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1 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Good morning. Everything is 2 ready to proceed in Springfield? 3 CHIEF CLERK: Yes, we are. 4 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Pursuant to the Open Meetings Act, I call the February 24, 2016 Regular Open 5 6 Meeting of the Illinois Commerce Commission to 7 order. 8 Commissioners McCabe, del Valle, 9 Edwards and Rosales are present with me in Chicago. We have a quorum. 10 11 We have no requests to speak and will, 12 therefore, move on to our Regular Transportation 13 agenda. There are no edits to the Transportation 14 Minutes of our February 10, 2016 Regular Opening 15 Meeting. 16 Are there any objections to adopting 17 these Minutes? 18 (No response.) 19 Hearing no objection, the Minutes are 20 approved. 21 Items RR-1 through 4 are Stipulated 22 Agreements Authorizing Grade Crossing Safety

Improvement Projects throughout Illinois. 1 2 Are there any objections to 3 considering these items together and approving the proposed Orders? 4 5 (No response.) б Hearing none, the Orders are approved. 7 Item MC-1 concerns Chicagoland Moving 8 & Storage, Inc.'s Application for a Certificate of 9 Public Convenience and Necessity under the Illinois Commercial Transportation Law. 10 11 Is there any objection to approving 12 the proposed Order? 13 (No response.) 14 Hearing none, the Order is approved. 15 Item AM-1 concerns setting a fitness 16 hearing regarding the Commercial Vehicle Relocator 17 License of Lincoln Towing pursuant to the Illinois 18 Commercial Relocation of Trespassing Vehicles Law. There are both substantive and 19 20 non-substantive edits to the proposed Order. 21 Is there a motion to adopt these 2.2 edits?

1 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: So moved. 2 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? COMMISSIONER McCABE: Seconded. 3 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any discussion? 4 5 (No response.) 6 All those in favor of adopting the 7 edits, say aye. 8 (Chorus of ayes.) 9 Any opposed, say nay. 10 (No response.) 11 The edits are, therefore, adopted. 12 Is there a motion to enter the Order 13 as edited? 14 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: So moved. 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? COMMISSIONER MAYE EDWARDS: Seconded. 16 17 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there any discussion? Commissioner del Valle. 18 19 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 20 On the July Bench last year when the 21 Commission voted to grant the renewal of Protective 22 Parking's licensing for a rate increase, I raised

questions about Lincoln Towing's citation record
which I had included in an edit as part of that
license renewal proceeding.

After raising questions at the Bench and finding inadequacies in the record regarding the failure of compliance by the company, I abstained from that vote.

8 Since the license was renewed last 9 July, 166 investigations have been opened; 84 are 10 still pending; and 28 administrative citations have 11 been issued. Overall, 92 citations are still 12 pending against the company.

I expect this investigation will provide what we were asking last June remain upon further inquiries into the conduct of this business and whether it is, in fact, fit to hold a license to operate in Illinois. Thank you.
