- 1 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Good afternoon again.
- 2 Are we ready to proceed in
- 3 Springfield?
- 4 COMMISSIONER CARRIGAN: Chairman, Mike
- 5 Carrigan. I -- we are ready to proceed.
- 6 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Thank you, Commissioner.
- 7 Under Section 2.02 of the Open
- 8 Meetings Act, and pursuant to Section 8-505 of the
- 9 Public Utilities Act, I call this Emergency
- 10 March 18, 2020, Special Open Meeting to order.
- 11 Commissioners Bocanegra, Kimbrel, and
- 12 Oliva are with me in Chicago, and Commissioner
- 13 Carrigan is joining us from Springfield. We have a
- 14 quorum.
- Before we proceed, I will again
- note and indicate that, due to the emergency measures
- 17 implemented in response to COVID-19 pandemic, the
- Governor's Executive Order 2020-07, we expect more
- 19 remote participation from the general public. And
- 20 due to that, I ask that Commissioners say their name
- 21 for the benefit of the public before speaking.
- 22 With that, we'll continue our meeting.

- 1 We have two items on the agenda: Items
- 2 1 and 2 are the Emergency Orders imposing moratorium
- 3 on in-person solicitations by the Alternative Retail
- 4 Electric Suppliers, or ARES, and the Alternative Gas
- 5 Suppliers, or AGS, during the COVID-19 public health
- 6 emergency.
- 7 The Orders note that a moratorium on
- 8 ARES and ARGS in-person solicitations is necessary to
- 9 slow the spread of the disease and to protect public
- 10 health. Preventing or minimizing the spread of
- 11 COVID-19 necessitates reducing personal contact as
- 12 much as possible.
- 13 In contrast, each ARES and AGS
- 14 representative engaged in in-person solicitation
- 15 attempts to personally contact and solicit while
- 16 generally in close physical proximity to the
- 17 customers.
- 18 Conducting in-person solicitations
- 19 during this health -- this public health emergency
- 20 may have a highly detrimental effect on the efforts
- of public health officials to limit the spread of
- 22 COVID-19. Further, such solicitation is inessential

- during a period of public health emergency. The
- 2 Orders prohibit in-person marketing activities for
- 3 the duration of the COVID-19 emergencies.
- 4 ARES and AGS have other means to
- 5 solicit customers, and customers wishing to begin
- 6 service from ARES and AGS have options to complete
- 7 such transactions online, by mail, or by telephone.
- 8 The Orders note that the ARES and the AGS are free to
- 9 continue marketing activities online, by mail, or by
- 10 telemarketing, provided that such activities are
- 11 conducted in a manner consistent with Section 19-115
- 12 of the Public Utilities Act and otherwise lawful.
- 13 Are there any objections to
- 14 considering these items together and approving the
- 15 Orders?
- 16 (No response.)
- 17 CHAIRWOMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Orders
- 18 are approved.
- This concludes this agenda.
- Judge Teague Kingsley, do we have
- 21 other matters to come before the Commission today?
- JUDGE TEAGUE KINGSLEY: No, Madam Chairman.
