SUBJECT: EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY - CITRUS FRUIT

- 1. ON 10 SEPTEMBER 1969 THE COUNCIL APPOINTED A WORKING PARTY TO EXAMINE THE REQUEST BY THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY FOR A WAIVER FROM ITS OBLIGATIONS UNDER ARTICLE I OF THE GENERAL AGREEMENT IN ORDER TO REDUCE THE CUSTOMS DUTIES IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN CITRUS FRUIT ORIGINATING FROM ASRAEL AND SPAIN, AND TO REPORT TO THE COUNCIL.
- 2. THE NEMBERSHIP WAS ESTABLISHED AS FOLLOWS:
