Tuition & Fees: This reflects the current tuition & fee the student will be charged. The OTD Hybrid program does not differentiate between in state and out-of-state students for tuition purposes.

Health Insurance – The figure provided is the current annual cost of the MUSC student health insurance plan. All MUSC students are required to maintain health insurance and this cost is automatically charged each semester. If you already have health care coverage through other sources, you must complete the online waiver process by the advertised deadline to remove the insurance charge from your bill.

Housing/Food & Transportation - Traditionally this is the amount calculated for food, rent and utilities during the months in which a student in a residential program is enrolled. Students enrolled in a Hybrid pathway program can utilize these funds for costs associated with travel to Charleston for immersive sessions (transportation & local accommodations) as well as cost of living expenses.

Personal / Misc. – The estimated cost calculated by the Office of Financial Aid for miscellaneous personal expenses such as laundry, medical expenses, clothing, haircuts, telephone, and other utilities, etc.

Books & Required Expenses: This total includes the estimated cost for books, supplies, and some additional travel as well as an average amount the Office of Financial Aid has determined appropriate to include. Examples of supplies and required expenses include a laptop purchase, scrubs for lab experiences and clinical sites, and National Board Exam fees.

The Cost of Attendance information is based on estimated figures, and as such, it may not accurately reflect an individual student's costs. For this reason, a student may work with the [Office of Student Financial Aid](#) to appeal or request an adjustment.

Please remember when determining your budget for living expenses that loans must be repaid with interest. It is to your advantage to keep expenses as well as borrowed amounts as low as possible. These are your future earnings that you are pledging. Keep careful records of your loan portfolio and take ownership of the process from the very beginning.
