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PROCEEDINGS

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2	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Pursuant to the provisions of the
3	Open Meetings Act, I now convene a regularly scheduled
4	Bench session of the Illinois Commerce Commission. With
5	me in Chicago are Commissioner Colgan, Commissioner
б	McCabe, Commissioner del Valle, and Commissioner Maye.
7	I am Chairman Scott. We have a quorum.
8	Before moving into the agenda, according to
9	Section 1700.10 of Title 2 of the Administrative Code,
10	this is the time we allow members of the public to
11	address the Commission. Members of the public wishing
12	to address the Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's
13	office at least 24 hours prior to Commission meetings.
14	According to the Chief Clerk's office, we have no
15	requests to speak at today's Bench session.
16	On to the public utility agenda. We will
17	begin with the electric portion. Item E-1 is Docket
18	No. ERM 13-092. This is ComEd's filing to revise its
19	bill format tariff to reflect changes in residential
20	bills based on customer preference research. Staff
21	recommends we approve the revision by not suspending the
22	filing.
23	Is there any discussion?

24 (No response.)

1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a motion to approve the 2 revision by not suspending the filing? 3 COMMISSIONER DEL VALLE: So moved. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner del Valle. 4 Is there a second? 5 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second. 6 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Seconded by Commissioner Colgan. 8 All in favor say aye. 9 (Ayes heard.) 10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed? 11 (No response.) 12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The vote is five to nothing, and the filing is not suspended. 13 14 We will use this five-to-nothing vote for the 15 remainder of today's public utility agenda unless 16 otherwise noted. Item E-2 is Docket ERM No. 13-100. This is 17 18 MidAmerican Energy Company's filing for a general rate increase for electric service. Staff recommends that 19 20 the filing be suspended and the matter set for hearings. 21 Is there any discussion? 22 (No response.) 23 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections to 24 suspending the filing?

1 (No response.) 2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the filing is 3 suspended and the matter will be set for hearings. Item E-3 is our reconciliation of revenues 4 collected under coal tar riders with prudent costs 5 associated with coal tar cleanup expenditures for 6 7 Ameren, ComEd, Nicor Gas, North Shore Gas, and Peoples Gas Light and Coke Company. Staff recommends entry of 8 9 an Order commencing the proceedings. 10 Is there any discussion? 11 (No response.) 12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? (No response.) 13 14 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 15 entered. 16 Item E-4 is our review and assessment of 17 ComEd's report concerning its 2011 reliability performance. Staff recommends entry of an Order 18 19 adopting the report. Is there any discussion? 20 21 (No response.) 22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 23 (No response.) 24 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is

1 entered.

2 Item E-5 is our investigation into ComEd's 3 compliance with the efficiency standard requirement of Section 8-103 of the Public Utilities Act for Plan 4 Year 5. Staff recommends entry of an Order initiating 5 6 the proceeding. 7 Is there any discussion? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections? 10 (No response.) 11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 12 entered. 13 Item E-6 is Docket No. 13-0453. This is John Kelly's complaint against ComEd as to billing and/or 14 15 charges in Calumet City. The parties have apparently 16 settled their differences and have filed a stipulation and joint Motion to Dismiss, which ALJ Haynes recommends 17 18 we grant. 19 Is there any discussion? 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 22 (No response.) 23 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the joint Motion to 24 Dismiss is granted.

1 Item E-7 is Docket No. 13-0495. This is 2 ComEd's petition for approval of its energy efficiency 3 and demand response plan pursuant to Section 8-103(f) of 4 the Public Utilities Act. ALJ Haynes recommends entry 5 of an Order directing ComEd to file a modified plan 6 consistent with the findings contained therein within 7 30 days of the date of the Order.

8 This item will be held for disposition at a 9 future Commission proceeding.

10 Item E-8 is Docket No. 13-0498. This is 11 Ameren's petition for approval of its energy efficiency 12 and demand response plan pursuant to 220 ILCS 13 Section 5/8-103 and 220 ILCS Section 5/8-104. ALJ Yoder 14 recommends entry of an Order conditionally approving the 15 energy efficiency and demand response plan.

16 This item will be held for disposition at a 17 future Commission proceeding.

18 Item E-9 is Docket No. 13-0499. This is the 19 Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic 20 Opportunity's petition for approval of its energy 21 efficiency portfolio and demand response plan pursuant 22 to Sections 8-103(e) and (f) and 8-104(e) and (f) of the 23 Public Utilities Act. ALJ Haynes recommends entry of an 24 Order directing DCEO to file a revised plan.

This item also will be held for disposition at
 a future Commission proceeding.

3 Item E-10 is our investigation of the 4 applicability of Sections 16-122 and 16-108.6 of the 5 Public Utilities Act. ALJ Teague-Kingsley recommends 6 entry of an Order confirming the Commission's original 7 conclusions on the issue.

8 Commissioner McCabe may have some questions.
9 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Yes.

10 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Good morning, Judge.

11 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Good morning.

12 JUDGE TEAGUE-KINGSLEY: Good morning, Commissioner. COMMISSIONER McCABE: I have some questions on the 13 sections on interval data access. One issue is whether 14 15 or not additional authorization is required before 16 interval data used for nonbilling purposes is released 17 by an ARES. And the PEPO agrees with staff and ComEd 18 that it is. Does this apply to both RES customers who 19 signed up directly and to Muni-Ag customers of an 20 aggregation supplier?

JUDGE TEAGUE-KINGSLEY: Yes. That authorization requirement applies to both. The Order declines to adopt the position that simple possession of an account number or a contract is sufficient. Instead, it adopts

1 staff's position that additional authorization is 2 required. So in the context of when an ARES or a RES signs up a customer directly, they have to provide a 3 4 disclosure during the sign-up that they're going to be 5 able to get that information. But if they don't, then 6 they have to do a separate verification, you know, for the authorization. And in the -- in the municipal 7 8 aggregation setting, they have to include that 9 information in the opt-out disclosure and they have to -- they do have to get an authorization. 10

11 COMMISSIONER McCABE: And given that smart meter 12 rollout has just begun, is it fair to say that in most 13 cases additional authorization is going to be needed? 14 JUDGE TEAGUE-KINGSLEY: It's fair to say if the RES 15 wants that information, yes.

16 COMMISSIONER McCABE: And also that with, I think, 17 about one-third of the municipal aggregation contracts 18 coming up this spring and more later this year plus 19 changes in Chicago status that there will be 20 opportunities for the RES's to notify customers and get 21 additional authorization?

22 JUDGE TEAGUE-KINGSLEY: Exactly, yes.

23 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Okay.

24 JUDGE TEAGUE-KINGSLEY: That is true. So they

1 won't have to do all these random authorizations. 2 COMMISSIONER McCABE: All right. Thank you. 3 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Thank you, Commissioner. Thank you, Judge. 4 5 Any further questions? 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there any further discussion? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: This item will be held for disposition at a future Commission proceeding. 10 11 Turning now to natural gas, Item G-1 is Docket 12 No. 13-0192. This is Ameren's proposed general increase in gas rates. ALJ Jones recommends entry of an 13 Amendatory Order modifying a sentence to comport with 14 15 the Commission's overall findings. 16 Is there any discussion? 17 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 18 19 (No response.) 20 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Amendatory Order 21 is entered. On to telecommunications, Item T-1 is TRM 22 23 No. 13-599. This is an Illinois Consolidated Telephone 24 Company's filing to implement a name change and flat

rate for Vacation Service. Staff recommends we approve 1 2 the name change and rate by not suspending the filing. 3 Is there any discussion? 4 (No response.) 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the filing is not 8 suspended. 9 Items T-2 through T-4 can be taken together. These items are our motions to initiate rulemaking 10 11 proceedings and authorize first notice periods on 12 amendments to 83 Illinois Administrative Code Section 736, 737, and 763. In each case, staff 13 recommends entry of an Order authorizing submission of 14 15 the first notice period. 16 Is there any discussion? 17 (No response.) 18 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 19 (No response.) 20 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 21 entered. Item T-5 is Docket No. 13-0091. This is 22 Michael Effiong's complaint against Frontier North as to 23 24 billing and/or charges in Bloomington. ALJ Yoder

recommends entry of an Order dismissing the complaint
 with prejudice.

3 Is there any discussion? 4 (No response.) 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is entered and the complaint is dismissed. 8 9 Item T-6 is Docket No. 13-0627. This is A-G Long Distance's petition for emergency relief from 10 11 the -- for the confidential and/or proprietary treatment 12 of their annual report for not less than two years. ALJ Haynes recommends entry of an Order granting the 13 petition. 14 15 Is there any discussion? 16 (No response.) 17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is entered. 20 21 Items T-7 and T-8 can be taken together. These are applications for state-issued authorization to 22 provide cable service pursuant to Section 401 of the 23 24 Cable and Video Competition Law of 2007. In both cases

ALJ Riley recommends entry of an Order granting the
 authorization.

3 Is there any discussion? 4 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections? 5 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 8 entered. 9 We have Petitions For Rehearing. Item PR-1 is Docket No. 06-0741. This is the reconciliation of 10 11 revenues collected under Atmos Energy's gas adjustment 12 charges with actual costs prudently incurred. Atmos has filed an application for rehearing and a motion 13 requesting a partial stay of the Order, both of which 14 15 ALJ Yoder recommends we deny. 16 Is there a discussion on rehearing? 17 (No response.) 18 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections to denying rehearing? 19 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the application for 22 rehearing is denied. 23 Is there a discussion on the Motion to Stay 24 the Order?

1	(No response.)
2	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections to
3	denying the stay?
4	(No response.)
5	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the motion for a
6	partial stay of the Order is denied.
7	Item PR-2 is Docket No. 13-0301. This is
8	Ameren Illinois's Rate MAP-P, Modernization Action
9	Plan - Pricing, Annual Update Filing. Ameren has filed
10	an application for rehearing which ALJ Albers and Yoder
11	recommend we deny.
12	Is there any discussion?
13	(No response.)
14	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections to
15	denying rehearing?
16	(No response.)
17	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the application for
18	rehearing is denied.
19	We have several items of other business on
20	today's agenda. The first is the Commission's Annual
21	Report on Electricity, Gas, Water, and Sewer Utilities.
22	Staff has requested approval to send the report to the
23	Governor and the General Assembly.
24	Is there any discussion?

1 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Yes.

2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Commissioner McCabe?

3 COMMISSIONER McCABE: I just wondered if we have 4 the opportunity to give any comments in the next day 5 here, if we have any, since we just got the report 6 earlier this week.

7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Yeah. Well --

8 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Okay.

9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: -- we can hold it also if that -10 COMMISSIONER McCABE: No.

11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: -- if that would make more sense.

12 COMMISSIONER McCABE: No. I'll -- I can get any

13 comments I have --

14 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Okay.

15 COMMISSIONER McCABE: -- within the next day.

16 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Okay.

17 Any other discussion?

18 (No response.)

19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Are there any objections to 20 submitting the report to the Governor and General 21 Assembly?

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the request for 24 approval is granted.

The second item of other business concerns our 1 2 approval of the IPA's section of a -- selection of a 3 Procurement Administrator for the IPA's upcoming electricity procurements. The IPA has selected NERA 4 5 Economic Consulting. б Is there any discussion on this item? 7 (No response.) COMMISSIONER McCABE: Just a question. 8 9 Is this a change in their provider? 10 (No verbal response.) 11 COMMISSIONER McCABE: No; the same one. Okay. 12 Thank you. 13 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a motion to approve the 14 IPA's choice? 15 COMMISSIONER DEL VALLE: So moved. 16 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner del Valle. 17 Is there a second? COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second. 18 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Seconded by Commissioner Colgan. 20 All in favor say aye. 21 (Ayes heard.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed? 22 23 (No response.) 24 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The vote is five to nothing, and

IPA's selection of a Procurement Administrator is
 approved.

The final item is a FERC matter concerning pending litigation, so we'll go into closed session to address it.

6 Is there a motion to go into closed session?
7 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: So moved.

8 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved.

9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner Colgan.

10 Seconded by Commissioner --

11 COMMISSIONER McCABE: McCabe.

12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: -- McCabe.

13 All in favor say aye.

14 (Ayes heard.)

15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?

16 (No response.)

17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The vote is five to nothing, and18 the Commission will now go into closed session.

19 Please let me know when the room is ready in20 Springfield.

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: That's right. 8 9 JUDGE WALLACE: And you guys missed some great 10 films by changing to Chicago. 11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The main question, Judge, is: Are 12 you wearing the kilt today? 13 JUDGE WALLACE: No. I couldn't.
