1                   CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Are we ready to proceed  
2 in Springfield?

3                   THE CHIEF CLERK: Yes, we are.

4                   CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Thank you.

5                                 Under the Open Meetings Act, I call  
6 the August 21, 2019, Regular Open Meeting to order.  
7 Commissioners Bocanegra, Oliva, and Sheahan are with  
8 me in Chicago. Commissioner Kimbrel is in  
9 Springfield. We have a quorum.

10                                We have no requests to speak.

11                                We're moving on now to the Public  
12 Utility Agenda.

13                                There are no edits to the July 29,  
14 2019, Policy Session Minutes.

15                                There are edits to the August 1,  
16 2019, Regular Open Meeting Minutes.

17                                Are there any objections to approving  
18 the Minutes as edited?

19   (No response.)

20                   CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
21 Minutes are approved.

22                                Moving on to our Electric items, E-1

1 concerns 19-0255, which is a Complaint against ComEd  
2 regarding overbilling in Chicago. The Order grants  
3 Respondent's Motion to Dismiss the Complaint with  
4 prejudice finding that the Complaint is barred by the  
5 statute of limitations and the doctrine of  
6 res judicata.

7 Are there any objections to approving  
8 the Order?

9 (No response.)

10 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Order  
11 is approved.

12 Item E-2 concerns Docket 19-0528,  
13 which is a Complaint against Direct Energy Business  
14 Services regarding unauthorized service and billing  
15 in Chicago. The parties filed a Stipulation and  
16 Joint Motion to Dismiss.

17 Are there any objections to granting  
18 the motion and dismissing the Complaint?

20 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
21 motion is granted.

22 Item E-3 concerns Docket 19-0457,

1       which is MidAmerican's Application to authorize the  
2       issuance and sale of up to \$1.7 billion of long-term  
3       debt. The Order authorizes the issuance of debt and  
4       requires MidAmerican to comply with reporting  
5       requirements of Part 240 of the Commission Rules.

9                       CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Order  
10       is approved.

11                       Items E-4 through E-10 concern  
12       Applications for authority to install distributed  
13       generation facilities in Illinois. The Order grants  
14       the Certificates finding the Applicants meet the  
15       requirements.

16                       Are there any objections to  
17       considering these items together and approving the  
18       Orders?

20                       CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
21       Orders are approved.

22                       Item E-11 concerns Docket 19-0592,

1       which is an Application for a license to operate as  
2       retail electric agents, brokers, and consultants in  
3       Illinois. The Order grants the license finding that  
4       the Applicant meets the requirements.

10                      Items E-12 and E-13 concern Dockets  
11       19-0796 and 19-0797, which are Petitions for  
12       emergency relief to protect portions of the  
13       Environmental Disclosure Report from release of  
14       proprietary information. The Orders grant the  
15       Petitions.

1       Petitions to Cancel the Energy Efficiency Installers

8                       CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
9       Orders are approved.

10                      Items E-19 through E-39 concern  
11       Applications for authority to install emergency  
12       efficiency measures. The Orders grant the  
13       Certificates.

18                      CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
19       Orders are approved.

21       is GRM 19-215, which is the filing by Nicor to revise  
22       the Rider 26 uncollectible expense adjustment. Staff

1 reviewed the filing and finds the proposed revisions  
2 reasonable, and, thus, recommends allowing the rate  
3 to go into effect as filed.

7 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the  
8 filing is not suspended.

9 Item G-2 concerns Docket 18-1648,  
10 which is the Complaint against Nicor as to billing in  
11 Downers Grove. The Order denies the Complaint  
12 finding that the complainant did not show that Nicor  
13 Gas improperly billed her.

17 CHAIRMAN ZALEWSKI: Hearing none, the Order  
18 is approved.

19 Item G-3 concerns Docket 19-0699,  
20 which is a complaint against Ameren Illinois as to  
21 malfunctioning gas meter in Peoria. The parties  
22 filed a Joint Motion to Dismiss the Complaint with

1 prejudice.

8 argument in Docket 18-1775, which is Nicor Gas' rate  
9 increase proposal. In their Brief on Exceptions, the  
10 Attorney General's Office and Nicor Gas requested  
11 oral arguments under Section 9-201(c) of the Act.

16 requests for oral argument are granted. I do notice
