- 1 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Are we ready in Springfield?
- JUDGE WALLACE: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
- 3 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Pursuant to the provisions of
- 4 the Illinois Open Meetings Act, I now convene a
- 5 Special Open Meeting of the Illinois Commerce
- 6 Commission.
- 7 With me in Chicago are Commissioners
- 8 Ford and O'Connell-Diaz. With us via video
- 9 conference in Springfield are Commissioner Elliot and
- 10 Acting Commissioner Colgan, I am Acting Chairman
- 11 Flores.
- We have a quorum.
- Before moving into the agenda,
- 14 according to Section 1700.10 of the Illinois
- 15 Administrative Code, this is the time we allow
- 16 members of public to address the Commission. Members
- 17 of the public wishing to address the Commission must
- 18 notify the Chief Clerk's Office at least 24 hours
- 19 prior to the meeting of the Commission. According to
- the Chief Clerk's Office, we have no requests to
- 21 speak for today.
- Moving into the agenda, we start with

- 1 Docket Nos. 09-0306 through 09-0311. This is the
- 2 Ameren Illinois Utility's rate case. We entered an
- 3 Order on this case on April 29th and since that time
- 4 a couple of accounting errors have been brought to
- 5 our attention. We have a corrected Order on the
- 6 agenda for today to address those two errors. We
- 7 have also have an emergency motion brought by the
- 8 Ameren Illinois Utility seeking correction of these
- 9 errors and other alleged errors in the appendices.
- 10 Let's address the corrected Order
- 11 first. I believe this Order corrects two accounting
- 12 errors identified by Staff. The first error is on
- 13 the calculation of cash working capital where the
- 14 function of this error is to underestimate the Ameren
- 15 Illinois Utility's revenue requirement by
- 16 approximately \$9.7 million.
- 17 The second error concerns a mistake in
- the spreadsheet formula affecting only AmerenCILCO's
- 19 electric operations and this mistake serves to
- 20 understate the Ameren Illinois Utility's revenue
- 21 requirement by approximately \$214,000. These errors
- were identified by Staff after we served today's

- 1 Order on the parties and the corrective Order is
- 2 meant to remedy both these errors.
- 3 Is there any discussion of the
- 4 corrected order?
- 5 (No response.)
- Is there a motion to adopt the
- 7 corrected Order?
- 8 CHAIRMAN COLGAN: So moved.
- 9 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there a second?
- 10 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Chairman, if I
- 11 have just might ask, the corrections were identified
- 12 by Staff, but were they not identified in the
- 13 compliance filing by the company?
- 14 CHAIRMAN FLORES: I don't know. They may have.
- 15 I do not know that answer.
- 16 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: We were served
- 17 with copies of the compliance filing by the company.
- 18 CHAIRMAN FLORES: What we are dealing with
- 19 right now is the corrected Order put forth by the
- 20 Commission. That's what we're deciding right now.
- 21 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: I'm just trying
- 22 to clarify the record.

- 1 CHAIRMAN FLORES: The record is that we are
- 2 dealing right now with a corrected Order put forth by
- 3 the Commission. That's what we're deciding right
- 4 now. There is a motion to adopt the corrected Order
- 5 by the Commission. That is the motion that is being
- 6 considered right now.
- 7 Is there a second?
- 8 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Second.
- 9 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Its been moved and seconded.
- 10 All in favor say "aye."
- 11 (Chorus of ayes.)
- 12 Any opposed?
- 13 COMMISSIONER FORD: Nay.
- 14 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Nay.
- 15 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Let the record reflect that
- 16 there are three in support, two opposed. Let's go
- 17 ahead and take roll call.
- 18 Commissioner Ford?
- 19 COMMISSIONER FORD: Nay.
- 20 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner O'Connell-Diaz?
- 21 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Nay.
- 22 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner Elliott?

- 1 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Aye.
- 2 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Acting Commissioner Colgan?
- 3 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Aye.
- 4 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Acting Chairman Flores votes
- 5 aye.
- 6 The vote a 3-2 and the corrected Order
- 7 is entered.
- 8 While this vote addresses some portion
- 9 of the issues raised in Ameren's emergency motion
- 10 filed on Tuesday, there are still other issues
- 11 remaining. Ameren's emergency motion referenced
- 12 alleged errors concerning cash, working capital and
- 13 severance cost adjustments, accumulated depreciation
- 14 reserve, accumulated deferred income taxes and
- 15 revenue lag associated with past through taxes.
- 16 Staff filed a response on Wednesday
- 17 agreeing that there are errors consistent with the
- 18 errors identified in the corrected Order, but
- 19 disagreeing that the other issues identified by
- 20 Ameren constitute errors and suggesting that the
- 21 Utility address these issues through rehearing.
- 22 Ameren filed a reply late yesterday.

- 1 ALJ Albers and Yoder are in agreement with Staff's
- 2 assessment regarding what constitutes errors and
- 3 recommends denying the motion to the extent it is
- 4 inconsistent with the corrected Order.
- 5 Is there any discussion?
- 6 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Judge Albers, I
- 7 have before me a memo from you and Judge Yoder with
- 8 regard to the emergency motion and in that I do not
- 9 find the discussion relative to the reply that was
- 10 filed by the company. Was that considered -- or I
- 11 think I got this before they had filed that -- so we
- don't have a rundown of the arguments presented by
- 13 the company in their reply, do we, in your memo?
- 14 JUDGE ALBERS: No, because we issued the memo
- 15 before the reply came in. We did not know the reply
- 16 was coming, but we did look at it this morning and I
- 17 am not prepared to change our recommendation. I
- 18 still am uncertain as of the three alleged errors.
- 19 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: And with regard
- 20 to -- I guess I'm confused in that it appears that
- 21 the majority has accepted the IIEC's correction to
- 22 AIU's adjustment pursuant to the Order that was

- 1 entered. And it seems that whatever calculation has
- 2 been done to the accumulated depreciation reserve
- 3 utilizes a hybrid calculation as opposed to the
- 4 IIEC's calculation.
- Is there anything that would help me
- 6 understand in Staff's reply why that was utilized
- 7 when they ran the numbers on that?
- 8 JUDGE ALBERS: I don't think so. That's
- 9 certainly Ameren's argument. I just couldn't tell
- 10 you right now if that's accurate or not.
- 11 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: And if my
- 12 recollection serves me properly, which sometimes it
- 13 doesn't, the IIC number on this issue and the AG
- 14 number were some \$23 million apart with regard to
- 15 that issue in the case in chief.
- MR. HICKEY: Commissioner, this is Steve
- 17 Hickey. My memory is not that great either, but I
- 18 believe that the IIC and AG had different positions.
- 19 I don't remember exactly what the differences were.
- 20 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: But if they had
- 21 different positions and we're adopting the IIEC's --
- 22 or the majority is adopting the IIEC's position, I'm

- 1 kind of left -- I think Staff suggested that in their
- 2 reply to the emergency motion they suggest that since
- 3 they proposed different amounts that the Commission
- 4 would independently use a different calculation,
- 5 which to me means a hybrid, I think.
- 6 MR. HICKEY: Well, I think something to
- 7 understand here is that when the ALJs put their
- 8 Proposed Order together and we adopted a position,
- 9 for example, of IIC, the AG or Staff, we typically
- 10 work with our accounting assistant to make sure or
- 11 try to make sure that we correctly reflect the entire
- 12 adjustment. And sometimes whether it's the IIC, the
- 13 AG or Staff, we don't believe that the entire
- 14 calculation or quantification contained in a
- 15 particular party's proposal is completely accurate or
- 16 carried all the way through and that's essentially
- 17 the problem we have here.
- 18 It was clear to us, for example, that
- in calculating cash versus capital that the appendix
- 20 to the Order, for example, incorrectly calculated the
- 21 lag days for revenue. With regard to this other
- 22 issue, we just have not had enough time. Again, this

- 1 is something that the Commission adopted different
- 2 than the Proposed Order --
- 3 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: I understand
- 4 that. I've sat in that seat and I know where you're
- 5 at. You're trying to understand what the thought
- 6 process was behind this other result that we have in
- 7 the Proposed Order which is different that what Judge
- 8 Yoder and Judge Albers recommended in their
- 9 recommendation to the Commission for the \$55 million
- 10 rate increase. So I thank you. I appreciate your
- 11 candor.
- MR. HICKEY: Sure.
- 13 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there any other discussion
- 14 at this time?
- 15 (No response.)
- 16 Is there a motion to deny the
- 17 emergency motion?
- 18 CHAIRMAN ELLIOTT: So moved.
- 19 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there a second?
- 20 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second.
- 21 CHAIRMAN FLORES: It's been moved and seconded.
- 22 All in favor say "aye."

- 1 CHAIRMAN FLORES Aye.
- 2 Any opposed?
- 3 COMMISSIONER FORD: Nay.
- 4 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Nay.
- 5 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Let the record reflect that
- 6 the vote is 3-2. We'll do a roll call vote so that
- 7 the record is clear.
- 8 Commissioner Ford?
- 9 COMMISSIONER FORD: Nay.
- 10 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner O'Connell-Diaz?
- 11 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Nay.
- 12 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Commissioner Elliott?
- 13 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Aye.
- 14 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Acting Commissioner Colgan?
- 15 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Aye.
- 16 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Acting Chairman Flores votes
- 17 aye.
- The vote is 3-2 and Ameren's emergency
- 19 motion is denied.
- We also have a procurement Item on
- 21 today's agenda --
- 22 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: Chairman, if I

- 1 might?
- 2 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Yes, ma'am.
- 3 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: I just have a
- 4 comment to make with regard to the case that was just
- 5 voted. After last week there were many things that
- 6 were being said and I just want to clarify for the
- 7 record some things that I saw out there. And forgive
- 8 me, I don't have a speech writer on my staff, so I
- 9 will have to clarify in my simple words about where I
- 10 find myself in this case.
- 11 Unlike some of the comments from the
- 12 majority that seem to suggest that Commissioner Ford
- and I had not done our due diligence with regard to
- 14 this case, let's get one thing clear, for weeks prior
- 15 to the vote on this matter our offices had asked for
- 16 clarification of the numbers and rate impacts for
- 17 each of the provisions to the ALJs Proposed Orders.
- 18 These revisions were supported in total by the
- 19 majority.
- 20 This stack of papers reflects the
- 21 numerous drafts of information that was tendered to
- 22 us during the weeks leading up to the vote. We would

- 1 review the items that were given to us only to be
- 2 told the numbers were incorrect and we would get new
- 3 drafts. The day of the vote, surprisingly, none of
- 4 the numbers added up. It was apparent from our
- 5 discussion last week that none of the majority could
- 6 articulate or, in fact, do a rate impact of each of
- 7 the revisions when we asked.
- 8 As Acting Chairman Flores stated in
- 9 his press conference, Our responsibility is not to
- 10 raise rate or lower rates, it's to make the decision
- 11 based on the evidence. With that I would agree, but
- 12 it is a fundamental tenet of a regulator to know the
- 13 rate effect of an item one is reviewing, and most
- 14 importantly, voting on. That is all Commissioner
- 15 Ford and I were asking for last week and, indeed, in
- 16 the weeks leading up to the vote. So here we are
- 17 today with what I would call a debacle that has
- 18 caused great concern in our state and on a national
- 19 level as to the competence of this Commission to
- 20 discharge its duties in compliance with the law.
- In my 20 years with this Commission I
- 22 can never recall a similar incident. The lack of

- 1 collaboration on this Order and command and control
- of the flow of information leaves me with a feeling
- 3 of unease and the seemingly result-driven process
- 4 that has occurred here makes me suspicious. It
- 5 should be noted that after the short recess a last
- 6 weeks meeting where the majority exited the bench and
- 7 went into a huddle and reappeared at bench, at no
- 8 time were Commissioner Ford and myself consulted or
- 9 conferred with by the group. The vote, as we saw,
- 10 was then rammed through.
- 11 This may be tolerated at other venues
- or other council meetings, but it is not acceptable
- in the proceedings of an adjudicatory body where our
- 14 duty is to apply the rules of law to the record
- 15 evidence. This debacle is certainly not the "product
- 16 a careful and thorough analysis of the evidence as
- 17 suggested by the majority. I leave it to others to
- 18 conjure up their own rationales. Thank you.
- 19 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Thank you, Commissioner.
- 20 Any other discussion or comments on
- 21 the record? Thank you very much.
- There is a procurement item on today's

- 1 agenda. We are scheduled today to vote on Ameren
- 2 Energy's request for proposal.
- 3 Is there a motion to accept the
- 4 results of Ameren's energy RFP?
- 5 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: So moved.
- 6 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Is there a second.
- 7 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Second.
- 8 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Its been moved and seconded.
- 9 All in favor say "aye."
- 10 (Chorus of ayes.)
- 11 Any opposed?
- 12 (No response.)
- 13 The vote is 5-0 and the results of
- 14 Ameren's energy RPF are approved.
- Judge Wallace, is there any other
- items to be addressed at Today's Special Open
- 17 Meeting?
- JUDGE WALLACE: No, Mr. Chairman.
- 19 CHAIRMAN FLORES: Thank you.
- Hearing none, this meeting stands
- 21 adjourned.

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
