How to Call 911

BE CALM, Responder Needs to Understand What You are Saying

BE PREPARED IN ADVANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

Your Name

Your Phone Number

The Address of the Emergency — Look at landmarks if you don't know the road address. What is the name of the road? Are you near a crossroad.

Type of Emergency - What is wrong? Fire, need police, need medical help **Car license plate, make, model, color and year of car -** If a car accident.

Make sure your cell phone GPS is on and leave your phone on so they can find you if you do not know the address.

You can have this form printed out and posted near your phone so you remember what to say when you call.
