- 14 I move to allow Chairman Scott's participation
- 15 by phone. Is there a second?
- 16 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.
- 17 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: It's been moved and seconded.
- 18 All in favor say aye.
- 19 (Ayes heard.)
- 20 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: Any opposed?
