1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings Act, I
2 call the July 7th, 2022, Regular Open Meeting to order.

3 Commissioners Kimbrel, Carrigan and
4 McCabe are in the Springfield office, and I am in the
5 Chicago office with Commissioner Bocanegra.

6 So we have a quorum.

7 We have no requests to speak, and we're
8 moving onto our Transportation Agenda.

9 There are no edits to the June 9th,
10 2022, Regular Open Meeting Minutes.

11 Are there any objections to approving
12 the minutes?

13 (No verbal response.)

14 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the minutes are
15 approved.

16 Under our Railroad Items, Item RR-1
17 concerns a public safety improvement project at a
18 railway crossing in Cook County. The order authorizes
19 a time extension to complete the project.

20 Are there any objections to approving
21 the order?

22 (No verbal response.)

1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is
2 approved.

3 Under our Motor Carrier Items,
4 Item MC-1 concerns an application for a certificate of
5 public convenience and necessity to transport household
6 goods. The order grants the certificate, finding that
7 the applicant is fit to provide the service.

8 Are there any objections to approving
9 the order?

10 (No verbal response.)

11 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is
12 approved.

13 Item MC-2 concerns an application for a
14 renewal of Commercial Relocator's License. The order
15 renews the certificate, finding that the applicant
16 meets requirements.

17 Are there any objections to approving
18 the order?

19 (No verbal response.)

20 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is
21 approved.

22 Items MC-3 and MC-4 concern stipulated

1 settlement agreements concerning alleged violations of
2 Illinois Commercial Transportation Law. The orders
3 accept the stipulated agreements.

4 Are there any objections to considering
5 these items together and approving the orders?

6 (No verbal response.)

7 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
8 approved.

9 Item PR-1 concerns LB Anderson Land
10 Holding, LLC's, or LBA, motion for reconsideration of
11 the docket T01-0064. The ALJ recommends denying the
12 motion for two reasons: First, because the motion for
13 reconsideration does not present "new" information not
14 previously adduced with sufficient specificity, and
15 two, the issue of building a bridge at the crossing was
16 presented by the parties at various times during the
17 proceeding but never pursued as a viable alternative to
18 the initial at grade crossing or later when the
19 crossing was permanently closed because of safety
20 issues.

21 The ALJ notes that the movant is not an
22 interested railroad company, public officer, or public

1 body as prescribed by the Administrative Code, and the
2 Commission agrees with the ALJ.

3 Are there any objections to denying the
4 motion for reconsideration?

5 (No verbal response.)

6 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the motion is
7 denied.

8 This concludes our Transportation
9 Agenda.
