1 PROCEEDINGS

- 2 CHAIRMAN FLORES: We will now begin with the
- 3 transportation agenda.
- 4 We have some minutes to approve from
- 5 the December 16, 2009, bench session. I want to make
- 6 sure all Commissioners have the material before them.
- 7 Yes?
- 8 COMMISSIONER FORD: Yes.
- 9 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there a motion to approve
- 10 the minutes?
- 11 COMMISSIONER FORD: So move.
- 12 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there a second?
- 13 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second.
- 14 CHAIRMAN FLORES: It's been moved and seconded.
- 15 All in favor, say aye.
- 16 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
- 17 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any opposed?
- The vote is 5-0 approving the minutes.
- 19 We will now move on to the section on
- 20 railroads. Starting with the Railroad agenda, we
- 21 have Items RR-1 (T09-0144) through RR-2 (T10-0001).
- 22 We will take those matters together. These are

- 1 stipulated agreements for safety improvements to
- 2 railroad crossings. Approximately \$491,560 in Grade
- 3 Crossing Protection Funds will be used. Staff
- 4 recommends entering the orders approving the
- 5 stipulated agreements.
- Is there a motion to enter the orders.
- 7 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved.
- 8 COMMISSIONER FORD: Second.
- 9 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Okay. It's been moved and
- 10 seconded. All in favor say aye.
- 11 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
- 12 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Any opposed? The vote is
- 5-0. The orders are entered.
- We will use this 5-0 roll call vote --
- 15 you know what, let's call the roll because
- 16 technically I want to make sure that -- because we
- are going to use this as any vote for a future
- 18 matter. So if we can just do a roll call.
- 19 Commissioner Ford?
- 20 COMMISSIONER FORD: Aye.
- 21 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner Elliott?
- 22 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Aye.

- 1 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner Colgan?
- 2 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Aye.
- 3 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Our other commissioner,
- 4 Commissioner Diaz?
- 5 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Aye.
- 6 CHAIRMAN FLORES: And I vote aye. So we will
- 7 use this 5-0 roll call vote for the remainder of the
- 8 Transportation Agenda unless otherwise noted.
- 9 Item RR-3 is Docket T09-0078. BNSF
- 10 Railroad and Ridgeport Logistic Center, LLC, have
- 11 petitioned to upgrade the railroad crossing of
- 12 Lorenzo Road in Will County. The project is expected
- 13 to cost \$1.9 million. No Grade Crossing Protection
- 14 Funds will be used. Administrative Law Judge O'Brien
- 15 recommends entering the order approving the project.
- 16 Is there any discussion on this
- 17 matter? Hearing none, are there any objections?
- 18 Hearing none, the order is entered.
- 19 Item RR-4 is Docket T09-0106. This is
- 20 a project to reconstruct the existing highway-rail
- 21 grade separation structure that carries U.S. Route
- 22 150 over the Norfolk and Southern Railway Company's

- 1 track in Mansfield. That's in Piatt County. The
- 2 \$3.9 million cost will be funded entirely from
- 3 federal funds. No GCPF will be used. Administrative
- 4 Law Judge Kirkland-Montaque recommends entering the
- 5 order approving the petition.
- 6 Is there any discussion on this
- 7 matter? Any objections? Hearing none, the order is
- 8 entered.
- 9 Item RR-5 is Docket T09-0132 Amended.
- 10 This order amends the original order to increase the
- 11 contribution from the Grade Crossing Protection Fund
- from \$40,040 to \$40,420. Staff recommends entering
- 13 the amendatory order.
- 14 Is there any discussion on this
- 15 matter? Any objections? Hearing none, the
- 16 amendatory order is entered.
- 17 That concludes the Railroad Agenda.
- Now moving on to motor carriers,
- 19 turning to Motor Carriers items, Items MC-1 through
- MC-4 (09-0464, 09-0987, 09-1156, 09-1219) will be
- 21 taken together. These are stipulated settlement
- 22 agreements with various carriers found to be in

- 1 violation of the Illinois Commercial Transportation
- 2 Law. Staff recommends entering the orders accepting
- 3 the stipulated settlement agreements.
- 4 Is there any discussion? Any
- 5 objections? Hearing none, this order will also be
- 6 entered, and we will be using the last most favorable
- 7 vote.
- 8 The Item MC-5 (1276MC-S25, 2141MC-S8,
- 9 4588MC-S13, 5134MC-S12, 6175MC-S12) concerns several
- 10 petitions to purchase the stock of Federal Warehouse
- 11 Company. Administrative Law Judge O'Brien recommends
- 12 entering the order authorizing the transactions.
- 13 Is there any discussion in this
- 14 matter? Any objections? Hearing none, the order is
- 15 entered.
- 16 Items MC-6 (222RTV-R) and MC-7
- 17 (245RTV-R) will be taken together. These are
- 18 applications for commercial relocator licenses.
- 19 Administrative Law Judge Kirkland-Montaque recommends
- 20 entering the orders granting the applications for
- 21 commercial relocator licenses.
- Is there any discussion? Any

objections? Hearing none, the orders are entered. 1 2 Items MC-8 (106RTV-R) is an 3 application for renewal of a commercial relocation towing license. Staff recommends approving the renewal application. 5 6 Is there any discussion? Any 7 objections? Hearing none, the renewal is granted. Mr. Matrisch, is there any further 8 9 business to come before the Commission today? 10 MR. MATRISCH: Nothing further, Mr. Chairman. 11 Thank you. 12 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Thank you, sir.
