Juneau, AK Flooding Resource Guide

August 2024

"A rush of water unleashed by an ailing glacier swelled an Alaska river to record levels Tuesday and caused destructive flooding in Juneau nearly a year to the date of a similar significant event. More than 100 homes have been damaged or impacted by the so-called glacial lake outburst flooding along the Mendenhall River in the Mendenhall Valley, according to city officials, who characterized the flood severity as "unprecedented." "The National Weather Service said the Mendenhall River crested early Tuesday at 15.99 feet (4.9 meters), higher than the 14.97-foot (4.6-meter) crest from last year's ferocious flood, which devoured huge chunks of riverbank.

This year's flooding reached farther into Mendenhall Valley. There was "a lot more water in the valley, on the streets, in people's homes," Barr said. Some streets at one point had 3 to 4 feet (0.9 to 1.2 meters) of water, possibly more, he said." [August 6, 2024] <u>via AP News</u>

City and Borough of Juneau

The City and Borough of Juneau (CBJ) has issued a local declaration of emergency following the August 6, 2024, Mendenhall River flood event. CBJ has set up an emergency operations center and is coordinating with state and federal officials to respond. - Alaska Electric Light & Power closely monitored rising water levels leading to and during the flood and disconnected power to affected neighborhoods prior to inundation.
