Roles:	The CASDP must be issued prior to releasing permits for any structures associated with the project.

Submittal	Stormwater Management Plans (SWMP) shall be prepared and submitted for review.
Process:	Plans shall be prepared in accordance with the Construction Activities Stormwater Manual.
	Construction Activities Stormwater Manual and Permitting Information
	Submit a draft narrative and plans for initial review. Documents shall be submitted <u>electronically using E-Permit</u>
	(preferred) or by attaching to an email to <u>developmentservices@denvergov.org</u>
	If needed, subsequent reviews should be submitted in the same manner as the initial review.
	Permit Transfers: Submit transfer application in PDF format to the Wastewater review engineer via email
	(preferred). Alternatively, transfer application may be submitted <u>electronically using E-Permit</u> or by email to <u>developmentservices@denvergov.org.</u> Application for transfer may be found within the CASDP narrative.
	Amendments: Submit amendments electronically using E-Permit (preferred) or by email to
	developmentservices@denvergov.org.
Approval	The plan reviewer will review for compliance and email comments that will need to be addressed prior to approval.
Process:	Upon approval for compliance by the reviewer, the Applicant &/or Engineer of Record will need to sign/stamp all
	documents (permit, narrative and plans).
	Submit one (1) electronic (scanned to pdf or electronically signed pdf) copy of complete narrative, plans and permit via
	E-plan or email per submittal instructions above. (Hardcopy final submittal is no longer required as of January 3,
	2017. All submittals including final submittal may be made electronically).
	Upon acceptance and approval of the signed/sealed electronic narrative, plans and permit, the invoice with payment
D :	instructions will be emailed to the applicant and Engineer of Record.
Permit Benchmarks:	This permit shall remain active and in effect until the project is completed and final stabilization has been achieved. Final Stabilization methods include: installation of sod or other landscaping measures, hard surfacing (such as paving or concrete), or
Dencimarks:	seeding that has achieved 70% uniform coverage. In addition, all BMPs must be removed, an inactivation request submitted to the
	WMD Wastewater Investigator, and the site must pass a final inspection.
	If work under this permit is not commenced within one (1) year from the date of issuance, or if after partial completion the work is
F	discontinued for a period of one (1) year, this permit shall become void. A request for time extension may be filed.
Fees:	4 Application fee of \$100.00.
	Review fees of \$200.00 plus \$ 25.00 per acre must be paid prior to final permit and site copy of CASDP issuance.  All checks should be made payable to Manager of Finance.
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Additional	Colorado law requires that all construction sites/development projects, which, by definition, disturb one or more acres in area (including demolition), are part of a larger or sale plan development, has significant potential for erosion, activities that disturb
Information	contaminated soils or activities that disturb or place fill in water of the US shall be covered by a State Issued General Permit for
	Construction Activities. The state permit is issued by the State of Colorado, Water Quality Control Division. Information on the
