THE CLERK: Madam Chair, it does not appear that she is logged on. This is the chief clerk.

CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Okay, just one last call for Ms. Davis. Thank you, Madam Clerk. I appreciate it. Okay, then with that, that concludes our request to speak and we will just move right on to the agenda.

Under our transportation agenda, there are no minutes to approve. Item RR-1 concerns a complaint filed by the International Association of Sheet

Metal, Air, Rail and Transportation Workers and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and Trainmen against the Union Pacific Railroad Company. The complaint alleges that Union Pacific's use of Uber to transport its employees to and from their places of employment or during the course of their employment violates the safety standards contained in the Illinois Administrative Code, the Illinois Vehicle Code and the Illinois Transportation, excuse me, Illinois Commercial Transportation Law. The order

finds that Uber is a transportation network company that is authorized to operate in Illinois pursuant to the Transportation Network Providers Act. As such, Uber is licensed by competent authority to transport the public and, when used by a railroad to transport its employees, is exempt from the safety standards prescribed by Part 1550 of the administrative rules.

The order dismisses Counts I and II of the complainants' first amended formal complaint and request for declaratory relief. Counts III and IV are rendered moot and the motion to dismiss the first amended formal complaint and request for declaratory relief is granted.

Are there any objections to approving the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

Items RR-2 through RR-5 concern various public safety improvement projects at railway crossings. The orders approve the terms of stipulated agreements, authorize the project construction and approve project cost apportionment.

Are there any objections to considering these items together and approving the orders? Hearing

1 none, the orders are approved.

Under our motor carrier items, item MC-1 concerns an application for renewal of a commercial vehicle relocator's license. The order grants the application, finding that the applicant meets the requirements. Are there any objections to approving the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

Item MC-2 concerns a stipulated settlement agreement regarding alleged violations of the Illinois Commercial Transportation Law. The order accepts the stipulated agreement.

Are there any objections to approving the order? Hearing none, the order is approved. This concludes our transportation agenda.
