- If a **RED** light permit is being applied for, the authorization must be completed by and include the signature of the Department Head or Chief of Fire, Ambulance, or Rescue organization.
- If a **BLUE** light permit is being applied for, the authorization must be completed by and include the signature of the Department Head, Sheriff, or Chief of the law enforcement agency (include title).
- Town Clerk certification is required if the applicant is a town constable.

When the Commissioner is satisfied with the condition and use of a vehicle, they can issue (and revoke, if necessary) permits for sirens and colored signal lights in certain situations:

1. Law Enforcement:

- Blue or blue and white signal lights and sirens can be authorized for any law enforcement vehicle that is owned or leased by a law enforcement agency, a certified officer, or the Vermont Criminal Justice Council.
- Red or amber signal lights can also be used for these vehicles, but they must be mounted to be mostly visible from the rear.
- If the person applying is a constable, they need to include a certificate from the town clerk confirming they are the properly elected or appointed constable and that their authority hasn't been limited by the town.

2. Emergency Medical Services and Fire Departments:

- Sirens and red or red and white signal lights can be authorized for all ambulances, EMS vehicles, fire department vehicles, and vehicles used solely for rescue operations. This also includes vehicles owned by volunteer firefighters or rescue squad members, even if it's their employer's vehicle if the employer gives written permission for it to be used in emergencies.
- Blue or amber lights can also be used for EMS or fire department vehicles, but they must be mounted to be mostly visible from the rear.

3. Other Rules:

- No permit will be issued for a vehicle unless this form has the vehicle owner's details and the person applying for the permit.
- Sirens and red, white, blue, or blue and white lights can also be authorized for restored emergency or enforcement vehicles used in exhibitions like car shows or parades. However, these sirens and lights should only be used during these events.

Light Permits are issued to a specific vehicle. When the vehicle's registration is transferred, the permit is valid for up to 30 days. A new permit application is required.
