CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Good morning. I have 1 2 10:32. Under the Open Meetings Act, I would like to 3 call the June 26, 2019, Regular Open Meeting to 4 order. 5 Are we ready to proceed in Springfield? 6 7 THE CHIEF CLERK: Yes, we are. 8 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Thank you. 9 Commissioners Bocanegra, Kimbrel, and Oliva are with 10 me in Chicago. We have a quorum. Commissioner Sheahan is seeking to 11 12 participate by phone. Commissioner Sheahan, are you 13 with us? 14 COMMISSIONER SHEAHAN: I am. Thank you. 15 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Are there any 16 objections to allowing Commissioner Sheahan to 17 participate by phone? 18 (No response.) 19 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, 20 Commissioner Sheahan is granted permission to 21 participate by phone. 22 We have no requests to speak filed

with the Commission as required by Commission 1 procedures. However, if there are members who do 2 3 want to speak, we do have a signup sheet, if there's 4 a last minute request, at the front of the room, and we will have speakers address the Commission at the 5 end after the agenda is completed. 6 7 We now move on to our transportation 8 agenda. 9 There are no edits to the May 30, 2019, and June 12, 2019, Regular Open Meeting 10 Minutes. Are there any objections to approving the 11 12 Minutes? 13 (No response.) 14 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Minutes are approved. 15 16 Moving on to our railroad items. 17 Items RR-1 through RR-5 concern 18 various public safety projects. Are there any 19 objections to considering these items together and 20 approving the Proposed Orders? 21 (No response.) 22 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the

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Orders are approved.

2 Moving on to our motor carrier items. 3 Items MC-1 through MC-3 concern 4 stipulated settlement agreements on alleged violations of the Illinois Commercial Transportation 5 6 Law. 7 Are there any objections to 8 considering these items together and approving the Proposed Orders? 9 10 (No response.) CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the 11 12 Orders are approved. 13 Item MC-4 concerns applications for 14 renewal of a Commercial Relocation Towing License for B & R Towing. 15 Are there any objections to approving 16 17 the Proposed Order that grants the renewal? 18 (No response.) CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Order 19 20 is approved. 21 Item MC-5 concerns Superior Transport 22 & Relocation's Application for a Common Carrier

Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to 1 2 Transport Household Goods. 3 Are there any objections to approving 4 the Proposed Order that grants the certificate? 5 (No response.) CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Order 6 7 is approved. 8 Moving on to our collateral recovery 9 items. 10 Item TR-1 concerns Applications for a Class E Recovery Permit. There are substantive edits 11 12 to the Order. The Order as edited grants the 13 application, but with a one-year probation period 14 finding that the Applicant's criminal record and 15 failure to pay fines warrants additional oversight due to public safety concerns. 16 17 I move the proposed edits. Is there 18 a second? 19 COMMISSIONER OLIVA: Second. 20 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Any discussion? 21 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Yes, thank you, 22 Chairwoman.

I would like to take this opportunity 1 2 to express my disagreement with the majority on this 3 matter. Having carefully considered the record as a 4 whole, I would vote to deny this Applicant's permit. 5 In so finding, I would rely in part and adopt in part the Staff's recommendation that this Applicant should 6 7 be denied based upon the nature of his offense and 8 his failure to pay the outstanding fine. 9 First, the prior offense involved a confrontational situation that resulted in a physical 10 11 altercation and harm to this individual. In my view, 12 this permit involves direct and potentially charged 13 confrontations with individuals similar to the 14 circumstances surrounding this Applicant's prior 15 offense. Second, I would agree with Staff that 16 17 this permit should be denied based upon the fact that 18 this Applicant has failed to pay any portion of his 19 outstanding restitution associated with this 20 particular offense. This failure to pay in my 21 opinion is a factor to be considered and is a 22 complete disregard for the rule of law.

1 I am concerned this Applicant will 2 exercise the same disregard with respect to the 3 granting of this permit. 4 For those reasons, I would vote to 5 deny the permit. Thank you. CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Thank you. 6 7 Any other comments? 8 (No response.) 9 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: All in favor of 10 approving the Proposed Edits, say aye. 11 (Chorus of ayes.) 12 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: All opposed, say nay. 13 COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Nay. 14 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: The ayes have it, the edits are approved. 15 I move to approve the Proposed Order 16 17 as edited. Is there a second? COMMISSIONER OLIVA: Second. 18 19 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: All those in favor of 20 the Order, say aye. 21 (Chorus of ayes.) 22 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: All opposed, say nay.

1	COMMISSIONER BOCANEGRA: Nay.
2	CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: The ayes have it. The
3	Order is approved.
4	Moving on to our administrative
5	matters.
6	Item AM-1, which is Docket Number
7	161368 MC, Sub 5, concerns Pier 60, Inc.'s, Emergency
8	Motion For Rehearing and Reconsideration of a Denial
9	of a Carrier's Application for Permitted Household
10	Goods Authority. This item will be held for a later
11	disposition and a denial of the authority pending the
12	Commission's review.
