The applicants have failed to 20 fix the deficiency in their applications and have 21 not responded to repeated requests by Commission 22 Staff to correct the deficiencies. Therefore, the

Ameren argues that 5 the Commission incorrectly stated that Rider NM had 6 not previously been found to be just and 7 reasonable. The Commission disregards the plain 8 language of the statute, the Commission incorrectly 9 relied on legislative intent, and that the order is not supported by the record evidence. 10 11 The ALJ recommends that the 12 Commission deny Ameren's application because no new 13 arguments or evidence is raised and because the 14 Commission has thoroughly considered the issues 15 brought up in the application for rehearing. 16 I am calling again a roll count. 17 if you are in favor of denying the application for 18 rehearing, please say "aye."
