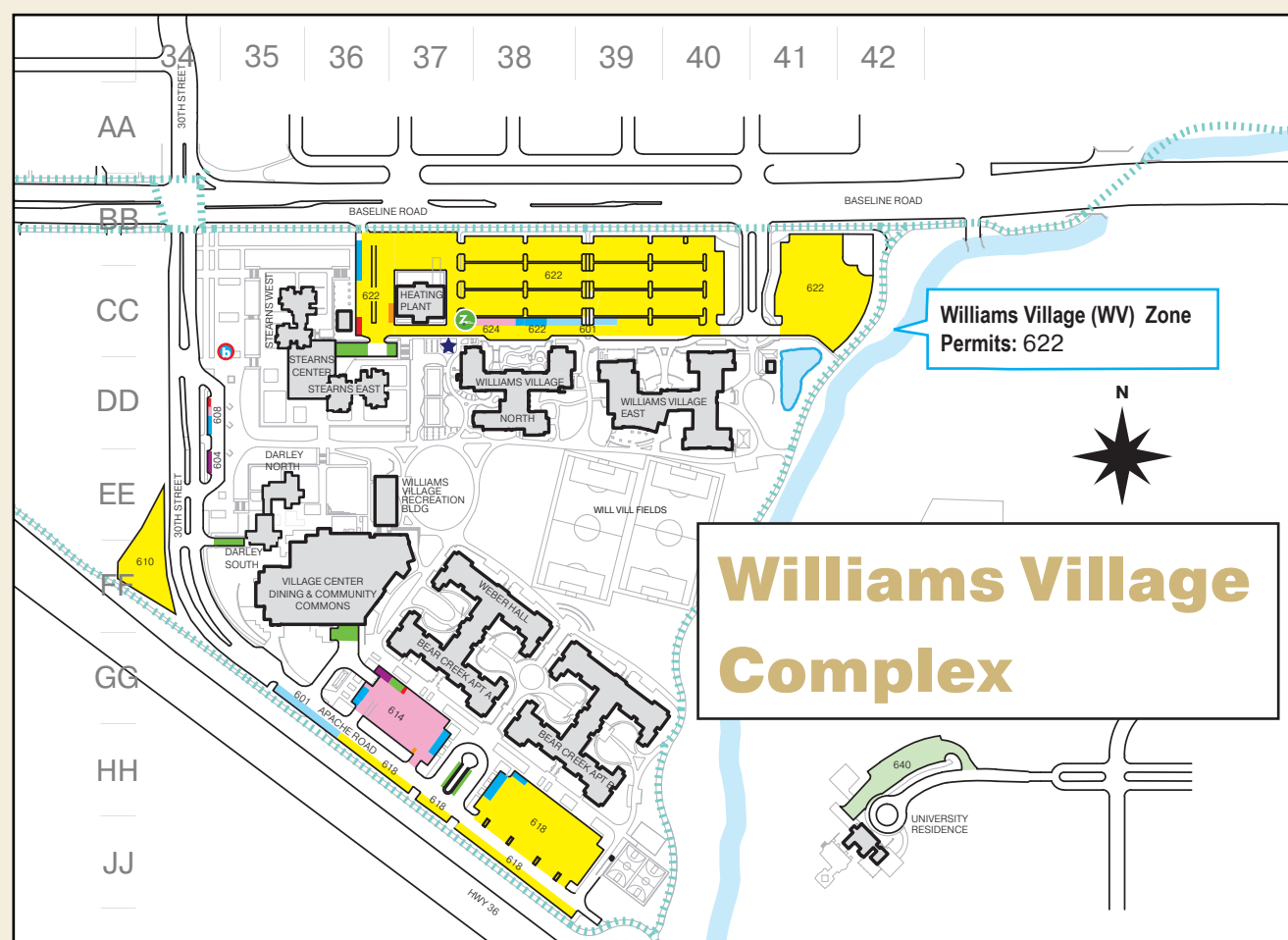
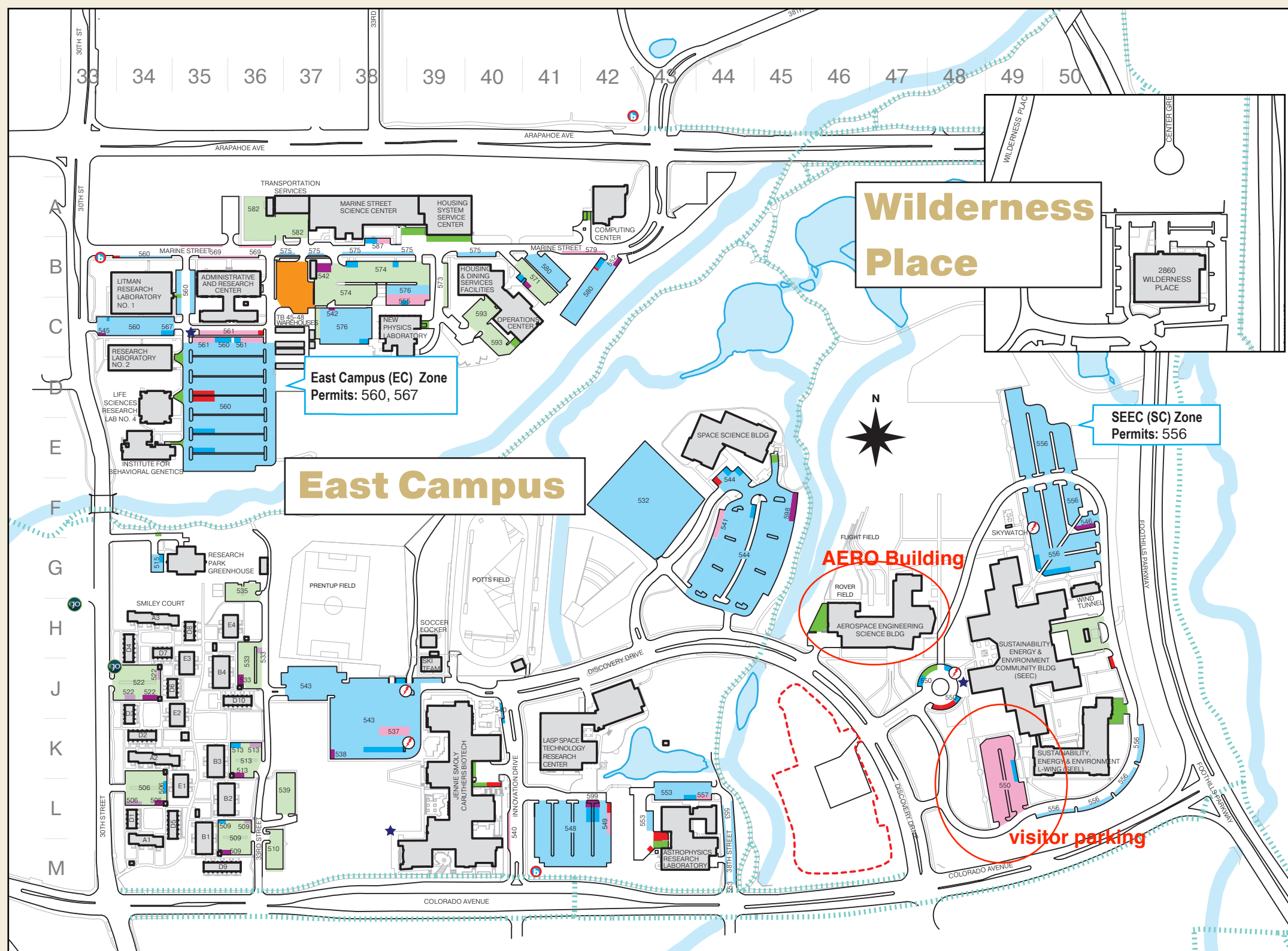

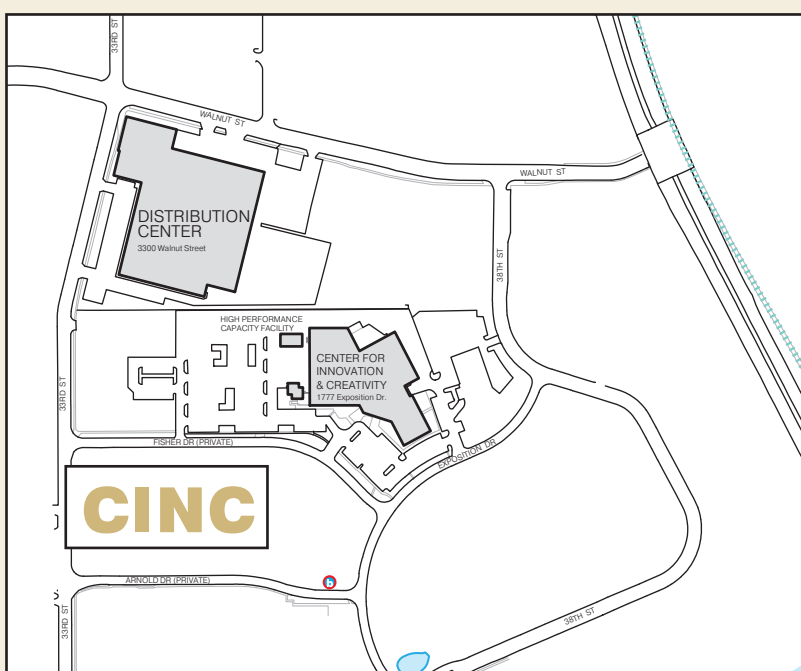

Buff Bus

RTD
RTD's CollegePass (students) and EcoPass (faculty/staff) is the pass you need to ride the RTD buses in and around town. It's a different card than your Buff OneCard. Parking Services develops and manages parking throughout the University of Colorado Boulder's Main and East campuses and the Williams Village/Bear Creek residential area. Parking Permits

Faculty and staff obtain parking permits with the assistance of their department parking liaisons. Student parking permits are available for purchase online at specified times. Personal permits must be paid for by individuals, not with university funds. All vehicles parked in a permitted lot or assigned overflow lot must be registered to a valid parking permit. Register all vehicles you will park on campus with Parking Services. Prorated refunds are available if you cancel your permit. Parking permits are registered to specific license plates and are not transferrable. When routine parking patterns are changed because of events, construction or emergencies, parking staff will provide permit holders access to a temporary parking lot, excluding campus move-in.

Visitors and Vendors

Visitors and vendors may purchase permits or pay at pay stations or meters. Short-term visitor and vendor permits are available at 1050 Regent Drive. Please check signs carefully before parking; regulations can vary by time of day or day of week.



Parkmobile pay by phone: Parkmobile allows you to pay for parking by phone at Parkmobile-enabled pay stations. When using Parkmobile you choose how long you want to park and pay for that amount of time. When the expiration time approaches, you can receive a text alert allowing you to extend your time (within the maximum time limit for the lot). For more information, please visit the Parking Services website.

Meters and pay stations: Read all parking signs. Pay at gray and blue meters seven days a week, at all times. Park only at blue meters when displaying a disability placard or license plate. Some pay stations accept visitor payments between 5 p.m. and 7:30 a.m., when permit restrictions are not in effect. During these times, lots are pay-by-plate and controlled through license plate recognition technology so you won't need to display your receipt. Pay red meters all days and times.

Weeknights and weekends: Several lots with pay stations become visitor lots from 5 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. weeknights, and all day Saturdays and Sundays. Lots are pay-by-plate and controlled through license plate recognition technology so you won't need to display your receipt. Parking signs will indicate whether parking lots are no-charge from 5 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. weeknights, Saturdays and Sundays.

Loading/unloading: Some buildings have a loading area where you may park at no charge for 15 minutes while loading or unloading a vehicle. Please be careful not to block driveways or dumpsters.

Special Events

Are you planning a campus event that requires parking for more than four vehicles? Please call 303-492-7344 for assistance. Parking Services creates parking and traffic plans for nearly 3,000 events each year, including parking for people with disabilities.

Reciprocal Parking

Student, faculty and staff permit holders from the UCBS, CU Denver and Anschutz Medical campuses may park at no-charge in CU Boulder Main Campus lots 308 and RG Zone, and in East Campus lots 543 and 560 by displaying their home campus permit. Parking in other lots and at meters requires payment. For more information, visit colorado.edu/parking/permits/parking-permits/cu-reciprocal-parking-agreement.

As a campus auxiliary, Parking Services is self-supporting. The sale of parking permits is the primary source of revenue. Parking Services provides a wide range of services including new and improved parking facilities, parking and traffic control for many campus events, and updated technology to improve customer convenience. CU Boulder is granted its authority from Colorado Revised Statute 23-5-107 to create rules and regulations including, but not limited to, control of parking spaces, assignment of parking permits, removal of vehicles parked in violation, and assessment of fines for violations. Be safe.

- » Heed posted parking signs.
- » Don't block driveways, sidewalks, streets or loading docks.
- » Unless you have a permit to do so, driving on campus sidewalks is prohibited and is never allowed during class changes.
- » Bicyclists and skateboarders must ride slowly on campus walkways, remembering that pedestrians always have the right of way.

Be considerate.

- » Obtain a parking permit for a permit-controlled lot.
- » Respond to parking citations.
- » Altering dates on temporary permits is prohibited.
- » Park in ADA-accessible parking spaces only if displaying a state-issued disability license plate, placard, decal or permit.
- » Use service parking spaces for service vehicles when possible.
- » Park only as long as needed to load or unload.

Be aware.

- » Read signage and park in designated parking spaces.
- » Pay meter and pay-station fees.
- » Don't park adjacent to yellow curbs or posts.
- » Display the correct permit, whether parking in a permit-controlled lot or a work site.
- » Bicyclists may lock their bikes only to designated bike racks.
