May 8, 2023 1 2 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Open meeting 3 to order. 4 Commissioners Carrigan, McCabe, Reddick and Paradis are with me in 5 Chicago. 6 We have a quorum. We have no 7 request to speak. We have no 8 9 transportation agenda, and we only have 10 two items on today's public utilities 11 agenda. The first item concerns two 12 13 motions for clarification from the AG and ICEA in docket 22-0431 and 22-0443, 14 which is Ameren's Petition for Approval 15 of its Beneficial Electrification Plan. 16 17 First, the AG is seeking 18 clarification regarding charge points 19 request that Ameren provide all 20 nonresidential ratepayers with rebates for the installation and maintenance of 21 2.2 Level II or Level III chargers. 23 The AG's request seeks to confirm 24 that the Commission denied Charge 25 Points' request in its final order. 4	request. The mandatory order grants the	
5	AG's motion and clarifies that Charge	
6	Points' request is denied.	
7	Are there any objections to	
8	granting the motion and approving the	
9	mandatory order?	
10	Hearing none. The motion is	
11	granted and the order is approved.	
12	Second, ICEA is seeking	
13	clarification regarding the final	
14	order's conclusion on time of use rates.	
15	Specifically, ICEA requests that the	
16	Commission strike three sentences from	
17	the Commission's conclusion regarding	
18	the CJC's whole house TOU proposal.	
19	ICEA argues that these sentences are not	
20	relevant to issues in this proceeding	
21	and are inconsistent with other findings	
22	in the paragraph.	
23	The ALJ recommends denying ICEA's	
24	request, finding that the findings are	
25	not inconsistent and that the request

12	electrification plan. Commission staff	
13	filed a motion for clarification	
14	requesting that the Commission clarify	
15	the definition of budget in the final	
16	order of this proceeding. Staff notes	
17	that ComEd's application for rehearing	
18	and the testimony recently filed in a	
19	multiyear rate plan proceeding, docket	
20	number 22-0486 and 23-0055 Consolidated	
21	show that ComEd intends to spend \$30.2	
22	million annually in its BE Budget, while	
23	the Commission approved an annual budget	
24	of \$77 million.	
25	Given that the Commission denied	



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2	comet's petition for rehearing related
3	to the budget in this docket, the ALJ
4	recommends the Commission enter an
5	amendatory order requiring comment to
6	make a good faith effort to
7	affirmatively commit to the budgeted
8	level of funding as approved by the
9	Commission in the final order.
10	Are there any objections to
11	granting the motion for clarification
12	and approving the amendatory order?
13	Hearing none. The motion is
14	granted and the order is approved.
