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1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Pursuant to the provisions of the 2 Open Meetings Act, I now convene a Regular Open Meeting 3 of the Illinois Commerce Commission. With us in Chicago 4 are Commissioner McCabe, Commissioner del Valle, and 5 Commissioner Maye. With us in Springfield is 6 Commissioner Colgan. I am Chairman Scott. We have a 7 quorum.

8 Before moving into the agenda, according to Section 1700.10 of Title 2 of the Administrative Code, 9 this is the time we allow members of the public to 10 11 address the Commission. Members of the public wishing 12 to address the Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's office at least 24 hours prior to Commission meetings. 13 According to the Chief Clerk's office, we have no 14 15 requests to speak at today's meeting.

16 The first item of business on today's agenda 17 is the approval of minutes from our April 16th Bench 18 Session. I understand amendments have been forwarded.

19 Is there a motion to amend the minutes?20 COMMISSIONER MAYE: So moved.

COMMISSIONER MCCABE: So moved. 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second? 20 21 COMMISSIONER DEL VALLE: Second. 22 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner McCabe. 23 Seconded by Commissioner del Valle. 24 All in favor, say aye.

8	investigation into ComEd's compliance with the energy
9	efficiency standards required by Section 8-103 of the
10	Public Utilities Act. ALJ Sainsot recommends entry of
11	an Amendatory Order correcting non-substantive errors
12	that appeared in the original March 5th Order.
13	Is there a motion to enter the order?
14	COMMISSIONER DEL VALLE: So moved.
15	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second?
16	COMMISSIONER MAYE: Second.
17	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Moved by Commissioner del Valle.
18	Seconded by Commissioner Maye.
19	Is there any discussion?

21	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: All in favor, say aye.
22	(Ayes heard.)
23	CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?
24	(No response.)

1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: The vote is 5 to nothing and the 2 Order is entered. We will use this 5 to nothing vote 3 for the remainder of today's Regular Open Meeting agenda 4 unless otherwise noted.

5 Items 5 through 11 can be taken together. These items are Petitions for cancellation of authority 6 7 to operate as an agent, broker and consultants in 8 Illinois, pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act. In each case ALJ Kimbrel recommends 9 entry of an Order granting the requested relief and also 10 11 directing each petitioner to file any outstanding annual reports. 12

13 Is there any discussion?

14 (No response.)

15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections?

16 (No response.)

17 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 18 entered.

19 Items 12 and 13 can be taken together. These 20 items are Applications for authority to operate as an 21 agent, broker, or consultant pursuant to Section 16-115C 22 of the Public Utilities Act. In both cases ALJ Kimbrel 23 recommends entry of an Order granting the requested 24 authority.

1 Is there any discussion? 2 (No response.) 3 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 4 (No response.) 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 6 entered. Item 14 is Docket No. 14-0302. 7 This is 8 TriEagle Energy's application for service authority under Section 16-115 of the Public Utilities Act 9 authorizing it to operate as an alternative retail 10 11 electric supplier. ALJ Albers recommends entry of an 12 Order granting the requested service authority. 13 Is there any discussion? 14 (No response.) 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 16 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 17 18 entered. CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Item 15 is Docket No. 14-0038. 19 20 This is Martin and Janet Wiesbrock's complaint against 21 ComEd as to billing/charges. It appears the parties 22 have settled their differences and filed a Stipulation 23 and Joint Motion to Dismiss which ALJ Sainsot recommends 24 we grant.

1 Is there any discussion? 2 (No response.) 3 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 4 (No response.) 5 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Motion to 6 Dismiss is granted. Item 16 is Docket No. 14-0060. 7 This is 8 Maurice Perkins, Inner City Youth Foundation's complaint 9 against ComEd as to billing/charges. ALJ Hilliard recommends entry of an order dismissing the complaint. 10 11 Is there any discussion? 12 (No response.) I just wanted to note that 13 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: 14 although we always encourage ratepayers to reach out to 15 our Consumer Services Division when they have a 16 complaint with regard to their utility service, they really need to do this in accordance with the 17 Commission's Administrative Rules. As the ALJ noted in 18 19 this proceeding, this means filing an informal complaint pursuant to 83 Ill.Adm.Code 280.170 before moving into a 20 21 formal proceeding. This is the most administratively efficient way of resolving complaints and we would urge 22 23 Mr. Perkins to follow this rule going forward. You will 24 find that the vast majority of complaints get settled

with that and other ones, so I think it is a very 1 2 effective tool and it is part of the Administrative 3 Code. Are there any other comments? 4 5 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections to entering the 6 7 Order? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 10 entered. 11 Items 17 and 18 can be taken together. These items are citations for failure to file recertification 12 reports required by 83 Ill.Adm.Code 450.110 [sic]. In 13 14 both cases ALJ Kimbrel recommends entry of an Order 15 suspending the respondent's certificate of service 16 authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant. 17 Is there any discussion? 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 22 entered. 23 Item 19 is Docket No. 14-0044. This is our 24 citation against EnerCom for failure to file its

1 recertification report required by

2 83 Ill.Adm.Code 454.110. It appears that EnerCom has now filed the required report and ALJ Kimbrel recommends 3 that we dismiss this proceeding. 4 5 Is there any discussion? 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the proceeding is dismissed. 10 11 Items 20 through 26 can be taken together. 12 These items are Aplications for certification to install, maintain or repair electric vehicle charging 13 station facilities pursuant to Section 16-128A of the 14 15 Public Utilities Act. In each case ALJ Benn recommends 16 entry of an Order granting the requested certificate. 17 Is there any discussion? 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 22 entered. 23 Items 27 and 28 can be taken together. These 24 items are Applications for certification as an installer

1 of DG facilities pursuant to Section 16-128A of the 2 Public Utilities Act. In both cases, the ALJ recommends 3 entry of an Order granting the requested certificate. 4 Is there any discussion? 5 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 6 7 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 8 9 entered. 10 Items 29 through 32 can be taken together. 11 These items are petitions for the confidential and/or 12 proprietary treatment of petitioners' various compliance reports. In each case the ALJ recommends entry of an 13 14 Order granting the requested relief. 15 Is there any discussion? 16 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 17 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 20 entered. 21 Item 33 is Docket No. 12-0285. This is 22 Peoples' informational statement pursuant to 23 Section 6-102(d) of the Public Utilities Act in 24 connection with the proposed issuance and sale of bonds

1 or notes. Peoples has filed a Petition to Reopen the 2 proceeding in order to extend the date by which it must issue the debt authorized by the Order and ALJ Haynes 3 4 recommends we grant the petition. 5 Is there any discussion? 6 (No response.) 7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the petition is granted and the proceeding is reopened. 10 Item 34 is Docket No. 14-0189. This is our 11 12 proceeding to approve the Illinois Statewide Technical Reference Manual for Energy Efficiency. ALJ Kimbrel 13 14 recommends entry of an Order approving and adopting the 15 Illinois Statewide TRM for Energy Efficiency 16 Version 3.0. 17 Is there any discussion? 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 20 (No response.) 21 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 22 entered. 23 Item 35 is Docket No. 14-0207. This is 24 Peoples informational statement pursuant to

1 Section 6-102(d) of the Public Utilities Act in 2 connection with the proposed issuance and sale of up to \$75 million aggregate principal amount of bonds or 3 notes, or a combination thereof, in one or more series. 4 ALJ Sainsot recommends entry of an order authorizing the 5 6 proposed transaction. 7 Is there any discussion? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 10 (No response.) 11 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 12 entered. Item 36 is Docket No. 14-0208. This is 13 Peoples petition for authority pursuant to 14 15 Section 6-102(b) of the Public Utilities Act in connection with the proposed issuance and sale of up to 16 17 \$100 million aggregate principal amount of bonds or notes, or a combination thereof, in one or more series. 18 ALJ Sainsot recommends entry of an order authorizing the 19 20 proposed transaction. 21 Is there any discussion? 22 (No response.) 23 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 24

(No response.)

CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 10 11 (No response.) 12 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Orders are 13 entered. 14 Item 42 is Docket No 14-0265. This is the 15 Illinois Telecommunications Access Corporation's 16 petition to set the annual line charge pursuant to 83 Ill.Adm.Code 755.500. ALJ Jorgenson recommends entry 17 of an Order granting the requested relief, decreasing 18 19 current line charges and requiring all carriers to file 20 new tariffs in compliance within 15 days of the date of 21 the Order. 22 Is there any discussion? 23 (No response.)

24 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections?

1 (No response.) 2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 3 entered. Item 43 is Docket No. 13-0699. ALJ Von Qualen recommends entry of an Order granting the requested relief. 10 11 Is there any discussion? 12 (No response.) CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any objections? 13 14 (No response.) 15 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Hearing none, the Order is 16 entered. Item 44 is Docket No. 13-0134. 17 This is 18 Enbridge Energy's Application pursuant to Sections 8-503, 8-509, and 15-401 of the Public 19 Utilities Act/The Common Carrier by Pipeline Law for 20 21 Certification and Authority to Construct and Operate a Petroleum Pipeline and for eminent domain authority. 22 ALJ Hilliard recommends entry of an Order granting the 23 24 requested relief.
