20	COMMISSIONER DEL VALLE: Thank you,
21	Mr. Chairman. My edits can be found on pages 2
22	through 4 of the Order. They reversed the Order's
23	conclusion and refused the applicant a permit.
24	In addition to adding to the applicant's

evidence section, my edit replaces the proposed 1 2 Order's analysis and concludes that the applicant's 3 permit be refused, pursuant to Section 80A1, which states that "An applicant's permit may be refused if 4 5 the applicant knowingly makes a misrepresentation in their application for the Recovery Permit." 6 7 Despite reading the instructions of the 8 application, and understanding that it didn't have a 9 time limit on convictions, which must be disclosed, the applicant filed an application, which failed to 10 11 list any of this convictions. The edit does not engage in a Section 85A 12 analysis of the applicant's criminal history, 13 because the criminal background is not the basis for 14 15 the refusal. Rather the refusal is based on the narrow ground of misrepresentation; thus, the edit 16 does not address the applicant's fitness to hold a 17 18 Recovery Permit. 19 With that, I move the adoption of this 20 item. 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The edits have been moved. Is 22 there a second? 23 COMMISSIONER MAYE: Second.
