CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Good morning.

Springfield?

5 the referee test permitted by our rules if it is
6 relevant to the complaint. Assertions to the
7 contrary are wrong. Thank you.

8 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you, Commissioner.
