- 3 Transportation agenda, we have minutes to approve for
- 4 the June 29 Regular Open Meeting, the July 14 Bench
- 5 Session and the July 28 Bench Session. Is there a
- 6 motion to approve the June 29, July 14 and July 28
- 7 Transportation minutes?
- 8 COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL-DIAZ: So move.
- 9 COMMISSIONER FORD: Is there a second?
- 10 COMMISSIONER ELLIOTT: Second.
- 11 COMMISSIONER FORD: It's been moved and
- 12 seconded. All in favor say aye.
- 13 COMMISSIONERS: Aye.
- 14 COMMISSIONER FORD: Any opposed?
- The vote is 5-0. The minutes are
- 16 approved.
- 17 Starting with the Railroad agenda,
- 18 Items RR-1 through RR-6 (T10-0107, T10-0108,
- 19 T10-0115, T10-0116, T10-0121, T10-0122) will be taken
- 20 together. These are Stipulated Agreements for safety
- 21 improvements to railroad crossings. Staff recommends
- 22 entering the Orders approving the Stipulated

- 19 Illinois, by exercising the right of eminent domain
- 20 to improve a roadway and bridge structure. ALJ
- O'Brien recommends entering the Order approving the
- 22 exercise of eminent domain.

- 1 Is there any discussion? Any
- 2 objections? Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 3 Item RR-8 is Docket T10-0039. This is
- 4 a Petition by Effingham Equity to modify a grade
- 5 crossing of the Illinois Central track in Gallatin,
- 6 Douglas County, Illinois. ALJ O'Brien recommends
- 7 entering the Order approving the modifications and
- 8 improvement.
- 9 Is there any discussion? Any
- 10 objections? Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 11 Item RR-9 is Docket T09-0119. This is
- 12 a Petition by the Illinois Department of
- 13 Transportation seeking authority to reconstruct a
- 14 bridge in the Village of South Elgin, Kane County,
- 15 Illinois. Chief ALJ Kirkland-Montaque recommends
- 16 entering an Order granting the Petition.
- 17 Is there any discussion? Any
- 18 objections? Hearing none, the Order is entered.
- 19 Items RR-10 through RR-13 (T07-0009,
- 20 T08-0123, T09-0060, T09-0062) will be taken together.
- 21 These are Supplemental Orders approving additional
- 22 Grade Crossing Protection Fund assistance or granting

- 1 an extension of time for parties to complete required
- 2 work. The Administrative Law Judges or Staff
- 3 respectfully recommends entering the Supplemental
- 4 Orders.
- 5 Is there any discussion? Any
- 6 objections? Hearing none, the Orders are entered.
- 7 That concludes the Railroad agenda.
- 8 Turning to Motor Carriers, Items MC-1
- 9 through MC-4 will be taken together. These items are
- 10 Stipulated Settlement Agreements concerning alleged
- 11 violations of the Illinois Commercial Transportation
- 12 Law. Transportation Counsel Nagel recommends
- 13 entering Orders accepting the Stipulated Settlement
- 14 Agreements.
