly by as the state government, under Gov. Quinn, contemplates — with relentless vigor — proposals that will ultimately affect major areas of public concern: health, public safety and unemployment.

In reading, "Union Station getting spruced up," March 5, in *The Herald-News*, I was most vexed and dismayed that large sums of money are available to renovate the "Old Union Station" in Joliet, with the state of Illinois providing a \$32 million grant for the project.

Renovation can be a meaningful project, but not before the means to provide for our families: food, shelter and clothing. Quinn proposes to eliminate nearly 3,000 middle class jobs by cutting prisons, parole agents, state police, mental health and developmental disability services. Compromising basic needs will adversely affect a

Elimination of these services will leave many already struggling families destitute. Cold concrete edifices may be in need of repair, but they do not suffer from hunger and deprivation.

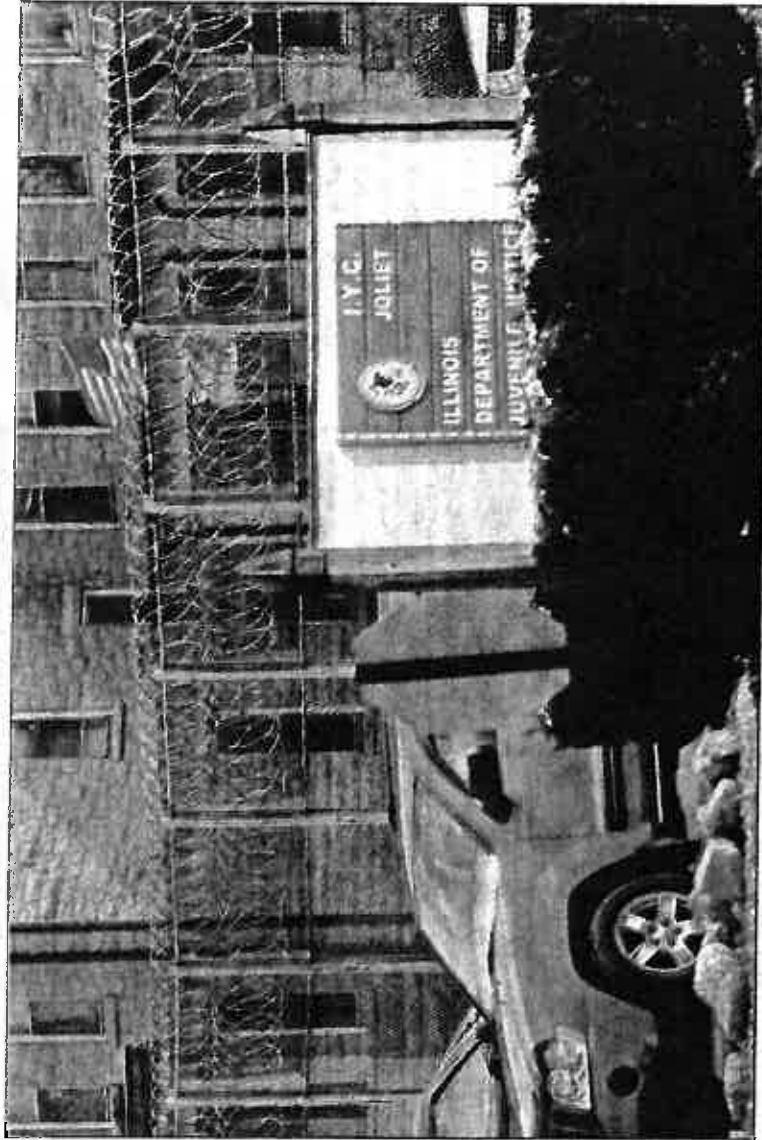
The true moral character of an individual, corporation or body of elected officials is shown by a sincere concern for the welfare of people, the fabric of any viable community. A community is not determined by cutting essential needs, but how well we can do with less in areas that will not cause detriment to indispensable services.

It is an easy task to eradicate services when speaking in general terms, but if reduced to a felon as your next door neighbor may be easier to fathom the distress created by an impulsive decision.

But, let us for the moment focus on at least one facility that will suffer a tremendous setback, not only to itself but to the very community in which it finds its host. The Illinois Youth Center of Joliet is listed as one facility to be scratched from existence.

In an interview with Sharon Konopka, a juvenile justice youth family specialist at IYC, remarked, "The youth center has been a great contributor to the economic welfare of Joliet, many of the employees reside within the area, closing the facility will increase the rate of unemployment."

She further stated, "Many here do not realize that the Department of Juvenile Justice is a caretaker of thousands of victims, as from

entity, apart from the Department of Corrections, providing a higher emphasis on rehabilitation than security exclusively. We are dedicated to instilling self esteem and a level of productivity in our youth that will ultimately lead to becoming contributing members of our society. She further stated, "Moving the youth farther south or to some other region would renege on victims' existence."

their immediate families, a cost and time factor too prohibitive for their means."

The human factor has not been given serious attention. The effect of moving youth will only add to their lack of stability. This is not rehabilitation, but another episode in their lives of further disappointment, of how their lives continue to be bereft of genuine concern and empathy. The employees of

the Joliet Youth Center have been most diligent and sincere in their concern for the residents of the center.

Despite the nature of crimes for which the residents have been contained, one prevailing thought provides continuous motivation: To save one life or soul is to save the whole world.

Is IYC-Joliet necessary? Plan to close it the focus of hearing

JOLIET — Lester Brown remembers beating the brush with a baton in a hunt for a juvenile inmate who had escaped from Illinois Youth Center-Joliet one day in the early 1980s.

The youth was waiting in the weeds with a gun he had stolen from a nearby house, Brown said. He and another guard searching the brush came close but did not find the escapee. He was found later, and Brown said he talked with the juvenile when he was back in IYC-Joliet.

“That kid said if we would have walked up on him we would have both been dead,” said Brown, who retired from IYC-Joliet in 2004 and now is an instructor in the criminal justice program at Joliet Junior College.

That escape and other incidents, including the killing of an IYC-Joliet employee by an inmate, led to the razor fence that surrounds the facility now, Brown said.

But the razor fence makes IYC-Joliet look more like a prison than a place of juvenile rehabilitation. Gov. Pat Quinn wants to close IYC-Joliet in part because it looks too much like a prison.

Public hearing Wednesday

Has Joliet become obsolete — no longer suitable for modern methods of incarcerating and rehabilitating young offenders? Or, is it needed more than ever as juvenile offenders become more violent?

Those questions are likely to loom large in the room on Wednesday, when a legislative panel holds a 10 a.m. public hearing at the Renaissance Center in Joliet to consider the future of IYC-Joliet.

“What the state is not letting the public know is they (IYC-Joliet) have kids who are doing 90 years, 99 years and 120 years,” Brown said. “If you move those kids to a less-secure facility, they would escape.”

That’s not the view from the administration of the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice, which runs the state’s eight youth centers.

The department’s website describes only Joliet as a maximum-security facility for male offenders.

But other facilities have maximum-security capabilities and handle the same kind of offenders in Joliet, said Kendall Marlowe, a spokesman for Juvenile Justice.

“There are multiple places that can take these youths,” Marlowe said. “Over time, different facilities have evolved so they can take different kinds of populations.”

Not only that, Marlowe said, but lesser juvenile offenders are more likely to be placed into a community program rather than being put into incarceration, which is opening up more room in the state’s youth centers.

The number of young offenders in Illinois Youth Centers in February was 1,075, Marlowe said. That’s down by 118 from a year ago and down 334 from five years ago.

"The population has been declining," Marlowe said. "And, it is a trend that we can expect to continue as we move to a model that is more rehabilitative."

A unique position?

The offenders in IYC-Joliet are more likely to require incarceration, Marlowe said. But there is plenty of room at the six other centers that will remain open if the governor's proposed cuts are enacted, he said. Quinn also has proposed closing Illinois Youth Center-Murphysboro.

"No one is suggesting that youth who are a danger to the community be back in the community," Marlowe said.

There is a basic disconnection between the official position at Juvenile Justice and what IYC-Joliet employees say repeatedly, and that argument is likely to be played out again at the hearing on Wednesday.

At a March 15 rally organized by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, which represents union workers at IYC-Joliet, employee after employee said the facility gets youths who are sent there after they cannot be controlled at other youth centers.

"There is a reason they are here," said Rosemary Bridges, a supervisor at IYC-Joliet. "When it comes to a point that they could not be controlled any longer, this is the end of the line."

Dear Director Bishop:

The State Facilities Closure Act states that: "No action may be taken to implement the recommendation for closure of a State facility until 50 days after the filing of any required recommendation." The recommendation for the Illinois Youth Center (IYC) at Joliet was filed on March 16, 2012. Accordingly, there should be no action performed to implement the recommendation for closure until May 5, 2012.

Potential violations of the State Facilities Closure Act were recently brought to our attention related to an emergency contract awarded by the Department of Juvenile Justice for work to be done at the IYC-St. Charles facility. In reviewing documents provided us, it does give the distinct impression that the work being done at IYC-St. Charles bears some correlation to the closure of IYC-Joliet.


In the justification for the original emergency contract for improvements at IYC-St. Charles dated March 7, 2012, the closure of IYC-Joliet is specifically cited as the reason for the relocation of 240 maximum-security recipients from IYC-Joliet to IYC-St. Charles. This relocation of youth offenders is articulated as the root cause that precipitates the need for upgrades and improvements at IYC-St. Charles in a timely manner.

While this contract was initiated prior to the filing of the recommendation for closure, emails associated with the contract reflect that amendments to the emergency contract were filed on March 22, 2012 -- during the time period where no actions should be taking place to implement the facility closure plan. Any upgrades or improvements at the IYC-St. Charles facility done under the emergency contract would also appear to violate the "no action" language of the State Facility Closure Act.


In reviewing the Department of Juvenile Justice's response to these claims, the Commission believes that even though improvements to IYC-St. Charles were long-standing requests, the work was directly initiated at this time due to the planned closure of IYC-Joliet. The Commission is disappointed in the Department's apparent disregard of the State Facility Closure Act as established in the emails between the Department of Juvenile Justice and the Capital Development Board that specifically reference the State Facility Closure Act timeline.

The Commission strongly urges the Department of Juvenile Justice to immediately cease all further activity related to the implementation of the facility closure of IYC-Joliet. Further activity by the Department in this manner, may precipitate additional action by the Commission.

Controversy swirls around St. Charles youth center work

SPRINGFIELD — As Gov. Pat Quinn prepares to close some Illinois youth centers that house juvenile offenders, the facility in St. Charles is slated for millions of dollars worth of upgrades to handle more than 100 new inmates he wants to transfer there.

But the state's largest employee union says the state shouldn't be planning such upgrades yet, as Quinn's plans aren't yet final.

With the governor's proposed closures of youth centers in Joliet and southern Illinois' Murphysboro, more than 100 prisoners would have to relocate. At least 132 prisoners from Joliet would be moved to Illinois Youth Center St. Charles, according to a state website announcing some of the upgrades.

To prepare for the influx of new inmates, six buildings at the Youth Center will need to be renovated, according to the website, including roof replacements, asbestos abatement, window installation and updating security systems.

Cost estimates and details about when construction would start are expected within the week, and work is expected to last several months, said Capital Development Board spokesman Dave Blanchette.

At this point, renovations are expected to cost \$4 million, including previous construction at the St. Charles facility in the last year.

"It's a 100-year-old facility, so the place needs work," Blanchette said.

But Anders Lindall, spokesman for the American Federation for State, County and Municipal Employees, said the construction is a violation of state law because the state can't start implementing facility closures until 50 days after they're announced. It hasn't been that long yet, Lindall said, calling the construction "blatant disregard" for the law.

Some Illinois lawmakers want Quinn's administration to stop construction, claiming it violates state law by closing state facilities, the Associated Press reported today.

The bipartisan Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability believes work on the Illinois Youth Center at St. Charles violates a requirement that the administration take no action to close a facility before announcing it.

But internal justice agency emails indicate the construction was sped up so the facility could accommodate 132 residents from Joliet, the bipartisan legislative commission said in a letter sent to Gov. Pat Quinn's administration this week.

STC youth center would gain 200 more inmates if Joliet facility closes

ST. CHARLES TOWNSHIP – A \$4 million plan to upgrade the Illinois Youth Center in St. Charles is on hold because its managing agency appears not to have followed state law, officials said.

At issue is the announced closure of the Illinois Youth Center at Joliet and the transfer of 200 of its 240 maximum-security inmates to St. Charles. St. Charles is a medium-security facility that would require upgrades to accommodate maximum-security inmates, said Dan Long, executive director of the Illinois Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability.

"The governor announced the closure of the Joliet center, which triggers the facility closure act," Long said. "There is not supposed to be any action until 60 days later and a public hearing and comment period."

Instead, the juvenile justice department was trying to get the work done at St. Charles on an emergency basis instead of regular bidding, Long said.

"They wanted emergency repairs and upgrades so they can bring in maximum-security individuals to St. Charles," he said. "They sent memos to the capital development board to get ready to transfer people from the facility in Joliet. It's a fairly clear violation of the act."

Long said purchasing officials with the capital development board agreed not to approve the emergency request for repairs the St. Charles facility.

"They claim that this stuff has been in works for along time – so how come it's on an emergency basis instead of the regular bid process?" Long said. "The question for the hearing is, why are you spending money in St. Charles to upgrade and move people from a facility in Joliet built to handle maximum-security individuals?"

A facility closure hearing on IYC-Joliet is scheduled for 10 a.m. Wednesday, at the Renaissance Center, 214 N. Ottawa St., Joliet. Anyone who wishes to give written or verbal testimony should contact Senior Analyst Ben Varner at 217-785-3208 or facilityclosure@ilga.gov.

Juvenile Justice spokesman Kendall Marlowe said while they do not believe the work at St. Charles violates the law, the work will not move forward until the matter is resolved.

"We fully respect the process," Marlowe said. "Much of this work has been a part of long-standing requests and involves matters beyond preparation for any maximum-security [inmates]. It's asbestos removal and roof repair."

According to a March 16 recommendation from Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice Director Arthur Bishop to Gov. Pat Quinn and the commission, the juvenile justice facilities have fewer youths and some facilities should be closed.

Closing Joliet would send 200 inmates to St. Charles, with 74 going to facilities at Kewanee and 36 to Chicago, according to Bishop's recommendation. This would result in 30 more staff at St. Charles, and five more each at Chicago and Kewanee. The total anticipated savings of closing Joliet would be nearly \$12 million.

Factors leading to that include an amendment to the Juvenile Court Act that went into effect this year requiring that courts incarcerate youth as a "last resort." That, combined with more programs aimed at diversion, have reduced the number in youth facilities to 1,021, down from 1,193 a year ago, according to the recommendation.

Still, the facilities closure law takes precedence. State Sen. Jeffrey Schoenberg D-Evanston, and State Rep. Patricia Belloc R-Westmont, chairman and co-chair of the Illinois Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability wrote a letter to Bishop on Tuesday alleging violations to state law.

"Nothing should be done until 50 days after notification of closure," Belloc said. "The governor has the power to close. We are the advisory group."

Belloc said it would make more sense to keep the Joliet facility open, since it already serves maximum security individuals, than spend money upgrading the St. Charles facility to serve the same purpose.

"It is important – especially for people in the area – for the closure or opening of a facility," Belloc said. "It is my strong concern that an emergency procurement process that is linked to a facility closure is a violation of the closure act."

Dorm 1 – 32 beds – 28 youth currently housed

11 youth facing felony adult time ranging from 6 to 28 years and will eventually be transferred to IDOC.

8 youth were negative transfers from other State Juvenile Institutions.

4 youth keep going to court fighting new charges.

Dorm 2- 94 beds – 66 youth (because of single bunk youth the bed space available is wrong). All youth in this dorm for the exception of 2 are fighting new adult charges ranging from drug possession to murder. The two youth housed here who are not fighting charges are here because are influential members of their STG and both displayed aggressive behavior towards youth and staff.

Some of these youth have been here at IYC 1-2 years fighting their charges. The family visiting them on the weekend is sometimes the only support that they have. On paper all these youth are Technical Parole Violators BUT WITH PENDING ADULT CHARGES. Some will finish their court cases while here and eventually be transferred to IDOC. Others will keep fighting their new charges until their 21st birthday and will eventually be transferred back to Cook County and continue fighting their cases from there.

Dorm 4 – Bed project going on

Dorm 5 – closed used as inventory overflow for bed project and roof project. Toxics are being temporary kept here instead of dorm 6 basement.

Dorm 3 - 72 beds – 65 youth

Approximately 30 youth are dorm 2 over flow that are younger in age less influential and aggressive.

12 youth doing Felony Adult time ranging from 1 to 28 years.

3 youth incarcerated for a Juvenile murder

2 youth labeled as violent offenders

17 youth are negative transferred from other State Juvenile Institutions

This dorm is unique that it houses dorm 2 over flow, youth from other counties fighting cases, technical parole violators and negative transfers from other institutions and youth facing adult time just waiting to be transferred to IDOC.

Dorm 6 – 30 beds - 20 youth

7 are negative transfers from other institutions (drug treatment) and program helps them in dealing with set time and other personal issues. And part of their condition of parole is finishing drug treatment.

Dorm 7 – Confinement – time out

Dorm 8 – 32 beds – 27 youth

A wing – Disciplinary problems / staff assaulters

B and C wing - 15 youth are returnees, 4 youth are former consent decree youth (dorm 2)

Dear Sir/Ma'am,

The closure of IYC-Joliet will not be a wise and rational decision. Closing IYC- Joliet will be equivalent to the early release program that allowed many adult inmates to be released early several years ago.

Placing the young male offenders in less secure facilities will only put the less-aggressive youths in danger. Young men at IYC-Joliet are youths with High-Profile cases; many of the male offenders are facing felony time. The placement of Maximum Security male offenders with medium/minimum youths will affect the dynamics of the group setting balance.

Not only does placing these male offenders in less-secured facilities present a safety concern, it also presents an economical issue. Many of these offenders, approximately 60-75% of the youths are consent decree youths. Therefore, they are fighting cases that may render sentences of up to life sentences.

With that being said, placing youths at IYC- Kewanee which is 2 ½ hours away from Cook County Court house (26th and California) is an economic decision the state cannot afford at this time.

Relocating these youths at other facilities will create an economical problem in addition to a safety issue. The safety issue is the increased time that will be spent traveling to the various Court writs. In order to get from Harrisburg to any Cook County Court, the writ will have to leave at (approx. 2 A.M.), earlier during inclement weather. The return writ could possibly return to the facility at (approx. 2 A.M.), if the youths' case is before the judge at 1 P.M. The majority of the courts begins session at 10 A.M.; unlike state-wide transportation court writs requires one-on-one supervision. During any particular week IYC-Joliet transports 25- 40 youths to court and on some days up to 10 youths. These numbers are due to the consent decree order, by Judge George M. Marovich, (No. 74 C 2949), dated Oct. 30, 2003.

The tremendous amount of over-time with transporting these youths to court daily will create another financial problem. If these youths are housed at IYC-Harrisburg the department will not have the luxury to utilized Graham Correctional Center as the mid-way point to received youths on transfer. This is a practice that is presently being used. If this practice is used the state will have to pay for staff who are traveling from the Northern region to provide escorts for each individual youth. In most cases more senior staff is utilized on writs due to their experience with handling the aggressive population of youths.

Attached you will find two lists that contains names of inmates who were housed at IYC-Joliet prior to being sentenced to IDOC. The lists are broken-down into two categories: those serving time ranging from 1-10 years, and the other (10 years up to life). While at IYC-Joliet, these inmates were identified as consent decree youths. Let it be known that it is an abbreviated listing.

In closing the employees at IYC-Joliet would greatly appreciate your time in reconsidering closing IYC-Joliet.

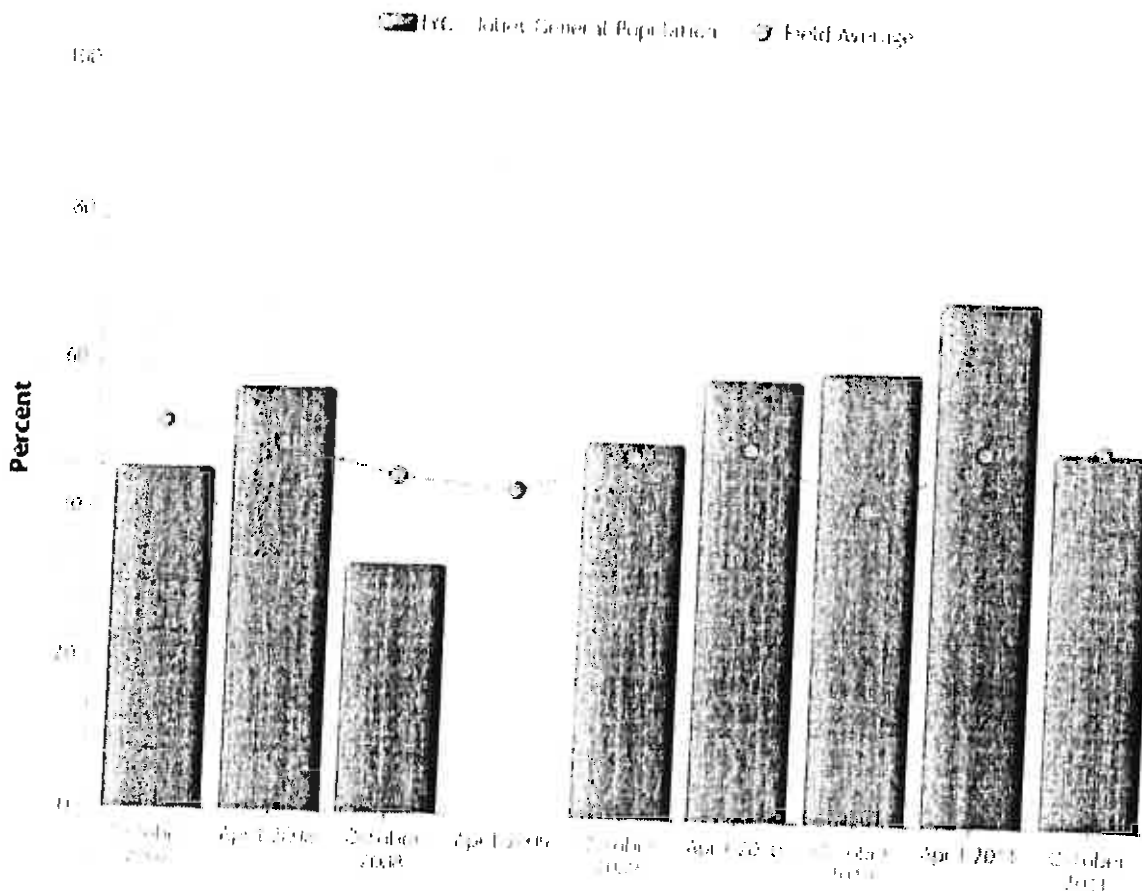

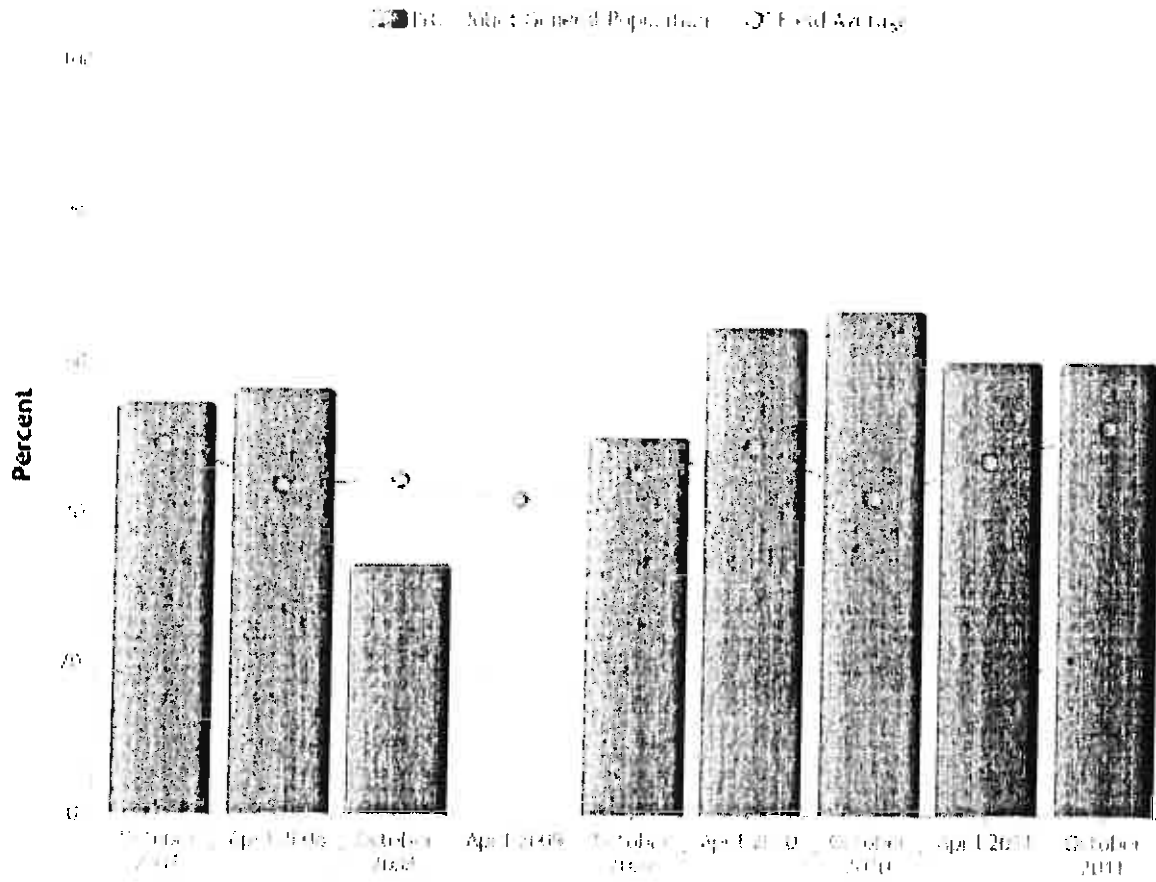

Percent of available population that has completed the program (IYC - Joliet General Population) compared to field average



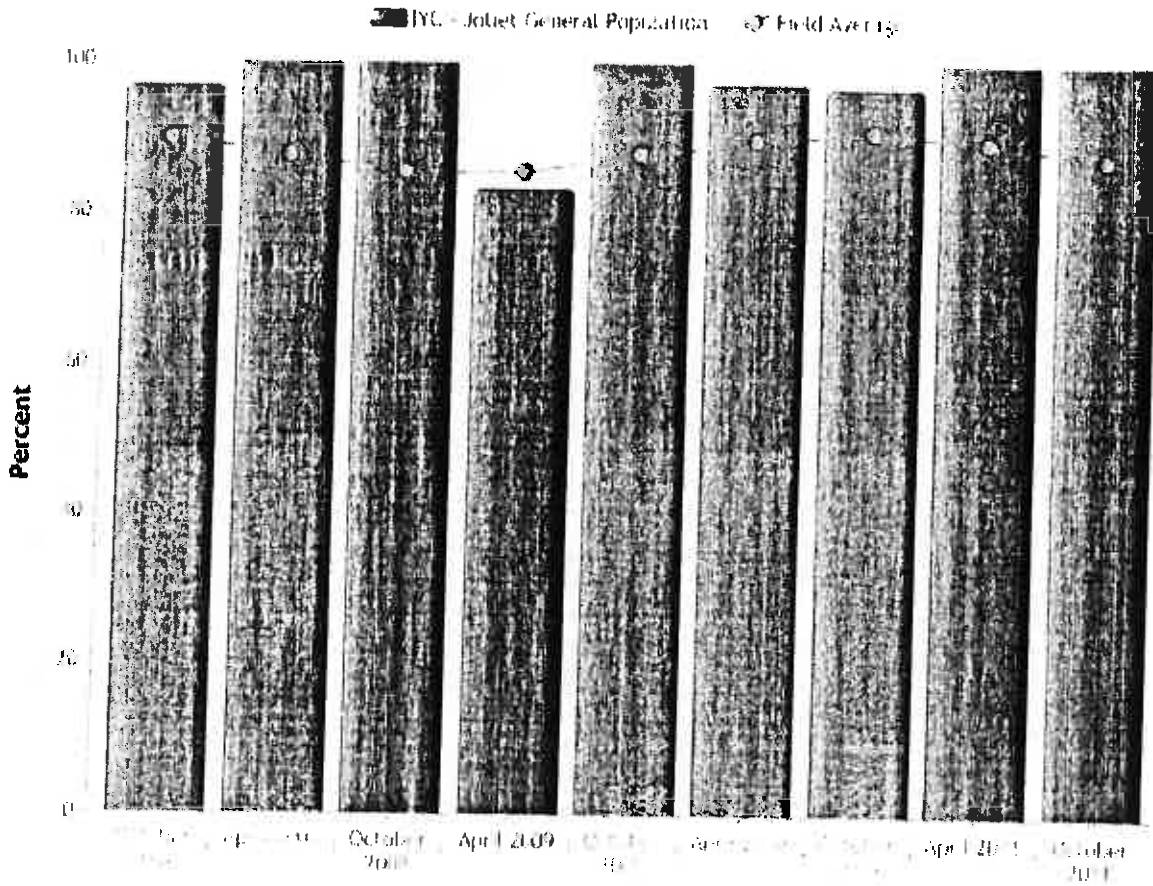

Percent of the population that has a high school diploma or GED, by race/ethnicity, sex, age, marital status, and disability



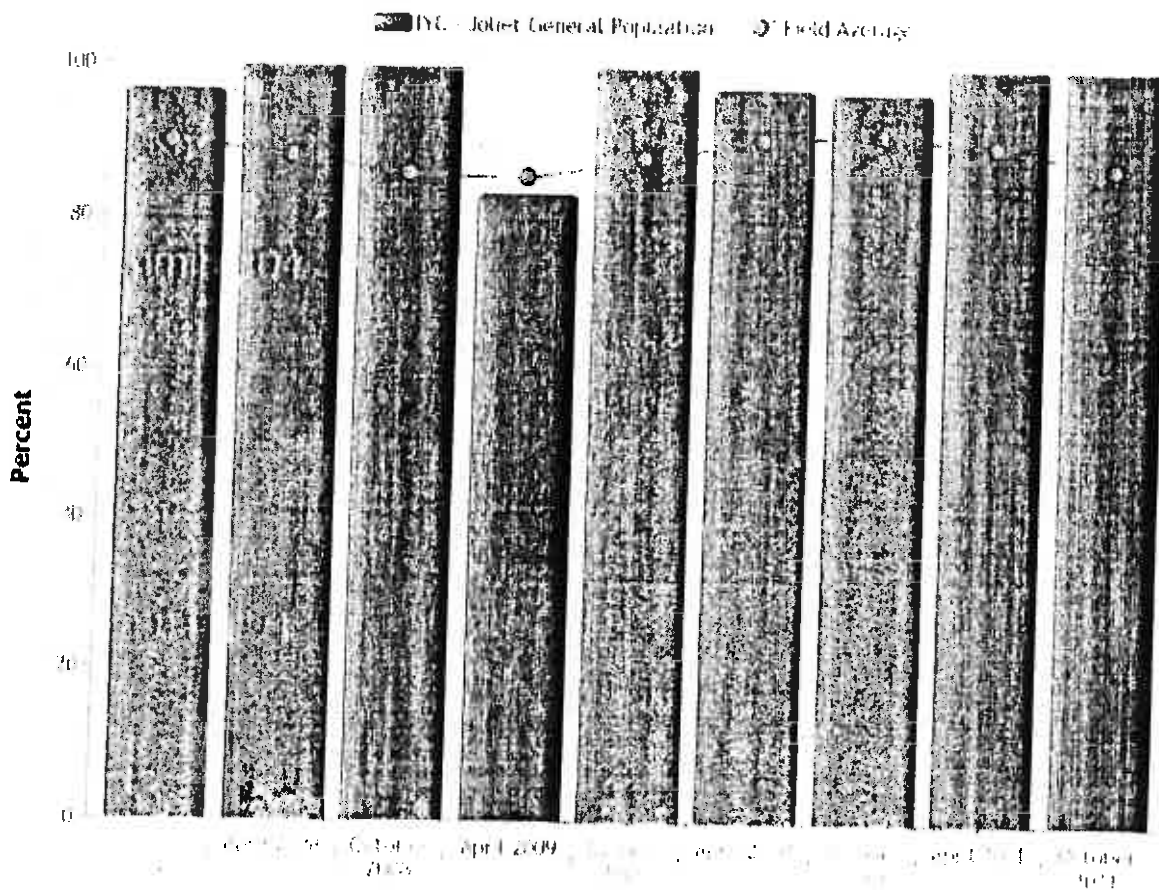

Percent of youths whose answers indicate that they received a math test



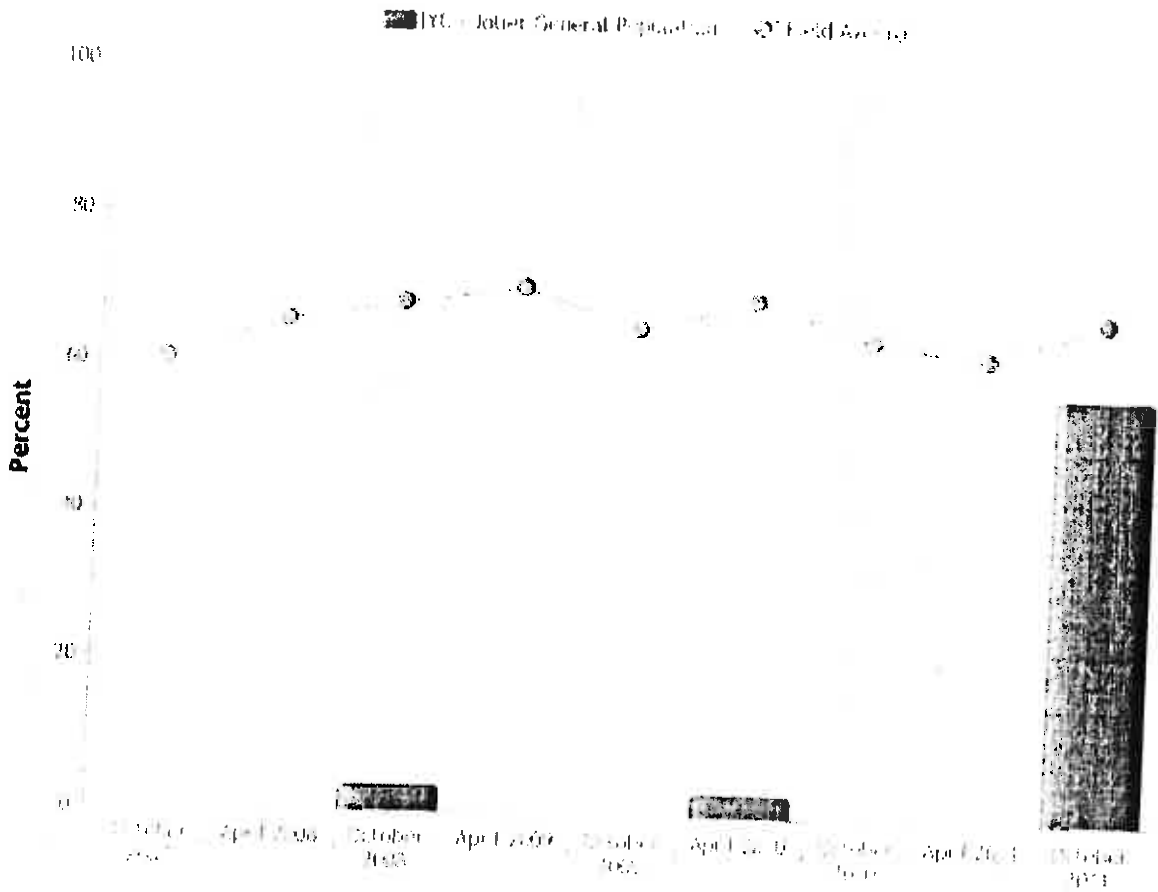

Percent of year 1 students who indicate that they receive a reading list



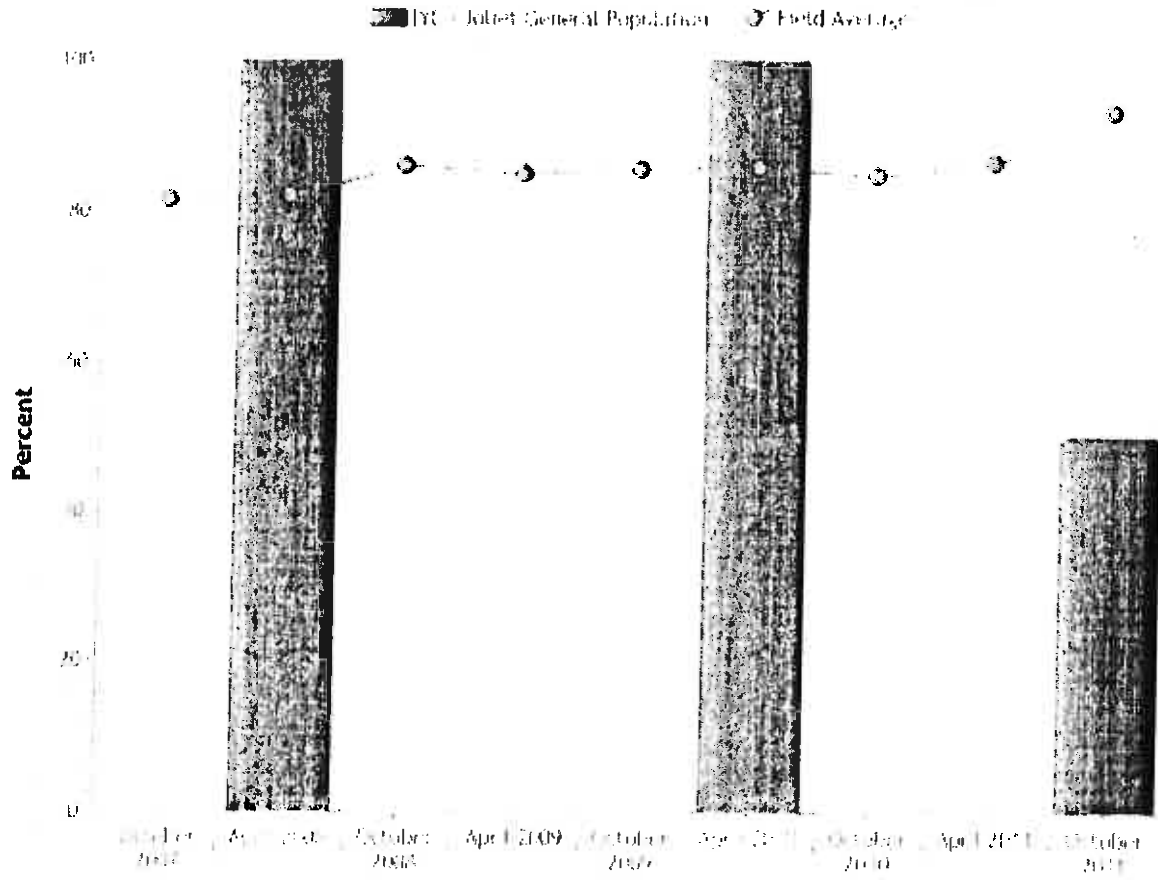

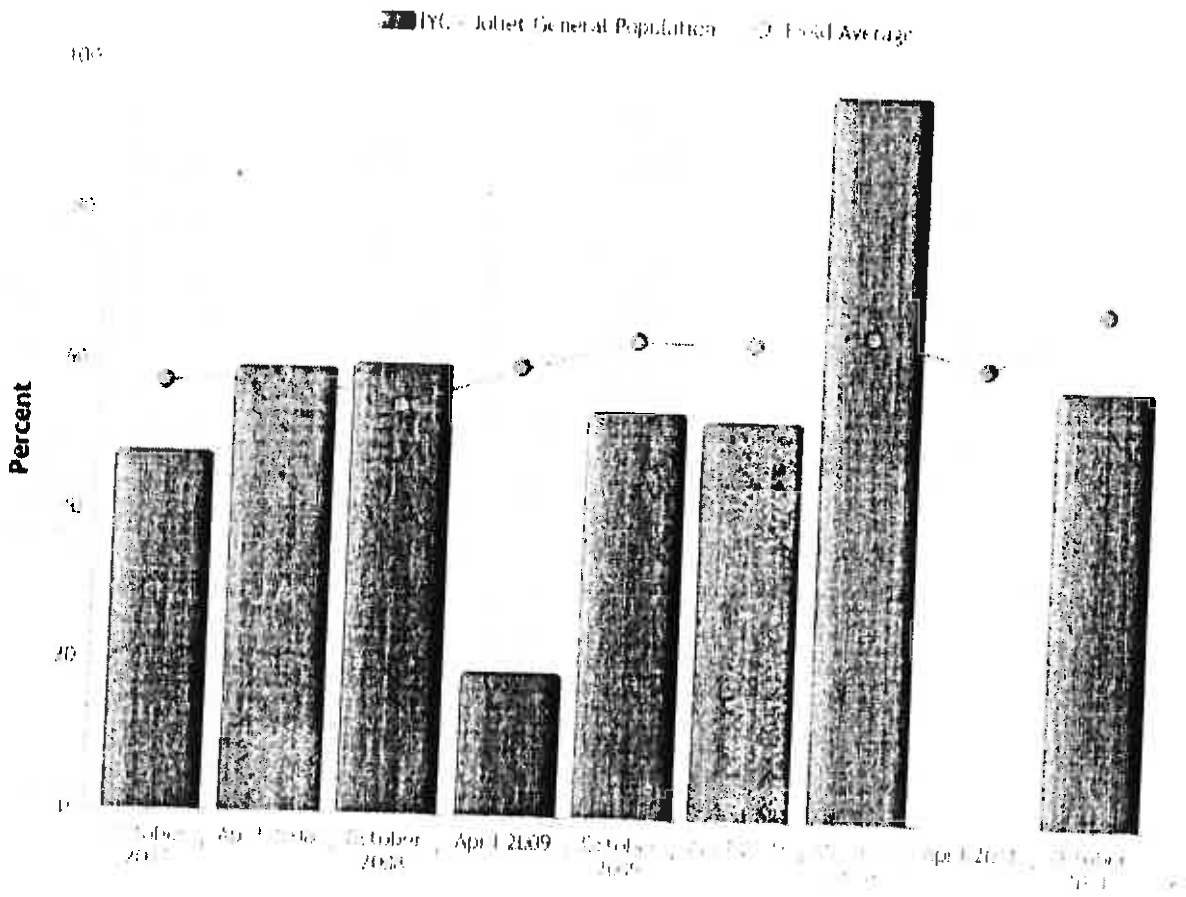
Percent of youth retained for more than 60 days whose records indicate that they received the vocational skills program as prescribed by the individual treatment plan.

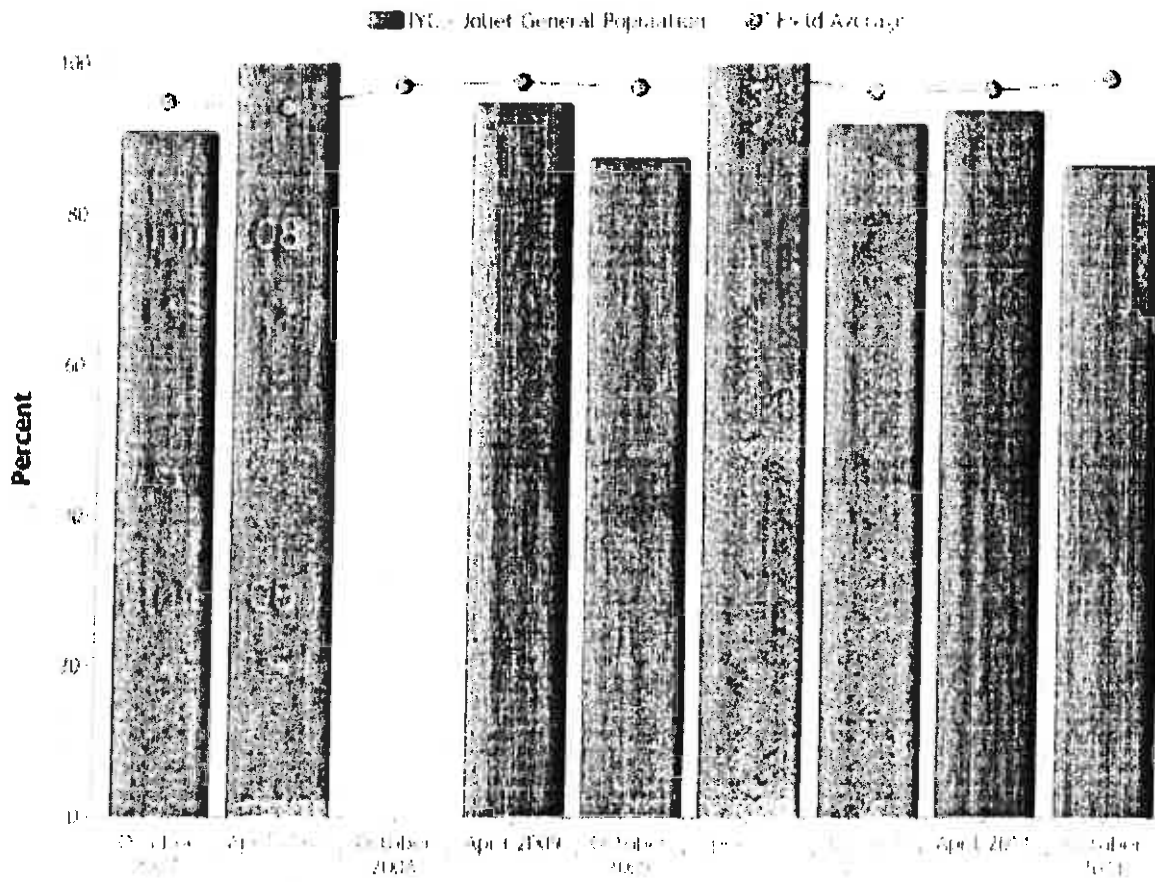
Percent of youths completed more than 60 days of school/vocational skills training

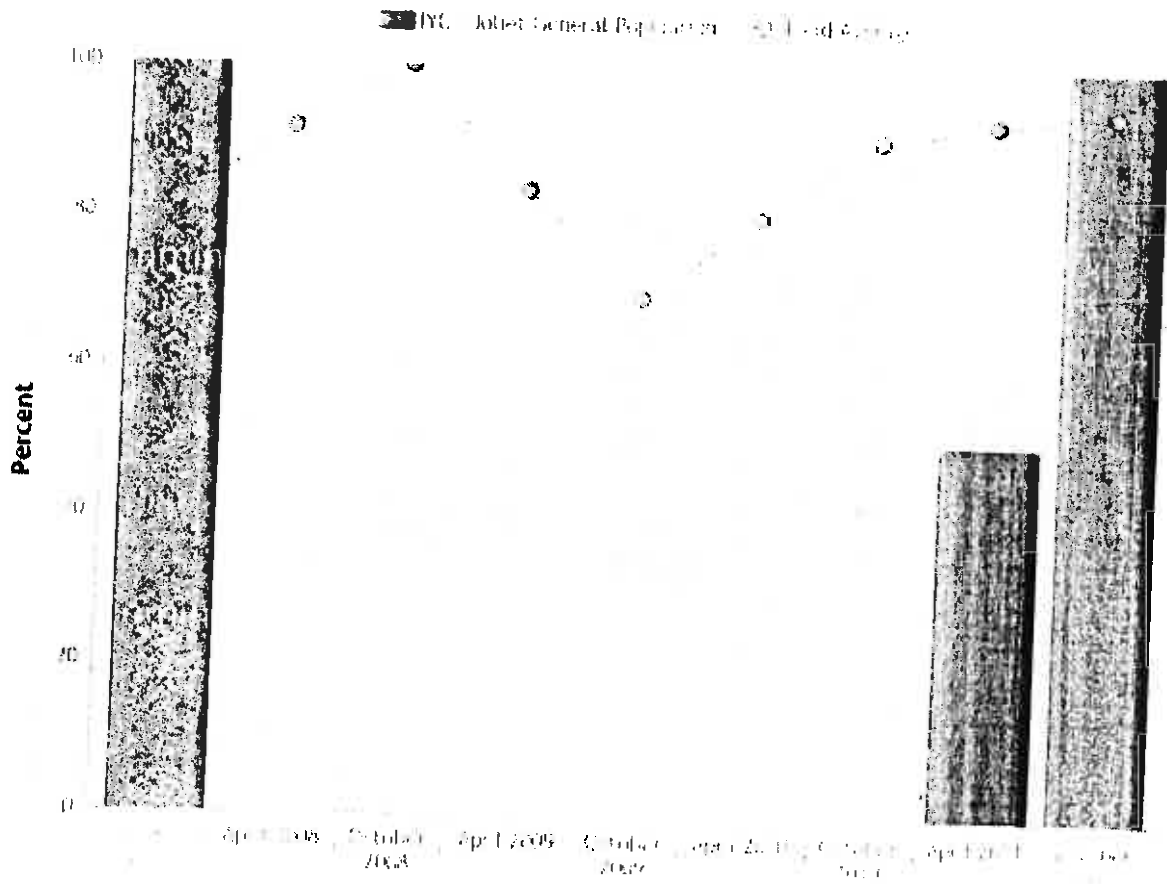

Percent of year-rounders (180 or more days whose records reflect that they received the educational programming) compared to individual treatment plans.



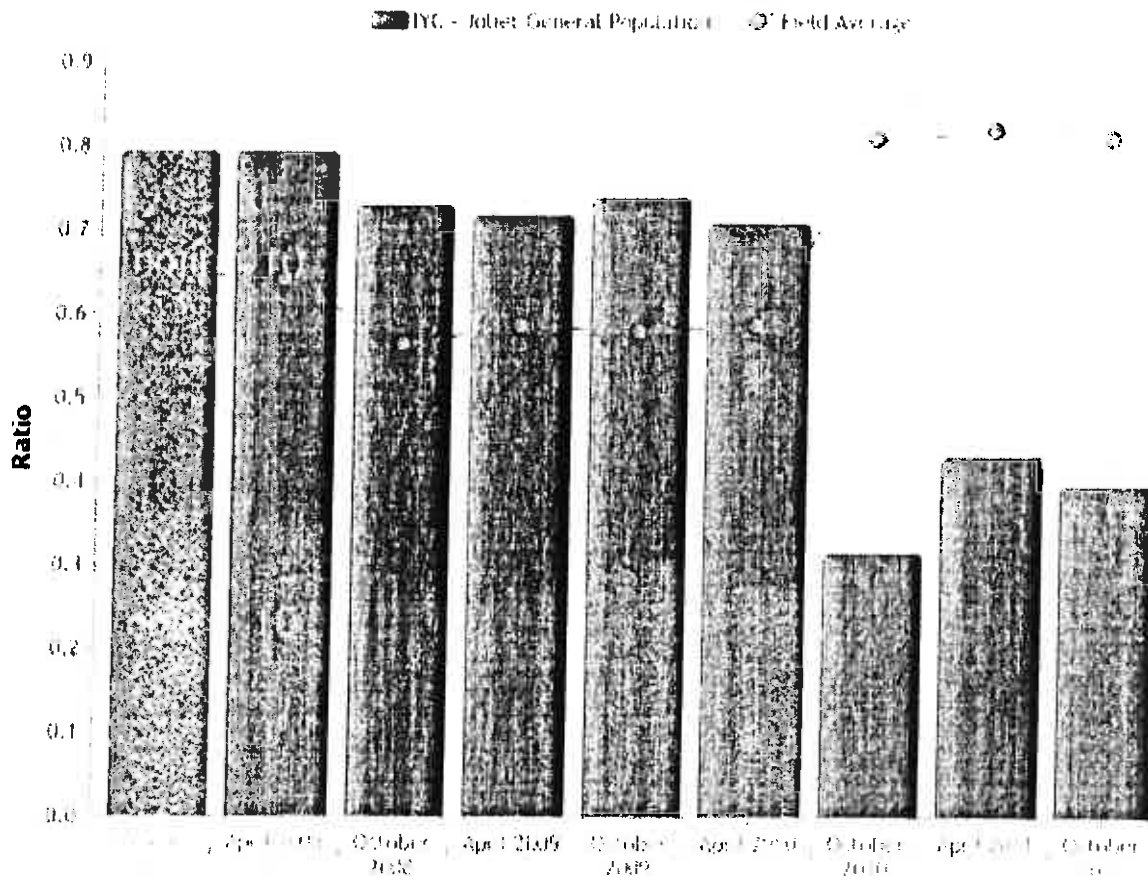

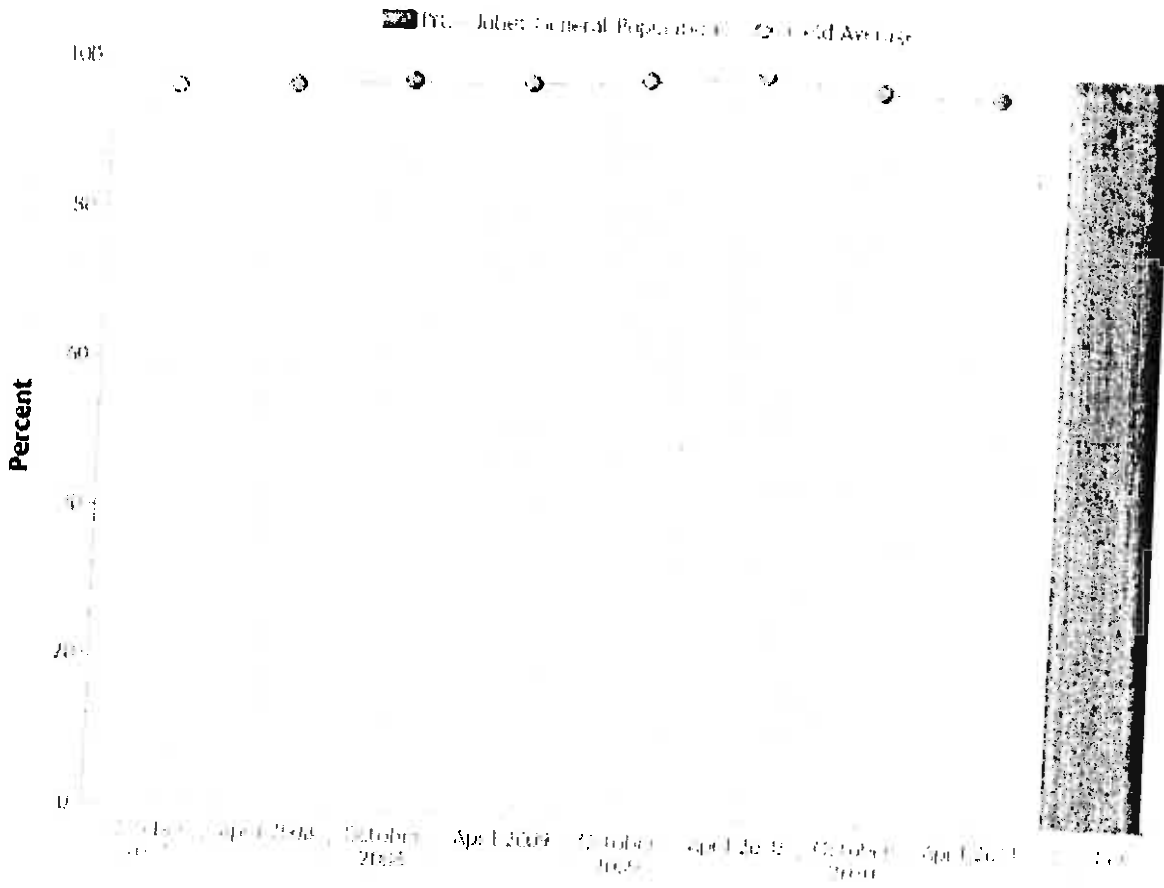

Percent of viewers who watched for more than 60 days whose household has a member who has a mental health condition.



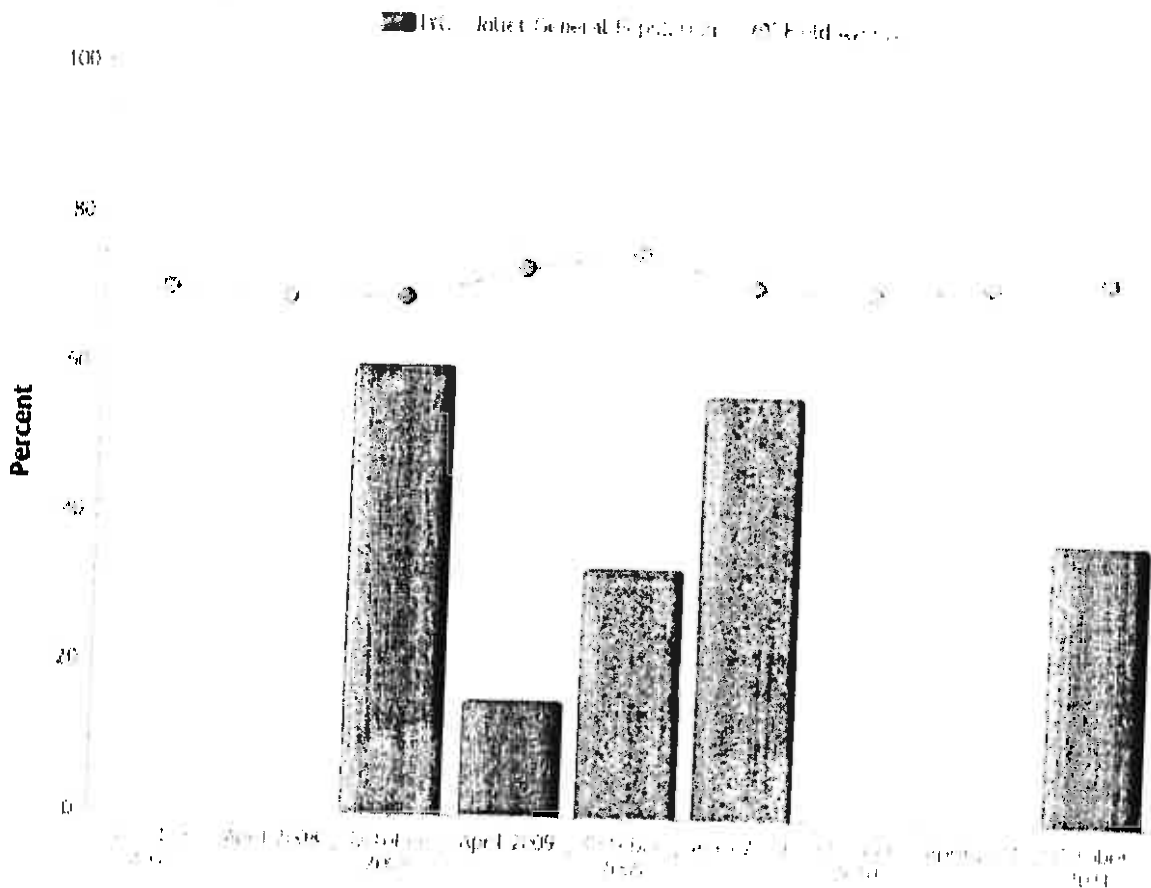

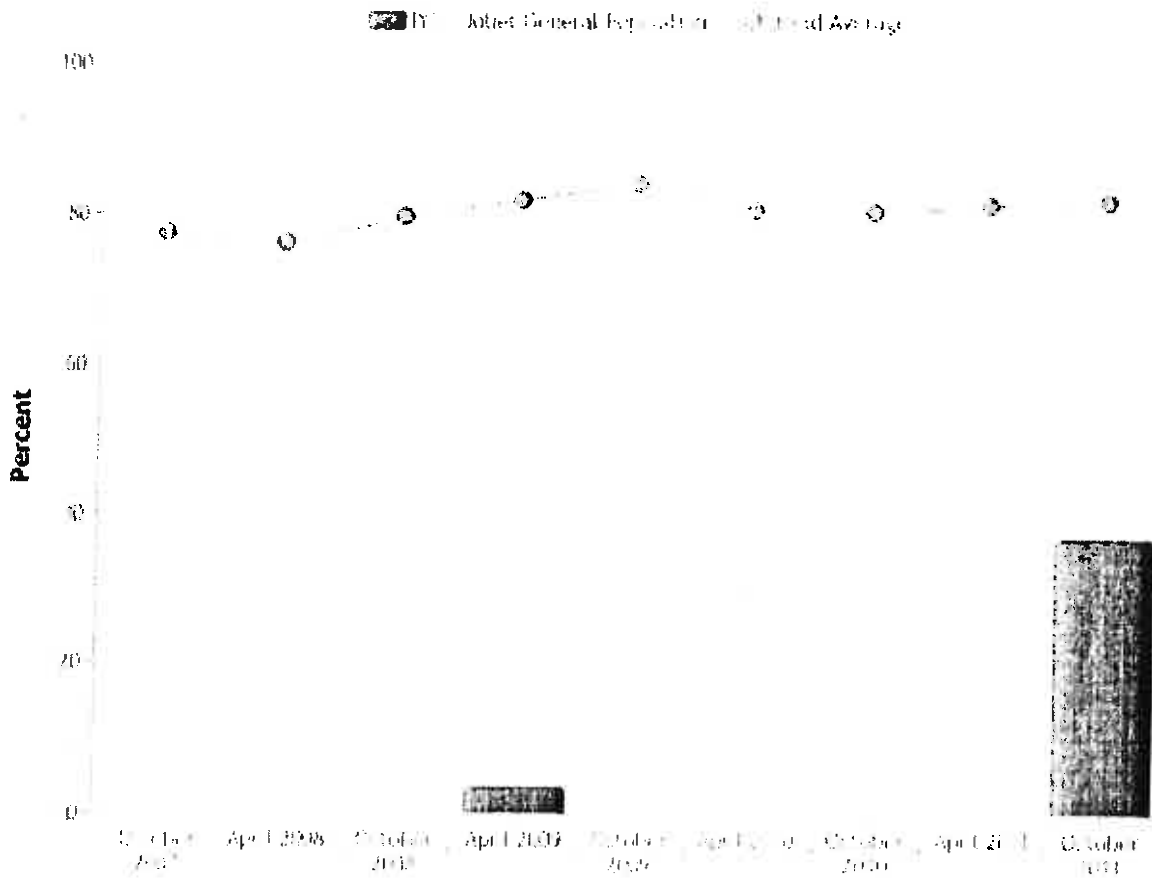

Percent of respondents who completed the survey for more than 60 days



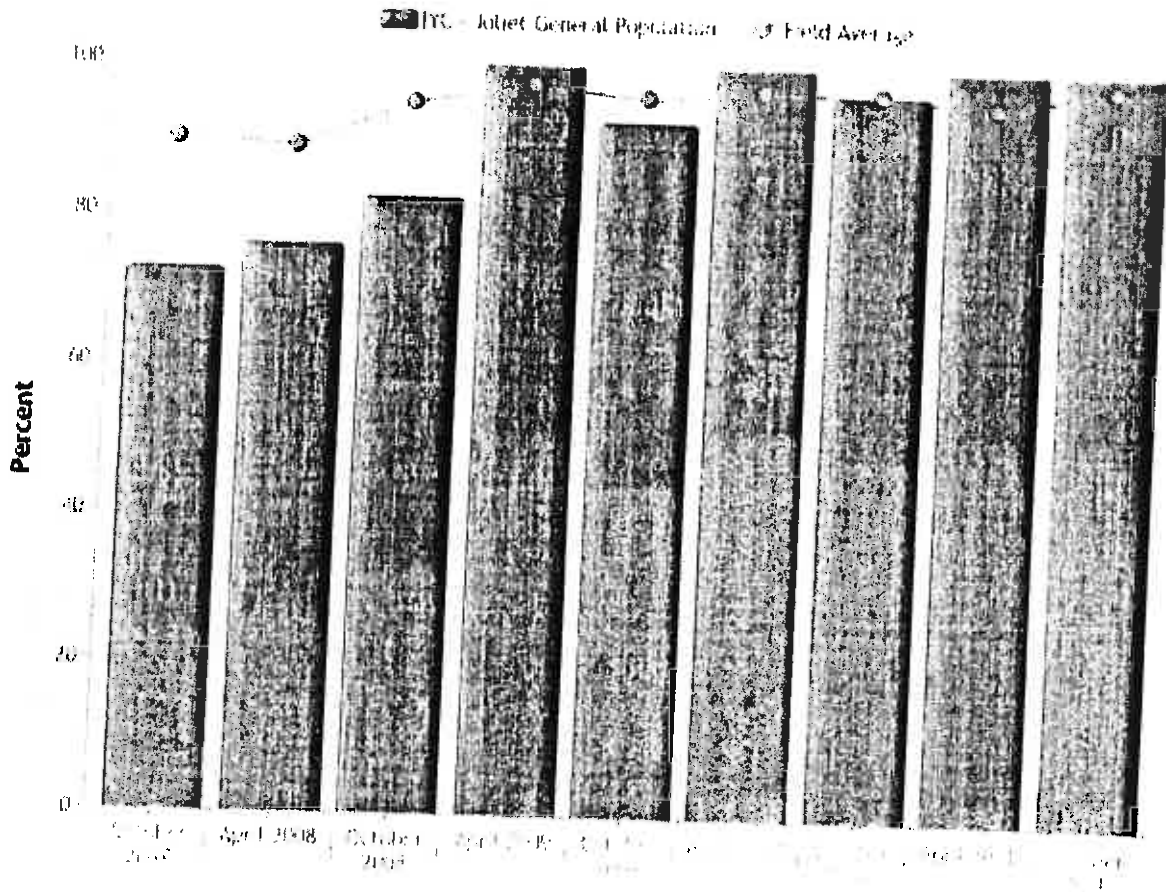

Percent of respondents who indicated that they have used a programming language that was not taught by a trained instructor



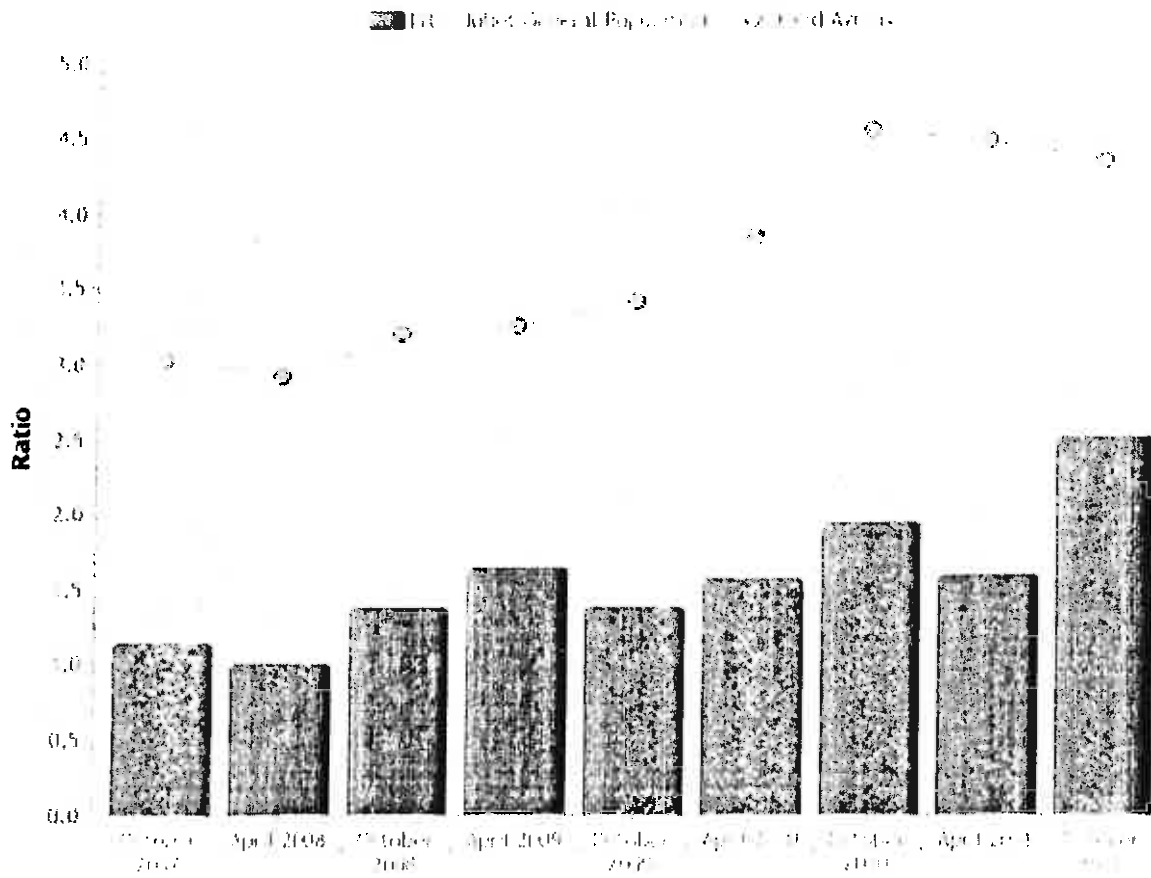

Percent of youth as defined for more than 30 days whose records are in a crisis intervention treatment plan, signed by youth and the responsible staff member



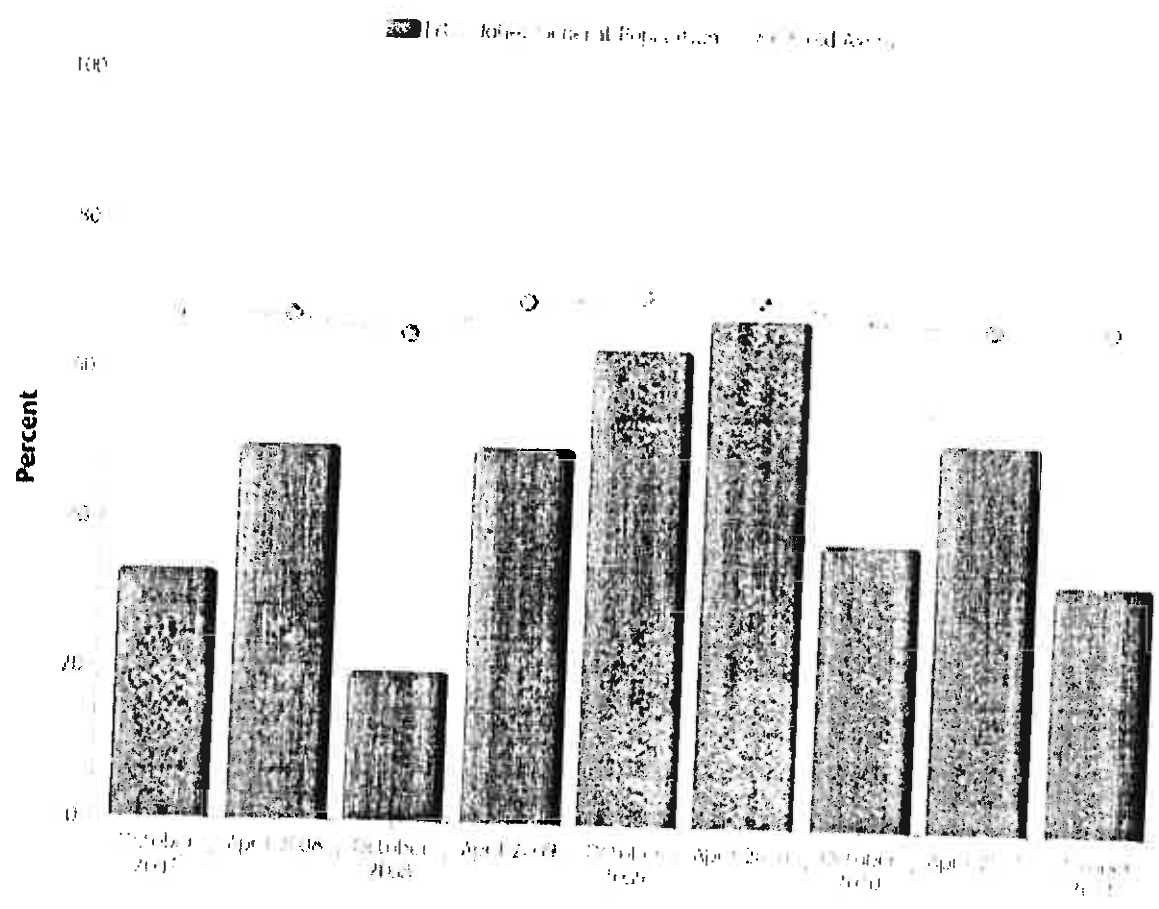

This is Troy Johnson, Chief Engineer at IYC Joliet. I have put together a short list of mechanical Upgrades and the condition of infrastructure, here at IYC Joliet,

With the Governor and Legislators faced with difficult decisions concerning closings in the upcoming months, I would hope that all the Pros and Cons will be measured before an educated decision can be made.

I am only providing truthful information, of which I feel I am the expert and the most qualified person to communicate these facts. I have the up most respect and confidence in the Governor that given the proper information, he and the legislature will make a sound decision.

I suspect that you have the ear of the Governor, and I am asking that you forward this information to him for his consideration.

IYC JOLIET Infrastructure

~ A complete underground sewer upgrade along with a bar screen building was finished in 1997.

~ New underground water lines and fire hydrants were added in 1995.

~A new addressable Fire alarm system with fiber optic communication was installed in 1998.

~The entire facility has fiber optic communication and cat 5 cabling for Lans computers.

~An electrical upgrade complete with underground cabling, new transformers, switchgear and a back up generator that will provide power to the facility automatically during power outages was complete in 1997

~ A new school, complete with vocational studies and G.E.D Academic accreditation which includes 21 classrooms, a library, computer lab, and offices.(1989)

~Two new living units with 96 beds along with ancillary and a gym were built in 1998.

~ 2.4 million dollars in new roofs were added to all the older living units, the gym and maintenance building. 2006 and 2012

~All the living units have been equipped with new hang proof furniture which is 75% complete and will be finished by next month. \$700,000 (2012)

~We have replaced 16 Heating and Air units in the last 9 years, all other units have new heat exchangers which doubles their life expectancy.

~We have, over the years removed a large portion of adult-like prison bars and continue to remove as time permits, in order to provide a more suitable environment for the young, incarcerated youth we serve.

~We are 97% asbestos free and have no asbestos in any of the living units which cannot be said for St. Charles.

~St. Charles had 5 buildings condemned last year! Millions are needed there to upgrade the physical plant, including boilers and mechanical upgrades.

~Our budget for repair and maintenance is a mere \$40,000 for parts and \$ 46,000 for contractual. I am sure that is much less than St. Charles.

~With minimal funds, Dorm 5 could be opened in the upcoming months, pushing our capacity to 448.

~We are constructed for maximum security youth, but can house medium security as well. We are the only Maximum security youth facility in the state.

In closing, I, Deputy Director Smith, Warden Rita, B/A Obradovich, and others have made fiscally sound decisions to decrease our spending without jeopardizing the integrity of our physical plant. I would hate to see those efforts go to waste. The amount of money spent on improvements and the integrity of IYC Joliet only makes it more valuable, and closing it seems fiscally irresponsible in itself.

Don't let the "on the surface" appearance of the old brick mislead you in to thinking the place is falling apart, I am confident that the physical structure at IYC Joliet is in as good of condition or better than most state facilities and has a very, very long life expectancy.

In light of the recent announcement by Governor Quinn, I feel it is important for all of us to review the major accomplishments that, together, we achieved here at IYC-Joliet since the establishment of the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice.

IYC-Joliet has been a consistent leader among juvenile institutions in advancing the fundamental philosophy that created IDJJ. A philosophy that believes in the individual care of our youths by highly trained staff with the purpose of protecting public safety by reducing the rate of recidivism. IYC-Joliet has been proud to work with some of the most severely behaviorally challenged juveniles in the state who, either through an extensive past history or a recent traumatic event at another facility, has been assigned to our care and custody. We, at IYC-Joliet, have monitored, tutored, worked with, and improved behavior that routinely exhibits high levels of aggression and negative behavior. Through the efforts of our very dedicated and highly trained staff we have been successful with improving the overall attitude and behavior of our youth in an effort to instill the self esteem and skills necessary to become productive citizens.

Although we are assigned the responsibility of working with the state's highest at risk youth population, IYC-Joliet has dramatically lowered employee assaults, youth assaults, youth fights, use of force, use of restraints and use of confinement. We, recently, formed a committee of security, clinical and management staff to identify the high risk indicators that lead to serious acts of violence for the purpose of de-escalating and stabilizing those factors before the act occurs; thereby reducing the chance of injury by both youth and staff while eliminating the need to negatively sanction those most serious offenses by reducing the likelihood for them to occur. This type of proactive stance is exactly what the philosophy of our agency was created for and is dedicated to while rejecting the old reactive and punitive philosophy of the past.

As we continue during the upcoming days it is vitally important that we do not abandon these ideals. Instead, IYC-Joliet should be proud of its early accomplishments and continue to strive to remain a viable asset of the juvenile rehabilitation system.

Although IYC-Joliet is committed to the continual improvement for such a vitally important role in juvenile justice, it's important to highlight the positive strides we have initiated. As the Superintendent of IYC-Joliet, I am proud of all that we have accomplished. I remain hopeful that we can continue to work together to improve the conditions of the juvenile justice system and improve the overall care of our youth.

Dear Governor Pat Quinn:

I currently have a family member incarcerated at IYC-Joliet. I have recently learned of your proposal to close this facility. I would like to ask you to reconsider your proposal. This closure would cause my family to endure both emotional and financial hardship. I will no longer be able to visit with my family member, which is an essential component in rehabilitation for my family member as well as to keep the family relationship in tact. I believe that if family is not able to visit with each other, this will cause deterioration in the family structure. The proposed move to another facility will cause an economic hardship, as transportation is not readily available to those locations.

I believe the staff at IYC-Joliet has taken a special interest in the rehabilitation of my family member by encouraging him to do better, to be better and to realize although he may have made poor choices in his past, his future, with the right determination can remain positive. They have encouraged him to grow as an individual and to seek better opportunities upon his release.

In closing, I would remind you that the concept of IDJJ was to reunite and continue to work on family relationships as well as encouraging the youth through programs, counseling and interaction with staff to become productive members of their community. The proposed closing of IYC-Joliet does not support the concept of IDJJ.



IYC-JOLIET is the only Maximum Security Prison for young adult male juveniles. The youth population at IYC-Joliet consists of violent offenders, negative transfers and the most severe behavior challenged youth in the State of Illinois. IYC-Joliet is also the parent facility for all Cook County Consent Decree youth. This population are facing charges such as murder, criminal sexual assault, battery with great bodily harm, gun charges etc. Youth at IYC-Joliet are not "adaptable" to community placement. In addition these youth are repeat offenders who have exhausted all avenues of services available before finally committed to the Illinois Juvenile Justice Department.

The staff at IYC-Joliet are a dedicated and professional group of individuals who have adapted to the concepts and mission statement of IDJJ. Although they work with the most violent and behaviorally challenged youth in the State of Illinois, the staff is dedicated to encouraging the youth to be better, to want better and to understand the mistakes in the past do not need to define who they are going to be. Youth at IYC-Joliet benefit from one on one counseling, group programs and participation, Mental Health Services, Academic Programming, Spiritual guidance and a staff that is dedicated to helping them grow in a positive manner.

Statement to the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability on Governor Quinn's proposal to close Illinois Youth Center Joliet

The Illinois budget must be both fiscally and socially responsible. As we tighten the belt, we must protect the core services the State of Illinois provides to its residents. Public safety is a paramount core service. The Governor's proposal to close Illinois Youth Center Joliet threatens public safety and poses far-reaching dangerous effects.

Illinois Youth Center (IYC) Joliet is our state's only maximum security facility for young male offenders. IYC residents are guilty of the most serious crimes. Some will proceed to Illinois' adult prisons when they "age out" of IYC. Some have come to IYC Joliet as "negative transfers" after endangering staff and residents at other Department of Juvenile Justice facilities. And forty-six percent of the current residents at IYC Joliet are "consent decree youths," juvenile-parole violators awaiting charges as adults in Cook County.

Governor Quinn's rationale for closing IYC Joliet is that "the physical structure is the least rehabilitative ... in the system." This is a simplistic view of the reality of IYC Joliet. On my visits to the facility, I have observed a dedicated, skilled staff providing a variety of rehabilitative services to a most challenging population. IYC Joliet has an effective substance abuse program which the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) plans to fund when current federal funding ends. IYC Joliet contains a high school, provides GED courses, and offers vocational apprenticeships, all to a population of which 60% are special education students.

The utility of IYC Joliet's proximity to Chicago cannot be overstated. Eighty-five percent of IYC Joliet youths are from Cook County. DJJ asserts that it is ideal to keep incarcerated youths as close to home as possible in order to make family visits feasible and frequent. The Governor proposes moving IYC Joliet residents to IYC Kewanee and IYC Harrisburg. The distance from Joliet to Kewanee is 112 miles, a drive of nearly two hours. Joliet to Harrisburg is 320 miles, a drive of five hours and forty minutes. Closing IYC Joliet and transferring these youths farther downstate would make family visits less likely and remove a crucial component in improving behavior and promoting rehabilitation.

Consent decree youths, whose population DJJ states remains stable at approximately 90 to 100 each month, must be transported from IYC Joliet to Cook County courtrooms. At least twenty youths are driven there by IYC staff each week. Moving these youths out of the metropolitan area would raise travel costs, lengthen the time staff is away from IYC Joliet, and increase the possibility of incidents en route.

I respect the Governor's good intentions toward the people of Illinois. However, the proposal to close IYC Joliet appears to be rushed, haphazard, and narrowly focused on bricks and mortar. It fails to recognize the type of youths incarcerated at IYC Joliet, the staff expertise and effective programs there, and the benefits of IYC Joliet's location. I encourage the DJJ to find cost savings and program improvements within the system which strengthen, rather than weaken, public safety and long-term efforts to turn young offenders away from a life of crime.

For all these reasons, I respectfully urge the members of this commission to reject the Governor's proposal to close Illinois Youth Center Joliet.

Dear Governor Quinn,

There is no question that you have a strong history of being a friend and supporter for the City of Joliet. Thanks to you, we have received a \$32 million dollar grant for the high-speed rail transportation center. You have delivered funding for the Arsenal Road interchange and the Illiana Expressway study. You have also taken a firm stand against slot machines at the race tracks. Today, however, I am writing to strongly object to your recent proposal to close the Illinois Youth Center in Joliet -- the state's only youth center for maximum security male offenders.

The IYC currently houses approximately 230 youths, all of whom have a "Level 1" security designation. They need a higher level of oversight either because of the type of crimes they committed, or the behavior toward other youths and staff in a less secure youth center.

85% of the Joliet IYC's population is age 17 or older. Approximately 15% have committed felonies including murder and attempted murder. Placing these older and more dangerous youths in a less secure facility with younger offenders is a recipe for disaster.

It is important to note that IYC Joliet delivers proven results. Recent data shows above average performance in the facility's education program with youths confined for over 6 months improving their math and reading scores between admission and discharge.

Most importantly, closing IYC Joliet will result in the elimination of 227 employees in our city that is already reeling from the economy as well as the negative impact of additional gaming licenses throughout the state, local casino staff layoffs and a severe decrease in Joliet's portion of the gaming taxes.

I urge you to please withdraw your proposal to close the Illinois Youth Center in Joliet and ask that you contact me personally to further discuss this critical issue.

I represent the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 263, a fraternal organization representing approximately 1000 correctional professionals from across the state. FOP Lodge 263 strongly opposes Gov. Quinn's plans to shut down this center. IYC Joliet houses some of the most dangerous juvenile criminals in the State including many that have been sentenced as adults or have pending criminal cases in adult courts. Moving these juveniles to other youth centers, that are not equipped and lack the experience of dealing with such offenders, increases the risk to staff as well as to the facility population.

The proposed closure also threatens remaining youth centers. Discipline at other centers could be adversely affected due to a lack of transfer options. In any correctional system, it is important to have maximum-security facilities such as IYC Joliet to deal with those residents at other institutions that cannot be managed effectively in less secure environments. Closure of this facility removes this as a management tool. Decreased discipline results in an atmosphere that is not conducive to rehabilitation.

For the past ten years, I have worked as a parole agent supervising juvenile offenders in Will and Cook County. The parole population has grown increasingly more difficult to manage due to shorter incarceration times and reluctance to return youth as violators. Closure of this facility will only exacerbate the problem. In the interest of public safety, the members of Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 263 urge you to vote no on this proposal.
