1 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Under the Open Meetings Act I
2 call the October 13, 2022, Regular Open Meeting to
3 order. Commissioners Kimbrel, Carrigan, and McCabe
4 are with me in Chicago. We have a quorum. We have no
5 requests to speak. We're going to move on to our
6 Transportation Agenda.

7 There are edits to the September 15,
8 2022, Transportation Regular Open Meeting Minutes.

9 Are there any objections to approving
10 the minutes as edited?

11 (No verbal response.)

12 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the minutes are
13 approved.

14 Under our railroad items, Items RR-1
15 through RR-4 concern various public safety improvement
16 projects at railway crossings. The parties filed
17 petitions to reopen these dockets and issue
18 supplemental orders seeking approval of additional
19 assistance from the Grade Crossing Protection Fund to
20 complete the project. The orders grant the petitions,
21 reopen the dockets, and grant additional funds, finding
22 that the requests for additional funding fair and

1 reasonable.

2 Are there any objections to considering
3 these items together and approving the orders?

4 (No verbal response.)

5 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
6 approved.

7 Item RR-5 concerns a public safety
8 improvement project at railway crossings in Cook
9 County. On April 19th of 2019, the Commission issued a
10 final order of this docket granting Illinois Central
11 Railroad Company authority to reconstruct a bridge that
12 carries tracks over Clark Street in Chicago. On
13 January 21st of 2022 the Company moved for leave to
14 withdraw its petition in the docket asking the
15 Commission to vacate the final order of April 19, 2019,
16 and close the docket. Based on the results of the
17 field testing and visual inspections, the Company
18 determined that notwithstanding the age of the current
19 bridge, it remains safe and adequate for its current
20 freight and passenger operations. The order grants the
21 motion to withdraw, vacates the April 19, 2019, order,
22 and closes the docket.

1 Are there any objections to approving
2 the order?

3 (No verbal response.)

4 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is
5 approved.

6 Item RR-6 concerns in public safety
7 improvement project at railway crossings in Will
8 County. The order approves the project, project
9 deadlines, and cost apportionment.

10 Are there any objections to approving
11 the order?

12 (No verbal response.)

13 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the order is
14 approved.

15 Items RR-7 and RR-10 concern various
16 public safety improvement projects at railway
17 crossings. The parties filed petitions to reopen these
18 dockets and issue supplemental orders seeking approval
19 of additional assistance from the Grade Crossing
20 Protection Fund to complete the project. The orders
21 grant the petitions, reopen the dockets and grant
22 additional funds, finding the requests for additional

1 funding fair and reasonable.

2 Are there any objections to considering
3 these items together and approving the orders?

4 (No verbal response.)

5 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
6 approved.

7 Items RR-11 through RR-14 concern
8 various public safety improvement projects at railway
9 crossings in Illinois. The orders approve the
10 projects, extend project deadlines, and approve cost
11 apportionment.

12 Are there any objections to considering
13 these item together and approving the orders?

14 (No verbal response.)

15 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
16 approved.

17 Moving on to our motor carrier items.
18 Items MC-1 through MC-5 concern applications for common
19 carrier Certificates of Public Convenience and
20 Necessity to Transport Household Goods. The orders
21 grant the certificates, finding that the applicants
22 meet the requirements.

2 these items together and approving the orders?

3 (No verbal response.)

4 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
5 approved.

6 Items MC-6 and MC-7 concern
7 applications for approval of Commercial Vehicle
8 Relocator's Licenses. The orders grant the
9 applications, finding that the Applicant meet the
10 requirements.

14 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the orders are
15 approved.
