Biographical Note on Mr. Julio A. Lacarte, Chairman of the Contracting Parties to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade

Mr. Julio A. Lacarte is a diplomatic career officer of the Government of Uruguay. He has served as Minister to Ecuador, Ambassador to Bolivia, Ambassador to the United States. He has also been Representative to the Organization of American States and Vice-President of the Council of the Organization of American States. He has been Deputy Executive Secretary of GATT and Chairman of the Council of GATT. At the present time Mr. Lacarte is Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany and Representative to the European Economic Community and to GATT.
