Dear Parents/Guardians of Current CCTS-GTC Juniors:

We hope your student is having a successful junior year at CCTS. Their senior year is fast approaching! The Senior Class Advisors and I are hoping to provide a memorable senior year for your student, and part of that is the 2025 senior trip!

The 2025 Senior Class Trip will held in May to coincide with the end of the spring semester at Camden County College. We have worked with Disney's #1 Senior Trip travel agency, World Class Vacations, to develop a fun-filled experience for our seniors! Here are the details on the 2025 trip:

- **Dates**: May 14-17, 2025
- Destination: Orlando, FL
- Lodging: Disney's All Star Sports Resort
- Activities:
 - May 14, 2025 Arrive at CCTS early a.m., travel via school bus to PHL airport, fly nonstop to Orlando International Airport, use pass for Walt Disney World waterpark (Typhoon Lagoon or Blizzard Beach), enjoy the day at waterpark before checking into Disney's All Star Sports Resort, visit Disney Springs shopping and dining area, travel back to resort
 - May 15, 2025 Park Hopper pass for Walt Disney World (Magic Kingdom, Hollywood Studios, Animal Kingdom, and Epcot)
 - May 16, 2025 Park Hopper pass for **Walt Disney World** (Magic Kingdom, Hollywood Studios, Animal Kingdom, and Epcot)
 - May 17, 2025 Check out of Disney's All Star Sports Resort, Park-to-Park pass for Universal Orlando Resort (Universal Studios and Islands of Adventure), travel to Orlando International Airport, fly to PHL, travel via school bus to CCTS late p.m./early a.m.
- Included: Transportation to and from all parks and to and from airports; nighttime security; checked bags and carry-ons; (1) \$10 Disney Dining card, (1) \$20 Disney Dining card, (2) \$30 Disney Dining cards, and (1) \$20 Universal Gift card

- Cost:
 - \$1625.00 per student (QUAD occupancy rooms)
 - \$1655.00 per student (TRIPLE occupancy rooms)
 - \$1745.00 per student (DOUBLE occupancy rooms)

- All rooms have two (2) queen beds. If you prefer not to share a bed with another student, select a double occupancy room. We strongly recommend a double occupancy room for all students. All rooms are same sex. No "couples" are permitted to room together.
- You may make your payments in installments, however, all seniors intending to go on the senior trip must make AT LEAST the following payment totals by the dates listed below:
 - \$515.00 by September 27, 2024
 - \$570.00 by November 25, 2024
 - The balance of their trip by February 21, 2025

The payments must be made online using **THIS LINK** or in the form of a money order (money order payments must be accompanied by the enclosed payment/information sheet). All money orders should be made out to "C.C.T.S.". You can sign up for GTC Class of 2025 Senior Trip Remind updates by texting <u>@25gtctrip</u> to the number <u>81010</u>.

Insurance: <u>Cancel for any reason travel insurance is not mandatory but highly recommended for each student</u>. The cost is \$81.00 per student for travel insurance. This travel insurance can provide up to a 75% refund up to 48 hours before the trip. This insurance must be purchased by October 14, 2024. <u>CLICK HERE</u> to purchase travel insurance directly through the insurance carrier (Travel Insured International).

Students who are on contract may not be permitted to attend the trip. Students who are suspended within one month of the trip (April 14, 2025 on) or have poor attendance may not be permitted to attend the trip and may have to request a refund via the cancel for any reason travel insurance or forfeit the cost of their trip.

Students must present proof of health insurance to attend the senior trip.

All students 18 and older MUST have a government-issued REAL ID on them to board the plane. Please make sure your senior brings their REAL ID or passport on the trip.

Please consider whether or not your student should attend the senior trip. This three-night trip is jammed-packed. Your student may not be able to go to the resort/hotel for an afternoon break. If your student cannot spend long hours in the heat among crowds of people, this trip may be difficult for them. Students on the trip are NOT with chaperones the entire trip. Our senior students are expected to conduct themselves properly when not with the chaperones. Generally, chaperones are in the same park as the students and can respond to them very quickly, however, our students are not expected to stay together as one large group throughout the trip. For this trip, there will be roughly one chaperone for every ten students. Here are some things you should consider prior to making your payments for your student:

- Does my student do well on their own?
- Does my student get homesick easily?
- Can my student handle crowded areas?
- Can my student navigate theme parks using their phone or a paper map without a chaperone?
- Does my student have medical concerns that may be difficult for them or chaperones to handle?
- Can my student budget their money to ensure they have sufficient food and drink?
- Has my student ever flown before? Will they have any problems flying?
