1 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Good morning. Are we ready to 2 proceed in Springfield? CHIEF CLERK: Yes, we are. 3 4 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Pursuant to the Open Meetings Act, I call to order the January 5, 2016 Bench 5 6 Meeting of the Illinois Commerce Commission. 7 Commissioners McCabe, del Valle, 8 Edwards and Rosales are present with me in Chicago. 9 We have a quorum. 10 We have no requests to speak and will, therefore, move into our Public Utility Bench 11 12 Meeting Agenda. 13 There are edits to the minutes of our 14 December 9th Bench Meeting. 15 Are there any objections to approving the Minutes of December 9th as edited? 16 17 (No response.) 18 Hearing none, the minutes as edited 19 are approved. 20 Items E-1 through 4 concern various 21 complaints filed against Commonwealth Edison. 22 Are there any objections to

considering these items together and granting the 1 Joint Motions to Dismiss? 2 3 (No response.) 4 Hearing none, the motions are granted 5 and the complaints are dismissed. 6 Item E-5 concerns Ameren's petition 7 seeking approval of its proposed reconciliations 8 under riders for uncollectible electric and gas 9 adjustments. 10 Are there any objections to approving the proposed Order? 11 12 (No response.) 13 Hearing none, the Order is approved. 14 Items E-6 and 7 are Applications for 15 Licensure to Operate as Agents, Brokers and 16 Consultants. 17 Are there any objections to 18 considering these items together and granting the 19 proposed Orders? 20 (No response.) 21 Hearing none, the Orders are approved. 22 Items E-8 and 9 are petitions

requesting Cancellation of Certificates of Service 1 2 Authority. 3 Are there any objections to 4 considering these items together and granting the proposed Orders cancelling certificates? 5 6 (No response.) 7 Hearing none, the Orders are approved. 8 Items G-1 and 2 concern North Shore 9 and Peoples Gas tariff filings to clarify the 10 demarcation between the two companies' gas piping. 11 Is there any objections to considering these items together and not suspending the filing? 12 13 (No response.) 14 Hearing none, the filings are not 15 suspended. 16 Item G-3 concerns the approval of Atmos Energy's Reconciliation of Revenues Collected 17 under Gas Adjustment Charges. 18 19 Are there any objections to approving the proposed Order? 20 21 (No response.) 2.2 Hearing none, the Order is approved.

| COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Mr. Chairman.               |
| CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Sure.                             |
| COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Mr. Chairman, happy New     |
| Year to everyone.                                   |
| On the lost gas issue, the Order                    |
| states that in response to requests for invoices it |
| has provided only one invoice. As I see it, that    |
| indicates that there were 1,199 excavation damages  |
| in 2012. Is that 1,199 or is that one invoice for   |
| that 1,199 amount?                                  |
| CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Let's make sure.                  |
| Gene, are you in Springfield?                       |
| (No response.)                                      |
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who are prepared to answer this? 1 2 MR. BEYER: This is Gene and Eric Lounsberry. COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Did you hear my 3 question? 4 MR. BEYER: To my understanding, it's one invoice 5 6 for one event. 7 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: To one event? 8 Now we have instructed Staff to work 9 with Ameren to develop a policy, is that correct --MR. BEYER: Yes. 10 11 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: -- to deal with lost 12 qas? 13 MR. BEYER: Yes. 14 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Is this something new to 15 us in an area that's new? Is there any history of 16 us addressing this issue as a Commission in prior 17 dockets? 18 MR. BEYER: I'm not aware of this issue being 19 brought to the Commission's attention in the past. 20 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Okay. So can you 21 explain why we are seeing it now? 22 MR. BEYER: I'm aware that the topic has been

part of our review and reconciliations for several 1 2 years. I expect you are seeing it now because we 3 don't like what is going on at Ameren at the moment. 4 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Okay. And so we haven't done or required any calculations of costs that is 5 6 passed on to ratepayers to be done in the past? 7 MR. BEYER: Would you repeat that. I'm not sure 8 if I caught that.

9 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: In the past we have not 10 done or required any calculations of the cost of the 11 lost gas due to excavation damages that ends up paid 12 through the PGA?

MR. BEYER: I'll have to check into that and get back to you.

15 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Okay. The reason I'm 16 asking these questions is because we are requesting 17 that that policy be developed here and the first 18 question that came to my mind, and I agree with 19 that.

20 Of course, I agree with Staff on this 21 because I don't think that these folks who do the 22 damage should walk away from their responsibility of

covering that cost of lost gas, and I know in some 1 2 cases -- in many cases it doesn't amount to a lot, but when I look at the figure and I look at 3 1200 excavation damages, I think that that could add 4 5 up, but I see that we are dealing specifically, of б course, with Ameren here, but my question is are we 7 going to develop a policy and a price to all the gas 8 companies in the same way? 9 MR. BEYER: Usually the way we have done things in the past on topics like this is we develop a 10 policy for one company and we'll make sure it's 11 12 applied to all of them or we will review the other companies for consistency. 13 14 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Okay. Thank you. 15 COMMISSIONER MAYE EDWARDS: Mr. Chairman. 16 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Commissioner Edwards. 17 COMMISSIONER MAYE EDWARDS: Thank you, 18 Mr. Chairman. 19 Thank you and good morning to both of 20 you, Eric and Gene. I have a question. 21 Just based on something in response to Commissioner del Valle's question, you stated that 22

we are seeing this now because of some concerns of 1 2 Staff, and you don't necessarily like what you have 3 seen, yet the Order was approving the 4 reconciliation. 5 So is there no -- does that go hand in б hand? You are not seeing -- you think there's some 7 cause for concern. Is it still appropriate for you 8 to recommend the reconciliation? 9 MR. BEYER: Okay. The witness to the case does not define issues -- what reconciliation they had 10 11 issues with. They had concern about lack of policy 12 in the fact there's only one adjustment for all the 13 noted hits. 14 I can't really speak to why that resulted in the reconciliation being approved. 15 I would have to look into it a little bit more. 16 17 COMMISSIONER MAYE EDWARDS: Thank you. 18 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Commissioner McCabe. 19 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Any sense of -- there were 20 a lot of third-party hits in the gas utilities. 21 What percentage of those resulted in diminutive gas 22 loss versus when these invoices will be relevant

versus how many are just diminutive? 1 2 MR. BEYER: I have no information along that line. 3 4 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Any sense of other states 5 that may have a practice or model to look at best 6 practice? 7 MR. BEYER: I'm not aware of that either. 8 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Thank you. 9 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Okay. Moving back to our agenda Item G-5 concerns North Shore and Peoples' 10 11 Petition to Determine the Adequacy of their Volume 12 Balancing Adjustment Riders, are there any 13 objections to approving the proposed Order? 14 (No response.) 15 Hearing none, the Order is approved. 16 Item G-6 is a complaint filed against 17 Peoples Gas regarding billing in Chicago. 18 Are there any objections to approving 19 the parties' Joint Motion to Dismiss? 20 (No response.) 21 Hearing none, the motion is granted and the complaint is dismissed. 22

1 Item 7 concerns Glacial Natural Gas' 2 Petition for Requesting Cancellation of a Certificate of Service Authority. 3 Are there any objections to approving 4 the proposed Order canceling the certificate? 5 6 (No response.) 7 Hearing none, the Order is approved. 8 Item G-8 concerns Future Now Energy's Application for a Certificate of Service Authority. 9 10 Are there any objections to approving the proposed Order? 11 12 (No response.) 13 Hearing none, the Order is approved. 14 Item T-1 concerns Talk America's Application for an Amended Certificate of Service 15 16 Authority. 17 Are there any objections to approving 18 the Amendatoty Order? 19 (No response.) 20 Hearing none, the Amendatoty Order is 21 approved. 2.2 Item W-1 is a complaint filed against

Illinois-American Water regarding billing. 1 2 Are there any objections to approving the parties' Joint Motion to Dismiss? 3 4 (No response.) 5 Hearing none, the motion is granted 6 and the complaint is dismissed. 7 Item PR-1 concerns an Application for 8 Rehearing filed in the proceeding granted in Ameren 9 Transmission Company's request for authority. 10 Is there a motion to deny the Application for Rehearing. 11 12 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So move. 13 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 14 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Second. 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: All those in favor, say aye. 16 (Chorus of ayes.) 17 Opposed, say nay. 18 (No response.) 19 The ayes have it and the request for 20 rehearing is denied. 21 JUDGE VON QUALEN: Chairman, this is 22 ALJ Von Qualen in Springfield.
