Thank you. 6 7 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is that a motion? 8 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Yes. 9 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 10 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Seconded. 11 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any discussion? 12 (No response.) 13 All those in favor, say aye. 14 (Chorus of ayes.) 15 Opposed, say nay. COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Is that in the Order or 16 17 the record? 18 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: On the edits. 19 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Okay. 20 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any nays? 21 (No response.) 22 The ayes have it and the edit is

1 approved.

2 Is there a motion to approve the Order as edited? 3 4 COMMISSIONER McCABE: So moved. CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second? 5 6 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded. 7 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any discussion? Commissioner del Valle. 8 9 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, just a really brief statement. 10 11 This docket's final Order represents 12 another necessary step in allowing customers to 13 realize the benefits and innovation promised to us 14 in the Modernization Program. I am proud of the efforts of all the stakeholders. 15 16 The Illinois Smart Grid Collaborative 17 Report was published in 2010. In that report it was 18 clear that many questions concerning data would not be resolved to realize the full customer benefits of 19 20 grid modernization. Since then, the rollout is over 21 22 halfway implemented. Roughly about 1.5 billion has

been spent. Here we are in 2016 and, despite this
Order here today, we still have unresolved
guestions.

4 Data privacy is an important issue, 5 but our slow pace and piecemeal approach only cost б our ratepayers by delaying the realization of the 7 benefits and, more important, the savings which were 8 promised by the modernization for which those 9 ratepayers are paying the bills. Thank you. 10 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you. Are there any further discussions? 11 12 Commissioner McCabe. 13 COMMISSIONER McCABE: I just want to commend 14 ALJ Haynes and the parties in this case. There were a lot of issues vigorously debated, and I share the 15 16 concern of CUB, EDF, and Elevate that require a 17 customer to perform authorization tasks multiple 18 times may lead to a higher program attrition rate 19 among non-RES third-party programs is one of the 20 issues that could possibly be addressed. 21 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you, Commissioner McCabe. 22
