1 PROCEEDINGS

2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Pursuant to the provisions of  
3 the Open Meetings Act, I now convene a regularly  
4 scheduled Bench Session of the Illinois Commerce  
5 Commission. With me in Springfield is Commissioner  
6 Colgan, Commissioner McCabe, Acting Commissioner Del  
7 Valle and Acting Commissioner Maye. I am Chairman  
8 Scott. We have a quorum.

9 Before moving into the agenda,  
10 according to Section 1700.10 of Title II of the  
11 Administrative Code, this is the time we allow  
12 members of the public to address the Commission.  
13 Members of the public wishing to address the  
14 Commission must notify the Chief Clerk's Office at  
15 least 24 hours prior to Commission meetings.  
16 According to the Chief Clerk's Office we have no  
17 requests to speak at today's Bench Session.

18 Moving to the Transportation agenda,  
19 we will begin with the approval of minutes from our  
20 June 5 Bench Session. I understand amendments have  
21 been forwarded. Is there a motion to amend the  
22 minutes?

1 COMMISSIONER COLGAN: So moved.

2 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Is there a second?

3 COMMISSIONER McCABE: Second.

4 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: It's been moved and seconded.

5 All in favor say aye.

6 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

7 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?

9 The vote is five to nothing, and the  
10 amendments are adopted.

19 CHAIRMAN SCOTT: Any opposed?

21 The vote is five to nothing, and the  
22 minutes from our June 5 Bench Session as amended are

1 approved.

2 On to the Railroad portion of today's  
3 agenda, Item RR-1 is Docket Number T12-0111. This is  
4 Alton & Southern Railway's petition for authorization  
5 to install two additional railroad tracks and to  
6 reconfigure the existing roadway surface and warning  
7 devices at a railway grade crossing in Madison  
8 County. ALJ Duggan recommends entry of an Order  
9 approving the construction of the two additional  
10 tracks.

5 Items RR-2 and RR-3 (T12-0135,  
6 T13-0033) can be taken together. These items are  
7 petitions seeking authorization for safety  
8 improvement projects on highway-rail grade crossings  
9 across Illinois. In each case the ALJ recommends  
10 entry of an Order granting the petition.

16 Item RR-4 is Docket Number T13-0060.

17 This is Kansas City Southern Railway, the Village of  
18 Murrayville and IDOT's Stipulated Agreement seeking  
19 authorization for safety improvement projects at a  
20 highway-rail grade crossing in Morgan County.  
21 Transportation counsel recommends entry of an Order  
22 approving the Stipulated Agreement.

6 On to Motor Carriers, Items MC-1  
7 through MC-3 (180482 MC, 111060 MC, 161676 MC) can be

10 Illinois Commercial Transportation Law. In each case  
11 our Transportation counsel recommends entry of an  
12 Order adopting the Settlement Agreement.

18 Item MC-4 (74081 MC) is Rokaitis  
19 Industries' application for renewal of its authority

22 of Trespassing Vehicles Law. Transportation counsel

1 recommends entry of an Order granting the request.

12 Act. In both cases ALJ Duggan recommends entry of an  
13 Order granting the license.

2 each case the ALJ recommends entry of an Order  
3 granting the application.

6 to Section 45 of the Collateral Recovery Act. In  
7 each case the ALJ recommends entry of an Order  
8 granting the permit.
