









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Introduction

The Oil and Hazardous Substance Release Prevention and Response Fund (Response Fund) was created by the Legislature in 1986 to provide a readily available funding source to investigate, contain, clean up and take other necessary action to protect public health, welfare and the environment from the release or threatened release of oil or a hazardous substance. Alaska Statute 46.080.030 states: "It is the intent of the legislature and declared to be the public policy of the state that funds for the abatement of a release of oil or a hazardous substance will always be available." (SLA 1986 Sec.1 Ch. 59).

The statutes governing the Response Fund were amended in 1989, 1990, 1991, 1994, 1999, and 2006. These amendments increased the scope that defines how the Response Fund can be used and it also increased the Department of Environmental Conservation's (DEC) reporting requirements. In addition, the 1994 amendment made major changes to the Response Fund structure by dividing the Response Fund into two separate accounts. The first account is the response account and the second account is the prevention account. The changes became effective on July 1, 1994. The diagram on page three illustrates the current structure of the Response Fund.

The 1999 amendment changed the reporting requirement on the status of the Response Fund from an annual report to the Legislature to a biennial report. The 2006 amendment changed the surcharge levied on crude oil produced in the state. The legislation imposed a prevention account surcharge of \$.04 (formerly \$.03) per barrel of oil produced from each lease or property in the state, less any oil the ownership or right to which is exempt from taxation. Sec. 26 of AS 43.55.201 was also amended to change the response account surcharge from \$.02 to \$.01 per barrel of oil produced from each lease or property in the state.

Response Account

The response account may be used to finance the state's response to an oil or hazardous substance release disaster declared by the governor, or to address a release or threatened release that poses an imminent and substantial threat to the public health or welfare, or to the environment. To access the response account for any incident other than a declared disaster, DEC must notify the governor and the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee within 120 hours of using the money from this account.

The response account is financed by a \$.01 per barrel surcharge and money recovered from responsible parties. The surcharge is suspended when the combined balance of the surcharge account; the response mitigation account and the unreserved and unobligated balance in the response account reach \$50 million. The account balance reached \$50 million for the first time during the quarter ending December 31, 1994. Therefore, beginning April 1, 1995, the surcharge collection was suspended.


Access to the fund for the response to the North Slope Pipeline spills occurred on November 20, 2006. This action lowered the balance of the account below \$50 million. On April 1, 2007, the Department of Administration imposed the \$.01 cent surcharge to restore the balance to \$50 million. The combined balance of the response account as of June 30, 2010 is \$44.6 million. As a result, the \$.01 cent surcharge has remained on through the Fiscal Year 2010.

Prevention Account

The prevention account may be used to respond to oil and hazardous substance releases that have not been declared a disaster by the governor. In addition, the prevention account is also used to fund Alaska's oil and hazardous substance release response and prevention programs. The Legislature appropriates money from the prevention account to support DEC for spill prevention and preparedness planning activities (AS 46.08.040(a)(2)).

The prevention account is financed with a \$.04 per barrel surcharge and fines, settlements, penalties and interest.

Situation:

The results from Phase I and Phase II studies in 2001 and 2002 indicated a chlorinated solvent plume in the Wendell Avenue Area in downtown Fairbanks. A dry cleaner (formerly MC Commercial Cleaners) at 314 Wendell Avenue was suspected as one source area. There were also reports of former dry cleaning operations in the Midnight Mine, located immediately to the east of 314 Wendell, and evidence of some soil contamination near the sewer line there. There were no resources available from responsible parties to address the investigation requirements.

FY09 Actions:

The ADEC conducted an areawide release investigation in FY09 that confirmed 314 Wendell as a source area. Tetrachloroethene, trichloroethene, dichloroethene, and vinyl chloride were detected in soil, groundwater, and air throughout the site and down gradient. Groundwater flow is to the north-northwest and pore water samples collected adjacent to the Chena River indicate chlorinated solvents are reaching the surface water. In addition, the air samples indicate vapor intrusion is occurring at the building on site and to the south. Access has not been permitted, but it's highly likely that significant vapor intrusion is occurring into the buildings immediately to the east and west.

FY09 Response Fund Expenditures: \$242,703.43 FY09 Cost Recovery: \$0.00

FY10 Actions:

FY 2010 work consisted of further source characterization, vapor intrusion data collection, further investigation of the potential risk to the Chena River, and completing an alternatives analysis for source removal and groundwater monitoring. The remediation system is planned for installation in FY 2011.

FY10 Response Fund Expenditures: \$205,618.65 FY10 Cost Recovery: \$0.00

FY11 Projected Actions and Expenditure Amounts:

Design and install a remediation system for source removal at 314 Wendell Avenue to eliminate the vapor intrusion, reduce soil contamination and limit further migration of contaminants to the river. The scope will also include groundwater and river water sampling program, and operation and monitoring of the remedial system.

Situation:

DEC was informed of a heating fuel release at this property in June, 2006, when an adjacent land owner reported heating fuel flowing onto their property. The fuel spill occurred in the immediate proximity of two residences. The land owner responsible for the heating fuel spill hired an environmental consultant and initiated site assessment and cleanup response actions at the site. In 2006, approximately 280 cubic yards of contaminated soil were excavated and removed from the site. About 15 cubic yards were excavated from the neighboring property. Following the completion of field work, the consultant reported contamination remaining onsite, as well as on the adjacent property. Groundwater was encountered at a depth of 13 feet at one location, and was also contaminated by the heating fuel. Following these initial response efforts, the responsible party notified DEC that he was unable to fund any further cleanup work.

In 2008, DEC hired a term contractor to identify the nature and extent of the residual petroleum contamination. Site soils were sampled, and six groundwater monitoring wells were also installed and sampled. It was determined that the residual contamination was limited in quantity and concentration; did not present an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment; and that no further State funded cleanup work was necessary. DEC was able to issue a closure decision for this site in August 2010.

FY09 Actions:

A DEC term contractor performed additional site assessment work in the effort to identify the lateral and horizontal extent of residual heating oil contamination and to determine residual concentrations, in order to be able to evaluate the risk any residual hydrocarbon contamination may pose to human health or the environment. Field work was performed in the fall of 2008 and a final report was received in March of 2009. Some residual soil contamination was detected in near proximity to the spill, and cleanup excavation pit area. Six groundwater monitoring wells were installed, sampled, and tested. The laboratory reported all analytes at less than their method reporting limit, with the exception of napthalene in MW-5. Napthalene was reported at a concentration of 0.0395mg/L, and the DEC groundwater cleanup level for napthalene is 0.73mg/L. Groundwater quality in all six monitoring wells met all applicable ADEC groundwater cleanup levels. Residual heating fuel contamination at this site was detected at relatively low concentrations in soil, and the impacts to groundwater appear to be restricted to the immediate spill area. Site conditions do not indicate any substantial risk to human health or the environment at this time.

DEC staff developed a groundwater sampling and analysis plan for additional sampling to collect sufficient water quality data to enable a closure determination, or establish the need for any additional assessment or cleanup work.

Situation:

The property is presently operating as a parking lot and is located on 4th Avenue, between Gambell Street and Hyder Street, in Anchorage, Alaska. The property is owned by Fourth Avenue and Gambell Associates LLC. The subject property was formerly occupied by a variety of businesses, including C&K Cleaners (which was a likely dry cleaners) from approximately 1968 through 1970, and NC Tire Center, which was the last occupant of the last building on the site (eastern portion) prior to being demolished.

Four site investigations have been conducted at the subject site since 1993. The primary contaminants found above the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup levels are tetrachloroethylene, also known as perchloroethylene or PCE, and contaminants produced during degradation, including trichloroethylene (TCE) dichloroethylene (DCE), and vinyl chloride. Other contaminants of concern include: ethylbenzene, diesel range organics, toluene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, n-butylbenzene, sec-butylbenzene, 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, p-isopropyltoluene, arsenic, barium, cadmium, lead, and chromium. PCE was found to be present in soil and groundwater on-site and on properties north of the site at levels that exceed DEC cleanup values for soil and groundwater. Groundwater was determined to be roughly 40 feet below ground surface and flows northeasterly.

DEC assumed the lead role on the project in 2008 following the responsible parties' statements that they were unable to fund any additional investigations. DEC had contractors evaluate the levels of PCE in soil and groundwater, develop a conceptual site model, and evaluate risks posed by the contamination.

FY09 Actions:

DEC's contractor was tasked with installing three soil gas probes for soil gas sampling, and collecting indoor and outdoor air samples on properties north of the subject site (i.e. Lots 1-6, Block 26A East Addition). The levels of PCE measured in soil gas and indoor air exceeded DEC's residential target levels established in DEC's July 2009 Draft Vapor Intrusion Guidance document. Consequently, data suggests that there may be a PCE exposure to residents in houses on Lots 1-6, Block 26A East Addition, that could cause harm if inhaled over a 20 or 30 year period.

A site reconnaissance was performed at the village of Akiak in 2000, in conjunction with the high school site visit. The tank farm is located approximately 50 feet west of the elementary school and 350 feet west of the Kuskokwim River. There is a 3.5-foot-high gravel dike and liner around the tanks. The tank farm consists of two vertical, welded steel, single wall, tanks with removable tops. Both tanks have a capacity of approximately 8,000 gallons, and the above ground storage tanks (ASTs) are supported on timbers with planking. The timbers and planking supporting the ASTs within the berm area were flooded because of precipitation retained by the berm. A chemical sheen was noted on open water within the bermed area, as well as vegetation growing within the bermed area through the liner. One soil sample collected at 2 feet below ground surface (bgs), down slope from the AST farm main valve assembly contained petroleum constituents above ingestion, inhalation, and direct contact cleanup levels. During the onsite inspection, children were playing around the ASTs.

FY10 Actions:

FY 2010 work involved the evaluation of the nature and extent of contamination. Soil samples from west of the tank farm contained petroleum constituents above ingestion, inhalation, and direct contact cleanup levels. An estimated 285 cubic yards of petroleum impacted soil is located at this location. The rest of the test pits contained detectable levels of contaminants, but below cleanup levels. Groundwater was not encountered.

There is a 2-foot-high gravel dike and liner around the AST farm with vegetation growing inside the dike area. The facility is not fenced or gated. The tank farm consists of seven vertical, welded steel, single wall tanks with removable tops. The individual ASTs vary in capacity from 5,000 to 9,750 gallons with a total tank farm capacity of 54,000 gallons. The ASTs are supported on timbers with planking on sandbags. Stained and darkened soil and sandbags were noted throughout the bermed area. One soil sample, collected at 12 inches below ground surface (bgs), adjacent to the gasoline fuel dispensing pump on the west side of the AST farm contained petroleum constituents above ingestion, inhalation, and direct contact cleanup levels.

FY10 Actions:

FY10 CIP funding was reallocated to other Capital Improvement Program sites due to the funding availability through FY05 CIP reallocation funding for this site. FY10 work, completed in the Fall 2009, involved characterization and evaluation of the nature and extent of contamination. Eighteen soil samples were collected from 15 soil borings and one test pit located around the tank farm. Test pits were not advanced north, east, or west of the tank farm due to obstructions. Soil samples from boring 10 and 13, located south of the tank farm, collected at a depth of 0.5 to 5.0 ft. bgs, contained petroleum constituents above ingestion, inhalation, and direct contact cleanup levels. An estimated 69 cubic yards of petroleum impacted soil is located at this location. The rest of the soil borings contained detectable levels of contaminants, but below cleanup levels. Groundwater was not encountered at 12 ft. bgs, consequently drive point wells were not installed. The closest drinking water well is located 500 ft away from the tank farm.

The village of Allakaket suffered severe flood damage in 1994, the result of unprecedented heavy rains. Damage to fuel storage facilities, tanks, and pipelines, resulted in fuel-contaminated soil in many parts of the community. Residents expressed concern about the future health of their children resulting from contact with contaminated soil at the school and vapors emanating from contaminated soil in proximity to the school tanks. There is also concern over contamination affecting their food and water well supply. The community requested assistance to clarify the extent and magnitude of the environmental concerns. There is an interest in redeveloping this property into a community area to include playground and greenhouse areas.

FY10 Actions:

Field work previously completed during FY09 was analyzed and reported during FY10. Additional projected cleanup work for the site was postponed for the 2010 field season pending the ability to review the findings and data being collected as part of an additional Allakaket areawide assessment underway by EPA through their Targeted Brownfield Assessment program, which would yield pertinent results about necessary corrective actions for this and other sites.

Situation:

The Aniak White Alice Communications System (WACS) site was developed and used by the U. S. Air Force as part of its Cold War communications network. By the late 1970s, the military facility was obsolete and was turned over to the Kuspuk School District, which renovated the main building and has used it as a school (Vocational Education and Middle School, and currently home sciences, shops, and computer classroom for secondary school, dorm rooms, and staff offices) since 1981. The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has owned the property since 1965 and currently leases the site to the Kuskokwim School District. During WACS operations and renovation of the school by contractors, fluids containing polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) were spilled in and around the generator room and onto the ground outside the building, resulting in soil contamination. Hazardous materials were placed into drums that were moved to various locations on the property, where additional spills reportedly occurred. PCB cleanup at the site was conducted in 1979-1983 and attempted to remove all PCB contaminated material and soil containing more than 50 parts per million (ppm) PCB. In 1996, DEC was informed numerous drums of waste and stained soil remained at the site. In 1997, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released a report that showed PCB contaminated soil remained in the soil outside the middle school wood shop, which was the former generator room at the White Alice Site. Subsequent sampling inside the school documented that PCBs had been tracked into the building. With DEC oversight, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers cleaned the inside of the Middle School and covered PCB-contaminated soil outside the school with a temporary liner and six inches of clean soil. Between 1998 and 2003, work was conducted to better characterize the extent and location of remaining PCB contamination, cleanup a portion of the site, and complete a feasibility study to evaluate alternatives for completing the PCB cleanup. Excavation and off-site disposal of soil containing more than 1 ppm PCB was recommended as the best overall alternative when considering regulatory compliance, protection of human health and safety, implementability, effectiveness and cost. Further cleanup was conducted during FY 2008 and documented that the lateral extent and volume of PCB-contaminated soil was significantly greater than expected. Additionally, trichloroethylene (TCE) contaminated soil and groundwater were discovered in 2008 and further characterized in 2009. TCE vapors were determined to be migrating into the Joe Parent School building at concentrations above target indoor air risk-based levels. Air filters were installed inside the building in 2009, which lowered the TCE concentrations significantly, but not below the target levels.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09 Shannon and Wilson, under contract to the Department of Environmental Conservation, removed the old White Alice Site septic system and approximated 3,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil and other cleanup materials were hauled off-site for disposal. A concrete spill containment pad for the fuel loading rack had to be removed; fuel lines and associated electrical lines had to be temporarily removed and replaced. A significantly larger volume of PCB contaminated soil was identified than anticipated. Due to funding and field season limits, excavated areas were backfilled. The 1 mg/kg PCB soil cleanup goal was not achieved. Security fencing was placed along the above ground fuel lines to prevent potential damage and limit access to areas with residual PCB contamination. TCE contaminated soil and groundwater were also encountered and a subsequent vapor intrusion assessment was conducted, which showed TCE vapors were migrating into the Joe Parent school building at concentrations above the target indoor air levels. DEC worked closely with the Kuspuk School District on developing plans to address the vapor intrusion issue. Some contaminated soil was staged in Aniak for later off-site disposal

The subject property is a vacant lot that had formerly been occupied by a territorial school building. The site had bulk fuel storage facilities, a pipeline, a generator building and a boiler room which were all potential locations of past releases. The vicinity of the former generator building was identified. The debris and overburden were removed. Field screening samples did not indicate contamination in this area.

Soil screening and analytical samples were taken from hand borings advanced in the vicinity of the former boiler room and the former tank farm area. Contamination (diesel range organics (DRO) up to 54,700 ppm) in the vicinity of the boiler room appeared to be limited to shallow soils and was horizontally distributed over a relatively small area. DRO contamination up to 29,700 ppm was identified in the vicinity of the former tank farm. Contamination appears to extend to a depth greater than 8 feet which was the deepest depth that could be achieved by advancing a hand boring. The majority of the contamination in this area is DRO but ethylbenzene was detected up to 11.7 ppm and benzene was detected up to 0.126 ppm. Three soil samples collected from the former boiler room and former tank farm were analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs), semo volatile organic compounds (SVOCs) and lead. One of the samples from the former tank farm area contained levels of 1-methylnaphthalene, 2-methylnaphthalene, and naphthalene above DEC cleanup levels.

In FY 2010, the field effort included the following activities: test pits were excavated to delineate the nature and extent of contamination; a limited groundwater evaluation was conducted, and drinking water samples were collected from potentially impacted potable wells near the site. Situation:

A Site Reconnaissance was performed at the village of Anvik on October 16, 2007. The Anvik Iditarod Area School Tank Farm is located approximately 200 feet southeast of the school, near the airstrip. The tank farm consists of three riveted steel rail tank cars (with the wheels removed) situated within a plastic lined dike. The total capacity is 21,126 gallons, however the tanks appeared to be empty. Evidence of tank overfilling was apparent on all three of the tanks. A strong diesel odor was reported near the rear of the middle tank car. According to the mayor, Robert Walker, approximately 3,000 gallons of fuel were spilled at this tank farm when a valve was inadvertently left open. It is not clear whether the spill was contained inside the dike. A soil sample collected 8 inches below ground surface from outside of the dike near a cam lock fitting contained 49,400 mg/kg diesel range organics (DRO) and 635 mg/kg gasoline range organics (GRO).

FY10 Actions:

Field work included the installation of test pits, which were placed around the perimeter of the tank farm to evaluate the potential migration of contaminants from the tank farm. However, only 7 of the approved 10 test pits were necessary to characterize the nature and extent of contamination at the former tank farm. The liner material inside the tank pit was intact, and appears to have been effective in keeping fuel spills inside the lined area, as no contamination was detected in any of the test pits. One drinking water sample was collected from the well at the school and did not contain detectable concentrations of any contaminants. Upon completion of the field effort, a final Site Characterization Report was completed. DEC has determined that the contaminant concentrations remaining on site do not pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment and this site will be closed.

The facility is currently operated as a salvage yard. It previously had operated as a gasoline station selling fuel. Scrap materials, solid waste and hazardous materials were suspected present throughout the property and have also been placed on adjacent properties owned by other parties. Seven buildings are located on the subject site, some of which have been burned or are in poor condition. In 1992, a Compliance Order by Consent (COBC) was signed with the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), noting that the drinking water well was too close to the service station fuel tanks. It was also agreed to that any work with the fuel system would be in accordance to federal and state regulations. The COBC also required submission of a site assessment report showing that polluted soils have been removed prior to any construction. Excavation of the station fuel tanks and stockpiling of potentially contaminated soils was conducted from 1992-1993, without the consent of DEC. At that time, DEC announced that a closure letter could not be issued. In 2007, a major fire destroyed the gas station building, attached store, living quarters, and adjacent restaurant on the property. The basement had a below-ground furnace which caused a secondary incineration, melting the pole structure of the building. A 2000 site inspection documented substantial quantities of lead-acid batteries stored on the ground and large accumulations of drums, barrels and other equipment and vehicles. Oil-stained soil was observed in some locations.

FY10 Actions:

FY 2010 work included the evaluation of the salvage yard as well as the two additional properties to either side of the salvage yard. An inventory was taken, including the location of buildings, areas of debris, potential sources of contamination and areas of stained soil based on visual observations and field screening. An estimate of approximate volume of waste, debris, hazardous material and contaminated soil was determined. This figure was used to determine the approximate costs for the removal of surface wastes and contaminated soil from the three properties.

Situation:

In the 1980's reports of contamination in Kotzebue emerged and free-phase product was observed seeping into the elementary school basement and the Kotzebue Sound. The source was believed to be the pipeline that supplied fuel to the school and hospital. Based on the potential threat to local fisheries posed by oil leaching into the Sound and the risks the children at the elementary school were potentially being exposed to, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) hired a contractor to install and operate an oil recovery system, therefore becoming a State-lead site at the time. This system included the installation of an oil barrier at the beach, installation of recovery/monitoring wells, and installation of an oil recovery trench in Second Avenue north of the former hospital. The performance and cost-effectiveness of the oil recovery trench were below expectations; therefore the installed equipment was left on-site for future recovery attempts. Such attempts were not pursued by DEC, leaving the recovery trench along Second Avenue in place for twenty years. Additional assessment of the area was never pursued, thus the current status of the contamination is not known and potential exposures pathways have not been evaluated.

Pore water samples collected in 2008-2009 confirmed petroleum contamination entering Kotzebue Sound from the City of Kotzebue. Several sites in Kotzebue are currently active and listed as a contaminated site in the DEC database, for which the risks for human health and/or the environment have not been assessed. Risks are expected to be present in the general area. Upcoming work consists of additional pore water sampling along Shore Avenue to gather baseline data prior to installation of a Department of Transportation & Public Facility sheet-pile seawall. Soil gas data was collected from area of the elementary school and former hospital fuel tanks in 2009. Data indicate petroleum contamination still exists near the original source area, but soil gas levels suggest vapor intrusion is not a concern at the elementary school.

A survey of buildings along Shore Avenue located near historic fuel releases for vapor intrusion assessment was planned in FY 2010, but some work was postponed until a determination of responsible parties is established.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC conducted a limited evaluation of some of the potentially completed exposure pathways as a result of the above mentioned spill. Pore-water samples along the Kotzebue Sound were collected to determine if contamination present in groundwater is reaching surface water. Soil vapor samples were also collected to determine if the vapor intrusion pathway is complete at the elementary school. Results indicated that petroleum contamination in groundwater is indeed reaching surface water. Surface quality standards for total aromatic hydrocarbons (TAH) and total aqueous hydrocarbons (TaqH) were exceeded as well as groundwater cleanup levels for DRO and benzene. Soil vapor samples indicated that, although vapors above screening levels were not measured in the vicinity of the school, contamination continues to be present in the area.

An attempt to remove the oil recovery trench was performed in the late summer. However, the contractor was not able to locate the trench. It is believed to have been removed during road work.

Additionally, DEC's contractor developed a feasibility study in which they evaluated potential mitigation alternatives to prevent the continuous seepage of contaminants to the Sound. Existing data gaps were also identified in the event that any of the proposed alternatives are considered.

Situation:

The Coastal Drilling site was reported to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) on July 2, 1988, under the Kenai Special Projects program. The Kenai Special Projects program was designed to identify and inventory historical contaminated sites on the Kenai Peninsula. Coastal Drilling is an abandoned industrial site, primarily comprised of two buried waste disposal pits. These pits were formerly used to dispose of industrial waste associated the oil field drilling activities for approximately 25 years. An estimated 7,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil and solid waste are present on the site. The contaminants include used oil, chlorinated solvents, batteries, diesel fuel and various types of solid waste.

The site is located on 7.4 acres in Soldotna, Alaska, approximately 3,000 feet northwest of the junctions of the Kenai Spur Highway and the Sterling Highway. One 3,500 square foot building and two concrete building foundations are present. The site is unfenced private land located approximately 200 feet from the playground area of the Soldotna Elementary school. The immediate area is now served by the City of Soldotna public water system. A municipal water well for the City of Soldotna lies within ½ mile of the site.

A number of monitoring wells have been previously installed and sampled onsite. Groundwater is periodically sampled to monitor groundwater quality, and to ensure that the contamination is not migrating offsite. Based on past groundwater quality monitoring data, the contamination appears to be largely confined within the two buried disposal pits.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC hired a term contractor to inspect and assess the current condition and suitability of all monitoring wells at the site. Damaged monitoring wells were repaired or decommissioned. All remaining monitoring wells were then sampled under a long-term groundwater monitoring program. A final report was prepared and provided to the department documenting all work tasks completed at the site. The report included the current status of groundwater quality at all sampling points, as well as an interpretation of findings and conclusions. This FY09 water sampling data continues to indicate that the contamination identified at this site is predominantly confined within the two buried pits, and that contaminated groundwater is not migrating offsite.

On December 25th 2009, at approximately 4:16 PM, ConocoPhillips Alaska Inc. (CPAI) reported produced water spill at Drill Site 1L at Kuparuk. CPAI estimated 94,920 gallons (2,260 barrels) of produced water and crude was released due to internal corrosion of a 6" water injection. Approximately 4.8 acres of tundra and gravel pad was affected.

FY09 Action:

Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) staff reviewed and approved CPAI cleanup plans to remove product from 2.95 acres of lightly misted snow-covered tundra and 1.83 acres of gravel pad. DEC responders monitored excavation and removal of contaminated snow and gravel from the site, and disposal of waste by grind and subsurface injection. Confirmation sampling of treated areas was conducted to assure cleanup end points have been reached.

DEC staff conducted a follow-up site visit in July 09 and found contamination remaining at the site. CPAI submitted revised clean-up and sampling plans to clean up the residual product.

Situation:

The site comprises approximately 28 acres that were occupied by a highway construction equipment and contracting company from the 1950's through 2002. The site was contaminated by numerous surface and subsurface spills including petroleum products and solvents associated with existing and former fuel tanks, and with the use of the property for fueling, maintaining, cleaning, and storing heavy equipment and vehicles during the operation of the contracting business. The site also includes the Patterson Street right-of-way to the west of the Wal-Mart property, down gradient from the site with respect to the groundwater flow direction, where groundwater in one of four off-property wells has exceeded 18 AAC 18.345 Table C trichlorothene (TCE) cleanup levels by approximately a factor of two during a total of four monitoring events to date. The site is comprised of three former tax parcels and the adjacent Patterson Street right-of-way to the west of the Wal-Mart property. The three tax parcels were identified as separate sites in the past but were combined into one site following the purchase of all three parcels by Wal-Mart and subsequent replatting. Approximately 11,000 cubic yards of petroleum-contaminated soil was excavated and treated by landspreading under a Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) approved plan and in accordance with a Prospective Purchaser Agreement (PPA) executed between Wal-Mart and DEC in December 2005. The landspread soil was last sampled in 2008 and found not to meet 18 AAC 75.341 Method Two cleanup levels for the contaminant of concern, diesel range organics (DRO).

FY10 Actions and Expenditure Amounts:

During FY10 the DEC project manager evaluated all submittals following the execution of the PPA in December 2005 to determine whether compliance with the terms of the PPA had been achieved. Numerous reports were submitted for review, but a summary report required by the PPA had not been submitted. The requirement was complicated somewhat by the fact that terms of the PPA required the the summary report to be done following the decommissioning of all monitoring wells. Since long-term groundwater monitoring may be required in one area of the site, the consultant tasked with completing a site summary expects to gain permission from client Wal-Mart to complete the summary report obligation prior to decommissioning of the monitoring wells. At the end of FY10 the state attorney representing DEC's interests had received the draft decision document and was evaluating it for compliance with the PPA.

The attraction to the site is a large earthen berm which was placed to reduce access along the river and prevent illegal dumping. The berm is presumed to be contaminated with lead from small munitions.

The State Division of Forestry is interested in upgrading the legal easement to access the timber across the Delta River, and the easement is generally needed for recreationists to access the Delta River. The continuing use of the Trespass range endangers the public that utilize the river and adjoining lands, as well as being a danger to air traffic utilizing the Delta Junction Airport. Situation:

DNR approached the DEC Reuse and Redevelopment Program for assistance in conducting an updated assessment of this site, which encompasses approximately 2.3 acres and is located adjacent to a wetland, which drains into the Cook Inlet. The landfill is associated with the former Nike Hercules missile site, which was later used by the State of Alaska during as a correctional facility. The landfill is approximately one-quarter mile west-northwest of the Battery Control Area and adjacent to Goose Bay wetlands and estuary (including the Goose Bay State Game Refuge).

The landfill was closed and covered as of December 2002; however there are no records which illustrate the type and extent of the final cover. Available records do indicate that asbestos was buried in an area adjacent to the landfill; however the exact location is not specified. It is suspected that asbestos pipe insulation is buried adjacent to the landfill, based on a 1984 letter from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to the Alaska Department of Corrections. Another concern at the landfill includes reports of transformer burial in the main landfill cell.

There is evidence that wastes are in direct contact with surface waters and the potential discharge to surface water poses a real threat. Field investigations were conducted in 1985 by both the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and Harza Engineering at the landfill. Sampling conducted prior to 2002, indicates probable contaminants include petroleum, oil and lubricant contamination and chlorinated solvents.

FY 2010 work included a site visit and the completion of a Property Assessment and Cleanup Plan. Multiple environmental concerns were identified, including both physical, and chemical hazards associated with exposed debris from eroding landfill.

Situation:

The tank farm was constructed in 1945 and was owned and operated by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to supply fuel for the airport from that time until 1972. A pipeline going out to the Gustavus Dock allowed the fuel to be pumped from the barge into the tanks. In 1972, the tank farm was transferred to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) who owned and operated it until 1980. From 1980 – 1983, the tank farm fell into private hands when Art and Linda Hayes bought them and operated the tank farm. In 1983, a private company, Gustavus Drey, bought the tanks and has been operating it since. The current tank farm has been in operation from 1945 to the present. A former FAA employee stated that fuel leakage to the ground was caused by corrosion to tank rivets and the leakage was severe enough that repairs were made in the late 1950s. In 1983, owner Gustavus Drey placed a liner around the tanks in the tank farm, but not under them. The tanks remained resting on the ground surface. A layer of soil was placed on top of the liner in order to prevent sunlight from degrading the liner. The FAA conducted a facility-wide study in 1991 and stained soil was documented at the tank farm inside the containment berm. In 1992, Gustavus Drey removed the soil above the liner and shipped it off for disposal (although Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) does not have documentation of disposal)) and placed the liner below the tanks. At that time, a perforated piping system located underneath the tanks was removed. FAA reports that the system was used for the discharge of waste oil below the tanks in order to help prevent corrosion of the tanks.

The City of Gustavus is working with the Agency for Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) to develop a new bulk fuel tank farm, adjacent to the old tank farm. Both the current tank farm and proposed new tank farm properties are owned by the State of Alaska, managed by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). DNR has given management authority over the property to the City of Gustavus based on DEC assurance that the current tank farm property will be characterized and, if necessary, cleaned up.

The Attorney General's Office is providing legal assistance regarding the determination of Potential Responsible Parties (PRP) and the proportioning of liability for characterization and cleanup of the Gustavus Tank Farm.

FY 09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC contracted to advance a grid of soil borings for soil sample collection and analysis. In addition, monitoring wells were installed at strategic locations to collect ground water samples for analysis. The soil and water data were presented with conclusions and recommendations in the *Gustavus Tank Farm Site Characterization Report* dated December 2008. The Report data indicate that petroleum contamination of surface soil is limited to the footprint of the fenced bulk fuel tank farm site. Petroleum contamination outside the perimeter of the tank farm exists as a lens of weathered petroleum in low concentrations at the depth of the water table extending south from the tank farm beneath the road in the direction of the dock. The water table is generally 8 to 10 feet below the surface and is influenced by tidal fluctuation of marine waters rendering it non-potable.

Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT&PF) currently occupies the subject lease lots, which support a maintenance facility for State vehicles, airport services, and heavy equipment storage. During the 1992 Environmental Phase I Assessment of this property, heavily stained surface soils were observed both inside and around the shop facilities. It was also noted that some pond surface waters exhibited a petroleum-type sheen. The assessment pointed to the following areas of concern: the drum and materials storage area on the eastern side of the warm storage building; the subsurface soils surrounding the on-site aboveground storage tanks; the area surrounding the fuel dispensing station; and the maintenance shop floor. During the phase II assessment, 33 soil borings were advanced. The analytical results found no benzene present in any of the samples. Elevated levels of xylene were found as well as diesel range petroleum hydrocarbons (DRPH). The elevated DRPH samples were found inside the two shop buildings. Tetrachloroethene (PCE) was also found at concentrations above clean up levels. In 2009, four soil borings were advanced inside the Shop Building to evaluate contaminant concentrations detected in the previous investigations. Soil samples were collected from each borehole and analyzed for diesel range organics (DRO), residual range organics, gasoline range organics, volatile organic compounds, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs). DRO was detected at 8.5 to 11 feet below ground surface (bgs) and benzene was detected 5 at 6-10.5 feet bgs. PCBs were not detected in any sample and PAHs were not detected above cleanup levels. The chlorinated solvents initially detected in the 1994 samples were not detected in 2009 samples.

Situation:

A regulated 1,000-gallon gasoline underground storage tank (UST) and a non-regulated 3,000-gallon heating oil UST were removed by Shannon & Wilson, Inc., in November 1998. Contamination at the gasoline UST was determined to be below regulatory levels. Elevated levels of petroleum hydrocarbons were found in both soil samples collected from the ends of the heating oil UST at depths of approximately 5.5 feet below ground level. Maximum concentrations detected in the soil remaining in the heating oil UST excavation were 10,300 ppm Diesel Range Organics (DRO), and 149 ppm of combined benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene and xylenes (BTEX) with 4.88 ppm benzene. Standing water was encountered in the excavation pit the morning after UST removal in the 6.5 foot deep excavation.

Because the extent and nature of soil and/or groundwater contamination was unknown, ADEC drafted a scope of work for additional assessment at and near the heating oil tank site in 2010. ADEC awarded a contract for undertaking the assessment actions in FY10, and the field activities were undertaken in June 2010. ADEC is presently waiting for a report from the term contractor that documents their assessment findings.

FY10 Actions and Expenditure Amounts:

FY10 CIP Funding was reduced due to a lower cost estimate. Field work consisted of drilling soil borings and installing monitoring wells. The results of the field effort will be provided in a Site Assessment Report.

Situation:

The Department of Transportation & Public Facility has offices and an equipment maintenance yard serving Juneau and the Southeast Alaska Area. Offices extend from the Glacier Highway entrance with repair shops at the back of the property. The east and west sides of the property are used as equipment and material stockyards. Environmental investigations at the facility include a landfill, an oil spill at a truck rack and multiple dispensers and/or leaking underground oil tanks both regulated and unregulated. Sources with complete exposure pathways and potential current or future risk are contaminated soil left in place after closure by removal in 2000 and 5 regulated underground storage tanks (USTs) located in several locations adjacent to the office buildings. A series of soil borings in 2003 investigated residual soil contamination and a network of water wells was installed to investigate ground water contamination. The 2003 data found elevated concentrations of gasoline and diesel range hydrocarbons and benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene and xylenes in both soil and ground water samples. A string of socks containing Oxygen Release Compound (ORC) were inserted into select monitoring wells to promote bacterial breakdown of ground water hydrocarbon contamination. In 2007 and 2008, samples were collected from the accessible monitoring wells and results indicate that benzene and gasoline and diesel range hydrocarbon concentrations in groundwater between the source area and occupied buildings are declining. ORC socks were again added to select monitoring wells. The vapor intrusion pathway at an office building down-gradient of the UST release source area was assessed in 2007 and 2008. Results do not indicate a risk of exposure for the building that was tested. The purpose of ongoing collection of well samples is to monitor residual subsurface hydrocarbon contamination and add ORC treatment to ensure that concentrations in ground water are continuing to decline and exposure pathways are controlled. If the data indicate an expansion of contamination then additional vapor intrusion pathway assessment and/or cleanup action will be performed to ensure the site does not pose an unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

FY10 Actions:

FY 2010 work included groundwater sampling to monitor declining hydrocarbon contamination to ensure that off-site migration pathways are protected. Field work was completed in FY 2010; no invoices were received by the end of the fiscal year.

Situation:

The subject site is located adjacent to the Knik River south of the Glenn Highway Bridge and was originally owned by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The BLM issued a land use permit to the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) in 1963 for use as a mineral material site for construction of the Glenn Highway, and DOT&PF operated the site as a gravel borrow pit. The site is readily accessible to the highway, and after gravel mining operations ceased the area became an unauthorized shooting range and dumping ground for approximately 30 years. During the early 2000's, a cleanup effort was conducted that removed illegally dumped material and approximately 106 cubic yards of lead contaminated soil. Capping material was placed over two former lakeside shooting lanes referred to as Shooting Area A2 and Shooting Area A1. As a result of the cleanup, the majority of lead contamination was removed and the site received a Cleanup Complete with Institutional Controls (ICs) closure determination in February 2004. In the Record of Decision, DEC recommended that additional ICs be established after transfer of the parcel to state ownership because more specifics about land use development would be known after the state assumed control. When the site was transferred from the Bureau of Land Management to the State of Alaska, the Alaska Department. of Natural Resources (DNR) received title for the benefit of Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game (DF&G). DNR then coordinated with DEC Contaminated Sites Program (CSP) to establish ICs) which were then documented in the chain of title and Interagency Land Management Agreement (ILMA). DF&G has proposed a development plan for this site which includes construction of trails, a canoe launch, picnic area and plans to stock Reflections Lake (former gravel pit) for recreational fishing. Lead contamination in the lake sediment exceeds ecological screening levels, and recent sampling results indicate that several former shooting areas still exceed lead cleanup levels. Further delineation of the extent of lead contamination in soil at former shooting range areas was conducted during FY10.

FY10 Actions:

During FY10, a work plan was developed and implemented to include the following activities: delineation of lead contamination at former shooting areas; permitting; lead screening/sampling of a proposed vault toilet location; and reporting. The final report will summarize all project information and pertinent documentation associated with the project. Based on preliminary data from the 2010 investigation, two separate areas of lead contaminated soil above the DEC lead cleanup level were identified. These areas are known as Area A1 and Area B1and are proposed for capping during FY 11. Two existing, seasonally submerged caps have been in place adjacent to Areas A1 and B1 since 2004. Due to erosion and because these areas are likely to see additional foot traffic once the site is developed into a park, DEC determined that existing sediment caps should be augmented with additional capping material.

The Contaminated Sites database has listed several sites in Kotzebue that are currently active, state-owned, and for which exposure pathways have been determined to be complete. Therefore, remediation and/or mitigation are necessary to address any risks to human health and/or the environment, including to ecological receptors in the nearby Kotzebue Sound and Kotzebue Lagoon.

Several data-gaps in the knowledge of the hydrogeology of Kotzebue currently exist. It has been determined that addressing these data gaps and designing a pilot-study to mitigate the migration of contamination from the Kotzebue Airport to the Kotzebue Sound and Lagoon is a priority.

This project also includes the Kotzebue Drum Dump, where a recent inventory of the site indicates that several drums remain on the property, some of them containing what seems to be waste oil.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, it was determined that the surface water exposure pathway was complete by collecting pore-water samples from the groundwater- surface water interface of the Kotzebue Sound and Kotzebue Lagoon. Surface water standards for total aromatic hydrocarbons (TAH) and total aqueous hydrocarbons (TaqH) were exceeded as well as groundwater cleanup levels for DRO and benzene. In addition, an inventory of remaining drums at the Kotzebue Sewage Lagoon Drum Dump site indicated that some empty drums and others (apparently containing waste oil) are still present on site.

The maintenance station is built on a gravel pad constructed of mine tailings, and the metals may be at background levels for the area. The drinking water is supplied by an off-site well that is reportedly completed to a depth of 320 feet in the bedrock aquifer about ½ mile up gradient from the site. A new onsite well may exist; however, the location and use are unknown.

A 1990 interim remedial action excavated approximately 0.5-foot-thick layer of impacted soil. Clean fill was placed in the excavated area, and the contaminated soils and product drums were shipped to a hazardous waste treatment facility in Kansas. Between 1993 and 2009, the site was sampled in multiple phases, discovering that soil contamination remains over cleanup levels. In 1993, a geo-membrane cap and temporary fence were installed over the highest concentrations, but subsequent sampling found that the fence did not encompass the entire contaminated area.

Additional sampling was done to help delineate the extent of the dioxin contamination. Also provided an updated evaluation of corrective action alternatives based on current site information.

Additional site characterization in 2007 did not fully delineate the extent of contaminated groundwater. Free product recovery was started in 2007 and continued into 2008. Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facility is in the process of re-aligning the road in front of the terminal building, potentially impacting existing monitoring wells.

During FY09, free-phase product recovery was conducted at select monitoring wells at the site, and the dissolved-phase groundwater contaminant plume was further delineated downgradient of the source area.

The airport well is 125 feet from the discovered contamination.

There is an extensive history associated with the use of this site that includes functioning as a refueling depot for aircraft during World War II, and providing as a staging area for work on the Alaskan Highway, the Canadian Oil (CANOL) pipeline project, and a defense fuel pipeline. There are environmental concerns about many of the lease lots and their impact on the surrounding community. These lots all border the main road in Northway and are open to wildlife, residents, and children. In addition, contamination at the sites deter future use of the developed sites and hinder development of lots that have high potential for use and benefit to the community. Buildings onsite are occupied and there is concern that both groundwater impacts and vapor intrusion into occupied buildings could be posing a risk.

FY 2010 work included continuing with the installation of monitoring points across the site, and a modification to include completing a vapor intrusion assessment and an expanded water well survey.

The pipeline was decommissioned in 1960 but four above ground storage tanks (ASTs) with associated piping and dispensers remained at the facility. Water for the site comes from a deep on-site well on the east side of the shop building. Due to contamination in the drinking water well, a holding tank was installed in 2006. A 4-inch gasoline piping rupture was discovered and is likely the major source of contamination. Approximately 420 cubic yards were removed and stockpiled on-site. The drinking water well was sampled and continues to show high levels of benzene contamination. Fractured bedrock in the area may hinder future groundwater investigations.

FY 2010 work included remediating the 420 cubic yard stockpile; sampling the drinking water well and developing a plan to prevent unauthorized use of the well; characterizing potential sources of contamination at the site; and evaluating the effect of groundwater contamination on surface water quality at nearby Yarger Lake.

The QNC has threatened legal action against the state since the QNC has not been able to use this property. Since DOT&PF was not successful in repeated attempts to obtain funding to clean this site up, DOT&PF they requested assistance from DEC's Reuse and Redevelopment Program in 2009 to evaluate cleanup alternatives and estimated costs.

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities Operations and Maintenance facility is located on Peger Road in Fairbanks. Environmental investigations began in the early 1990s, and are the result of compliance with Underground Storage Tank (UST) regulations and a federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act compliance audit. Soil and groundwater within the facility are contaminated with chlorinated solvents, trichloroethylene (TCE) and its breakdown products, and gasoline and diesel fuels. TCE and benzene concentrations about cleanup levels in the groundwater extend offsite into residential neighborhoods. In 2004, about 700 cubic yards of TCE contaminated soil was excavated, but no other specific remediation has occurred. Contaminated soil was left in place after closure by removal of five regulated underground storage tanks in several locations on the property. A network of monitoring wells was installed to investigate ground water contamination. Elevated concentrations of gasoline range hydrocarbons and benzene have been detected in water samples from five monitoring wells and elevated concentrations of diesel range hydrocarbons have been detected in seven monitoring wells. During construction of a new office building, gasoline vapors were detected in utility trenches that connect the new building to the main office structure. Ground water data also indicated that gas vapors were likely present and could pose an exposure risk along the vapor intrusion pathway to indoor air of the new building.

In 2007, groundwater monitoring of all wells and field testing of ambient air in one of the occupied buildings on the property was completed. Results indicate that benzene and gasoline range hydrocarbon concentrations in groundwater between the source area and occupied buildings are declining as a result of active treatment. Sub-slab soil vapor and indoor air sample data collected in 2007 indicate that indoor air exposure from the soil vapor intrusion pathway was not a current risk for the building that was tested.

During FY09, the 2008 field work included ground water sampling at each of the monitoring wells and vapor intrusion assessment for an office building. After collection of the water samples, fresh oxygen release compound "ORC" socks were placed in the water wells to promote bacterial breakdown attenuation of the petroleum in the soil and ground water. Results indicate that concentrations of benzene and gasoline range hydrocarbon in groundwater between the source area and occupied buildings are declining. The sub-slab soil vapor and indoor ambient air sample data indicate that indoor air exposure from the soil vapor intrusion pathway was not a current risk for occupants of the building. Although tetrachloroethylene (PCE) was detected in sub-slab soil vapor in concentrations above the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) screening levels, the compound was not detected in ambient indoor air samples. PCE is used in vehicle maintenance but has not been a contaminant of concern for soil ground water contamination near the building property.

This former Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) Silvertip Highway Maintenance Station facility had diesel and gasoline tanks removed in the late 1980s. A site assessment was performed after a gasoline underground storage tank (UST) and a diesel UST were removed in 2006. Approximately 100 cubic yards of contaminated soil were excavated in conjunction with the 2006 tank removal, and stored in Supersacks until the soil was landspread in May, 2008. Confirmation soil samples for hydrocarbon contamination was below soil cleanup levels. Groundwater monitoring for petroleum hydrocarbon contaminants began in 2006 and by 2007 groundwater (GW) monitoring results indicated a decreasing trend. In 2008 the groundwater monitoring showed only one exceedance of DRO in monitoring well (MW) 5 with gasoline and volatile constituents below the groundwater cleanup levels. It is recommended that future site work include sampling of MW5 and the landspread soil to determine if the gasoline and diesel contaminant concentrations meet the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) soil cleanup levels. Three distinct source areas are present at the site: (1) gasoline underground storage tanks (USTs) at Building 4801; (2) diesel USTs at Building 5820; and (3) a disposal pit at Building 5750. At Building 4801, free-phase product has been present in the area and observed in MW-4 for several years. At Building 5820, groundwater contamination has largely attenuated, though monitoring continues. At Building 5750, the disposal of solvents in an unlined pit led to solvent contamination in groundwater which has also largely attenuated downgradient of the source area.

In addition to the sources discussed above, several other environmental issues are present at the site that must be addressed prior to considering the long term status of the site. These issues include:

- A storm drain at the site is being infiltrated by contaminated groundwater from Buildings 4801 and 5750 and transporting contaminated water to the storm water detention pond;
- The storm water detention pond has contaminated sediment that produces hydrocarbon sheen when disturbed; and
- The storage of sand mixed with salt leading to chloride contaminated runoff that may impact the flora and fauna off of the property to the southeast.

Groundwater monitoring has been conducted at the site since the 1990's to delineate the extent and characterize the nature of groundwater contamination at the site. In 2007, 28 monitoring wells that were no longer needed were decommissioned, leaving approximately 17 monitoring wells in place for future use.

Situation

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) Unalakleet snow removal equipment building (SREB) is located on Norton Sound, adjacent to the airport, near the village of Unalakleet. In 1997, an underground storage tank (UST) was removed from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) maintenance building west of the DOT property, which prompted a release investigation (RI) in year 2000. The RI identified petroleum constituents in the groundwater close to the DOT property line. One well-point just west of the SREB property contained free-phase product exceeding 6 inches in measurement in one observation well. During the 2000 RI, a fuel line was discovered abandoned in place located between the DOT&PF SREB and the FAA maintenance building.

FY09 Actions

During FY09, work performed at the site included an evaluation of the source of the free-phase petroleum hydrocarbons and groundwater contamination at the site, and an assessment of the historic underground pipeline. Analysis of the sample data indicates petroleum contamination at the site begins at or slightly above the ground water interface at 8 feet below ground surface (bgs). Samples collected at the pipeline depth, at 3 to 5 feet bgs, contained little or no petroleum constituents; therefore the pipeline does not appear to be a contamination source. Subsurface soil samples collected, at 8 to 15 feet bgs, contained measurable diesel range and benzene above cleanup levels. Water samples collected from five monitoring wells contained contaminant concentrations above maximum allowable concentrations. Source of contamination remains unknown.

A Conceptual Site Model (CSM) completed by the consultant indicates incidental soil ingestion, ingestion of groundwater, and indoor and outdoor air inhalation are complete. The risk to these exposures is considered low. This area is located in an industrial zone, and there are limited volatile fractions present and no drinking water wells exist on the site. Furthermore, due to the vicinity to the ocean, salt water intrusion is most likely making the water non potable thus eliminating the drinking water pathway.

Situation:

In 1993, a 1,000 gallon heating oil tank was removed from the site and diesel contaminated soil was discovered. In 1997, two 3,000 gallon underground storage tanks (USTs) and associated dispensers were removed from the northeast portion of the site. The material excavated during the removal was used to backfill the excavation. A fire destroyed the former maintenance station in the early 2000s. In 2007, a site characterization was conducted. Twenty one test pits were dug and eight soil borings were advanced and completed as groundwater monitor wells. Soil and groundwater samples indicated that both media in four areas were impacted above Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup criteria. In 2009, contaminated soil was excavated from all known contaminated areas. Soil stockpiles were generated for each contaminated area and were designated as either potentially clean, petroleum contaminated, or chlorinated solvent and petroleum contaminated based on field screening results. The stockpiles were eventually placed on a concrete pad that was bermed with clean soil. Confirmation soil sample results from the base of each four excavation pits confirmed that no contaminated soil remained in all four contaminated areas with the exception of the former dry well location. All excavation pits, were brought up to grade with clean soil. In 2010, stockpiled soil was spread out and treated via landfarming and groundwater samples were collected to determine if groundwater contaminants exceed DEC cleanup criteria.

DEC's contractor excavated contaminated soil from four source areas and stockpiled excavated soil as "clean," "potentially clean," or "contaminated." Activities also included sampling the on-site drinking water well and two existing wells for contaminants of concern, and decommissioning the on-site drinking water well.

Situation:

On January 23, 2009, after months of increased seismic activity, the Alaska Volcano Observatory raised the alert level for Mount Redoubt from Yellow to Orange. At that time, the Drift River Oil Terminal (DROT), located approximately 35 kilometers to the east, held over six million gallons of crude oil in two of the six 270,000-barrel storage tanks.

On March 22, 2009, Mount Redoubt Volcano produced a series of five explosive eruptions that each lasted from 4 to 30 minutes. Central Alaska Response Team (CART) and the U. S. Coast Guard (USCG) personnel conducted an over-flight the following day and found that the resultant lahars (or volcanic mudflows) caused extensive flooding at DROT. However, no oil releases occurred from either of the two operational storage tanks and there was no damage to the protective tertiary dike system or the individual tank secondary containment systems.

FY09 Action:

Beginning in late January 2009, CART began an assessment of potential impacts by working with Cook Inlet Pipeline (CIPL) and other state and federal agencies. CART made presentations to the public informing them of current and potential options to reduce any environmental impacts throughout this event.

The CART State On-scene Coordinator (SOSC) and staff were part of a state/federal Joint Incident Management Team (JIMT) and State Crisis Management Team established to discuss situation updates from the Alaska Volcano Observatory, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), USCG and other attending Incident Management Team (IMT) agencies. The Joint Incident Management Team (JIMT) conducted daily teleconferences to review and discuss each of the response objectives/strategies within the state Incident Action Plan (IAP) and discuss new issues and safety concerns related to the objectives. A joint State/Federal Command website was created for the incident to facilitate access to information by the general public.

A second major eruption occurred on March 28, 2009. On March 31, 2009, an IMT was activated at a "Command Post" at the Sheraton Hotel in Anchorage. A Unified Command (UC) consisting of the USCG Federal On-scene Coordinator (FOSC), DEC SOSC, and the CIPL Incident Commander provided unified response objectives. The primary objectives were to ensure the protection of citizens and response personnel and the protection of the environment. To better facilitate meeting these objectives, three workgroups (Facility Restart/Oil Movement, Spill Response, and Lahar/Flood Forecasting) were established and daily IAPs were generated. CART participated in over-flights of the DROT and participated as members of the JIMT and State Crisis Management Team.

On April 6, 2009, after a two-day delay due to volcanic eruptions, the T/V *Seabulk Arctic* completed the transfer of approximately 60 percent of the crude oil from the two tanks in service at the DROT facility. Both operational tanks were ballasted with seawater as a precaution to maintain tank stability if significant flooding occurred at the facility inside the secondary containment. On the evening of April 6, 2009, all CIPL crew were safely evacuated from the oil terminal and Christy Lee loading platform.

The Command Post was deactivated on April 7, 2009 and response personnel were placed on standby. On April 21, 2009, the T/V *Mississippi Voyager* arrived from California to remove as much of the remaining

crude oil as possible from the terminal. Measurements and confirmation by a third party after transfer to the tanker was completed determined that approximately 841,680 gallons (20,040 barrels) of crude oil remained in the tanks at DROT. This amount is about 13 percent of the original 6.2 million gallons (148,000 barrels)...

On June 23, 2009, the UC approved plans to remove oil and ballast water from the tanks at the DROT facility in a continuing response to the threat from the Mount Redoubt Volcano.

FY10 Actions:

On July 13, 2009, CIPL announced that pipeline operations were expected to resume by mid-August. Resumption of operations was contingent upon the completion of modifications at CIPL's DROT and Trading Bay facilities and was also subject to regulatory approval. The facility modifications were completed and all necessary regulatory approvals were received. CIPL planned to transport oil stored at facilities at Granite Point and Trading Bay and ship it through CIPL's 42-mile pipeline for direct delivery to tankers berthed at the Christy Lee Platform. This modified procedure was designed to bypass the tanks at DRT (tight line operation). Crude oil storage operations at the terminal were to remain suspended.

On August 3, 2009, DEC issued a "Minor Amendment Approval" for the CIPL Oil Discharge Prevention and Contingency Plan (No. 07-CP-2081). The changes associated with this amendment were temporary, and because the current status of the facility included manning and other response resources and capabilities as described in the currently approved plan, they did not diminish CIPL's ability to respond to an oil discharge. Approval was on condition that the records documenting the weekly visual inspections described in Section 3.11.3 of the amendment were sent to the DEC contact on a monthly basis. In addition, DEC required an amendment to the contingency plan prior to resumption of "normal" operations, including use of crude oil storage tanks number 1 and 2, or in the event of any other changes to the facility operations that may require changes to the approved plan.

On August 4, 2009, the T/V *Overseas Boston*, under contract with Tesoro, arrived at the Christy Lee Platform to load oil and ballast water from the tanks at the DRT facility. This offloading operation was in accordance with a plan approved by the Unified Command in a continuing response to the threat from Mount Redoubt Volcano. Upon completion of the oil and ballast water removal, the T/V *Overseas Boston* loaded crude oil from Chevron Upstream, Exxon Mobil, and Pacific Energy a tight line configuration. Upon departure from the Christy Lee Platform, the T/V *Overseas Boston* proceeded to the Tesoro Refinery in Nikiski to offload the crude oil. The ballast water was taken to Emerald Services in Washington State.

On August 7, 2009, CIPL completed removal of oil and water from tanks 1, 2, and 3. Removal of all oil and water was not feasible due to current operating conditions. Tanks 1 and 2 were taken out of service and flanged off after the oil and water was removed. Currently, tanks 1 and 2 each contain 1,396 bbls of oil and 4,636 bbls of water. Tank 3 was pumped down to 999 bbls of oil. The Unified Command "stood down" following the completion of the oil and ballast water offloading to the *T/V Overseas Boston*. Regulatory oversight of the DRT Facility then transitioned back to normal agency functions.

The Unified Command and Drift River Terminal Coordination met with the Kenai Peninsula residents on Monday, August 24, 2009, to provide an update on the CIPL interim operations.

Situation:

The Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) was contacted in 1994 regarding a petroleum hydrocarbon seep into Eskimo Creek in the vicinity of Eddie's Fireplace Inn. The source(s) of contamination was unknown but sample analysis indicated a diesel range fuel product. Possible suspect areas included a former heating oil tank buried behind Eddie's Fireplace Inn and possible debris and/or runoff from the King Salmon Airport.

DEC assumed the lead role in the site investigations at Eddie's Fireplace Inn because the owner had died and his estate was unwilling or unable to do so. The former heating oil tank had previously been decommissioned by the former owner without any sample data. It was suspected as a source and the DEC investigation identified soil and groundwater contamination in the former tank location. Interim corrective action included the installation of recovery wells to intercept product before it entered the creek. However, soil contamination at (and adjacent to) the seep area continued to cause sheen and product release to the creek.

In November 2001, DEC's term contractor installed an interception trench and recovery system. The 70 cubic yards of petroleum contaminated soil excavated from the trench was transported off site and stored at the community landfill. In October 2002, 30 cubic yards of contaminated soil was excavated adjacent to Eskimo Creek and transported off site to the landfill. The contaminated soil was thermally treated in 2003 and used as landfill cover material. Since 2001, DEC has annually monitored the interception trench and recovered free product, and periodically sampled the onsite drinking water well and existing monitoring wells.

FY09 Actions:

DEC continued to perform free product recovery in the interception trench and recovery wells at the site. Groundwater monitoring continued from the drinking water well on site.

In May 1995, two aviation fuel tanks, piping and dispenser were removed and replaced by a new tank and piping in 1998. Contamination was found along the piping and at the dispensers. The shallow groundwater was found to be contaminated. Four soil/groundwater areas were sampled in 2004 and were found to be contaminated just to the south of the drinking water well. In June 2006, the responsible party excavated 68 tons of contaminated soil (to the north of the drinking water well) and transported it off site for thermal treatment. Three groundwater monitor wells were installed and contamination in soil and groundwater above site cleanup levels was identified. Groundwater is shallow (4 feet below ground surface) and the remaining contamination is located near the drinking water well. Fire Lake is also within 40 feet of contamination. The drinking water well was sampled in 2009 and did not have detectable levels of contamination. In July 2007, under the State-Lead cleanup action, 651 tons of contaminated soil and 23,000 gallons of contaminated groundwater were removed and treated. Confirmation sampling in 2007 showed that some contaminated soil and groundwater remain at this site. Additional monitoring and corrective action is required at this site.

Situation:

Large amount of petroleum spills have occurred on the refinery since 1977 when it was built. Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) issued a compliance order by consent in 1986 and the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued consent orders for Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) violations in 1989. Further site characterization and monitoring continued along with pump and treat remediation on the refinery through the 1990s and early 2000's. In 2001, a new chemical, sulfolane, was detected in the groundwater and monitoring began for this unregulated chemical. In 2009, sulfolane was detected in the City of North Pole public drinking water wells and subsequently in approximately 200 private homes. The extent of the plume has not yet been defined, but extends approximately 3.5 miles and has been detected at 200 feet below ground surface in several drinking water wells. Sulfolane has also been detected in vegetables grown with the tainted water. The toxicity of this chemical is not well known, but evaluation of the data from the state and federal agencies has resulted in an interim cleanup level of 25 parts per billion, lower than the concentrations detected in 128 private wells. An interim cleanup plan is in place while the characterization continues. DEC has formed a technical project team to oversee the investigation and regulation of the facility.

DEC worked with numerous entities on the sampling of the City of North Pole Wells, research of sulfolane characteristics, case studies, and other regulatory precedents, as well as provided technical assistance in the reviewing of the site characterization work plan and interim removal action. DEC was instrumental in the creation, facilitation and participation in the TPT and the investigation of other sites for the presence of sulfolane. Department of Environmental Conservation Spill Response visited the site in 1996 and recommended corrective action and unsuccessfully attempted to contract cleanup actions. In 2006, the City of Pilot Point applied for, and successfully received, a DEC Brownfield Assessment to conduct a Phase I ESA, which made recommendations for further site characterization. The community of Pilot Point intends to work toward redeveloping the cannery site and some of the buildings to support tourism and the community, to provide economic opportunities for the region.

During FY08, a release investigation was completed at the former cannery involving soil testing across the site in multiple locations. The Former Auto Salvage Yards site includes two adjacent auto salvage yard sites that were subject to multiple surface spills of waste oil, gasoline and diesel over decades of commercial salvage yard activities. The two sites were administratively combined into a single site during FY09 because the nature and occurrence of contamination was similar, the sites occupied tax parcels that were about to be replatted into one parcel, and the proposed new construction a 55,000 square foot warehouse would straddle the boundary between the sites. Both of the sites were conditionally closed by 2004, but subsequent investigation done in anticipation of new development identified previously undocumented groundwater contamination that exceeded Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup levels. In addition, the planned land use changed from the current vacant status to a proposed building site. The changed knowledge of site conditions and proposed change in land use necessitated modifications to the existing conditions of closure. A new Record of Decision for the combined sites was issued in February 2009 that required additional groundwater and soil investigation by the property developer.

During FY09, staff administratively combined two adjacent auto salvage yards based on similar contaminant types and occurrences and on other factors; reviewed reports documenting groundwater contamination that was previously undocumented; and modified and reissued the conditional site closure documents as a single document for the combined site. The final Record of Decision for the consolidated former sites upholds the existing conditional closure status granted to the former sites but includes additional conditions based on the proposed changed land use from vacant land, and the documentation of previously unknown groundwater contamination. At the end of FY09 DEC had reviewed and approved a plan by the prospective purchaser of the site to install and sample new monitoring wells, and to sample or decommission certain of the existing monitoring wells.

The final volume of released fluids was estimated to be 5,000 ft³ of gas, 42 gallons of crude oil and 1,890 gallons of produced water. The 9A Flow Line is used to transport reservoir fluids from Drill Site 9 to FS2 for processing.

On March 5, 2009, the F/V *Mar-Gun* grounded on the north shore of St. George Island at Staraya Artil, a fur seal rookery and significant archaeological and paleontological site. The vessel's five crew members were safely evacuated by the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG). An undetermined amount of fuel was released from ruptured tanks on board. One Central Alaska Response Team (CART) employee, along with the USCG Pacific Strike Team, traveled to St. George for the response. Additionally, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), USCG, and the responsible party, represented by O'Brien's Response Management, Inc., formed an Incident Management Team (IMT) in Anchorage to oversee the response. Over the next two months, pollution hazards were removed from the vessel, it was surveyed and prepared for salvage, and the shoreline was monitored for impacts. The CART State On-scene Coordinator (SOSC) and other IMT personnel participated in daily or weekly meetings and teleconferences to provide state oversight. CART on-site activity included monitoring removal of fuel, oil, and other chemicals from the vessel, monitoring waste management, conducting shoreline assessments, and watching for wildlife impacts. A total of 18,371 gallons of fuel and oil were successfully removed from the *Mar-Gun*. On May 13, 2009, the vessel was safely refloated and towed to Dutch Harbor for repairs.

The vessel ran aground on March 5, 2009 and response activities continued to May 15, 2009 when the vessel was safely moored in Dutch Harbor.

Situation:

Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has been investigating and monitoring areawide soil and ground water contamination in the area of Gaffney Road since 1997. The assessment used passive soil gas surveys, groundwater monitoring wells, and sewer line sampling methodologies to define the nature and extent of the contamination. The contamination consists primarily of tetrachloroeythlene (PCE) and its breakdowns chemicals from former dry cleaning operations in the area. The groundwater contaminant plumes extend in a northwesterly direction from Gaffney Road towards the Golden Heart Utilities well field that serves the City of Fairbanks. However, the groundwater monitoring data collected over the best 10 years indicates the contamination is not reaching the public water wells.

Four release areas of chlorinated solvents have been identified. Three are west of Cushman Street, creating the "Gaffney-West" groundwater contaminant plume, which consists primarily of PCE. The fourth source area is located east of Cushman Street and has created the Gaffney-East groundwater plume that consists of both PCE and trichloreythlene (TCE). The distribution of contaminants is associated with the sanitary sewer lines in the area. Vapor intrusion assessments from 2007-2010 indicate six building with intrusion occurring, three with concentrations above a risk-based screening level. There are 3 other buildings that are believed to have vapor intrusion occurring based on soil gas, but access has been denied to take indoor air samples. A combined soil vapor extraction and sub-slab depressurization system was installed at the Good News Bible and Book Store in 2009 to address the current exposure at that site and the primary source of the Gaffney-West groundwater plume. It is continuing to operate.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, the area east of Cushman Street was investigated. Three of the buildings east of Cushman are experiencing vapor intrusion. The soil south of these buildings is impacted, but the contamination does not extend south of airport way. Two potential sources have been identified.

Additionally in FY09, treatability and feasibility studies were conducted at the GNBB and soil vapor extraction (SVE) was selected as the preferred remedial alternative. This also satisfies the settlement agreement requirements. Annual groundwater monitoring of both the western and eastern plumes was conducted.

The Flow Station 2 oil transit line spill on the North Slope began on August 6, 2006. Approximately 2,281 gallons of crude oil were released to the tundra. The spill was discovered when BPXA was shutting down the line in response to a smart pig operation. The pig data revealed 16 anomalies in 12 locations along this line with corrosion related pipeline wall thinning. For these reasons, BPXA shut down the Greater Prudhoe Bay oilfield, which is the largest oilfield in the United States accounting for approximately 8 percent of the nation's domestic oil production.

The Gathering Center 2 oil transit line release was discovered on March 2, 2006 by BPXA operators. The location of the release was a 34 inch single phase transit line between Gathering Center 2 and Pump Station 1 in the Western Operating Unit of Prudhoe Bay.

After the August 2006 BP Flow Station 2 transit line spills and resulting partial shutdown of the Prudhoe Bay Field, the Department of Law (DOL) requested an RSA from Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) to fund the investigation of the oil spills and BP's pipeline maintenance and corrosion management practices.

The investigation began during FY07 and is continuing into FY09.

The old Hooper Bay School and surrounding buildings were destroyed in a fire on August 3, 2006. The only building remaining is the teacher housing, located on the northwest side of the site. Several private residences on the south side of the school site were also destroyed. Hydrocarbon contamination was documented in a November 2006 report for the Lower Yukon School District. Selected excavation and characterization in September 2006 were the subject of this report, which concluded that fuel contamination in soil near two former above ground storage tank (AST) locations remains above Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup levels. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) was conveying the property via quit claim deed to the Lower Yukon School District (LYSD), which in turn intends to transfer it to the Sea Lion Corporation, who will lease it to the Alaska Commercial Company (ACC) for construction and operation of a new retail store for the village. Satisfactory cleanup, or a better understanding of the residual contamination, is necessary to enable reuse of the site and make this project successful.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, a limited site characterization was conducted on the Hooper Bay School Property. During the site characterization, forty-nine test pits were advanced to a maximum depth of 6.5 feet below ground surface. The results of the site characterization indicate contaminated soil remains in front of the teacher's housing (270 cubic yards) and in the former generator area (150 cubic yards). However, the proposed location for the development of the new store would not likely be impacted by the identified subsurface impacts, enabling the transfer and construction to move forward.

On September 16, 2008, North Slope Borough (NSB) Public Work employees contacted the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) to report the release of approximately 2000 gallons of gasoline. An investigation into the release revealed that fuel leaked from damaged underground piping during a transfer of fuel from the village's bulk fuel storage tanks to the gas station. NSB Public Works employees trained as hazardous materials responders worked to isolate the source and remove free standing fuel pooled in a turndra depression.

FY109 Action:

DEC staff reviewed and approved work plans submitted by the NSB to characterize the site. A partial site characterization began September 26, but was temporarily suspended due to inclement weather. When NSB failed to resume and complete the site characterization by a designated date, a Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued with conditions to complete the work prior to the onset of winter conditions. Additionally, the NSB was requested to submit a repair plan prior to conducting work on the damaged underground piping. On March 23, 2009, NSB remobilized to the site with drilling equipment ot complete the site characterization and sampling. DEC staff reviewed the ist echaracterization report and transferred the site to DEC Contaminated Sites program when site characteristics and sampling results revealed unrelated contaminates at the site.

A biathlon shooting range located near the Kincaid Outdoor Center on W. Raspberry Road in Anchorage was closed in late 2007 after 20 years of use. The range was subsequently removed during May 2008 earthwork and other preconstruction activities for a proposed artificial turf soccer field and stadium. Bullet slugs and fragments and potentially contaminated soil removed from the range and particularly from the target line were not properly tracked or handled, so that the location of an estimated 75 cubic yards of hazardous waste, federally regulated under the Resource Conservation and Resource Act (RCRA) hazardous waste regulations, remains at the site within approximately 14,000 cubic yards of fill that were moved during the 2008 site work. As a result of the mishandling of the contaminated media, a Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for soil that was stockpiled improperly and the soccer field project area, encompassing all areas documented as contaminated or potentially-contaminated by lead, was classified as a RCRA solid waste management unit. EPA is the lead oversight agency but the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Contaminated Sites regulations are also applicable to the site cleanup. DEC has coordinated closely with EPA with respect to communications to the involved parties to and otherwise providing regulatory oversight to prevent duplication of effort by the responsible parties. Activities completed to date include the removal by the responsible parties in Sept. 2008 of approximately 52 tons of hazardous waste that was disposed of at a permitted facility out-of-state.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC reviewed submittals by the Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) and Kincaid Project Group (KPG) and coordinated with KPG, MOA and EPA following EPA enforcement actions. EPA issued an NOV to MOA and KPG on July 17, 2008 for RCRA violations associated with a soil stockpile created in May 2008 and in May 2009 broadened the scope of the violations to include KPG and MOA's creation of RCRA-regulated land disposal units when KPG moved lead and lead-contaminated soil from the former location of the biathlon range into fill areas. KPG submitted a work plan to DEC and EPA on April 16, 2009. Subsequently EPA notified KPG and the MOA that the April 16th work plan did not appear to provide for sufficient characterization. KPG advised DEC and EPA that it would submit a revised characterization plan, with the plan yet to be submitted at the end of FY09.

Upon Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) review of this report it was determined that the diesel levels remaining on site were not a risk to human health or the environment, and the site was granted a Cleanup Complete with Institutional Controls (ICs) determination.

FY 09 Actions:

During FY09, Oasis Environmental dug ten test pits at the former LKSD tank farm. Soil samples were analyzed for the full array of hydocarbon constituents. Diesel Range Organics (DRO) was the only contaminant of concern that remained above the most stringent cleanup level. However, remaining DRO was below Method Two inhalation and ingestion health-based levels. Groundwater was not encountered to a depth of 12 feet, and no surface water was found within 50 feet of the site. Community drinking water sources were evaluated, and there were no impacts found as a result of contamination.

Situation

The 24-inch diameter produced oil line that connects Drill Sites 2W and 2U to Drill Site 2V, known as the 2WU Produced Oil line, leaked in the early morning on December 16, 2007, spilling approximately 102 barrels of oil and produced water onto the tundra. The failure was determined to be a 6-inch long rupture through the pipe wall, due to corrosion under insulation, at the 9 o'clock position on the pipe.

The crude oil misted on approximately 350,223 square foot (sq. ft.) of frozen lake surface; 183,824 sq. ft. of snow covered tundra; and released "heavy" contamination to approximately 7,405 sq. ft. of snow covered tundra. In response to the release ConocoPhillips (CPAI) removed the misted oil from the lake and tundra plumes and the pooled oil and contaminated snow beneath the flow-lines. The heavily oiled area was divided into six treatment cells, which were flooded with water to float and recover remaining oil, and reduce the salinity concentration from the produced water.

After the contaminated snow was removed from the tundra and lake plume, and the flood tactic executed in the "heavily" oiled site beneath the vertical support member (VSM), analytical samples were collected to assess the concentration of petroleum hydrocarbons remaining in the soil, snow, and lake ice. Analytical tests were performed in the treatment cells to assess the salinity remaining from the produced water which may affect redevelopment of tundra vegetation. The analytical results support a favorable cleanup performance as determined by Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup regulations.

Personnel from DEC, Alaska Clean Seas (ACS), and Alaska Biological Research (ABR) monitored the site throughout the season. Tundra reestablishment is progressing, non-vascular species are most prominent

Situation:

A 1991 site assessment, conducted in response to neighbor's complaint of acid draining off-site, identified elevated levels of lead and total petroleum hydrocarbons in the soil and groundwater. Additional site assessment work was conducted between 2001 and 2004. Soil samples exceeded applicable cleanup levels for lead, mercury and 1,2,4 trichlorobenzene. Three monitoring wells were installed and samples but detected no contamination in groundwater above cleanup levels. In 2005, about 372.3 tons of lead contaminated soils was removed to reduce the risk at the site. In 2007, two additional areas were investigated within the project site, by advancing two borings, and collecting additional soil samples. During the same time period, approval was given to install an asphalt cap. This would prevent exposure to humans through ingestion and dermal pathways from lead contamination. Complications from the asphalt cap required additional investigation and the final removal of the cap, and replacing it with a gravel cap, and engineered drainage.

FY 2010 work included the re-design of the cap for gravel replacement however necessary permits were not obtained from the Municipality of Anchorge to implement the plan.

Situation:

On March 29, 2006, Terry Berger with the Mat-Su Borough Solid Waste Program reported to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) that there was possible ground contaminated resulting from oil and other hazardous materials at the Mat-Su Town Site, 8862 C Street East, near Palmer, AK.(old Mat-Su Town Site, N 61.54100 W 149.22690).

Mr. Gerald Poirier was identified as the property owner. DEC conducted a site visit to investigate the Mat-Su Borough's report. During the site visit, it was found that the property was littered with various garbage, 55- gallon drums, 5-gallon containers, and derelict vehicles. Some drums were found to be empty and others were found to contain some unknown amount of liquids. The property is located on a muskeg area; therefore, part of the property was saturated with water. Large portion of the property with standing water was colored green, similar to the color of antifreeze. Mr. Poirier's son was present during the site visit and he indicated that it was a green dye that was in a container. The container rusted through, exposing the dye to the water. He confirmed his claims by adding the powder to the water, which indeed turned green. Mr. Poirier is deceased and his wife, Mrs. Wanda Poirier is the current property owner. Mrs. Poirier was reported to be living on monthly social security checks.

In 2006 and 2007, Mat-Su Borough's vehicle removal program removed approximately 100 vehicles from the property. Mrs. Poirier's son consolidated all the drums and 5-gallon container to one location on the property.

FY09 Action:

On August 27, 2008, DEC met with Mrs. Poirier, adjoining property land owners, and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at the Mat-Su Town Site to document existing contamination and to identify other possible contaminations. Upon review of the site, EPA agreed to address the hazardous materials identification and disposal and DEC agreed to consolidate and mitigate the 59 drums and 5-gallon containers, some of which were actively leaking oil. The drums are suspected to contain used oil, lube oil, hydraulic oil, ethylene glycol, and contaminated water.

On October 21, 2008, DEC returned to the site and covered the drums using tarps and deployed absorbents pads to minimize contamination impact to the ground from the leaking drums. On the same day, Mrs. Poirier signed an agreement providing consent for DEC and the contractors to remove oil and hazardous waste from the property.

On April 24, 2009, state contractor completed removed all oil and ethylene glycol products from the property for proper disposal. Fifteen drums containing used oil contaminated with chlorinated solvents were over packed to mitigate the risk to the environment.

On April 27, 2009, EPA contacted DEC and advised that they were unable to provide funding to remove and dispose the drums containing hazardous material as previously committed. Thirty four drums containing hazardous materials are awaiting removal and disposal from the site.

Situation:

On January 12, 2009, at 03:00 a crude oil and produced water spill was discovered at the Milne Point Facility by British Petroleum (BP) employees. The volume of the products released was initially estimated at greater than 55 gallons. At approximately 09:15, BP environmental staff increased the volume to 3,360 gallons (80 barrels). However, at ~ 05:00 a delineation and volume survey was conducted by Bell and Associates. They estimated the volume released at 24,078 gallons (573.3 barrels) of which, 6,888 gallons (164 barrels) was confined to secondary containment. They also estimated the area impacted at 6,030 square feet.

On January 13, 2009, BP engineers conducted an additional survey and estimated the volume outside of secondary containment at 17,273.56 gallons (411 barrels) of which, 14,635.56 gallons (348.46 barrels) was crude oil. The fluids were recovered with vacuum trucks and transported to a 400 barrel upright insulated tank for settling purposes and crude oil estimations. Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) required that fluids be maintained at temperatures greater than 100 degrees for separation purposes. DEC required that an environmental firm be hired to perform the tank strapping, calculate the product recovered, conduct field screening, provide cleanup direction and pull soil samples for laboratory analysis. The environmental firm estimated that 1,864.8 gallons (44.4 barrels) of crude oil was recovered from the spill site.

BP contracted Oasis Environmental of Anchorage, Alaska to perform the field screening, collect confirmation samples and review the data to determine the volume of the release. On April 28, 2009, BP submitted the final report to DEC estimating the final volumes of the release at 4048.8 gallons (96.4 barrels) of crude oil and 5712 gallons (136 barrels) of produced water. The final entries into the DEC database are in the process of being entered and the cleanup has been considered complete.

FY09 Actions:

During the initial response PERP had responders on site over a period of 14 days who monitored the cleanup, approved plans and coordinated with Industry Preparedness Personnel (IPP) in requiring the removal, cleanup under and replacement of both the sand slurry tank (tank 5417)and the water clarifier tank (5401) secondary containments. The cleanup ceased on February 13, 2009 due to cold weather and commenced again on April 16, 2009, once the weather improved. During the second phase of the cleanup, PERP had responders on site for an additional 12 days.

A Subpoena to preserve and produce documents was issued to BP on January 14, 2009.

A letter of State Interest was issued to BP on February 12, 2009.

A Civil Referral was sent to the Department of Law on March 31, 2009 for the initiation of Civil Enforcement proceedings and Formal Cost Recovery.

Situation:

On December 8, 2004, the M/V Selendang Ayu, a freighter carrying soybeans bound for China, ran aground on the north coast of Unalaska Island in the Aleutians. The vessel broke in two, spilling its soybean cargo and dumping over 300,000 gallons of bunker oil and diesel fuel into the ocean waters. The fuel oil contaminated many miles of shoreline. A vigorous effort of shoreline cleanup commenced shortly after the spill, continued until February of 2005, was suspended for several months due to winter weather, and then ran again through the summer months. After one last minor shoreline cleanup project in 2006, the US Coast Guard, the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), and the responsible party's incident commander jointly announced the completion of all cleanup operations.

A joint Federal/State Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) and Restoration process began immediately after the vessel spilled its cargo and fuel, a process that continues today. Federal and State natural resource trustees, which include an DEC representative, completed in the spring of 2007 the "pre-assessment" phase, which is a screening process that looks at possible resource damages to determine if additional action is warranted, and began the "assessment" phase, wherein they gather the data necessary to quantify the injuries and determine damages. Restoration of damages is the ultimate goal.

FY 09 Actions:

The trustees generally met about once a month, with smaller technical committees meeting more often to deal with specific issues, including several studies, such as harlequin ducks exposure and mortality rates and a survey of spill-impacted shores for lingering oil. In August of 2009, a research team, which included two DEC personnel, conducted a series of site visits on Unalaska Island to collect sediment and mussel samples on previously oiled shorelines to determine the amount of lingering hydrocarbons resulting from the spill.

NRDA trustee meetings continued, usually on a monthly basis. Work on several studies, including the Lingering Oil Study, proceeded, with final publication expected in FY11. Situation:

Pedro Bay village administrators first contacted the department in 1993 with reports of diesel fuel odors in the school and the presence of occasional sheen on the water at the shore of Lake Iliamna. Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) involvement as state lead began in 1997.

Historic fuel storage methods involved storage of up to 500 drums in the playground area. An addition to the school building was later constructed over the area used to store drums. Spills had also occurred at the tank farm and generator building. Soil and groundwater had been contaminated with benzene and diesel. Lead had also been found in past groundwater results above cleanup levels. A past estimate suggested the area of petroleum contamination to be approximately one acre. However, concentrations and extent of subsurface contamination were unknown prior to FY09. Soil sampling results within the past ten years had been limited to a few surface soil samples for petroleum contamination.

Lake and Peninsula School District conducted a limited interim remedial action for soils within the playground are in 1995, and about 4 cubic yards were removed. This was the first of two excavations that took place at this site prior to FY09. In 1999, DEC stockpiled additional excavated soil and installed a groundwater remediation system to address hydrocarbon seepage into water bodies. The stockpile remained on site. Site structures were removed by 2007.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09 additional site characterization was performed to address data gaps before finalizing a Corrective Action Plan. Following multiple teleconference meetings to include various stakeholders, the Corrective Action Plan was finalized.

Situation:

On June 6, 2009, the Central Alaska Response Team (CART) received a report of a spill on the Pile Bay Road near Lake Iliamna. A 9,500 gallon tanker trailer operated by Iliamna Development Corporation (IDC) had been unhitched from a truck tractor in the early afternoon, leaving it on *blocked landing gear and* parked on a 5 percent downgrade slope approximately 200 feet from the Iliamna River old bridge crossing. Approximately five hours later, the tanker trailer was discovered lying on the ground spilling fuel. The investigation determined that approximately 1,400 gallons of diesel was spilled when the trailer landing gear collapsed causing a hairline crack along a weld and a quarter-size hole in the tank. The spill migrated downhill from the source to approximately 50 feet from the edge of the river. On June 8, 2009, IDC staff began removing heavily saturated soil from the approximately 160 foot by 25 foot spill area with heavy equipment. CART staff was on site monitoring the excavation activities. On June 9, 2009, fuel sheen was discovered entering the Iliamna River through fractures in the bedrock underlying the spill site. The sheen is contained along the river bank using protective water boom, and absorbent boom and pads. Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and IDC response personnel are continuing to monitor the site. The response contractor and IDC staff completed excavation activities and collected confirmation soil samples on June 17, 2009.

FY09 Action:

On June 6, 2009 the incident was reported to DEC and a response effort was coordinated with IDC.

On June 8, 2009, DEC responder from Anchorage arrived at the spill site to provide cleanup oversight.

On June 17, 2009, IDC, under the oversight of DEC, completed soil excavation activities and soil sampling.

FY10 Actions:

In July 2009, DEC conducted two site visits to monitor excavation activities and to check the stockpiles. Additional stockpile sandbagging and berming were needed due to Illiamna River flooding caused by heavy rainfalls.

On August 5, 2009, under the oversight of DEC, IDC began clearing and preparing a leased property for remediating the stockpiled contaminated soil. Activity for backfilling the excavated area began in conjunction with preparing the leased property for remediation work.

In August 2009, Bristol Environmental installed a groundwater monitoring well and IDC backfilled the excavated area. DEC provided oversight for these two activities. Preparation of the contaminated soil remediation site continued. The three soil stockpiles were moved to the prepared remediation area and the former stockpile sites were cleared of residual contamination and confirmation samples were collected for analysis.

On August 15, 2009, DEC requested a winter recovery and monitoring plan for the river's shoreline. The absorbent boom and pads along the river were expected to become ineffective as winter approaches and therefore other fuel recovery methods needed to be considered.

In September 2009, DEC and Bristol Environmental conducted a site visit at the spill and remediation area. The contaminated soil remediation area remained unfinished. Logistics and purchase of a rock screen for soil and rock separation proved problematic for IDC. Plans for remediation site completion were postponed until spring 2010.

In October 2009, a passive winter recovery boom system was placed at the edge of the Iliamna River spill site by Bristol Environmental and IDC, allowing the removal of the fast water booming from the river. Continuous monitoring of the site was discontinued for the winter months.

In January 2010, Bristol Environmental submitted an interim cleanup action report to ADEC. The report documented cleanup actions taken to date, contaminated soil remediation plans, and confirmation soil and groundwater sample analytical results.

In May 2010, DEC and IDC conducted a site visit in early May to inspect and assess the Iliamna river passive boom system for condition and signs of continued sheen released to the river, assess the condition of the spill site, and to check on the progress at the uncompleted remediation area.

In June 2010, DEC and Bristol Environmental conducted a site visit assess the Iliamna River site and soil remediation area. DEC recommended that the passive recovery boom system remain in place for the remainder of the summer months with boom being replaced if damaged or otherwise deemed necessary through periodic inspections. Bristol Environmental collected water samples from the groundwater monitoring well for analysis. The sample analytical results showed "non-detect" levels; therefore, DEC approved decommissioning of the well. Plans were made to conduct a site visit in the fall of 2010 for inspections and to make a determination of the final removal of the passive boom system from the river's edge.

Situation:

The passenger vessel *Princess Kathleen* grounded and later sank north of Juneau, Alaska during foul weather in September 1952. Reports of the volume of fuel onboard at the time of the sinking varied greatly between historic sources. According to Canadian Pacific Railroad, owner of the vessel, the *Princess Kathleen* could hold approximately 160,000 gallons of bunker oil when fully loaded and an unknown volume of other petroleum products. During the last several years the number of rainbow sheens reported in the area increased and on several occasions residents reported tar balls washing ashore.

FY10 Action:

In February 2010 Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the United States Coast Guard formed a Unified Command to identify if the *Princess Kathleen* still contained fuel and if it was leaking. Remotely Operated Vehicles documented small quantities of bunker oil seeping from decaying rivets and escaping open portholes. Divers indentified a significant quantity of bunker fuel still within 10 of the 14 fuel tanks during an initial assessment; the remaining four tanks were initially inaccessible during the assessment because of the lay of the vessel. The Unified Command commenced fuel recovery efforts having identified the Princess Kathleen as a significant threat to the environment.

Containment and sorbent boom was pre-deployed around the work site and additional response equipment was pre-positioned at sensitive areas near the site prior fuel recovery efforts. Responders were on site during all active operations to insure a rapid response in the unlikely event of a catastrophic release from the *Princess Kathleen*.

Heat exchange coils were inserted into the tanks to heat the bunker oil allowing it to be pumped a tank-barge anchored above the wreck. Divers also used suction hoses to manually remove fuel from the overhead spaces that had leaked from the fuel tanks but remained trapped within the vessel. A total of 123,575 gallons of bunker oil and other petroleum products were removed from the 14 tanks and overhead spaces of the Princess Kathleen.

Red Dog Mine is located about 20 miles south of Kivalina and is one of the world's largest zinc and lead mines. The port and mine sites are operated by Teck and owned by NANA Corporation. In 2009, Teck Cominco changed the corporation to Teck Resources Limited. The road is owned by Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) which passes through the Cape Krusenstern National Monument, managed by the National Park Service. The mineral soil is processed at the mine, which is located about 50 miles from the ocean, and the concentrate ore is transported by covered truck to storage buildings at the port. During the open water period, the ore is moved by conveyor belt system from the buildings to barges, and transported from the barges to 3.0 miles off shore and placed into larger vessels.

Fugitive dust from the transportation of the ore concentrate between the mine and the port has resulted in contaminating those areas and along the 52 mile connecting road for zinc, lead and cadmium above background levels. Petroleum contamination is also present at the powerhouse due to release of crankcase oil and fuel oil from sump beneath generators.

FY09 Actions:

Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) reviewed and provided comments to Teck Cominco regarding Teck's "Draft Fugitive Dust Risk Management Plan Red Dog Operations, Alaska" dated August 2008. DEC also public noticed this draft document and participated in public informational meetings at Noatak and Kivalina that were hosted by Teck regarding this plan. The draft plan noted that six more detailed subplans would be submitted to DEC and to the public for review such as monitoring and reclamation. In FY08, DEC had approved of the risk assessment to address fugitive dust at the mine site and in its approval letter, DEC requested a management plan to address the risks to human health and the environment that were identified in the report. DEC also provided comments to DNR who coordinated the State's comments and provided them to EPA regarding EPA's preliminary draft "Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement" developed for the potential expansion to mine the nearby Aqqaluk ore deposit.

FY10 Actions:

DEC provided comments on Teck's "Draft Fugitive Dust Risk Management Plan Red Dog Operations, Alaska" dated August 2008. The plan was rather general in nature and referenced that six more detailed subplan would be submitted at a later date. One of those subplans "Communication Plan" was provided to DEc and various stakeholders on 4/2/2009 and DEC noted it had no comments on that subplan. DEC requested that the remaining draft subplans, e.g. monitoring, be provided to it by 10/1/2009.

DEC public noticed Teck's two draft implementation plans that address technical issues regarding findings of the fugitive dust risk assessment at Red Dog Mine: the Monitoring Plan and the Remediation Plan. DEC posted the notice on DEC's webpage and requested that comments be submitted between 6/15 through 5:00 p.m. 8/2/10. The notice informed individuals that the two draft plans can be found on DEC's webpage at: http://www.dec.state.ak.us/spar/csp/sites/reddog.htm.

The draft plans are part of Teck's Risk Management Plan (RMP) for effective management of fugitive dust issues at the mine. The RMP stated that six subplans would be developed and submitted at a later date. Teck provided a Communication Plan that DEC did not public notice but posted on its webpage. The RMP defines and will guide actions to minimize the potential for effects to human health and the environment from fugitive dust from the Red Dog operation, including the mine, road, and port. The RMP plan lays out objectives to achieve this overall goal. It also defines the scope for preparation of individual implementation plans.

Situation:

River Terrace RV Park (RVRVP) is a 10-acre parcel located adjacent to the Kenai River in Soldotna. A dry cleaner facility operated there from the 1960s through the 1980s. Currently the parcel is occupied by a trailer court, a recreational vehicle park and associated facilities, including a Laundromat.

In 1992, a complaint of leaking barrels was received by Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and 22 barrels of waste oil and other hazardous substances were identified on site. One of the 55 gallon drums was labeled "perchloroethylene" which is also known as tetrachloroethylene or PCE. The owner was requested to have an environmental contractor remove the barrels and investigate the property based on its past use as a dry cleaning facility. The assessments identified soil contamination above DEC cleanup levels for petroleum hydrocarbons and PCE.

In 1997, DEC evaluated the information from the site investigation and established alternative cleanup levels (ACL) for the site. The groundwater monitoring results identified PCE above the ACL and the property owner developed a plan to address the problems. The owner excavated approximately 3,300 cy of soil under the direction of EPA and treated it on-site using a soil vapor extraction system. Following a settlement agreement with the property owner DEC assumed the lead role to investigate the site and performed a water quality and sediment investigation in the Kenai River adjacent to RTRVP. Furthermore, a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) was prepared that further characterized the site and evaluated several remedial alternatives to treat the contamination. A Record of Decision established cleanup levels at the site and specified Hydrogen Release Compound (HRC) as the method to treat the groundwater. The injections would occur in a phased approach. In fall 2000, 56 HRC injection points were installed in Phase I and in 2001, another 51 injection wells were installed under Phase II.

In 2002 DEC determined that the degradation had stalled at the cis 1,2-dichloroethylene (cis DCE) stage and conducted a pilot bioaugmentation study to determine if microbes could facilitate the breakdown of the cis DCE. DEC continued to monitor the treatment at the site and evaluate trends in contamination in both the groundwater and the sediments in the Kenai River. Between 2002 and 2006, HRC was injected in selected areas in the upper and lower plume in four additional injection events (Phases II-V). In addition to cleanup activities, funding has been provided for legal advice on cleanup matters, litigation of the State's cost recovery action, and litigation to retain access to the site for the assessment and cleanup work.

FY09 Actions:

DEC continued groundwater monitoring at the site by performing semi-annual monitoring in spring and fall. DEC's contractor finalized reports for work performed in FY08 including a drum characterization and disposal project, and a sediment and pore water investigation. Department of Law (DOL) reviewed correspondence by the property owners' counsel to amend the Consent Decree.

FY10 Actions:

DEC continued groundwater monitoring at the site by performing semi-annual monitoring in spring and fall. DEC's contractors oversaw the injection of HRC into six existing injection points in the upper

plume where previous sampling indicated that HRC was near depletion. DEC's contractor finalized reports for work performed in FY09. DEC also met with EPA for a site inspection and review of records for the State and Tribal Assistance Grant program.

Department of Law will provide legal support to DEC to either modify the Consent Decree to extend the time line for the property owners to reimburse the State or to recover the remaining monies owed plus interest and other needed legal support.

Situation:

On 4-18-2008, The City of Shishmaref called to report the discovery of 100-200 gallons of diesel fuel near the city's water plant. Local responders began to recover pooled product while Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) mobilized Alaska Chadux Corporation to assist. Investigation into the cause revealed that approximately 4,300 gallons were released when tank farm operators opened bulk tank valves and inadvertently overfilled the water plant's day tank. The spill site was delineated while responder's worked to remove and stockpile contaminated snow into lined storage cells. Remaining free product was pumped into a designated storage tank while sandbag berms and underflow dams were constructed to catch residual fuel carried by spring run-off. On 6-19-08, DEC returned to complete the clean-up and recover product form the contaminated snow cell. The remaining response equipment was demobilized and the site is being transferred to Contaminated Sites for future monitoring.

Local responders conducted the initial response, while DEC mobilized Alaska Chadux Corporation to assist. The spill site was delineated while responder's worked to remove and stockpile contaminated snow into lined storage cells. Remaining free product was pumped into a designated storage tank while sandbag berns and underflow dams were constructed to eatch residual fuel carried by spring run-off. On 6-19-08, DEC returned to complete the clean-up and recover product from the contaminated snow cell. The remaining response equipment was demobilized and the site is being transferred to Contaminated Sites for future monitoring. All these activities took place in FY08. Costs associated with those activities were paid in Fiscal Year 2009 due to delay in vendor's submission of invoices.

Situation:

In 1995/1996, an area-wide trichloroethylene (TCE) groundwater plume was discovered in the Six-Mile Richardson Highway area. The plume is over a mile in length, up to 1,200 feet wide, and up to 100 feet in depth. It extends in a northwesterly direction from south of the New Richardson Highway to the Six-Mile Village Subdivision area.

The plume impacted fifteen residential drinking water wells and the homeowners were provided financial assistance to install water treatment systems (e.g., carbon filters) to remove the TCE from their drinking water. In 1996, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) initiated an annual long-term groundwater program that includes sampling from permanent monitoring wells and a selected number of residential wells. The data indicates a decreasing trend in contaminant concentrations over time.

Individual site investigations were conducted concurrently with the initial phases of the area wide groundwater investigation. Site investigations at the McCall, Holder, Walsky, and 6-Mile Truck Shop properties concluded that there are multiple source areas where TCE was discharged to the ground. The individual source areas are creating groundwater plumes that eventually merge together to form the area-wide plume. The source areas appear to be located on the Holder and Walsky properties. Potentially responsible parties have been notified of the contamination, but DEC has continued to lead investigation and treatment of the areawide plume.

FY09 Actions:

In FY09, the long-term monitoring continued along with residential well sampling. Additionally, the contractor completed an inventory of homes over the plume area for a vapor intrusion pathway analysis. There are buildings in the area that may be experiencing vapor intrusion

Situation:

The former Royal Master Laundrette, which is now the Good News Bible and Bookstore, released tetrachloroethylene (PCE) into the environment during its operation as a dry cleaner. This release is now the primary source of the groundwater contamination in the Gaffney Road area west of Cushman Street. The release also caused soil and soil gas contamination near the building that is causing vapors to migrate into the building, creating an inhalation risk for the employees. This property was separated out from the Gaffney Road Area-wide investigation because a settlement agreement was signed by Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the responsible parties, including the current owner and the former owner who operated the dry cleaning facility, that limits liability for those parties and commits the State to treating the soil contamination with soil vapor extraction (SVE). The SVE system was installed in 2009 and continues to operate. There is a long-term monitoring program for the groundwater and vapor plumes.

FY10 Actions:

FY 2010 work included the installation of a soil vapor extraction system to treat the soil and stop vapor intrusion. Groundwater and air monitoring continues as well.

Situation:

The site comprises approximately 10 acres; a five-acre parcel including a spit and uplands owned by North Pacific Seafood, Inc. (NPSI) that is occupied by a fish processing and cannery facility, and a stateowned adjacent 5-acre marine tideland leasehold that surrounds the sea-ward portion of the spit. The site is located across Togiak Bay from the city of Togiak. The site was contaminated by surface and subsurface gasoline and diesel releases in excess of 35,000 gallons that reportedly took place from the early 1980's until late 1987, when Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the U.S. Coast Guard investigated and confirmed complaints of ongoing releases. The fuel releases contaminated the groundwater and to an unknown extent, the shoreline and waters of Togiak Bay and the adjacent Togiak River estuary, with a sheen observed on the waters of Togiak Bay and 300 feet of shoreline impacted by fuel. Following enforcement and other legal actions approximately 12,400 gallons of fuel was recovered from groundwater recovery wells over a two-year period and the fuel storage and transfer facilities were upgraded. An additional release of approximately 260 gallons of diesel fuel was documented in 2005 when a valve between a supply tank and incinerator was left open. During 2002 and 2003 approximately 7,300 cubic yards of soil and sediment were excavated and later thermally remediated using an on-site remediation system. An additional 1,100 cubic yards of contaminated soil remains stockpiled at the site. Togiak Fisheries initiated a risk assessment process for the site in 2005, with the final document submitted in August 2007 and approved in November 2008. Following completion of planned work by NPSI and DEC review, DEC expects to grant site closure with institutional controls status during calendar year 2010.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, staff reviewed new monitoring reports, field notes, and all site information in the Contaminated Sites file for the site and determined that data gaps exist with respect to groundwater and surface water data. Although DEC prepared and provided to NPSI a draft Record of Decision (ROD) that would have allowed closure with institutional controls given the available site information, NPSI elected to forego site closure with institutional controls until additional work is done to simplify the content of the decision document.

During FY10, DEC approved NPSI's plan for assessing the integrity of existing monitoring wells, groundwater monitoring and surface water impact monitoring. DEC expects to complete the draft ROD based on a report to be submitted in fall 2010 summarizing work at the site including site work completed during the 2010 field season. Situation:

A site characterization was conducted October 2007 at the Togiak School property (4.8 acres) in conjunction with building demolition and new school construction. The findings indicated historic contamination, including gasoline and diesel range organics, and benzene above Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) cleanup levels. Contamination was found at multiple locations on both the northern and southern halves of the property. The site is sometimes referred to as the Togiak Old School. Demolition and construction plans included removal of the south end of the main school building as well as all other buildings and facilities on the southern half of the property. Renovations are planned for the northern half of the property for continued use as a school. After the building demolition plan is complete, the City of Togiak plans to reuse the southern half of the property as a recreation facility, meeting hall, and playground/park. There are also individual residential buildings on site.

During FY09, assessment activities were completed during the decommissioning activities at the old school site. Significant contamination was identified and approximately 4,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil were excavated and stockpiled at the landfill. Situation:

On December 23, 2009, the Central Alaska Response Team (CART) received a report from the U.S. Coast Guard of the vessel grounding in Prince William Sound. The 136-foot tug had completed an ice survey and was headed back to port at the time of the grounding. The vessel had approximately 100,000 gallons of diesel on board at the time of the grounding. Spill containment boom was immediately deployed around the vessel. R & R Diving Services was dispatched to conduct an underwater survey to assess the damage. The survey revealed extensive damage to the hull, including a 4- to 5-foot section missing from the keel. Three of the tug's diesel tanks were breached: one from the port (1P) side and two from the centerline (2C and 3C). Tank 1P did not contain any fuel and tanks 2C and 3C contained 10,000 and 23,540 gallons of diesel fuel, respectively, at the time of grounding. On the evening of December 24, the Unified Command approved plans to transfer fuel during the night from the *Pathfinder*'s breached tanks to the response vessel *Valdez Star* and to tow the *Pathfinder* to Valdez during daylight hours on December 25. Approximately 49,000 gallons of diesel fuel and water mix was removed from two damaged tanks, 2C and 3C, and then the *Pathfinder* was towed to Valdez, arriving at approximately 1:15 AM on December 27. CART staff participated on over-flights, filling positions in the Incident Command Post and on-site response oversight.

December 24 - 27, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Responder participated in overflights during the event.

December 24, Two DEC Marine Vessel staff from the Valdez office participated in the initial formation of the Incident Command.

The Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) currently owns land, structures, and associated abandoned tank farm that resides within the community. Of the two primary buildings on the site, one is slated for future demolition and the other is of new enough construction to warrant repair and reuse. The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) built the school on this site in 1957, and there was suspected contamination associated with the structures, petroleum contamination associated with the tank farm, and potential polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) associated with former power generation and transformers. Previous investigations by the school identified lead paint and asbestos issues, however PCBs and petroleum contamination remained suspect in soil at the site.

A site reconnaissance funded by the Denali Commission found diesel range organics (DRO) contamination up to 6,290 mg/kg in 2001. Less than 30 feet away from the tank farm is a drinking water well for the Paul T. Albert Memorial School which is used by most of the village residents for drinking water. This well, which is reported to be set at 38 feet below ground surface (bgs) with static water at about 10 ft bgs, is relatively shallow and could potentially be impacted by the DRO contamination from the tank farm.

During FY09 additional site characterization was planned. Due to logistical problems and sampling errors, data gaps still exist at this site and further site characterization to address the data gaps is warranted to better assess the groundwater ingestion exposure pathway. Situation:

In 1957, the Department of Army, Corps of Engineers (USACE) entered into a 5-year lease agreement with the University of Alaska (UA) for use as the Nike missile launch facility. After the lease was up in 1962, USACE entered into a 25-year lease agreement with the Department of Natural Resources for the same property. The lease was terminated in 1982 whereby the military left all the improvements in place.

The State of Alaska returned the land to the University and the site became both blighted and contaminated due to the presence of hazardous materials used in building construction, the use, spillage and storage of fuels, lubricants and solvents over 25 year of operation, and by vandalism of abandoned equipment that may have resulted in contaminants entering the environment. UA conducted site assessments in 1991 and 2002 that identified hazardous materials and contamination and pursued cleanups that removed and remediated some of the contamination, yet it is believed that contamination from multiple sources persists. In 2009, UA requested assistance from the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Reuse and Redevelopment Program to help quantify the magnitude of environmental issues at this site since UA is interested in returning the property to productive use.

FY10 Actions:

DEC completed a Property Assessment and Cleanup Plan for the Goose Bay Nike Missile Site and Launch Control Area and Landfill, identifying extensive environmental hindrances at the site, including: illegally dumped debris, vehicles, drums, paint cans, and construction debris; asbestos containing materials; floor drain outlets; a trespass shooting range and lead contamination; a septic tank and associated leach field; sumps associated with launching structures; and petroleum contaminated soil associated with abandoned vehicles and equipment.

Situation:

Beginning on or before July 13, 2007, at the Coffman Cove Road Project near Coffman Cove, Alaska, the Western Federal Lands Highway Division (WFLHD) conducted an operation that periodically resulted in an alleged violations of the water quality standards for certain parameters. Such actions are in violation of 18 AAC 70.010(a) and 18 AAC 70.020 (b)(6). Material borrow source B-5 rock was placed as fill material for highway construction through a corridor of high value streams and wetlands above Sweetwater Lake on Prince of Wales Island. When exposed to air and/or water, the B-5 pyritic shale oxidizes to form sulfuric acid drainage which readily dissolves any heavy metals complexed in native material. In fall 2006, Department of Fish and Game (DF&G) Office of Habitat Management and Permitting (OHMP) observed low pH and iron (III) hydroxide, "yellow-boy" turbid conditions in catalogued streams. The observed conditions continued to worsen and in December 2007 field and laboratory sampling data was sent to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Water Division Clean Water Act 401 Permit Program, who then issued an Enforcement Compliance Letter to WFLHD requesting prompt site characterization and mitigation to halt Water Quality violations that degrade habitat and threaten aquatic life.

The Department's allegations are based partially on self-reported sampling data. The May, 2008 *Coffman Cove Road Water Quality Assessment* reported to DEC that the WFLHD contractor documented low pH levels at four culvert crossings within the project area beginning on July 13, 2007. These culverts were identified as Station 19+964, 22+196, 23+965, and 24+701. All road building materials at these sites originated at borrow source B-5.

As a resource trustee for the federal lands, the Forest Service (FS) invoked lead cleanup authority under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). When a federal resource trustee invokes CERCLA authority as On-Scene Coordinator (OSC) for emergency removal actions, the State role in the decision process becomes advisory, providing comments to the OSC on how to best select a site cleanup remedy that serve the State's interests, such as protecting and maintaining water quality and habitat resources. As a result of having a long track record of pursing the State's interest with federal agencies in the CERCLA process, DEC Contaminated Sites Program assumed the lead for the Department. The site was designated Forest Service 3030 Road on the Contaminated Sites Database and scored high priority using the Environmental Tracking Module.

A resource trustee technical advisory team consisting of WFLHD, EPA, and FS federal agencies and DEC and DF&G/OHMP State agencies met to consider response objectives and available options. The FS OSC chose to use the current WFLHD road construction contractor for a Time Critical Removal Action (TCRA) to remove the B-5 acid-producing rock from embankments at two culvert crossings with the 3027 catalogued stream for transfer to borrow site B-1 where the acid-producing rock was layered with limestone and covered. DEC requests for widespread water quality and habitat assessment simultaneous with the removal action and adoption of at least a best management practice plan for consolidation of B-5 rock were considered not practicable.

FY 09 Actions:

During FY09, the DEC quickly mobilized an environmental contractor to the site to conduct a thorough baseline assessment of water quality and habitat conditions in the 3.5 mile complex network of streams and wetlands. The result is Oasis Environmental January 2009 PHASE I FINAL REPORT - PRINCE OF

WALES ISLAND FOREST ROAD 3030 SURFACE WATER AND SEDIMENTS ASSESSMENT. The report stated that "The study found at least one exceedance of Alaska Water Quality standards at each site, ranging from three to 16 exceedances per site. Exceedances were seen for these metals: aluminum (55), cadmium (24), cobalt (4), copper (26), iron (35), lead (10), manganese (33), mercury (8), nickel (16), selenium (1), and zinc (18). Exceedances were also seen for these other parameters: chloride (1), color (8), pH (35), dissolved oxygen (11), sulfate (10), total dissolved solids (9), and zinc (18) (page vi)."

The Department acknowledges that the report also found that "Exceedances of WQS criteria for some metals were observed at sites that didn't appear to be below where B-5 material had been placed: aluminum, iron, lead, and mercury. Although these exceedances were almost all slight, the results suggest their natural concentrations are relatively high and at levels near WQS criteria. Therefore, additional loading of these metals into the streams from the B-5 material may be of particular concern (page vi)."

Although stream health appears to be on the road to recovery where complete removal of B-5 material was performed, the 2009/2010 TCRA workplan provides WFLHD with the option for partial removals of B-5 material at the remaining impacted highway-water body crossings. The State resource trustees are opposed to the high-risk TCRA plan option adopted by the FS OSC and finds full removal as the only viable option to protect water quality and habitat resources above Sweetwater Lake. In addition, B-5 consolidation plan at the B-1 borrow source is not consistent with DEC solid waste mining industry standard practice for acid-producing rock. The B-1 borrow source is next to Hatchery Creek, arguably the highest value subsistence and sport fishing stream on Prince of Wales Island. The current estimated volume of B-5 material scheduled for removal and transfer to the B-1 borrow source is 80,000 cubic yards.

Situation:

The Coffman Cove Road improvement project began in 2002 to reconstruct a 4.9 mile old logging road on mostly Forest Service property. The western division of the Federal Highway Administration began upgrades to widen and improve the road for general use. The road links the City of Coffman Cove to the the North Prince of Wales Road, which is the main north/south route on the island.

Water quality concerns surfaced in June 2007 when representatives of the Western Fedral Land Highway Division (WFLHD) observed excessive corrosion of a culvert in place for only eight months. Water quality monitoring that year revealed a pH of 2.3 units just downstream of the culvert, a violation of the Alaska Water Quality Standards. Normal pH levels in Southewast Alaska can range from 4.5 to 7.0. Low pH readings at four other culvert locations, all fish-bearing streams, also exceeded the standards, as did high levels of iron and copper. Along the 3-1/2 mile project length, streams between the roadbed construction and Sweetwater Lake exibited orange staining and heavy flocculate "pudding". WFLHD notified Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) of water quality violations in December 2007. DEC responded with a Notice of Violation and request for Site Characterization Study and mitigation proposals. The result was a WFLHD-sponsored investigation in spring 2008 which documented acidic stream conditions with elevated metal concentrations and evidence of damage to aquatic life and habitat destruction.

The degraded habitat conditions force aquatic life to avoid the affected streams interrupting the life cycles of many fish species. Potential human health impacts so far seem limited to a US Forest Service (USFS) Cabin on Sweetwater Lake. The Forest Service posted a caution for people who visit or rent the public recreation cabin or boat launch sites at Sweetwater Lake. There are no dwellings on any of the affected streams.

Current owners and operator (Potentially Responsible Parties or PRPs) of the site are the US Federal Highway Administration (operator), USFS (3.65 miles of the road) and the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) (landowner on 1.25 miles of the road). In June 2008, DEC requested that the PRPs submit a conceptual site mode, submit a draft removal action plan, submit a plan that addresses proper transport and storage of the B-5 material, characterize the B-5 material, establish and monitor contamination trends in groundwater and surface water, conduct an ecological risk assessment, and submit a draft plan to restore safe and productive habitat and repopulate resident fish in the streams. Using their Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), USFS authority, conducted their first time critical removal action of B-5 material from Stream 3, B-5 Cut, D-2 Pit and consolidation of material at the B-1 Pit during the fall of 2008, installed monitoring wells and conducted surface water quality measurements.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC reviewed (in accordance with State environmental regulations/statutes) CERCLA time-critical removal action work plan/scopes of works, and schedules to address the acidic rock drainage at the Stream 3, B-5 Cut, D-2 Pit. DEC attended comment resolution meetings, teleconferences, and site visits.

Situation:

The Ross-Adam Mine site is an inactive uranium mine, located in Tongass National Forest, 8 miles north of the south end of Prince of Wales Island, and 1.5 miles west-northwest from the head of the West Arm of Kendrick Bay. Radiation was discovered at the site in 1955, which led to mining development of the uranium. It was worked on and off from the 1950s until the 1970s.

The US Forest Service (USFS) conducted a Preliminary Assessment/Site Investigation in 2004 which documented elevated levels of uranium and other radioactive contaminants of concern in several large waste rock piles, soils, stream sediments and marine sediments. In 2008, the USFS signed an Administrative Order on Consent with former mine operators Newmont Mining Company and Dawn Mining Company to conduct an Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis (EE/CA). The purpose of the EE/CA is to gather additional site information and evaluate various removal alternatives to clean up the site.

FY10 Actions:

In FY10, Newmont and Dawn Mining released a Draft Site Characterization Report to the US Forest Service and Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) for review. Given the unique issues associated with radionuclide contamination, DEC requested a review of the document from a term-contractor with specialized radionuclide experience. DEC provided these and other comments to Newmont and Dawn Mining Companies and participated in comment resolution meetings.

Situation:

The Salt Chuck Mine is an old abandonded copper and gold mine, located in Karta Bay near Kasaan on the Tongass National Forest on Prince of Wales Island. Heavy metal contamination and petroleum product contamination of soil, surface water, marine organisms and intertidal sediments on State intertidal lands was found in 1998. The total surface area of suspected contaminated area is approximately 23 acres.

In 2002-2007, the US Forest Service (USFS) conducted an Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis (EE/CA). The objective of this study was to define the extent of the contaminated area and evaluate various removal alternatives for cleanup of the site. The draft EE/CA report was given to Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) to review in 2007 and showed that the majority of the contamination is present on State-owned tidelands. Given the extent of contamination and risk to subsistence users and resources, DEC requested that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) evaluate the site for inclusion on the National Priorities List. In 2008, the USFS Office of General Counsel determined that the USFS would be unable to address the contamination on the State-owned tidelands. However, the USFS received some federal stimulus funds to conduct a removal of contamination on the USFS -managed uplands. In September 2009, the EPA listed the USFS Salt Chuck Mine on the National Priorities List.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, DEC conducted a site visit with the Environmental Protection Agency and US Forest Service. DEC reviewed and commented on technical documents for the site. DEC conducted negotiations with the US Forest Service regarding the potential for site cleanup actions. In response to an EPA request for a State position regarding potential site inclusion on the National Priorities List, DEC staff conducted outreach to State and Federal agencies, industry, tribes, and the affected public to provide information and hear concerns. DEC prepared outreach materials including fact sheets and presentations as well as management briefing materials. DEC participated in a mining symposium on Prince of Wales Island.

FY10 Actions:

In FY10, DEC provided technical assistance to the EPA during the final stages of the Superfund listing process. DEC also conducted public notification and outreach regarding the listing. DEC reviewed the US Forest Service's revised EE/CA document, provided comments, and participated in comment resolution meetings. DEC also attended community meetings on Prince of Wales Island. At the request of the Organized Village of Kasaan, DEC designed and contracted for the manufacture of signs to be placed at the site warning subsistence users not to eat shellfish from Salt Chuck Bay. These signs were installed for DEC by the US Forest Service.

Situation:

This former US Air Force (USAF) tank farm was built to support the WWII Lend/Lease Program. The property is owned by the USAF and the tank farm was operated from 1944 to 1991 by the USAF and its lessees, Chevron (Standard Oil) and Crowley Maritime. Soil and groundwater is contaminated with petroleum due to historical spills and refueling operations. Free product has been observed on the property and at the water table on the property boundary. Contaminated groundwater is present on and off-site; fuel impacts extend to the Snake River (an anadromous river) and Snake River sediment. Surface water quality violations have not been observed. Polychlorinated bi-phenyls (PCB)s and pesticides are potential contaminants of concern. The site consists of the former tank farm property, former fill stands, and remaining pipelines associated with the former tank farm. The USAF Relative Risk Evaluation Worksheets (9/4/95) ranked the former tank farm and pipeline sites as MEDIUM and LOW overall risks, respectively. The USAF worksheets also indicated that limited information is available from the 1988 Woodward-Clyde field investigation and the analytical findings from this report are valueless. A section of pipeline that crossed the Snake River was removed in April 1994; potential contamination along the underground portion of this pipeline and other pipelines has not been completely evaluated. Chevron performed significant characterization of soil contamination along the property boundary and management of contaminated soil and groundwater during the City of Nome's utility upgrade along Port Road in 2004/2005. Crowley conducted a site characterization study in 2008 which staff responded to in 2009 stating that the site will require further treatment. The Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) group met in 2009 and planned for treatment feasibility studies, monitoring work, and other evaluations. Contamination and an interim-action treatment system (currently inactive) have interfered with Nome Joint Utility's ability to tie in new utility customers adjacent to the site. Department of Environmental Conservation staffs are working with the PRP group and the Utility to approve methods for these utility extensions.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, staff participated in meetings with multiple responsible parties, reviewed corrective action plans and status reports, and interfaced with legal on issues of concern. Staff provided comments and approvals to work products.

FY10 Actions:

During FY10, staff worked with the PRPs and their contractors to further delineate the extent of contamination and evaluate potential cleanup alternatives. A bench scale treatability study was initiated to evaluate the potential for in-situ chemical oxidation as a portion of the cleanup plan.

Situation:

The Wrangell Institute was built in 1932 by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and used as a school for Native children until the 1970s. In 1978, the facility was transferred to the Cook Inlet Regional, Inc., and was used for several years as housing for the Forest Service for the Young Adult Conservation Corps. In 1995, ownership of the property was transferred to the City of Wrangell.

Contamination at the site is the result of leaks and spills along the heating fuel transfer and fueling systems. On-site there were two large 20,000 gallon fuel tanks which stored heating oil for the school. The fuel was transferred from tankers uphill to the tanks by a pipeline and then dispersed to the individual fuel tanks at each building by another pipeline.

In 1999, the City removed all of the tanks and excavated 750 cubic yards of contaminated soil which was stockpiled in a rockpit. In 2001, the City performed a site assessment of the property, demolished all of the buildings, excavated additional contaminated soil which was stockpiled near the site, and collected samples to determine levels of contamination remaining on-site. In fall 2002, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) contacted the Potentially Responsible Parties (PRPs) to begin discussions about future cleanup actions. In October 2003, DEC performed a thorough site characterization of the site, installing monitoring wells, and collecting soil, sediment, groundwater, and surface water samples.

After several years of negotiations, in June 2007, the US Department of Justice signed a settlement agreement for \$2.35 million for the federal portion of the cleanup action, long-term monitoring, payment of State of Alaska past and future oversight and contractual costs, and payment of City and Borough of Wrangell past cleanup costs. In FY08, the DEC term contractor excavated the majority of the contaminated soil and stockpiled it at site.

FY09 Actions:

During FY09, the final site excavating activities were completed with a total of almost 11,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil removed. The DEC term contractor demobilized from the site. DEC contracted with a term contractor specializing in disposal of contaminated soil to send 400 cubic yards of highly contaminated soil to a landfill in Oregon. In FY09, DEC also transported all of the remaining lightly-contaminated soil to the Wrangell Landfill to be used as cover material during the closure of the landfill. The original settlement agreement for the cleanup of the Wrangell Institute specified that the City and Borough of Wrangell would transport the soil, however based upon the increased volume in soil, DEC agreed to transport the soil. DEC also reviewed the groundwater and surface water sampling results submitted by the City and Borough of Wrangell.

DEC sent a closure letter to the City and Borough of Wrangell. A small volume of contaminated soil remains at the southern end of site at the former bulk fuel pipeline. Surface water samples down gradient met Alaska Surface Water Quality Standards. The location has been surveyed and a site figure depicting the location was created. No reporting requirements are needed.

Situation:

In May 2009, heavy snow melt and ice dams caused rivers and streams to rise and caused flooding in communities along the Yukon and Kuskokwim river systems. The flooding impacted several communities, damaging many homes, businesses, and public infrastructure. Several areas had to be evacuated. Many public and private drinking water systems were impacted by the flooding, as well as wastewater disposal systems, and landfills. The flood waters damaged or displaced numerous fuel tanks, drums, and other containers in the communities and other locations along the rivers. There were also petroleum spills in many of the flooded communities.

FY09 Action:

Eagle: Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) staff and a contractor was sent to Eagle with the mission to mitigate the effects of the released fuel and collect and/or stabilize drums and tanks that were damaged or displaced by the ice and flood waters. A lined containment area was set up in the gravel pit near the airport in Eagle. Drums with product were collected, over-packed and placed in the lined area. Household hazardous waste (paint, batteries, cleaning products etc.) were collected and placed in fish totes in the lined area. Disturbed fuel tanks were emptied and stabilized. In support of the Department of Transportation mission to reopen the road from Eagle to Eagle Village. DEC removed all hazardous wastes and drained fluids from abandoned wrecked vehicles that were found during the debris removal along the right-of-way.

<u>Tanana</u>: DEC staff traveled to Tanana and worked with our contactor to collect drums that contained product and had been displaced by the flood, stabilize tanks, and sanitize the general area with lime to protect the inhabitants and the response workers from diseases caused by exposure to sewage.

Stevens Village: DEC and a contractor traveled to Stevens Village. Since most of the residence of Stevens Village used wood heat the issue of displaced tanks was not a major concern. However, over 80 drums containing product have been collected from the debris lines downstream of the village. The drums were staged at the barge landing in a lined area.

FY10 Actions:

<u>Eagle</u>: Through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Division of Military and Veterans Affair (DMVA) the debris removal from personal property has been completed. ADEC will dispose of the household hazardous waste that was collected during this process. No other actions are anticipated at this time.

<u>Tanana</u>: The recovered fuel and household hazardous waste was either recycled or transported out of the Tanana to be disposed of at a licensed facility. No other actions are anticipated at this time.

Situation:

The Sterling ZipMart facility was a gas station which opened in 1985. The original underground storage tank (UST) system which consisted of two 10,000 gallon steel tanks with a single wall piping, was owned and operated by Whittier Properties, Inc. from April 1990 to December 2000. In August 1995, when the original USTs were replaced with a new 20,000 gallon, three-compartment tank, minor soil and groundwater contamination was encountered. No cleanup action was conducted because it was not reported as a significant problem.

In December 2001, additional assessment was performed when the responsible party (RP), Whittier Properties, was closing the facility. This 2001 fieldwork (conducted initially by the RP under the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Financial Assistance Program) identified significant soil and groundwater contamination associated with the piping and fuel dispensers. Thirteen inches of fuel product were detected in two 40 foot deep monitor wells. The exact quantity of fuel spilled is unknown, but the DEC has determined that the quantity exceeds 50,000 gallons, based on a review of fuel records.

The contamination migrated in a southeasterly direction and dissolved-phase fuel contamination in excess of DEC groundwater cleanup levels has been encountered in a plume approximately 2,400 feet long and up to 600 feet wide. When the RP was unable to continue, the DEC assumed the lead role for characterization, remediation and monitoring of the fuel release on the former gas station property, as well as on adjacent and down-gradient properties. The groundwater and drinking water wells in the area continue to be monitored by DEC to determine the risk to human health, and to define the extent of contamination.

A product recovery system which was operated from 2002-2005 resulted in the recovery of over 15,000 gallons of product. Following the free-phase product recovery effort, a soil vapor extraction system (SVES) was installed in 2005. In 2007 the SVES was expanded to the east of the existing system which allowed for treatment and cleanup of the secondary source area on the Sterling Baptist Church property. The SVES is currently operational and continues to extract gasoline in the vapor phase from the source area throughout the year.

FY09 Actions:

During spring of 2009 an Oxygen Releasing Compound (ORC) Pilot Study was undertaken to evaluate the effectiveness of injecting an oxygen source into the aquifer to enhance bioremediation, and slow the advance of dissolved phase gasoline constituents at the down-gradient end of the contaminant plume. In May 2009 the existing UST, associated fuel dispensers, and piping were removed. Approximately 774 tons of petroleum impacted soil were excavated from the vicinity of the UST system and transported to ASR in Anchorage for thermal treatment. Soil in the bottom of the excavation was treated with ORC Advanced oxygen releasing compound and RegenOX chemical oxidizer to enhance degradation of the petroleum remaining in the subsurface. A passive soil ventilation system was installed in the excavation backfill to facilitate removal of volatile compounds and enhance oxygen movement in the subsurface.

FY10 Actions:

Additional funding came from the FY05 CIP, allowing some of the FY10 funding to be reallocated to other CIP projects. FY 10 work included continued sampling of groundwater and drinking water; operation and maintenance of the soil vapor extraction system; monitoring of oxygen releasing compound to enhance contaminant degradation of groundwater in the down-gradient plume front area; further investigation and characterization in the northeastern area of the groundwater plume; and product level monitoring.

<u>Sec. 46.08.060</u>. Report. (a) The commissioner shall make available a report to the legislature not later than the 10th day following the convening of each first regular session of the legislature. The commissioner shall notify the legislature that the report is available. The report may include information considered significant by the commissioner but must include:

- (1) the amount of money expended by the department under AS 46.08.040(a) during the preceding two fiscal years.
- (2) the amount and source of money received and money recovered by or on behalf of the department during the preceding two fiscal years under
 - (A) AS 46.08.020; and
 - (B) AS 46.08.025;
- (3) a summary of municipal participation in the department's responses that were paid for by the fund;
- (4) a detailed summary of department activities in responses paid for by the fund during the preceding two fiscal years, including response descriptions and statements outlining the nature of the threat; in this paragraph, "detailed" includes information describing each personal services position and total compensation for that position, each contract in excess of \$10,000, and each purchase in excess of \$10,000; and
- (5) the projected cost to the department for the next two fiscal years of monitoring, operating, and maintaining sites where response has been completed or is expected to be continued during the next two fiscal years.
- (b) As part of the department's on-going identification efforts associated with oil spill or hazardous substance release or waste sites, the commissioner shall include in the report under this section
 - (1) the number of sites that are included in the department's contaminated sites data base, whether the site is active or closed; and
 - (2) a prioritized listing of those sites, both statewide and by community, based on the immediate and long-term threats to the public health or welfare or to the environment.
- (c) In addition to the department's report required under (a) of this section, the governor shall submit a report about use of the fund during the previous two fiscal years to the legislature not later than the 10th day following the convening of each first regular session of the legislature. In the report, the governor shall describe in detail the governor's use of money from the fund, with separate explanations, by agency, of the activities that were paid for under the authority of AS 46.08.045.
