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- 1 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Good morning. Are we ready to
- 2 proceed in Springfield?
- 3 CHIEF CLERK: Yes, we are.
- 4 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Pursuant to the Opening
- 5 Meetings Act, I call the June 21, 2016 Regular Open
- 6 Meeting of the Illinois Commerce Commission to
- 7 order.
- 8 Commissioners del Valle, Edwards, and
- 9 Rosales are present with me in Chicago and we have a
- 10 quorum.
- 11 We have no requests to speak and will,
- 12 therefore, move into our Regular Public Utility
- 13 Agenda. There are edits to the Minutes of our May
- 14 26, 2016 Electric Policy Session. There are no
- edits to the Minutes of our May 25th and June 1st
- 16 Regular Open Meetings.
- 17 Are there any objections to approving
- 18 the Minutes?
- 19 (No response.)
- 20 Hearing none, the Minutes are
- 21 approved.
- 22 Item E-1 concerns Mt. Carmel Public

- 1 Utility Company's Compliance Filings.
- 2 Are there any objections to not
- 3 suspending the filings?
- 4 (No response.)
- 5 Hearing none, the filings are not
- 6 suspended.
- 7 Item E-2 concerns Ameren's AMI
- 8 Deployment Plan. I move to reopen the docket for
- 9 the limited purpose of reviewing Ameren's proposal
- 10 to accelerate and expand its AMI Deployment Plan and
- 11 set a schedule that would allow for a final order by
- 12 September 24, 2016.
- 13 Is there a second?
- 14 COMMISSIONER ROSALES: Seconded.
- 15 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Any discussion?
- 16 (No response.)
- 17 All those in favor, say aye.
- 18 (Chorus of ayes.)
- 19 Opposed, say nay.

- 2 Reconciliation of Revenues Collected under its
- 3 Energy Efficiency and Demand Response Adjustment
- 4 Rider.
- 5 Are there any objections to approving

- 9 Item E-4 concerns the Independent
- 10 Evaluator's Evaluation Report on the Electric and
- 11 Gas On-Bill Financing Programs required by the
- 12 Public Utilities Act.

- 15 COMMISSIONER MAYE EDWARDS: Moved.
- 16 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Is there a second?

- 20 COMMISSIONER del VALLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
- 21 On-Bill Financing was meant to allow utility
- 22 customers to purchase cost-effective energy

- 1 efficiency measures and realize the benefits of
- 2 savings in energy costs and consumer energy to the
- 3 benefit of all ratepayers.
- 4 The program originally found that two
- 5 years into the program application rejection rates
- 6 were up 50 percent across all utility programs. It
- 7 also found that interest rates were within the
- 8 national average had increased since the program's
- 9 inception.
- I agree with the utility's position
- 11 that they do not need legislative changes to begin
- 12 exploring the evaluator's recommendations and
- improving these programs.
- 14 Ameren Illinois has already taken
- 15 steps to address the high rejection rates by
- initiating a pilot utilizing bill payment histories
- as a means to establish program eligibility.
- 18 I hope they explore not only the usage
- 19 but help to increase participation and reduce the
- 20 rejection rates but also whether the resulting data
- 21 support lowering the credit score threshold, and I
- 22 encourage On-Bill Financing programs to explore

- 1 similar pilots and implement the best practices
- 2 learned.
- I also encourage the utilities to work
- 4 with their program's lenders to ensure that it is
- 5 soliciting funding sources with the best terms
- 6 available, including the lowest reasonable interest
- 7 rate.
- 8 These steps should help to ensure that
- 9 On-Bill Financing better serves as a low-cost
- 10 financing option for utility customers who are
- 11 otherwise unable to afford alternatives.
- This program was not designed for
- 13 higher income folks and it wasn't even, I think in
- 14 my opinion, designed for the upper middle class but
- 15 rather for that middle, middle and lower income
- 16 folks who would not have the perfect credit score
- but, in many instances, struggle and pay their bills
- 18 and pay them on time and should not by rejected,
- 19 because it's a program designed to help them and
- 20 they shouldn't be rejected outright, and the
- 21 rejection rate is very high, and, in fact, it's also
- that there's a high percentage, even though it's

- 1 across the board, of applications being withdrawn
- which means that finding a better deal elsewhere,
- 3 and so that's why I think we would have to pay close
- 4 attention to the interest rate.
- 5 So having said that, Mr. Chairman, I
- 6 support the report, but I wish we would have gone
- 7 further in encouraging the further development of
- 8 this very important program that helps people
- 9 replace their equipment and become more energy
- 10 efficient which in the long run helps all
- 11 ratepayers. Thank you.
- 12 CHAIRMAN SHEAHAN: Thank you.
