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- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: By the power vested
- 2 in me by the State of Illinois and the Illinois
- 3 Commerce Commission, I now call for status hearing
- 4 74 RTV-R Sub 15. We are here on a status hearing on
- 5 the pending hearing on fitness to hold a commercial
- 6 vehicle relocator's license, and the respondent today
- 7 is Rendered Services Inc.
- 8 May I have appearances, please. Let's
- 9 start with Staff.
- 10 MS. ANDERSON: Thank you, your Honor.
- 11 My name is Jennifer Anderson. I
- 12 appear on behalf of the Staff of the Illinois
- 13 Commerce Commission. My address is 160 North LaSalle
- 14 Street, Chicago, Illinois, 60601. My phone number is
- 15 312-814-1934.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Thank you.
- MR. BARR: Good afternoon, your Honor. My name
- is Benjamin Barr. I also appear on behalf of the
- 19 Staff of the Illinois Commerce Commission. My
- 20 address is 160 North LaSalle Street, Chicago,
- 21 Illinois, 60601. My phone number is 312-814-2859.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Mr. Rothschild?

- 1 MR. ROTHSCHILD: Good afternoon, your Honor.
- 2 My name is Donald S. Rothschild. I appear today on
- 3 behalf of the respondent, Rendered Services Inc. My
- 4 business address is 835 McClintock Drive, Burr Ridge,
- 5 Illinois. I'm an attorney licensed by the Supreme
- 6 Court.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. Thank you.
- 8 All right. As I stated earlier, today
- 9 is a status hearing on the discovery that is in
- 10 process between the parties. And on that note, I
- 11 will just ask the parties to give us an update on
- where things stand in terms of the discovery.
- 13 MS. ANDERSON: Thank you, your Honor.
- 14 Yesterday I received in the mail an
- initial response to Staff's standard request from
- 16 Rendered Services. I haven't really fully been able
- 17 to analyze that response yet. They did produce some
- 18 documentation. They did make objections to several
- 19 requests.
- 20 So I will need some time to further
- 21 review that response and try to resolve differences
- or make amendments to the request working with

- 1 Mr. Rothschild, with respect to Staff's production of
- 2 records in response to Rendered's requests to produce
- 3 and Rendered's interrogatories that were served on
- 4 Staff. We have made progress on getting records
- 5 ready for that.
- 6 We will require more time for rounding
- 7 up the final records and for me to review them once
- 8 the response is complete. What I would request is
- 9 for Staff to produce its response to Rendered on or
- 10 before August 19 and for your Honor to set an
- 11 additional status hearing maybe sometime between
- 12 August 22 and 31 so we can see where we are and make
- 13 sure the matter continues to progress.
- 14 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay.
- 15 Mr. Rothschild, do you have anything to add?
- MR. ROTHSCHILD: Yes, your Honor. You know, I
- 17 think the status date seems reasonable to me. With
- 18 respect to our discovery, though we did object to a
- 19 number of the requests, we pretty much responded and
- 20 provided information to virtually everything noting
- in one of the responses that this laundry list of
- 22 information that they were requesting regarding

- 1 towing activity is all embodied in documents. And
- 2 under the Supreme Court Rules, we're allowed to
- 3 furnish documents in lieu of creating lists and
- 4 responding.
- 5 However, the documents that are
- 6 responsive are in excess of 35,000 documents. And in
- 7 the response, I invited Ms. Anderson to my office to
- 8 look at them because they're too difficult to scan
- 9 because they're like tissue paper copies of tow
- 10 tickets, and I doubt she wants them sent to a copy
- 11 service. That would be kind of expensive.
- So we're available by appointment to
- 13 give her a room or even give her some water, and she
- 14 can go look at our 35,000 records.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Is this something
- 16 that can be -- and I don't know what the specific
- 17 request is.
- MS. ANDERSON: Your Honor, I would ask
- 19 additional time to try to speak with Mr. Rothschild
- 20 on that issue.
- I do agree that what he has just said
- on the record is consistent with what he responded in

- 1 terms of the records potentially responsive to one of
- 2 the requests, the data request.
- 3 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. So there may
- 4 be opportunity to work on that particular data
- 5 request or in some way narrow the response, some way
- 6 to reduce the amount of information that's required
- 7 in response at this point; is that true?
- 8 MS. ANDERSON: Yeah. I will try to consider
- 9 the situation and see if we can either make the
- 10 inspection as he proposes or reach some sort of other
- 11 accommodation or narrowing.
- 12 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. All right.
- 13 Well, and then you're saying that you should be able
- 14 to produce documents per their request by August 19?
- MS. ANDERSON: That's what I'm requesting, your
- 16 Honor, yes.
- 17 MR. ROTHSCHILD: Are we talking about documents
- or responses to the interrogatories also?
- 19 MS. ANDERSON: Both.
- MR. ROTHSCHILD: Okay.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay.
- 22 MR. ROTHSCHILD: Could they be emailed to me on

- 1 that date? The documents, if they're not voluminous.
- MS. ANDERSON: The interrogatories, I should be
- 3 able to email. The document request, I'll at least
- 4 be able to email the initial response pages. But if
- 5 the attachments are too large, I would have to mail
- 6 them physically.
- 7 MR. ROTHSCHILD: Okay.
- JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: And you're saying a
- 9 status between the 22nd and when?
- 10 MS. ANDERSON: I was suggesting sometime
- 11 between the 22nd and the 31st.
- 12 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Can we do the
- 13 afternoon of the 30th?
- 14 MR. ROTHSCHILD: You know, I have this quirky
- 15 case where I have to take depositions at night. And
- 16 it's kind of throwing my schedule off. I mean,
- 17 literally, in the middle of the night.
- 18 So could we do it like on the 1st or
- 19 the 2nd -- actually, the 1st, would that work?
- MS. ANDERSON: Okay. September 1st would work
- 21 for Staff.
- 22 JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. That's a

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Thursday morning or afternoon?
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           MR. ROTHSCHILD: Morning is good.
           JUDGE KIRKLAND-MONTAQUE: Okay. So this status
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     hearing shall be continued to Thursday, September 1st
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     at 10:00 a.m. And that gives Staff time, and also
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     Staff submit its responses to the interrogatory and
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     documents to Rendered by August 19th. All right. So
     that's all for that matter.
