2 CHAIR ZALEWSKI: We are now moving on to
3 the public utility agenda. There are edits to the
4 April 5th and March 23rd regular open meeting
5 minutes. Are there any objections to approving
6 the minutes as edited? Hearing none, the minutes
7 are approved.

8 Item E-1 concerns a filing by Ameren to
9 revise its electric tariff table of contents
10 sheets. Commission staff has reviewed the filing
11 and recommends not suspending it.

12 Are there any objections to not
13 suspending the filing? Hearing none, the filing
14 is not suspended.

15 Item E-2 concerns MidAmerican's petition
16 for consent and approval of a contract with an
17 affiliated interest. MidAmerican has now filed a
18 motion to withdraw, noting that the parties agreed
19 to terminate the agreement, and are not going to
20 close the transaction.

21 Are there any objections to granting the
22 motion to withdraw? Hearing none, the motion to
23 withdraw is granted.

24 Item E-3 concerns docket 22-0231, which

1 is Illinois Power Agency's petition for approval
2 of the IPA's 2022 long-term renewable resources
3 procurement plan. The Commission granted IPA's
4 petition to reopen this docket to consider
5 modifications to the plan in light of the
6 oversubscription of the Equity Eligible Contractor
7 or EEC category. The order on reopening approves
8 the IPA's proposed modifications to the plan as
9 specified in the order. Among other, the order
10 applies a developer cap on day one of the program
11 year, and again when any remaining DG capacity is
12 made available for community solar. The order
13 finds that this will give smaller developers at
14 least two opportunities to apply for the community
15 solar subcategory.

16 Are there any objections to approving
17 the order on reopening? Hearing none, the order
18 is approved.

19 Item E-4 concerns a petition for a
20 certificate as an installer of a new utility scale
21 solar project. The order grants the certificate
22 finding that the application has met the necessary
23 requirements.

24 Are there any objections to approving

1 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

2 Item E-5 concerns a complaint against
3 ComEd as to electrical wires. The order dismisses
4 the complaint with prejudice finding that the
5 Commission lacks authority under the act to hear
6 the complaint.

7 Are there any objections to approving
8 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

9 Item E-6 concerns ComEd's proposed new
10 rider IGP, or Infrastructure With Grant Programs.
11 ComEd motioned to withdraw the filing and
12 terminate the proceeding, noting that it is
13 unlikely that there will be Infrastructure
14 Investment and Jobs Act projects flowing through
15 proposed rider IGP in the near future.

16 Are there any objections to granting the
17 motion to withdraw and terminating the proceeding?
18 Hearing none, the motion to withdraw is granted
19 and the proceeding is terminated.

20 Item E-7 concerns a petition for a
21 certificate of service authority to act as an
22 alternative retail electric supplier or ARES in
23 Illinois. The order grants the certificate,
24 finding that the applicant has met the necessary

1 requirements.

2 Are there any objections to approving
3 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

4 Item E-8 concerns a petition to cancel
5 certificate to operate as a retail electric agent,
6 broker or consultant in Illinois. The order
7 cancels the certificate.

8 Are there any objections to approving
9 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

10 Item E-9 concerns a request for a
11 confidential or proprietary treatment of
12 Petitioner's report. The order grants the
13 protection, finding that the information is highly
14 proprietary and confidential.

15 Are there any objections to approving
16 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

17 Item E-10 concerns an application for a
18 certification to operate as an installer of
19 distributed generation facilities in Illinois.
20 The order grants the certificate, finding that the
21 applicant meets the requirements.

22 Are there any objections to approving
23 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

24 Item E-11 concerns an application for a

1 certification to install, maintain or repair
2 electric vehicle charging station facilities in
3 Illinois. The order grants the certificate,
4 finding that the applicant meets the requirements.
5 Are there any objections to approving the order?
6 Hearing none, the order is approved.

7 Items E-12 through E-18 concern
8 applications for certifications to install energy
9 efficiency measures in Illinois. The orders grant
10 the certificates, finding that the applicants meet
11 the requirements. Are there any objections to
12 considering these items together and approving the
13 orders? Hearing none, the orders are approved.

14 Moving on to our gas items. Item G-1
15 concerns a filing by People's Gas to revise its
16 rider PRG, or producer of renewable gas
17 transportation service to clarify provisions
18 related to capital cost charges. Commission staff
19 has reviewed the filing and recommends not
20 suspending it.

21 Are there any objections to not
22 suspending the filing? Hearing none, the filing
23 is not suspended.

24 Item G-2 concerns a complaint against

1 People's Gas as to billing. We will be holding
2 this item for later disposition.

3 Item G-3 concerns Nicor Gas petition to
4 determine the accuracy of rider 26 reconciliation
5 statement. The order approves the reconciliation
6 as specified in the appendix, finding that the
7 charges prudently incurred.

8 Are there any objections to approving
9 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

10 Item G-4 concerns Nicor Gas petition to
11 determine the accuracy of their rider one public
12 utility assessment charge reconciliation
13 statement. The order approves a reconciliation as
14 specified in the appendix, finding the charges
15 prudently incurred.

16 Are there any objections to approving
17 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

18 Item G-5 concerns Nicor Gas petition for
19 a consent to enter into a credit agreement with
20 affiliated interests. The order finds that the
21 financing proposal is in the public interest,
22 consistent with the requirements of the Public
23 Utilities Act and supported by evidence. The
24 order approves the petition subject to staff's

1 proposed reporting requirements.

2 Are there any objections to approving
3 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

4 Moving on to our telecommunications
5 items. Item T-1 concerns petition to relinquish
6 designation as an eligible telecommunications
7 carrier, or ETC. The order grants the petition,
8 finding that the petitioner has shown that
9 following relinquishment of its designation there
10 will continue to be at least one other ETC in the
11 portions of the 2021 ETC designation area. Are
12 there any objections to approving the order?
13 Hearing none, the order is approved.

14 Item T-2 concerns a motion to withdraw
15 Network Innovation Inc.'s petition for
16 authorization to transfer its certificates of
17 authority to provide local and interexchange
18 service to Network Innovations LLC. After filing
19 the petition, petitioner learned that since the
20 proper paperwork had been submitted to the chief
21 clerk's office, the conversion can be done with a
22 name change as opposed to a docketed proceeding.

23 Are there any objections to granting the
24 motion to withdraw? Hearing none, the motion is

1 granted.

2 Item T-3 concerns CM-RUS, LLC's petition
3 to change corporate form. The order grants the
4 petition and cancels the certificates of service
5 authority issued to CNN-RUS Inc. in docket number
6 22-0391, and issues new certificates of service
7 authority to CMN-RUS, LLC.

8 Are there any objections to approving
9 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

10 Items T-4 and T-5 concern applications
11 for certificates of authority to operate as
12 resellers and facilities-based carriers of local
13 and interexchange telecommunications services.
14 The orders grant the certificates, finding that
15 the applicant meets the requirements.

16 Are there any objections to considering
17 these items together and approving the orders?
18 Hearing none, the orders are approved.

19 Item T-6 concerns Spectrotel Services
20 LLC's petition to cancel its local and
21 interexchange certificates. The order grants the
22 petition and cancels the certificates. Are there
23 any objections to approving the order? Hearing
24 none, the order is approved.

1 Item W-1 concerns a complaint against
2 Illinois American Water Company as to payments.
3 The order denies the complaint, finding that the
4 complainant failed to sustain his burden of proof
5 related to his allegation that the company
6 improperly overbilled him and also failed to
7 sustain his burden of proof related to his
8 allegation that the company violated the provision
9 of Section 280.50 of the Commission rules.

10 Are there any objections to approving
11 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

12 Item W-2 concerns Illinois American
13 Water Company's petition for reconciliation under
14 its rider BDE, or bad debt expense. The order
15 approves the reconciliation as specified in the
16 appendix, finding that the charges were prudently
17 incurred. Are there any objections to approving
18 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

19 Item W-3 concerns Aqua Illinois petition
20 for reconciliation under its rider UART, or
21 Utility Assessment Recovery Tax. The order
22 approves the reconciliation as specified in the
23 appendix, finding that the charges were prudently
24 incurred. Are there any objections to approving

1 the order? Hearing none, the order is approved.

2 Item W-4 concerns an application for
3 approval of a reorganization transaction. The
4 order approves the proposed transaction subject to
5 certain conditions and determinations as set forth
6 in the order. Are there any objections to
7 approving the order? Hearing none, the order is
8 approved.

9 Moving on to our petitions for
10 rehearing. Item PR-1 concerns a petition for
11 rehearing in consolidated docket 22-0431 and
12 22-0443, which is Ameren's petition for approval
13 of beneficial electrification plan. The
14 commission issued its final order in this
15 proceeding on March 23rd of 2023. On April 19th,
16 ICEA filed a motion for clarification and on April
17 24th the AG filed a motion for clarification and
18 an application for rehearing.

19 The Commission will consider the
20 application for rehearing at this meeting while we
21 are going to hold consideration on all other
22 motions, all of the motions for reconsideration,
23 excuse me; I'm going to reread that so I get it
24 clear.

1 The Commission will consider the
2 application for rehearing at this hearing while we
3 will hold all consideration on the motions for
4 clarification until our next meeting. The AG
5 application for rehearing seeks rehearing on a
6 number of issues, including the retail rate cap
7 and the costs that count towards it, budget,
8 rebates, and cost-benefit analysis.

9 The ALJ recommends the commission deny
10 the application for rehearing because there have
11 been no additional arguments or evidence presented
12 that warrant a rehearing. The Commission agrees
13 with ALJ. Are there any objections to denying the
14 AG's application for rehearing? Hearing none, the
15 application for rehearing is denied.

16 Item PR-2 concerns a petition for
17 rehearing in consolidated docket 22-0432, and
18 22-0442, which is ComEd's petition for approval of
19 its beneficial electrification plan. A final
20 order was issued on March 23rd of 2023, and on
21 April 18th of 2023 ComEd filed an application for
22 rehearing. On April 21 of 2023 CTA/City filed an
23 application for rehearing. And on April 24th of
24 2023, the AG filed an application for rehearing.

1 On April 27th of 2023 staff filed a motion for
2 clarification.

3 The Commission will consider all
4 applications for rehearing at this meeting while
5 we will be holding consideration on staff's motion
6 for clarification until our next meeting.

7 So first, we'll look at the CTA/City and
8 the AG's applications for rehearing. The CTA/City
9 requests the rehearing on the modifications to
10 rider NS, or nonstandard services and facilities,
11 with respect to make-ready infrastructure and
12 rider DE regarding the deposit requirements.

13 The AG is seeking rehearing on a number
14 of issues, including the retail rate cap, budget,
15 rebates, nontransportation programs, cost-benefit
16 analysis. The ALJ recommends that the commission
17 deny the applications for rehearing filed by
18 CTA/City and the AG because there have been no
19 additional arguments or evidence presented that
20 warrant rehearing.

21 The Commission agrees with ALJ. Are
22 there any objections to denying the CTA/City and
23 the AG's applications for rehearing? Hearing
24 none, the CTA/City and the AG's application for

1 rehearing are denied.

2 Next, we'll consider ComEd's application
3 for rehearing. ComEd is seeking rehearing on two
4 issues. First, cost recovery mechanism; and
5 second, revision of the budget.

6 The ALJ recommends that the Commission
7 grants ComEd's application for rehearing in part
8 and deny in part. The ALJ recommends denying
9 rehearing regarding ComEd's cost recovery
10 mechanism and granting rehearing regarding ComEd's
11 proposed lower budget. The ALJ recommends that if
12 the Commission grants rehearing, the Commission
13 should consider placing some limitations on the
14 scope of rehearing and make clear that all budget
15 adjustments are intended to reduce the overall
16 budget and no program's budget or subprogram's
17 budget may be increased.

18 The Commission does not agree with the
19 ALJ, finding that no additional arguments or
20 evidence have been presented that warrant
21 rehearing.

22 Are there any objections to denying
23 ComEd's application for rehearing? Hearing none,
24 the application for rehearing is denied.

1 Moving on to other business. Item O-1
2 concerns the IPA's 2022 long-term renewable
3 resources procurement plan. The IPA --

4 MS. TEAGUE-KINSLEY: Excuse me, I'm
5 sorry, Madam Chairman, did you do the AG's
6 application for rehearing?

7 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: I did, because when
8 I called the vote I lumped the CTA/City and AG's
9 application for rehearing together. And both were
10 denied.

11 MS. TEAGUE-KINSLEY: Okay.

12 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: In that vote.

13 MS. TEAGUE-KINSLEY: Okay. I'm sorry.
14 Thank you very much.

15 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Thanks for checking.
16 Okay. Other items, item O-1 concerns IPA's 2022
17 long-term renewable resources procurement plan.
18 The IPA is seeking approval of its proposed credit
19 amount for the Customer Self-Direct Renewable
20 Portfolio Standard Compliance Program. Are there
21 any objections to approving the IPA's proposed
22 credit amount? Hearing none, the IPA proposal is
23 approved.

24 Items O-2 and O-3 concern approval of

1 batches, contracts and confirmations under the
2 Illinois Adjustable Block and Solar for All
3 programs. Are there any objections to considering
4 these items together and approving the program
5 administrator's submission? Hearing none, the
6 submissions are approved.

7 This concludes our public utilities
8 agenda. Do we have other matters to come before
9 the Commission today?

10 MS. TEAGUE-KINSLEY: No, Madam Chairman.

11 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Do any of the
12 commissioners have other business to discuss?
13 Hearing none, without objection, the meeting is
14 adjourned.
