# Office of History and Archaeology news

#### **Alaska Historical Commission**

The **Alaska Historical Commission** meet by Microsoft Teams on Thursday November 17, 2022. The AHC reviewed 22 grants and made recommendations to the Alaska State Historic Preservation Office for funding CLG, development and predevelopment, and Preserve Alaska grants. The SHPO will be reviewing the grant applications prioritized by the AHC for eligibility and available funding. Notifications of award will be sent in the next few weeks.

# **NPS Grant opportunities:**

The National Park Service is now accepting applications for the <u>Save America's Treasures</u> (SAT) grant program. The SAT program provides preservation and conservation assistance to nationally significant historic sites and collections. \$26.5 million will be competitively awarded. A dollar-for-dollar, non-Federal match, is required, this can be either cash or documented in-kind services. SAT is administered by the National Park Service (NPS) in partnership with the <u>National Endowment for the Arts</u> (NEA), the <u>National Endowment for the Humanities</u> (NEH), and the <u>Institute of Museum and Library Services</u> (IMLS). Preservation projects fund physical preservation of historic buildings, sites, structures, and objects. Collection projects include conservation of artifacts, museum collections, documents, sculptures, and works of art.

The NEH Division of Preservation and Access offers grants of up to \$10,000 for preservation assistance for small and mid-sized institutions. The grant provides funding for preservation assessment, planning, supplies, and professional development. Collections may include special collections of books and journals, archives and manuscripts, prints and photographs moving images, sound recordings, architectural and cartographic artifacts, furniture, historical objects, and digital materials. ### National Trust for Historic Preservation news

Paul Edmondson, president and CEO of the National Trust, announced that he will be stepping down in spring 2023. As the organization's ninth president, Edmondson oversaw important milestones in broadening the National Trust's base and impact, achieving critical work to protect and preserve places across the nation.

#### 2023 African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund

The National Trust's <u>African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund</u> opened the Letter of Intent (LOI) period for its <u>2023 National Grant Program</u>. Grants provide a range of **funding from \$50,000** to **\$150,000** for ongoing preservation activities for historic places like sites, museums and landscapes that represent African American cultural heritage. LOI due December 19. Learn more about the <u>2022 grantees</u>.

Through its National Grant Program, the Action Fund supports projects focused on African American cultural heritage, including capital projects, organizational capacity-building, project planning, and programming and interpretation. There are new priorities for this grant round.

**Peter H. Brink Leadership Fund grants** (up to \$2,500) for travel costs and mentor honoraria are available for Organization Level Forum or Main Street America members of the National Trust. The purpose of these grants is to support the leadership and effectiveness of staff and board members of preservation organizations through individualized mentoring and the sharing of expertise.
