



CHAINS REQUIRED IN VERMONT

It's the LAW!

- WHO** Drivers of vehicles with a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR), or Gross Combination Weight Rating (GCWR) greater than 26,000 pounds.
- WHAT** Must chain up certain tires of your vehicle (see reverse for more details).
- WHERE** VT Route 9 between Bennington and Wilmington.
- WHEN** During periods of inclement weather and message boards are activated.
- WHY** Vermont law requires chain up to ensure safe travel for all.



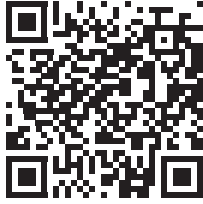
