Item M-1 concerns a rulemaking proceeding in response to Public Act 102-0662 to amend part 288 of the administrative code and create a consumer intervenor compensation fund. The second notice order adopts recommendations by Staff, ComEd, and the AG, Community Organizing and Family Issues, or COFI, that the scope of 288 is not limited to article 9 rate cases. The order also drops ComEd's proposal to broaden the scope of the role.

There are substantive edits to the order. The edits add clarifying language to section 288.200(a)(4) to exempt residential and small commercial utility customers for the definition of, quote, "parties that have financial interest in the outcome of the proceeding," end quote. The edits also adopt AG/COFI's recommendation to remove the requirements that a consumer-interest representative seeking compensation from the fund must provide advanced notice to the ALJ overseeing the relevant

The fund 9 exists to increase procedural equity among interested parties and to broaden participation in expertise 10 11 before the Commission. 12 Siege implementation is taking us into 13 new territory. Experience over the next few years will 14 inform whether future adjustments are needed. 15 Thank you. Any other comments?
